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MAJOR JOSEPH P. CLEARY, PAST DEP'T COMMANDER.

The above face is familiar to all Monroe County residents as chief guardian of the peace of Rochester. His services in war are only excelled by his services to this city.

He is a member of Marshall Post, No. 307, and past department commander of New York State. Marshall Post is named after his own commander in 6_1 - 6_5 . E. G. Marshall commanded the 13th New York Infantry, and when its term of service ended in 6_3 he was placed in command of the 14th N. Y. Heavy Artillery.

BRILLIANT WAR RECORD.

Joseph P. Cleary was born in Limerick, Ireland, March 11th, 1844. When 14 years old he came to the United States and joined his brother, M. F. Cleary, in this city. In the spring of 1358 the two brothers went to Chicago, where they were employed in the nurseries near that city.

In 1860 Mr. Cleary returned to Rochester and in the following year enlisted in Company E, 13th New York Infantry. The "Old 13th," as it was popularly called in the Army of the Potomac, went to the front in command of General Quinby. In the engagements at Blackburn's Ford, First Bull Run, Siege of Yorktown, Hanover Court House, Mechanicsville and Gaines' Mill the regiment was thrown into exposed positions, and did heavy fighting, in which Chief Cleary took part.

While assisting a wounded comrade at Gaines' Mill, Cleary was captured by the rebels and taken to General Longstreet's headquarters. From there he was sent to Libby prison, where he spent three weeks, and was then transferred to Belle Isle. On August 6, 1862, he was exchanged and was conveyed under a flag of truce to Harrison Landing, then McClellan's base of supplies. Shortly after his return to the regiment part of McClellan's command on the peninsula was transferred to central Virginia, where they became part of General Pope's army.

At the second battle of Bull Run, Corporal Cleary was severely wounded. He was conveyed to the memorable Apple Orchard and laid there for five days, a prisoner. Then the wounded were sent through the lines to Washington, Cleary being taken to the hospital on Meriden Hill. Later he was transferred to Annapolis, where he remained until December 2, when he rejoined his regiment before Fredericksburg. On the morning of the commencement of the battle of Chancellorville the term of enlistment of the 13th expired and the regiment was sent to Elmira and mustered out of service.

On June 9, 1863, the Fourteenth New York Heavy Artillery was organized, with the remnant of the old 13th as a nucleus. Cleary went out as orderly sergeant of Company F, and was promoted to be second lieutenant of Company B, in October of the same year. During the winter of 1863 four companies were stationed at Sandy Hook, during which time Lieutenant Cleary acted as post adjutant and post quartermaster. The next April his company went to Washington and camped back of Alexandria, where it was attached to the Third Brigade, First Division of the Ninth Army Corps under Burnside. The regiment next marched to Warrentown Junction and joined the Army of the Potomac, under General Grant. It was engaged in the battle of the Wilderness, during which Lieutenant Cleary was acting adjutant of the regiment.

Subsequently the 14th was engaged in the battles of Spottsylvania Court House North Anna River, Cold Harbor and Petersburg and Weldon Railroad. On the second day of that battle Lieutenant Cleary was placed in command of the 170th New York Regiment, whose officers were on the sick list. At the battle of Spottsylvania Court House, Lieutenant Cleary was promoted to first lieutenant and captain at Pegram's farm, where he commanded the battalion. The battalion moved back to the front of Petersburg for the winter, and in November Captain Cleary was placed in command of six mortar batteries in front of Fort Hell.

Some time in March he was wounded on top of the head by the explosion of a shell. In the same month he was promoted to major, and his command was attached to Tidball's Artillery Brigade, which went as far as Berksville station support, ing the center of Grant's army. During the trip Major Cleary was detailed to command the battalion in charge of 24 wagons sent out to destroy artillery carriages and bring back captured guns.

After Lee's surrender the 14th New York marched to Washington, thence to Tenallytown, making headquarters at Fort Reno, and the regiment was distributed along to Fort Stevens. Major Cleary had been brevetted lieutenant-colonel and returned with that title, on August 24, 1865.



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COL. HENRY S. REDMAN,

The subject of this sketch was born in the town of Clarkson, Monroe County, N. Y., in 1845. At the age of eighteen he enlisted in Company L, 21st New York Griswold Light Cavalry and soon went to the front with his regiment, which was assigned to General Stall's Division, being promoted to Corporal and Sergeant. He was detailed as Chief of Orderlies on the staff of Brigadier General Tibbitts and during his military career took part in the following battles : Upperville, Marl Bottom Bridge, Moorefield, New Market, Pridmont, Lynchburgh, Staunton, Lexington, Paris, Liberty, Salem, Winchester, Frederick City, Hillsboro, Snicker's Gap and Ashby's Gap.

At the latter engagement he was shot through the left lung and lay on the battlefield all night. When found, he was carried across the mountain to Paris, Va., where he was taken prisoner by Colonel Mossby's men. Through the help of one of Mossby's Sergeants he made his escape to General Sheridan's lines. He was discharged at Annapolis City, Md., July, 1865.

Since his return to civilian life he has been engaged as commercial salesman, and Superintendent of Monroe County Court House for the past eleven years, which position he now holds. He has been an active member of the Grand Army of the Republic since 1868.



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GENERAL JAMES R. CHAMBERLIN.

General James R. Chamberlin, Past Commander of Monroe County Veteran Brigade, was born in Troy, N. V., Sept. 10, 1825, and was a graduate of the Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. He moved to Rochester, N. Y., in the fall of 1850, and has been a resident of this city engaged in active business ever since.

The following is his military record, as taken from the Adjutant General's Report of the State of New York, Vol. II., 1863 :

"Chamberlin, James R., age 35 years, enlisted in the Third New York Cavalry August 31, 1861, at Rochester, mustered in as Sergeant, Company H, August 31, '61, to serve three years ; mustered in as Second Lieutenant, Company Y, August 31, '61, to serve three years ; mustered in as Second Lieutenant, Company Y, 1861 ; mustered in as First Lieutenant, Company F, date not stated. Acting Adjutant First Battalion since July 1, 1862 ; transferred as First Lieutenant to Company A, April 23, 1863 ; promoted Captain June 1, 1863 ; wounded and in hospital at Fortress Monroe, Va.; resigned to assist in raising a regiment Augu t 13, 1864 ; commissioned Second Lieutenant Dec. 4, 1861, with rank from June 21, 1861, original ; commissioned First Lieutenant March 4, 1863, with rank from Dec. 30, 1862, original ; commissioned Captain, March 4, 1863, with rank from Dec. 30, 1862, vice Joy, resigned.

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COL. CHATFIELD.

Past Col. I. H. Chatfield was born in Saratoga, N. Y., in 1843. When the war broke out he enlisted, August, 1862, as private in Company I, 140th Regiment, N. Y. S. Vols, and served until close. April, 1880, he joined O'Rorke Post, No. I, G. A. R., and served in various offices; 1865 he was elected commander of the Post, and during his term he brought the Post up to a large membership. In 1806 he organized C. Rorke Camp, No. 60, S. O. V., with a charter membership of 105, which is said to be the L rg st in the state. February, 1807, he organized I. F. Quinby Post, No. 400; he was elected commander and served the Post two terms in that office. During the year that Quinby Post was organized he also organized and mustered in a camp of Sons of Veterans at Churchville, February 28th, 1800. He takes great pleasure in instructing young men in military tactics, and devotes a great deal of time to that branch. He is known throughout G. A. R. circles as the organizer in the Grand Army Republic.

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O'Rorke Post No. 1. ROCHESTER, N. Y.

This post is the only one in the State of New York that holds its rank and number in the Grand Army without a charter. It was first organized in 1866, and on that claim it was received in the order on dispensation. It was the second Post organized in the United States, the first and original Post having been mustered in Decatur, Ill., the same year.

From the ranks of O'RORKE POST have sprung all the other Posts in the city of Rochester, as well as many in the surrounding counties, over one thousand soldiers and sailors having been mustered into its ranks since 1866. At present it has the largest roster of any in this part of the State.

The Post was named for a brave and honorable young soldier, who was killed while leading his regiment on Little Round Top, at the battle of Gettysburg, July 2d, 1863. Col. P. H. O'RORKE was a graduate of West Point, and entered the service in 1861, being attached to the Engineer Corps as Lieutenant. On the first of October, 1862, he was breveted Colonel and placed in command of the 140th Regiment, New York State Volunteers, then in camp at Pleasant Valley, Maryland.

Several years ago a Drill Corps was organized among the members of this Post, and it is to-day the only one of its kind in the State that is fully equipped with arms, accoutrements and uniforms. There are fifty members in the ranks of the Drill Corps. They first distinguished themselves at the funeral of Gen. U. S. GRANT, for which they received special mention from Army headquarters.

At their rooms, which are located in the City Buildings, on Front street, regular encampments of the Post occur on the alternate Thursday evenings of each month. 92 Front street.

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Lieut. Col. Louis Ernst was born in Juiy, 1825. In 1831 his parents removed to this city, and it has been the home of the family every since. In 1840 Col. Ernst assisted in organizing Company D, known as the "Union Guard" 54th Regt. N. G. S. M. and holding various commissions until 1862 when he resigned the office of Lieut. Col. in the regiment in order to accept the position of Lieut. Col. in the 140th Regt. N. Y. S. V., which regiment he organized and took to the front. He was present at the battles of Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville and Gettysburg. He resigned his commission in August, 1863, his business interest requiring his immediate personal attention. He was a member of Peissner Post and a member of the Soldiers' Monument Association. Shortly before his death he was elected commander of the Veteran Brigade of this City and was to have been Chief Marshal at the dedication of the Soldiers' Monument on Memorial Day, 1802.

He passed from this life April 3, 1892.

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Peissner Post, No. 106.

This Post is composed entirely of Germans and the whole work of the Order transformed to the German language. It was chartered August, 1872. Some difficulty was at first experienced in selecting a name for the Post, but eventually it was decided to perpetuate the name of one of our adopted citizens, and a faithful soldier who sacrificed his life for the Nation.

ELIAS PEISSNER was born in Germany and was a polished scholar. Soon after coming to America he became a teacher of the German language at a college in Schenectady, N.Y. When the Rebellion had been raging for about one year he decided that it was his duty to offer his services to the country. He succeeded in recruiting a regiment afterwards known as the 119th New York Volunteer Infantry and was at once commissioned its Colonel. The regiment was mustered into the U.S. service Sept. 1, 1862, and credited to New York city. Col. PEISSNER proved his ability as a soldier as he had a teacher until the battle of Chancellorsville, Va., May 2, 1863, when a bullet terminated his honorable career.

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

This Post was mustered into the Department in 1876, and secured its number on special dispensation from a Post that had been disbanded. Its members are enterprising, and to them belongs the first honor of presenting flags to the Public Schools, the ceremonies occurring in Rochester, Washington's Birthday, 1889. The transfer of the flags from one standard bearer of the schools to another takes place annually on the above day at the City Hall, under the auspices of this Post, assisted by the G. A. R., and are of the most impressing as well as interesting character.

It was named after one of America's most famous soldiers, Gen. GEORGE H. THOMAS, a graduate of West Point, who served his country faithfully during the Florida, Mexican and Seminole Indian wars, as well as in the late Rebellion. Gen. THOMAS was born in Southampton county, Va., in 1816, and died at San Francisco, Cal., March 28th, 1870. In 1851-54 he was Instructor of Artillery and Cavalry at West Point, and was brevetted Major General April 25th, 1862. In 1868, he declined the rank of brevet Lieutenant-General, tended to him by Gen. GRANT.

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

Entered as a private in Company A, 13th N. Y. Volunteer Infantry. After carryng a musket eight months was promoted to 2d Lieutenant, 25th N. Y. Volunteer Infantry, and participated in the battles of Blackburn's Ford, Bull Run, siege of Yorktown, battles of Hanover, Fredericksburg and Chancellorsville; was discharged as Captain July 10, 1863, by reason of expiration of term of service. He immediately commenced raising a company for the 21st N. Y. Volunteer Cavalry (Griswold Lights) and was again mustered into service Oct. 10, 1863.

While in the Cavalry service he participated in 23 recorded engagements and served as an Aid-de-Camp on the staff of Maj. Gen. Stahl and as an inspector on the staff of Brig.-Gen. Tibbetts. Was mustered out May 12, '65, by reason of close of the war.

He joined the G. A. R. in the year 1869 and from that time has been an indefatigable worker in the cause; was Department Inspector on the staff of Department Commanders Reynolds and Hedge, was a delegate to and attended national encampments at Chicago, Minneapolis, Portland, San Francisco, Detroit, Louisville and St. Paul, and nearly every Department Encampment since '69, and served as member of the Department Council of Administration for the years 1893, 4 and 5. No one is better informed in Department affairs.

He originated the plan and was on the committee that carried out the entertainment of the celebrated Department Encampment at Rochester in 1881; he was chairman of the committee of arrangements of the no less pleasing entertainment at the Department Encampment at Rochester in 1894; He is a Past Commander of George H. Thomas Post No. 4, and has served three terms as Commander of E. G. Marshall Post 307.

He has been twice Commander of the Veteran Brigade (Chairman Memorial Committee and Marshal of the Day) of Monroe county. The first time he presided over the only public evening exercises on Memorial Day ever held in the city of Rochester, at which a large sum was raised for the Grant Monument in New York city. His second term as Brigade Commander, 1892, was signalized by the presence of the President of the United States, members of his Cabinet, and the Governor of the State and his Staff and other distinguished men, and by far the greatest number of people ever in the city, and the largest and most successful parade and public exercises incident to the dedication of the Soldiers' Monument.

Through his efforts the General Relief Committee, G. A. R., acting under the State law, was organized and its workings perfected, through which more public money has been secured and distributed to needy comrades, and the widows and orphans of those deceased than in any other city of like population.

He has been fearless and effective in his advocacy of the rights of his comrades to public employment, and has voiced their wishes for more just and liberal pension laws. Comrades unfortunate or needy find in him a friend and counselor.

At the Encampment of the Department of New York, G. A. R., held at Utica in May, 1896, he was unanimously elected Department Commander.

He is now Postmaster of our city, having been appointed by President McKinley Sept. 16, 1898.

At the battle of Fort Hell, 1864, he was captured and confined in a Rebel prison until the last regular exchange of prisoners took place. He died in July, 1883.

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COL. JAMES A. BURKE.

Commander of Myron Adams Mounted Post, No. 84, G. A. R.

Comrade Burke enlisted at his native city, Albany, N. Y., as a private in Company E, 177th Regiment, New York Infantry, October 11th, 1862, and served under General Banks at the siege of Port Hudson, and through the campaign in the Department of the Gulf, 10th Army Corps. Mr. Burke removed to Rochester, N. Y., seven years ago, and engaged in business, and is of the firm of Burke & White, Bookbinders.

Myron Adams Mounted Post, No. 84. ROCHESTER, N. Y.

Instituted January 23, 1806, by Col. JAMES S. GRAHAM, acting under orders from Department headquarters.

MYRON ADAMS was mustered into service in Geneva in 1862 as a corporal of the 126th N. Y. Infantry, Co. F. Shortly after he was made hospital steward in the Regular Army at Baltimore, and then Second Lieutenant in the 2d U. S. Colored Troops. He was again appointed an officer with the same rank in the U.S. Signal Corps. At the battle of Mobile Bay he was posted upon the "Lackawanna" on foretop cross-trees taking signals from Major Kinney (a life-long friend) on Admiral Farragut's flagship "Hartford." The admiral is said to have asked Major Kinney to signal the "Lackawanna" : " For God's sake, get out of the way!" Myron Adams only caught "For God's sake," when by God's providence, his flag wound itself around his face so he could not see the rest of the signal. The order was not given below, and the "Lackawanna" kept on her way and crushed and sank the Rebel ram "Tennessee," and no doubt that won the day. He was taken a prisoner (but paroled) by Stonewall Jackson at Harper's Ferry. He resigned his commission and was mustered out in Rochester, September 16, 1865. He was pastor of Plymouth church in Rochester nearly twenty years, and only ended his pastorate by his death on December 29, 1895.

When at Mobile Bay he was only 23 years of age-very young for the service he was engaged in. Post meets 1st Wednesday each month at G. A. R. Hall, Court House,

COL. RICHARD KINGSTON.

Commander of I. F. Quinby Post, No. 400,

Was born in Rochester, June 19, 1843. He enlisted, August 27, 1862, in Company E, 140th New York Infantry, and participated in all the engagements of his regiment, being wounded at Spottsylvania, and was discharged, June 21, 1865, by reason of close of the war : joined O'Rorke Post, No. 1, at its organization, was transferred and became a charter member of Quinby Post, March 1, 1897, and was elected Junior Vice Commander ; January, 1898, became Senior Vice Commander, and January, 1809, was elected Commander of the Post.

I. F. Quinby Post, No. 409. ROCHESTER, N. Y.

This Post was organized March 1, 1897, and named in honor of Gen. ISAIAH FERDINAND QUINBY. He graduated from West Point in 1843. He served under Gen. TAYLOR in the Mexican War and took part in the several engagements on the Rio Grande. After the war he was appointed a professor at West Point but resigned in 1852. When the Civil war broke out he assisted in organizing the Thirteenth New York Infantry and became its Colonel, the regiment passing through Baltimore shortly after the attack on the Sixth Massachusetts. Promoted to Brigadier General, August 2, 1861, was one of Grant's most trusted division commanders in the operations which resulted in the fall of Vicksburg. December 31, 1863, ill health forced General Quinby to resign. He died in this city, September, 1891. As a soldier, he was sans pear et sans reproche.

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
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
