(Thomas H. O'Connor of Magee Avenue is the only one of the three still a Tenth Warder. E. Earl Baynes is deceased and Edward R. May, former Riviera Theater manager, resides in another city.)

The politicians must build new organizations, choose new leaders and new candidates and solve a host of attendant problems.

The Tenth Ward Courier, on the other hand, will go on serving the same advertisers and readers, as always. Why change to an unfamiliar name, we ask ourselves, especially since the new Tenth Ward will be entirely within the bounds of our circulation? We could call it the Tri-Ward or Northwest Courier, as some people have suggested, but we are not inclined to do so unless our readers convince us they are preponderantly for a change.

We could, of course, make it the OLD Tenth Ward-Courier, but in the annals of time and even in the 100 or more years of the old Tenth Ward itself, 34 years is but a short span, or is it?

It will be necessary for all those between 18 and 21 years of age, who wish to donate, to have their parents sign special permission blanks which will be available in the schools.
