Supervisors Re-appoint Leaders

Organization of the Board of Supervisors for the current year resulted in few changes as far as Northwest area wards were concerned. Five of the six supervisors went back into office with only one of the six, Frank Hemmerich (R) of the 24th, re-joining after a two year absence.

Two of the six have high ranking positions in the board, Robert P. Neilon (R) of the Ninth and George

J. Stockmeister (D) of the 20th being re-appointed as assistant leaders. Raymond Margrett (D) in the First, Jerry Clifford (R) in the Tenth and John Scibilia (D) in the 15th are the other incumbents.

This will be the last term for some of the supervisors, since ward lines are about to be abolished and the next Board of Supervisors will be elected along new district lines.

Seeking More Evidence On Vandalism

Acceptances have been received from several city officials for the Jan. 27 meeting of the Maplewood (formerly Tenth Ward) Neighborhood Association, but the needed written reports on incidents of vandalism are slow coming in.

"Perhaps, due to the holidays, people didn't have the time", says Albert Jeandheur, chairman, "but we need these letters. We have many word-of-mouth reports and we would like to have these and others substantiated in writing. This is the type of complaint that gets action."

Names of writers will be held in strictest confidence, states Jeand-

heur, who would like to get the letters, addressed to him at 1261 Dewey Ave., no later than this weekend.

Arthur B. Curran, Jr., in his former capacity as city manager, accepted the invitation of the association to send representatives to the Maplewood Association meeting which will be held at Dewey Ave. Presbyterian Church. He assured Mr. Jeandheur that top city officials would attend, Police Chief William Lombard has accepted, as have Councilmen William J. Malley and Robert F. Wood and Henry R. Dutcher, Jr., chairman of the Zoning Board.

Sex Offender Legislation Suggested By Officials

A bill which is "tough but fair" providing punishment for sex offenders was suggested at a parents' committee meeting held last Wednesday at the Charles Settlement House in Jay St. The proposal, made by Councilman Stephen May and to be submitted to the State Legislature, was one of a number of suggestions advanced at the meeting.

Assemblyman Charles F. Stockmeister says he will submit a bill requiring persons convicted of certain lewd crimes to register with the police when they change their address or car. Failure to register would be a misdemeanor. Supervisor Scibilia stated he will seek a resolution from the Board of Supervisors supporting the bill.

persons in the 11th, 15th and 20th Wards had signed petitions asking for help in coping with the wave of sex offenders.

ASSEMBLYMAN POWERS noted that the laws such as proposed by Stockmeister and May are needed because sex offenders have the greatest record of repeating their crimes.

Second Neighborhood Association Organizing

Another neighborhood association is being formed in the Northwest area of Rochester and will have its first formal meeting on Sunday, Jan. 9 in St. Anthony's Church Hall, Ambrose St. Residents of the First, 15th and Ninth Wards, south of Lexington Ave., are invited to attend. The meeting starts at 7 p.m.

A committee of ministers and priests from churches of the area have done the preliminary organization, but hope to turn the reins over to laymen of the area. The new organization, similar to the Maplewood Neighborhood Association, will be known as the Edgerton Neighborhood Association.

Supervisors John Scibilia and Robert Neilon will represent the two major political parties on a steering committee which will also include the Rev. Robert Booher of Christ Presbyterian Church and

the Rev. Paul Freemesser of St. Anthony's Roman Catholic Church. Ten laymen from each of the churches in the area are also included on the organizing committee.

The Rev. Albert Jeandheur, chairman of the Maplewood Association, will be one of the speakers and will describe the activities of his group. John DeCesare, prominent Eighth Ward Republican, will preside at the meeting.

Problems of the neighborhood and the need for a neighborhood improvement group such as proposed will be discussed.

Creative paste-up work can keep children busy for hours.

You'll need several coloring books, a large supply of crayons — and anything on the kitchen shelf or in the odds-and-ends drawer that looks handy.

First a child colors a picture of his choice with crayon. He can draw his own picture or trace one if he prefers. Next, he'll paste on various materials to add dimension.

Before you begin, it's a good idea to spread large squares of oilcloth on the floor or over the play table.

A child may color a picture of a duck, then paste on shredded cotton balls to make it downy. If he colors a horse, he can paste on a saddle cut from a scrap of leather or leathery-looking vinyl. A girl might color a picture of a doll, then add a dress cut from real cloth, using any remnants supplied by the sewing basket.

To a farm scene, a little boy could add a fence made of flat popsicle sticks. Scraps of felt are handy for cutting out animal figures and pasting them into a drawing.

"The combination of bright crayon coloring and smooth and rough materials gives his work a brilliance and texture that pleases a child," points out Mary Hill, an editor with Whitman Publishing Company of Racine, Wisconsin, world's largest publisher of children's activity items. "Also," she reminds, "the finished work is often original enough to be framed and hung in the child's room where the whole family can enjoy it."

Children enjoy pasting up many objects from leaves to buttons to dried beans.

Gift wrap and ribbon can be cut up and used in many ways, too. A length of yellow ribbon makes a sunny road when pasted into a landscape. Flowered gift paper can be pasted across a meadow. Trees can be cut out of green tissue paper and pasted into a pastoral scene.

The working materials are modest and thrifty, and widely available at local stores. But to a child they are invaluable helps to creativity.

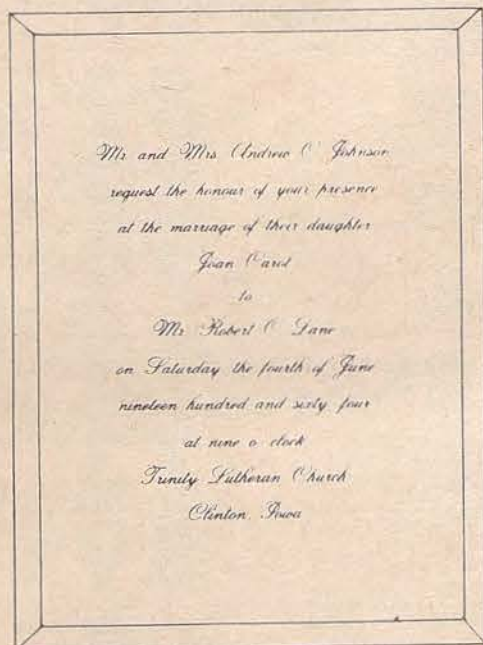

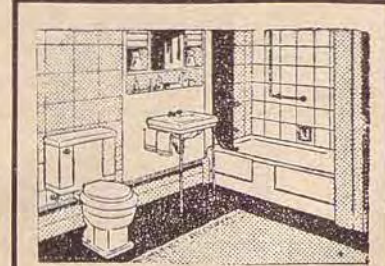

New Otis Street Sewers Promised Next Spring

An intolerable condition that residents of Otis St. have suffered since 1892 is about to be remedied, according to Vernon Packard, commissioner of Public Works. The commissioner, a Democrat, and Chris Strippoli, Republican leader of the First Ward, are credited with research which will result in the improvement of sewer facilities and will also earn both men "the everlasting gratitude of home owners", as one resident put it.

Year after year the basements of the homes on both sides of Otis St. have been flooded with sewer water after every heavy rainfall, causing damage to furnaces and stored articles. For over 40 years petitions remained unanswered by Rochester city officials.

Finally, Strippoli and Packard began checking into the problem. They found a report dating back to

1892 stating that the sewers connecting the Otis St. sewer system were too small to handle existing residential area.

It has now been promised that in the early spring the city will process bids for the construction of a new sewer system.

chiatric care for sex offenders. They also have issued an appeal to all people of this area who favor such legislation to call the Charles Settlement House at FA 8-5453. Jack Quinn of the Charles Settlement House staff says "your help is essential".

COUNCILMAN MAY endorsed a proposed state law which would require convicted sex offenders who move into this state or within the state to register with local law enforcement agencies. But he also urged caution in drafting legislation "in this extremely sensitive field". "In spite of our deep abhorrence of the acts of these criminals", said May, "and our fervor for bringing them to book, we must go slow in enacting laws which can so directly - and adversely - effect the life and liberties of some of our fellow citizens."

"Councilman-elect Robert Wood and I have been studying a number of bills which have been introduced in past sessions of the State Legislature on this subject, and statutes which are now on the books in other states, including California, Massachusetts and Michigan. We are also soliciting the opinion of appropriate experts in the fields of law enforcement, psychiatry, medicine and penology."

"What we seek is a bill which will be tough but fair - a bill which will be realistic in terms of gaining sufficient support to pass the Legislature, and practical in terms of its enforceability. We will continue our investigation of this problem and hope to have a sound proposal which will meet all of these criteria in the near future."

"Enactment of such a bill can go a long way toward protecting young and old alike from sex offenders and increasing safety on our streets."

Red Cross Gives Safety Tips

Accidental falls, second only to traffic accidents as a major cause of accidental deaths in this country, take an especially heavy - but preventable - toll during the icy winter months, the American Red Cross warned today.

"If you will take normal safety precautions, especially while walking on ice and snow covered surfaces, you can do a lot to keep yourself from being listed among the national average of 52 Americans who will die from falls every day of this year", Wilbur E. Mauk, local ARC Safety Services Director urged.

During 1964, he said, falls killed 19,100 persons - 11,900 of them in the comparative safety of their own homes. Falls strike most heavily at the upper age group - those over 65. In 1963, over 14,300 fall victims were in this age bracket, according to statistics released by the National Safety Council.

Accidental falls on the job accounted for more than 20 percent of all deaths and over 18 percent of all permanent injury cases.

"This appalling number of deaths and injuries can only be prevented if people become more aware of the problem and take preventive action", the Red Cross safety expert declared.

"Adding to the tragedy of most accidents is the fact that they usually are caused by some hazard that no one gave a second thought to, such as a marble on a step, or a tiny icy spot on an otherwise clear sidewalk."

He said one of the best safeguards against accidents is to take a Red Cross First Aid Course which teaches accident prevention as well as emergency care of the injured.

City Manager Seymour Scher will head a panel of city officials who will attend the special meeting called by the Maplewood (formerly Tenth Ward) Neighborhood Association for next Thursday, Jan. 27, in the meeting hall of Dewey Avenue Presbyterian Church. The principle topic of discussion will be neighborhood teenage gangs, vandalism and what to do about it.

Police Chief William A. Lombard and two or three city councilmen also are expected to attend the meeting and to speak briefly. The assistant director of the city and county Youth Board, William Howard will represent that agency.

An appeal made through the columns of this newspaper by Chairman Albert Jeandheur of the neigh-

borhood association has resulted in a score or more of specific reports on incidents and these will be on the agenda for the Jan. 27th meeting.

"We now have a good picture of the problems confronting us," says Jeandheur, "and we are appreciative of the cooperation we have received from people who have written to us."

He emphasized that "a sizeable turnout is essential if we are to make any headway".

THE ASSOCIATION was successful this week in its efforts to help block the issuance of a zone variance for a used car lot at Dewey and Electric Aves. An all-out last-minute appeal through the use of circulars delivered to homes in the affected area brought a crowd of 30 people to the Zoning Board hearing. Among speakers against the car lot were John R. Saxe, the association secretary, and Mr. Jeandheur. Also speaking in opposition was Daniel F. The variance was denied despite the "hardship" plea of the owner, a Buffalo man, that no one wants to re-open the service station which occupies the site and that the used car lot proprietor seems to be the only prospective buyer.

Maplewood Assn. Meeting Gives Hope For Neighborhood Improvement

More police protection, possibly foot patrolmen and endorsement of a law to make parents financially responsible for acts of vandalism by their children and numerous other proposals to cope with teen age problems in the old Tenth Ward area were advanced at a well attended mass meeting sponsored here on Jan. 27 by the Maplewood Neighborhood Association in Dewey Presbyterian Church.

'Post' Canceled Due To Storm

For the second time in its 39 year existence, your neighborhood newspaper was snowed under last week. The issue was ready for the presses, but delivery of the paper last Wednesday was ruled out by inability of the mailmen to make their full rounds. The '66 Blizzard now takes its place in history alongside the blizzard of '44, only worse, most observers agree.

Our neighborhood should be shovelled out from under the heaviest fall of snow we have ever experienced by the time this newspaper reaches your home on Feb. 9, we hope.

The meeting attracted wide attention and considerable coverage in the press, including a strong editorial in the Democrat & Chronicle, as well as on TV and radio. Here are some of the highlights of remarks by various speakers following introduction by Albert L. Jeandheur, association chairman, who set the stage for the discussion by citing numerous actual cases of trouble.

CITY MANAGER SCHER: Answers are not simple, but is interested in new approaches within the limits of the city's powers. Possible solution, saturation of the area with intensive police presence. Critical of some parents for not exercising control over their children.

I was very pleased on Monday, Jan. 24 when Speaker Travia of the New York State Assembly announced that electronic voting equipment will be installed in the Assembly by the end of this session or the beginning of the 1967 session. You will recall that I supported and requested this procedural change last year and this year submitted a bill calling for such action.

The benefits of electronic voting are three-fold; Firstly, under the present two hundred year old voice voting method, many inaccuracies occur. Not only will there be little or no error in the report on a legislator's vote, but it will also serve as an attendance register. Unfortunately, some assemblymen on both sides of the aisle have poor attendance records and now such absence will be clearly noted so that you, the voter, can readily note if your representative is on the job.

Secondly, time will be saved. Long roll-call votes often demand 20 to 25 minutes of the Assembly's time. It is no short task to call the names of 165 men and duly record their vote. However, under electronic voting, after debate has ended, it will take less than 2 minutes for the full membership to vote and be recorded, allowing more time for debate and sound legislative development.

Thirdly, this legislative reform in no way is partisan or benefits particularly the democratic or republican party. It has been supported by every major non-partisan group whose only goal was that of sound legislative practice and reform.

The column which follows was intended for publication in the Feb. 2nd issue, was canceled due to the weather emergency.

Certainly one of the prime concerns in New York State over the last few years, if not the last decade, is that of water pollution. The importance of this area has been discussed with such great frequency and at length that I do not wish to spend time on the need for clean waters. Some of the causes of dirty or polluted water which not only has worked against those of us with conservation interest, but has threatened the supply of the water we need for actual body consumption, are the poor methods used by both home and industry in elimination of our waste matter.

However, we cannot criticize industry and the home owner unless we first classify our waterways correctly. By classifying I mean A, B, C and D, which in turn means designed for drinking; designed for swimming; designed for lesser purposes; etc. I submitted a formal request to the State Water Commission last week in Albany for a reclassification or regrading of Black Creek.

This is because of the condition of Black Creek not only for those of us who live in the vicinity but for our friends from the City and other areas who want a clean, well-stocked, recreational center to visit on the weekends and holidays. I have received great support in this area from the Chamber of Commerce and in particular Joseph Schirano and his group from Churchville who aided in gathering petitions for this purpose. I will report on the decision of the commission when I am in receipt of their reply.

In this same area, I submitted a bill, which I believe has a good chance of passing, which will allow the Water Commission to hold hearings and make the necessary investigation for the purposes of upgrading a waterway without charging the applicants for the cost of the hearing. Unfortunately, under present law a town, village or group of individual citizens who persuade the commission to hold a hearing for the purpose of re-

classification of a waterway, ARE CHARGED FOR THE HEARING. This is totally unfair. The commission only holds a hearing when there is sufficient evidence to warrant a hearing so there is no fear that they will be dissipating the public funds on a wild goose chase. If there is justification for hearings, then the citizens who took the time and trouble to make the research to promote the hearings SHOULD NOT THEN BE FORCED TO PAY FOR THEIR GOOD CITIZENSHIP. After all when a person requests a hearing from the Internal Revenue on his income tax report—whether he wins or loses—he is not expected to pay for the cost of the hearing. This same logic must apply to all state hearings.

POLICE CHIEF LOMBARD: We can be proud of our children except for a fraction of a per cent. Dropouts and jobless are principle concern. Citizens must help police even to the extent of "turn-over arrests" and appear in court to help prosecute. Has 16 non-uniformed officers working on youth problems. Sends letters to parents of delinquents. Willing to put special police here equipped with walkie-talkies. Hopes to eliminate delay in police response to calls by new shifts which go into effect later this month.

YOUTH BOARD ASSISTANT HOWARD: Willing to send in four workers into the area. Knows of no organized gangs in the old Tenth. Has great faith in the majority of teen agers.

CITY COUNCILMAN WOOD: Advocates foot patrolmen on the beat, more vigorous attitude and an end to coddling by judges, more Saturday night activities for kids financed by the city and businessmen. Suggests formation of a citywide federation of neighborhood associations.

COUNCILMAN GILLETTE: Says area has improved in his 55 years as a resident and he sees it as a very stable, good place to live. Failure of parents to correct children is the problem. Doesn't believe vandalism is excessive, but if he finds it is so will see to it something is done about it.

REV. JEANDHEUR: Would encourage kids to think of vandalism as "stupid" and urged them to turn informer, to tell teachers and school counselors who the trouble makers are. Sees it as his duty to press charges against offenders and then, as a minister, to go visit them in jail.

Writing in complaints was a suggestion advanced by numerous officials and the Maplewood Neighborhood Association requests that copies of the letters be sent to the association at 1261 Dewey Ave. to insure follow-up. A "new sense of hope prevails", says Rev. Jeandheur, "in view of the expressed determination of the city to do something about our problems."

Secretary John Saxe announced that the association will also concern itself in the future with traffic problems; planning, zoning and beautification and improved neighborhood housekeeping.

Union Services During Lent

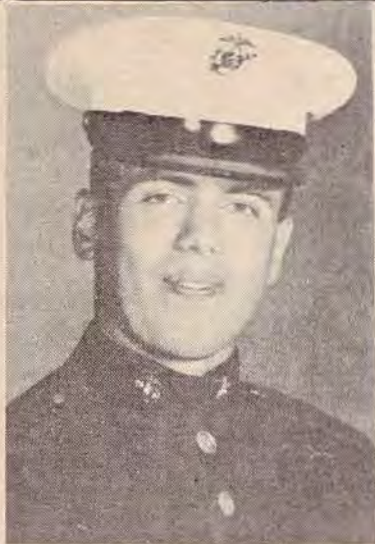

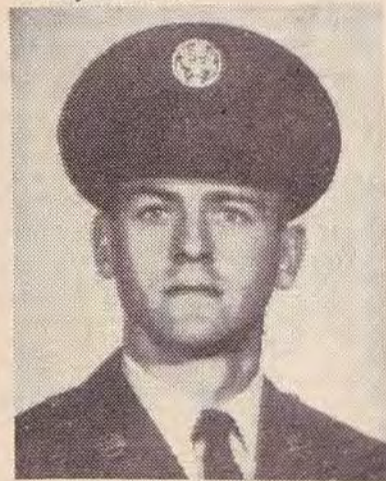



REPORT From ALBANY

By Assemblyman James E. Powers



On Feb. 15 I opposed but the Assembly passed a bill which relates to confidential recommendations for teacher applicants in New York City. My opposition was not partisan because the sponsor of the bill was a Democrat and all but three Democrats supported the measure, but I believe it is a step in the wrong direction. It should be also noted that bills which at first apply only to New York City often result in statewide application.

What does the bill do? The bill states that "the contents of any letter, data or document received by the Board of Examiners regarding any applicant for license in the public school must be made available to the applicant. The candidate or applicant will have the opportunity to answer statements or charges therein before a final decision is made by the Board of Examiners." At first glance, this may appear to be good law -- after all in a court of law one has an opportunity to face his accusers but let us look a bit further.

I stated on the floor I COULD SUPPORT THE BILL IF THE CHARGE OF ACCUSATION AGAINST THE APPLICANT WAS OF SUCH A NATURE THAT, IF TRUE, IT WOULD CONSTITUTE A FELONY. If you accuse a man of theft, extortion, or moral turpitude, certainly you should stand ready to defend your charges, for they are grave indeed. However, the thought that every unflattering statement you might make in a letter of recommendation would necessitate your appearance before the Board of Examiners would result in letters of recommendations that had little similarity with the truth.

Let's face it, no single recommendation will determine approval or rejection of an applicant. If six of an applicant's superiors were asked to evaluate him and five took the position he was dedicated, responsible and competent, the fact that one was highly critical would not result in a rejection.

If a person holding a responsible position had to appear before a

20-20 Vision Not Always Perfect

A mistaken belief that a child's eyes are perfect because he has 20-20 vision is probably one of the greatest reasons his school work falls below expectation, according to the Rochester Optometric Association.

During the annual observance of "Save Your Vision Week", Marvin A. Shulman, O.D., president of the association, notes that many children with 20-20 vision may be seriously handicapped in school as well as in their enjoyment of other every day activities by visual handicaps other than the ability to see clearly.

"Vision is a collection of several skills, such as the ability to focus, to distinguish colors, coordinate head and eye movements, to name a few, and if a child is sufficiently deficient in one of these skills, he may be hampered in his intellectual, social and emotional growth."

Many school and behavior difficulties could be prevented if a child's vision is professionally examined before he enters the classroom and is checked annually thereafter, Dr. Shulman advised.



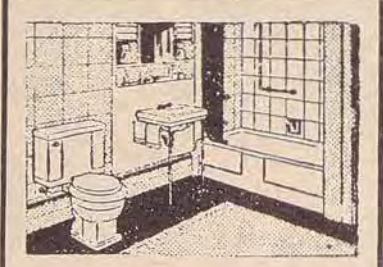

Protection For Animals
I am sure we have all been distressed by the reports in local newspapers and national magazines in reference to dognappers. These unscrupulous people who steal or obtain dogs in a variety of ways for the purpose of displaying them in fights or for unsanctioned experiments are despicable.

In an attempt to halt such activities, the Assembly this week passed two bills which I believe will be of interest to you. One bill, A1 704, states "that it shall be unlawful for any laboratory or institution to purchase any dog or cat for experimental purposes unless the seller thereof shall provide proof of ownership of the animal. . . Every such laboratory or institution shall keep a record of each such purchase, the name and address of the seller and a copy of the proof of ownership given at the time of the transaction."

We all agree that animals must be used for certain experiments. If we do not experiment on animals, then we must out of necessity experiment on people. However, to kidnap or steal a family pet, which subsequently is illegally sold to an institution, has no defense. The anguish of a family, particularly where children are involved, when they lose a pet can easily be appreciated. I am sure most of us could accept the loss of property worth \$500 with much greater resignation than the loss of a pet at a market value of 50¢.

A second bill, A1 2735, provides for a fine up to \$1,000 and imprisonment of one year for causing animals to fight other animals or persons.

We have seen a raft of animals dognapped from the home, beaten and starved and transformed from loving members of a family to vicious blood-seeking beasts for the sole purpose of engaging in fights to the death. This type of "entertainment" could only be appreciated by a sadistic and mentally twisted pervert.

I strongly supported these two bills for the protection of animals and will do anything else in my power to put an end to this practice. Should you have any information in this area, please feel free to contact me.

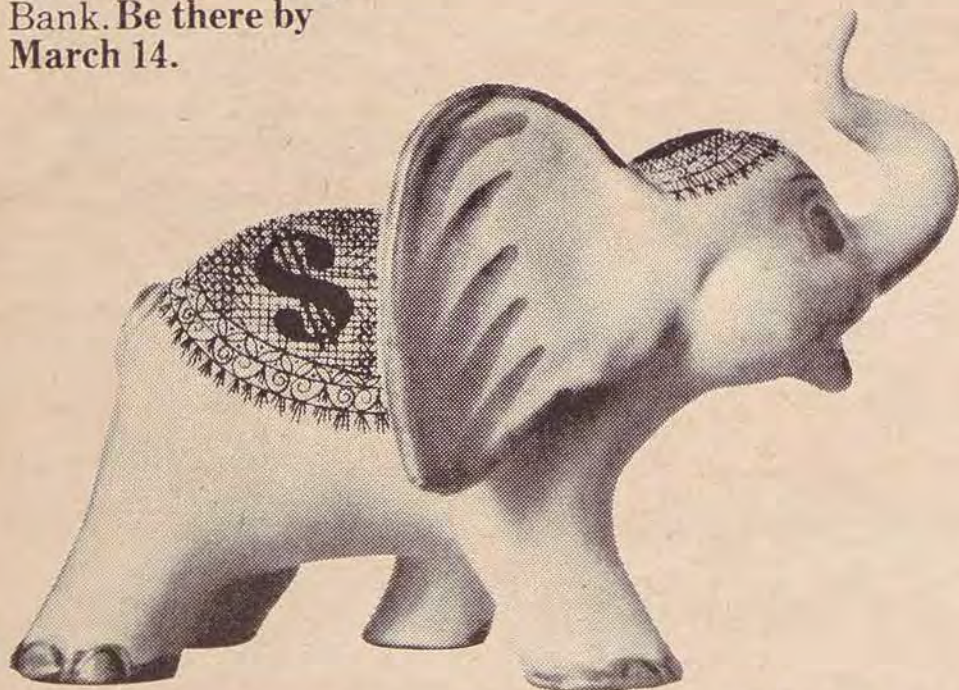

Must one be subjected to the indignation of reviewing these ruins every time they enter or exit at Lake Ave. To lose any desire to maintain your home in good condition, all one has to do is look at the corner. This is the easiest way to become discouraged and figure what's the use. The City Officials don't care, the men we helped elect to office do not care. They live elsewhere, where such things are not even permitted to start and are prohibited. Why should we care?"

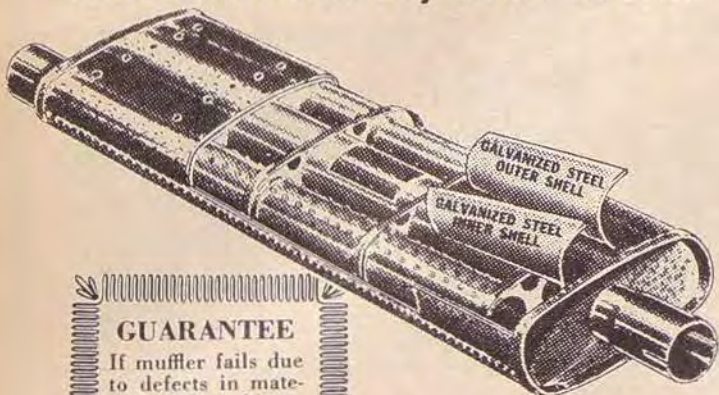
