Truck Obstruction Gets Criticism

Large trucks continue to block traffic on Dewey Ave. near Driving Park and Thomas J. Fenlon, president of the business men's association at the corner, has issued a statement "deploring the condition" and calling on the Wegman food store to carry out a promise to rectify the situation which Fenlon claims was made to him.

"The Wegman Enterprises", said Fenlon, "in a letter to me dated April 13, 1965, stated that

it was not their intention to inconvenience the people nor to contribute to a traffic problem. As of now I fail to see any improvement.

"I would suggest a concerted effort on the part of motorists and pedestrians involved to make their complaints known to Wegmans."

The Wegman loading platform where much of the foodstuff sold at the store is brought in via trucks is on heavily traveled Dewey Ave. and large tractor trailers find it necessary to back in. Occasionally this is during peak rush hours and delays the movement of traffic, according to Fenlon.

Spain & Portugal As Seen By Editor

The island of Majorca, a couple hundred miles out in the Mediterranean off the coast of Spain, is in some respects a second Miami Beach, although at about half the price. We heard about it all over Portugal and Spain, so nothing to

do but go see it for ourselves. Like Miami, let us say, it has its good points and its bad.

This was one time, fortunately, that we made reservations ahead. We bought our plane tickets at the American Express office in Madrid and at the same time had them book us into a hotel, which they did by telephone. Our first choice was all filled up, but we did get accommodated at the Mediterraneo Gran Hotel, which we were told was panned by Fielding, the tourist bible. Now, having been there we couldn't disagree more heartily with Mr. Fielding. We were well satisfied.

WE FLEW IBERIA and arrived at Palma, the big city on one end of the island, exactly on schedule. Going back, sad to say, it was raining and when it rains in Majorca (which it does about half the time) four or five hour delays are not uncommon. We came over non-

**TAX DEDUCTIONS
FOR TEACHERS**

On October 3, 1966, the Treasury Department said it had decided that teachers who take additional courses to improve their professional standing normally can deduct the cost from their income tax.

The Treasury Department said the deduction would be allowed if the additional education was needed to maintain or improve required skills or to fulfill new requirements imposed by the teacher's employer.

This is a good step. The children and in the end also the taxpayer receives the benefit when any teacher improves his skill. The state income tax structure, with some minor exceptions, conforms to the federal program. I believe it only logical that the state should also allow the same deduction. I am in the process of contacting the State Tax Department to determine if a decision has been made. When an interpretation is available, I will report it.

Joint Legislative Committee
On Higher Education Meets
In New York City

On Wednesday, Oct. 5, I flew to New York City to participate in a meeting on higher education in New York State. It is the function of our committee to review the progress of our state's higher education, and to make recommendations to the Legislature.

Parents of college age children know how difficult it is for students to gain acceptance at many of our state's schools. We will have to expand our Community colleges and State University facilities such

stop in two hours and took about 12 hours going back, but since it was about the only bad break in our entire trip, we just laughed it off.

The most famous product of Majorca, as many women know, are the Majorcan pearls. There was so much advertising warning you to make sure to get the genuine variety and only from certain jewelers, that the average tourist was afraid to buy. But his wife wasn't. And everyone comes back from this island with earrings, necklaces and bracelets of matching pearls. The prices are attractive, but it takes about five years, they say, to find out how good the quality is. (Gloves, too, are considered good value there).

Parma lies right on the shore of the Mediterranean, with long rows of hotels, complete with swimming pools, palm trees, patios, balconies and sidewalk cafes. It abounds in restaurants and night clubs. There is no end of excitement and taxis being quite cheap, the visiting population is quite mobile.

DURING THE DAY, you make for the center of the city where all the stores are--and you can shop to your heart's delight. Like in many European cities, the shopping district is concentrated on narrow, winding streets and you can walk for miles just window shopping. At times you have to shove your way through the crowds and in many of the shops you just can't get waited on. For the most part, the tourists there seemed to be mostly European; certainly not too many American. Just standing on a corner watching the people as they amble by is reward enough for allowing yourself to get so dog-tired, which we did, especially the male contingent.

RIGHT AROUND the corner from our hotel, in one direction we found

as Brockport if we are to meet the demands. In a later article, I will describe the progress being made and some of the problems confronting us.

As a public service, paid for by Assemblyman Powers

a small counter-type restaurant, run by an American, featuring hot dogs and other American delicacies such as hamburgs, omelets and ham sandwiches. Equally close to the hotel in the opposite direction was the El Patio, which was touted as serving the best food in all of Europe. We ate a meal there for somewhere around five dollars each and came away groaning, but delighted.

That's Majorca for you. A place of strange contrasts, and most certainly a must if you are in the area. We wanted to go to the other end of the island where some fabulous homes, fine beaches and deluxe hotels are located; in fact reserved a car to make the trip, but were rained out.

We went to only one night club and that was almost one too many. It had a shipboard atmosphere that was quite different, but the dance floor was jam-packed, just like home; and the drinks, even Coke, were \$1.50 per copy.

ONE DAY we took a bus ride on recommendation of our door man (more about him later) to see the Grotto at Genova. The bus route was over almost mountainous terrain and we circled through a half dozen little towns, high up into the hills. Opposite the bus stop we went through a gate and into the ticket office, a 2x4 place but big enough for a lunch counter and a sort of a bar where you could get good Spanish brandy for about 15 cents a serving.

Presently when the group got large enough, an English-speaking guide ushered us down a dark and winding "stairway", cut out of stone and leading into an underground cavern that apparently had been there since time immemorial. The guide lighted up each "scene" as we came upon it and as he said it was a little like Disneyland, only created by nature, earth faults and what have you. The stagemite formations were really beautiful and drew many ohs and ahs from the admiring tourists.

NOW ABOUT that doorman at our hotel. He doubled in brass. Come five o'clock each day and he would swap his doorman's coat for very swanky evening attire, complete with tie and tails, and mount the little stage at the foot of the winding staircase in the hotel salon. He was the tenor in a musical threesome along with an accomplished violinist and a good piano player. He had a very passable voice and rendered light opera pieces much to the satisfaction of his sizeable audience--both before and after dinner. (They do things quite leisurely over there, starting with cocktails about five and ending with after-dinner brandy as late as 10 or 11.)

DESPITE SOME bad weather, we thoroughly enjoyed Majorca and were sorry we only had four days there. But we were due back in Madrid; and also our reservations had run out and we had to leave. But as mentioned previously we had lots of time to cool our heels at the Palma Airport awaiting our plane back to the mainland. But we made it--in the middle of the night--and had to get the porter

out of bed to check into our apartment hotel. However, the next day dawned sunny and bright and we promptly forgot the nightmare. AFTER THREE MORE DAYS in Madrid, described in previous episodes, we jetted over to London via BEA and were met at the airport by some friends from London who drove us out some 30 miles into the countryside to a 15th Century inn where we had a delightful dinner. Then back to our motel at the airport for a night's rest previous to an uneventful, but thoroughly enjoyable jet flight back to America. THE END.



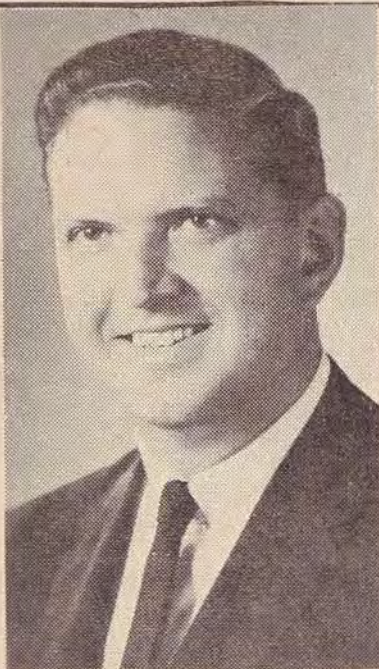

Want A Summer Government Job?

Representative Barber B. Conable, Jr. (37th District) recommends that students interested in summer jobs next year with departments and agencies of the federal government should take the Civil Service exams which will be given for the positions this fall and winter. As a follow-up to my article last week, in which I discussed the meeting I attended as a member of the Joint Legislative Committee on Higher Education, I would like to devote this article to the full time enrollment at State University. For your benefit, I am reprinting an article from the State University Newsletter:

State University's full-time enrollment for the fall is expected to exceed 121,000 students, according to President Gould.

President Gould notes that preliminary figures indicate the full time student body should increase by more than 14,000, or about 13 per cent, over the 1965 total of 107,700. Part time enrollment is expected to exceed 87,000 raising the total student body to more than 208,000 during academic 1966-67, compared to 186,000 in 1965-66.

"These figures," states the President, "further substantiate State University's recommendation in its recent Interim Master Plan Revision that enrollment estimates for 1970 be revised upward, to 184,650 students.

President Gould feels that "even if State University were only to maintain this fall's numerical rate of increase through the end of the decade, we would certainly surpass the earlier 1970 estimate of 160,500 and very nearly meet the new projection for that date."

He points out, however, that the addition of planned new facilities at the 57 campuses now conducting classes, and the opening of new colleges at both the two-year and four-year levels, can be expected to provide adequately for the new enrollment projections.

A general breakdown of the preliminary full-time enrollments indicates that the University Centers and the Medical Centers are enrolling more than 26,380 students. A full-time student body of 32,140 is expected at the University's four-year colleges.

The six Agricultural and Technical Colleges anticipate a full-time registration of 10,170 students, and the 28 Community Colleges are planning for a total of 46,150 full time enrollees.

**Green Pennants
Given For Safety**

Green Pennants signifying accident-free safety records were raised last week on flagpoles of 229 schools in Rochester and Monroe County in a county-wide celebration of the fifth annual Green Pennant Day.

With a record 245 schools participating in the program this year, only 16 have had pupil-caused traffic accidents and no school has had more than one accident charged to it. This compares with 226 out of 238 schools that had perfect records during the first 30 days in 1965.

Each of the schools that received Green Pennants will remain eligible to receive the coveted Perfect Safety Award for going through the entire school year without a student caused accident. During the last school year a total of 146 out of 242 participating schools earned Perfect Safety Plaques. For 78 of these schools it marked the fourth straight year in which they had no student-caused accident.

The Green Pennant activity is a traffic safety program aimed at increasing safety awareness and reducing traffic accidents among elementary and secondary school students. It is sponsored by General Motors' two Rochester divisions--Delco Products and Rochester Products, the Rochester Democrat & Chronicle and Times Union in cooperation with local law enforcement officers.

During the school year the pennant flies daily from the school flagstaff under the American flag as long as that school has an accident-free record. The pennant is lowered and placed inside the school whenever there is a student caused traffic accident.

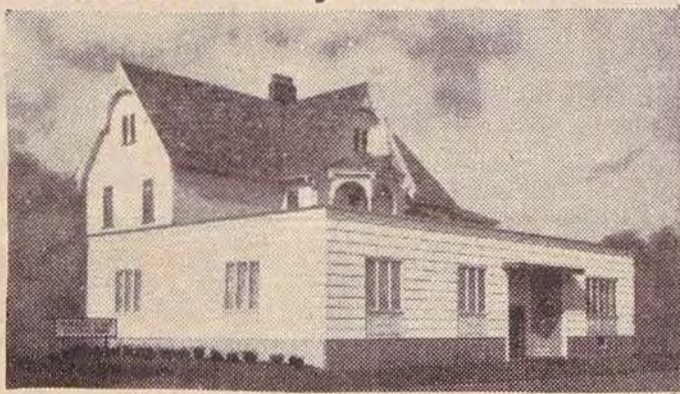

Notice To Be Given On Zone Hearings

The Zoning Board of Appeals will notify neighborhood associations of items to be considered at future hearings, Councilman Stephen May told the Park-Meigs Neighborhood Association last week. Zoning Administrator Harold J. Fuhrman has informed him he said of the board's willingness to mail notices of hearings to all neighborhood groups which indicate an interest in receiving them.

The Councilman introduced amendments to the Zoning Code last May, to require such notification, but he said he was willing to let it be handled by administrative means "at least on a trial basis." He said he thought the arrangement would "safeguard the interests of neighborhood associations and insure that they will have a full opportunity to be alerted and to testify, if they wish, on pertinent zoning matters."

May called neighborhood associations "bulwarks against zoning abuses and our best protectors of neighborhood integrity. To safeguard the character of our city, they must be kept fully informed of what the Zoning Board is doing." May also said that he will press soon for City Council action to require that property owners be given 20 rather than 10 days' notice of zoning hearings and to increase the notification area from 200 to 500 feet from the property in question.

Vandals who broke into the Rothschild used car office on Dewey Ave. last week made off with valuable motor vehicle records and the owner (Don Rothschild, phone MA 1-3800) is offering a reward to anyone who finds them. The forms are MV 50's and were in a green drawer which was taken apparently because it also contained some tools.

Other papers were found discarded in the neighborhood and it is assumed that the records were also thrown away by the thieves. Also stolen were check books and a radio.

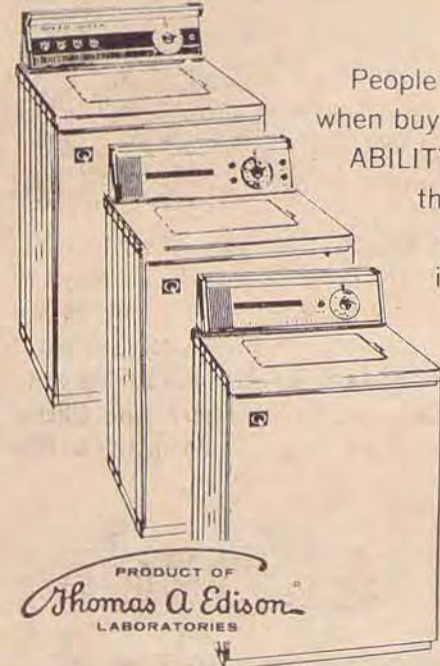

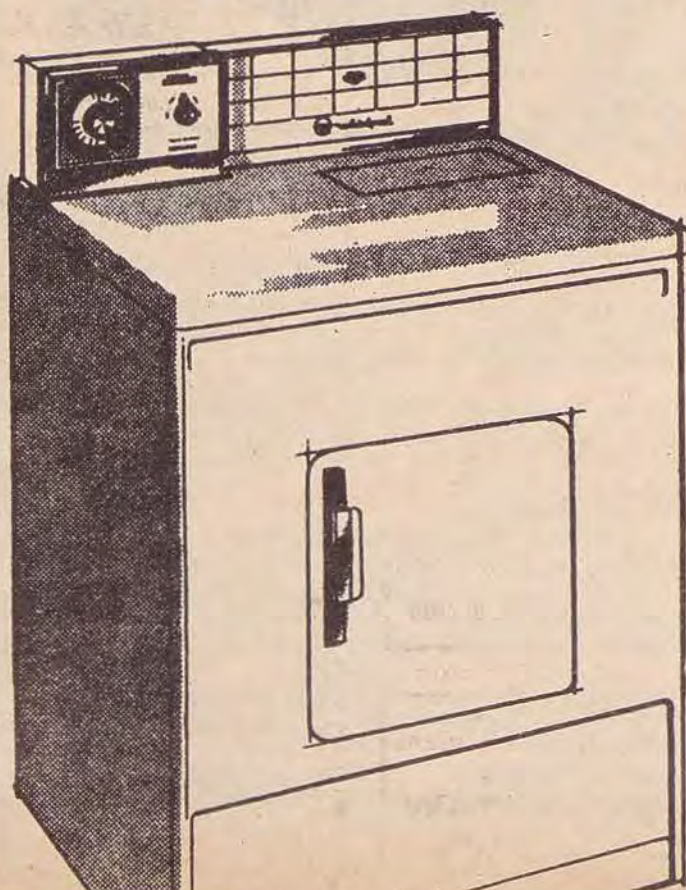

How To Vote Next Tuesday

Changes of district lines for state senate and assembly, plus abandonment of the old ward system and setup of a new county legislative body - very frankly - leaves people confused. But there is no need to panic. All you need to know is who your candidates are - and that information is readily available.

On this page you will find the names and addresses of all the candidates for whom you can possibly vote here in Northwest Rochester. If you are in doubt as to which names you will find on the voting machine in your district, ask any of the candidates, any ward leader or any ward committeeman. Or call the County Board of Elections, 34 State St.

Outside of state assembly and county legislator there is no reason for confusion. You are in the 51st state senate district and the 37th congressional district; you are in either the 133rd or 134th assembly district; and in either the 26th, 27th, 28th or 29th county legislative district; the constitutional convention delegates you vote for are in the 51st district; the judges, district attorney and county clerk candidates from which you will choose are clearly stated.

We offer you no advice on whom to vote for. We just say, **BE SURE TO VOTE** on Tuesday, Nov. 8.

We take a stand on just one issue - **AGAINST** the lottery amendment, since we are convinced it will do infinitely more harm than good.

Voting Shift From Wards To Districts

Residents of certain areas in the Northwest section will find next Tuesday that they have been shifted to new polling places. Although the majority of voters will go to the same places to cast their ballots, the change from ward to district lines this year will affect many voters in the border areas.

In an effort to equalize voting strength in each district, the Northwest section of town has been split up into four districts instead of six wards, as formerly. And the district lines are laid out like a jigsaw puzzle with absolutely no regard for the convenience of anyone.

Ward leaders, in many instances, have to work for two candidates for the new Monroe County Legis-

lature (which is replacing the old Board of Supervisors). Long established ward organizations, both Republican and Democrat alike, have divided loyalties and are trying valiantly to promote in two county legislative districts simultaneously. It isn't easy, but that's the way it's going to be in the future unless the State Constitutional Convention decides that another re-districting is in order. Or else ward organizations will be re-constituted along district lines.

Voters in doubt as to where to vote - or in which district they now live - will do well to heed the advice of the Post-Courier editor. See your ward leader, committeeman, any of the candidates or call the Board of Elections.

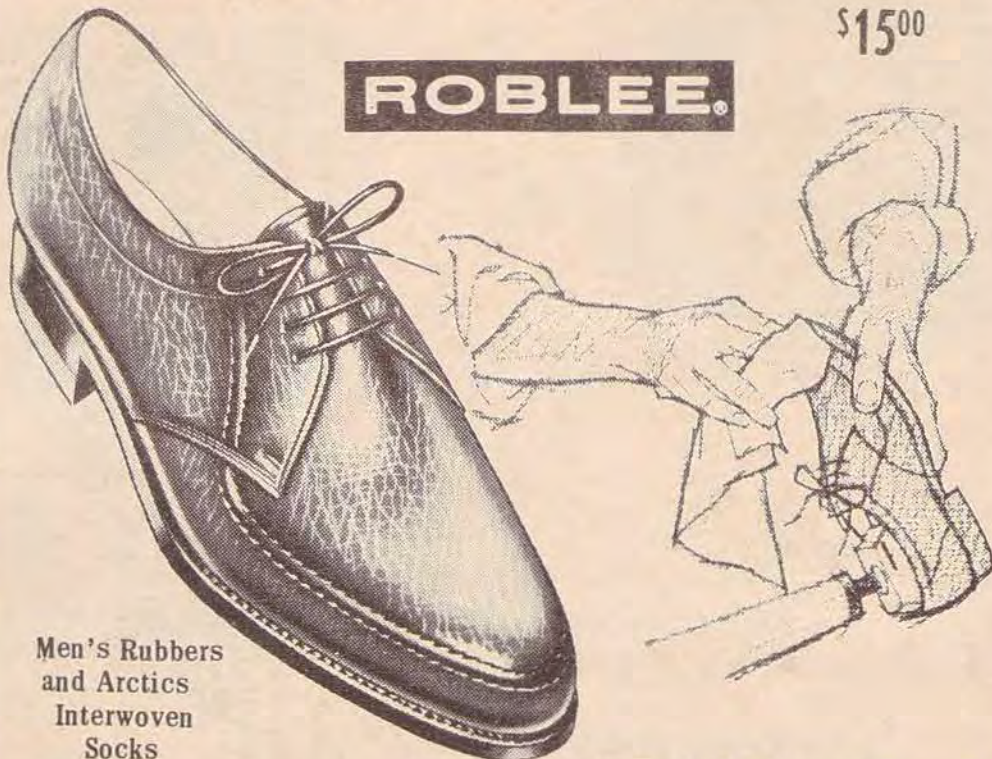

Gordon A. Howe would resign as county manager if he had to choose between his present job (as manager) and the post of delegate to the State Constitutional Convention. He took that stand at the political forum held here Sunday night in answer to a direct challenge from Andrew G. Celli, also a convention delegate candidate.

The 200 or more people who turned out for the forum at Dewey Ave. Presbyterian Church heard Celli repeat a charge previously made that Howe cannot legally run for delegate. Howe countered that convention rules say any elected or appointed official except a sheriff can be a delegate; and also claimed the attorney general concurred.

"However", said Howe, "if I were to be disqualified for delegate because of my job, I would resign as county manager. This is because of my sincere interest in the convention and my deep conviction that I have something to contribute to it."

Celli and Howe shook hands, thus apparently removing Howe's eligibility as a campaign issue.

The forum lasted two hours as promised and turned out to be a spirited, sometimes heated debate with no holds barred. There were angry outbursts from the nine candidates on the debating platform and the audience also got excited at times. Yet despite the divergence of views, Moderator Gordon Skinner kept the meeting under control. Personal attacks and serious accusations enlivened the discussions with three or four of the speakers on their feet at the same time on several occasions, but time limits were honored and all participants agreed it was a fair debate.

Party lines were crossed by some speakers, Democrat against Democrat and Republican against Republican; also a Liberal and a Conservative surprisingly agree-

ing with major party opponents on some matters.

Questions from the floor brought direct answers from the panelists on a large number of subjects and brought out their views on many of the major issues of the campaign.

One question which got an emphatic "yes" from nearly everyone of the nine candidates came from a lady in the audience who wanted to know if any of them thought State Education Commissioner Allen had overstepped the bounds of his office in the matter of school integration.

It was generally agreed that similar forums should be held in years to come and that something should be done to encourage greater public participation.

15th GOP Banquet

The 15th Ward Republican organization's annual dinner-dance held at Doud Post on Oct. 22, was described as a "Great Success" by Dominick DeGuarde, Ward leader. He attributed its success to time spent by the men's and women's Republican organization and to the excellent turnout of the 15th Ward residents.

Among those who attended were County Manager Gordon A. Howe, Sheriff Al Skinner, Republican County Chairman Vincent Tofany and the candidates competing for either county-wide or city-wide positions in this year's coming elections.

We Must Have A Full Time Legislature
After serving two terms in the Assembly, I believe we must have a full time Legislature. Full time, in my opinion, would be a session which would last a minimum of 8 to 9 months a year. The work of government is so great and complex that we must devote more and more time to the needs of the people.

This year, although the session went into July, I still felt much legislation was rushed through without adequate time for debate and research. Moreover, with the Constitutional Convention taking place next year, I believe many responsible Legislators will want to attend some of the hearings and contribute testimony in areas in which he may possess particular knowledge or interest.

The public has become aware that our State Government cannot be run as it was at the turn of the century. Not only must more time be allocated, but we must endeavor to get Legislators from all walks of life. I want to compliment the many firms and institutions which are willing to give leaves of absence, without pay, to allow their employees to serve in government. This is extremely important. We certainly do not want our Legislature to be made up only of the wealthy or people whose work lends itself to intermittent absence.

It will always be necessary to set up a calendar or timeschedule to complete Legislation. No matter how long we remain in Albany, each session will leave some major problems still unsolved, but we must never again meet for a few months a year--

It takes art to help children be creative.

You can awe a small audience by teaching them tricks with paints and crayons.

"Ghost" drawings will amuse them. You draw a picture in white crayon on white paper. Brush watercolor lightly over it and the drawing appears. The children will want to try.

Paints at the creative art racks of variety stores can be used in many new ways. Ever blow paint with a straw? On white paper a child can make small pools of tempera paints in various colors. Then he blows through a soda straw and the colors flow in all directions. He has an abstract to frame.

Fingerpaints come in tubes now, another new idea. Ideally, fingerpainting is done on big sheets of glossy paper. If you have none, a roll of glazed white shelf paper will do. The child squeezes out colors and makes designs with his fingers and hands. The paint washes off. In fair weather the patio or picnic table is ideal. On rainy days, the basement spread with newspapers gives room to work. Finished drawings can be clipped to a clothesline to dry.

"Cleaning up teaches responsibility," reminds a new book on *Creative Painting* for youngsters from Whitman Publishing Company of Racine, Wis., leading makers of juvenile art supplies. Parents can help, the book points out, by providing a cardboard workbook for supplies.

A starter's book, a somewhat more advanced one, and books on paper art and print art are lavishly illustrated with photographs. Even a child who skims gets a graphic idea of how to use and tend his materials.

Any neighborhood could soon set up an art show. Even if the paintings sell for nickels and dimes, the dabbler likes to see his work displayed. A juvenile talent show can brighten life.

Northwest area, Joseph Ferrari beating John Scibilia in the 26th district and Robert Neilon winning over Louis Christopher in the 29th. George Stockmeister (D) won a close one from Joseph Esposito (R) in the 27th. Romano, as noted, is apparently ahead by three votes in the 28th, with absentee and military votes to be counted.

Governor Rockefeller may have won re-election, but he lost here in

five of the six local wards, only the Tenth giving him a plurality and that by about 14 votes out of 3400. Attorney-General Lefkowitz did a little better winning the Ninth and Tenth and losing the 20th Ward narrowly. Democrat Comptroller Levitt ran ahead of the state ticket winning in all six wards.

Family Court Judge Joseph Fritsch lost only one ward here, the 15th and was runner-up to Surrogate Michael Rogers for biggest plurality in the county. Rogers won all six local wards.

Powers, Strong Here

James Powers, who was elected state senator in the 51st district, got his entire plurality and about 100 votes to spare in the six Northwest wards. The Democratic assemblyman who will now serve in the upper chamber at Albany campaigned strongly in this area and attributed some of his success to a "Report From Albany" column run in weekly newspapers including the Vicinity Post and Tenth Ward Courier. He defeated Kenneth Barclay unofficially by 2769 votes and had a plurality here of 2829.

Congressman Barber Conable who won re-election handily, carried all local wards. District Attorney John Little, re-elected, carried the Ninth and Tenth and lost the First, 15th, 20th and 24th County Court Judge Harry Rosenthal, also re-elected, won all six wards.

Frank Carroll (R) won the 15th in the run for Assemblyman, 133rd district, capturing the 20th, but losing the 15th and 24th.

Edward Provenzano (R), Ninth Warder, made a success of his first try for public office by capturing one of the two City Court Judge posts, along with Democrat Arthur Curran. Provenzano did well in every one of the Northwest wards and accomplished the difficult feat of winning in a city election, something which Republicans had not been doing too easily in recent years.

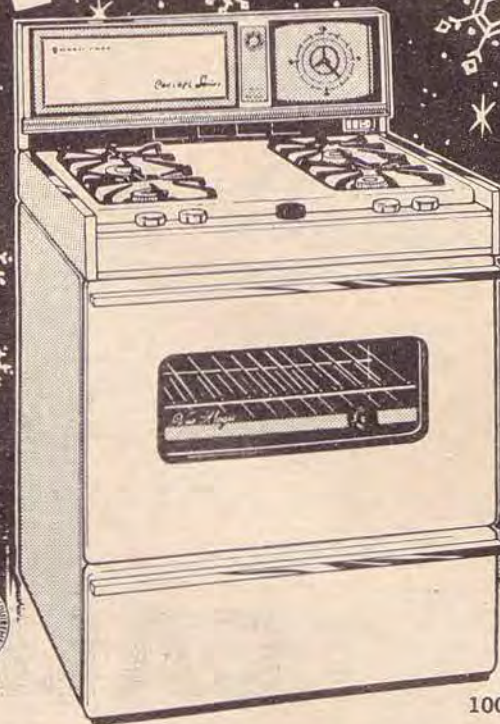

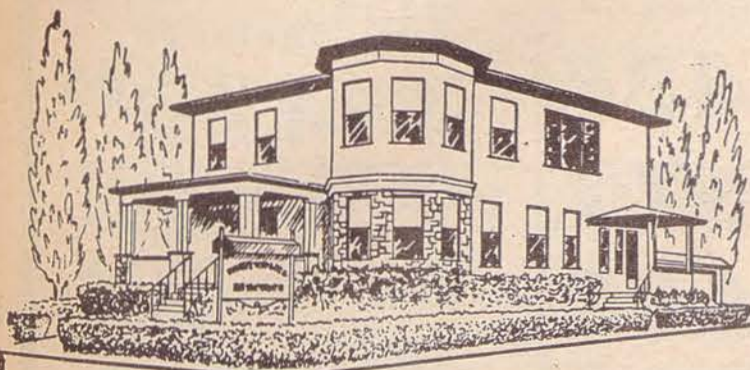

Romano, Stockmeister Win Cliff-Hangers

Official results, announced ten days after Election Day when the Board of Elections completed its check of the voting machines, confirmed the victories of Charles F. Stockmeister and John Romano in the cliff-hanger contests for 134th Assemblyman and 28th District County Legislator respectively.

A premature announcement on Nov. 14 in which William M. Steinfeldt allegedly had conceded to Stockmeister, it develops, was not based on fact since the vote count, as reported in the Post-Courier of Nov. 16, had not been completed and no one, including Stockmeister himself, was certain of the final outcome. The "concession", which appeared in a local daily on Nov. 14, was obtained by a ruse, according to Steinfeldt.

"I was out of town", he said "and had left a statement with my wife to be given out when the official count was completed. A reporter convinced Mrs. Steinfeldt that she should read him the statement over the telephone and apparently gave her the impression that it would not be used at that time."

Stockmeister won the city wards by three votes and the town of Greece by 103, for a plurality of 106. He claims that appearance of his name in two places on the voting machine, for assemblyman and for constitutional convention delegate, confused people, accounting for his poor showing in the assembly race.

Romano's surprise victory over Supervisor Raymond Margrett in the 28th County Legislative District was by the narrow margin of five votes, according to the official count. Margrett has been supervisor of the First Ward for two terms and Romano is now completing his first term as constable of the Ninth Ward. Romano lives in Lakeview Terr. and owns the Rochester Tire Mart in Broad St.

"Conform Or Else" Edict To Smith-Oak Junkyard

The lease for the controversial junkyard at Smith and Oak Sts., which expires today, will be on a month-to-month basis until conditions specified by four neighborhood associations have been met. City Manager Seymour Scher, in answer to questions asked by Councilman Stephen May, has given these assurances:

1. The city manager agrees to the conditions laid down by the neighborhood associations (listed below).

2. The city will continue the Atkins lease on a month-to-month basis until terms of a new lease are worked out.

3. The city administration will consult with the neighborhood groups before the new lease is submitted to the City Council.

4. Scher will consider granting short term leases.

Four organizations have banded together to demand action to "clean up objectionable conditions about which the general neighborhood has been alarmed for years". The groups are UNITE, represented by Louis Romano; FRIEND represented by Frank Scarfone; Edgerton Association, represented by Frank Battaglino; and Maplewood Association, represented by John Saxe.

The action demanded is as follows:

Complete cleanup to comply with city codes; re-inforced sidewalks and driveways; high masonry wall around entire junkyard; cessation of burning; no renewal of lease until these proposals are fully satisfied.

"I am encouraged by the attitude of the City Manager", says Councilman May, "and his willingness to cooperate with the neighborhood groups. He promised that the problems caused by the Atkins junkyard will be alleviated. This would be a tribute to the neighborhood associations for their perseverance and uniting to make constructive proposals to improve conditions in the area".

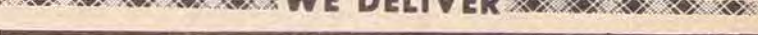

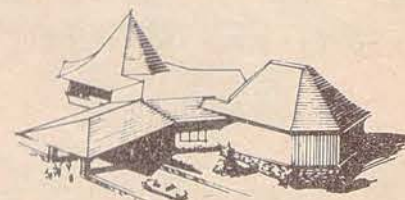

In the past, a customer received a post card containing his cost of service. The new procedure is for the bill to be enclosed in an envelope. A return envelope will also accompany the bill.

To keep customers informed on RG&E services and operations, new appliances and other uses of electricity and gas, a folder called "RG&E News Notes" will be sent along as well. Approximately 240,000 bills are mailed to RG&E customers every month.

Catholics To Install Bishop Sheen Here

Sacred Heart Cathedral, here in the old Tenth Ward on Flower City Park, will be scene next Wednesday of one of the most sacred of all Catholic church spectacles, the installation of a bishop. In this case it will have special significance, since a man of worldwide renown, Bishop Fulton J. Sheen, will be taking on the role of Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester and the ceremony will draw nationwide and possibly worldwide attention.

Bishop Sheen has requested that "everything be kept as simple as possible", but it will be an exciting experience for local people even though of necessity they will have to content themselves with sidewalk vantage points. In the evening, however, a public reception at the War Memorial will give thousands an opportunity to greet the bishop.

Invitations have been sent to about 150 bishops throughout the country and many are expected to attend. Diocesan officials from throughout the state, priests of the diocese, representatives of other faiths and public dignitaries will undoubtedly fill the Cathedral sanctuary to its capacity of 1,000.

To avoid congestion near the church, preparations have been made to transport by bus 400 priests from Aquinas Stadium where they will park their cars. Bishops and other dignitaries will have cars driven by priests and will put on their vestments in the parish hall in the rectory basement. Priests will use the parish school for donning their vestments. Numerous newsmen and other media representatives are coming from out of town and there will be a room at the Cathedral especially for them. (Father Richard Tormey a former Tenth Warder, will do the local TV commentary.)

Both WHEC-TV and Channel 13 will broadcast the event, from in front of the church and from strategic points inside the sanctuary. Two cameras will be placed at pillars a few feet from the altar and a third will record the scene from the rear of the church.

Politics Ruled Out Of Junkyard Case By Protesting Neighborhood Groups

Although pleased with the prospect of favorable action by the city in the Oak St. and Smith St. junkyard matter, the four neighborhood associations pressing for a clean-up this week expressed fear of political overtones. The coordinator of the UNITE-FRIEND-EDGERTON-MAPLEWOOD associations, Jack Quinn, has written a letter to this newspaper to emphasize that "our struggle is not politically based".

Text of the Quinn letter, addressed to the editor of The Vicinity Post, is as follows:

"I am writing in behalf of the UNITE, FRIEND, EDGERTON, and MAPLEWOOD organizations concerning the article on Atkin's Junkyard in the Nov. 30 edition of the Vicinity Post.

"We regret the fact that one of the city councilmen obtained untimely publicity in our campaign to have Mr. Atkin's lease renewed based on our five proposals.

"Our organizations would like to have the record corrected that our struggle is not politically based. No city councilman is mediating our cause.

"Our associations have personally contacted the nine city councilmen as well as other public officials concerning our proposals. We will give due credit publicly to those elected officials who back our cause.

"Any similar publicity by officials before the case is resolved will be considered in poor taste and will only hamper the honest efforts of the citizens in this area."

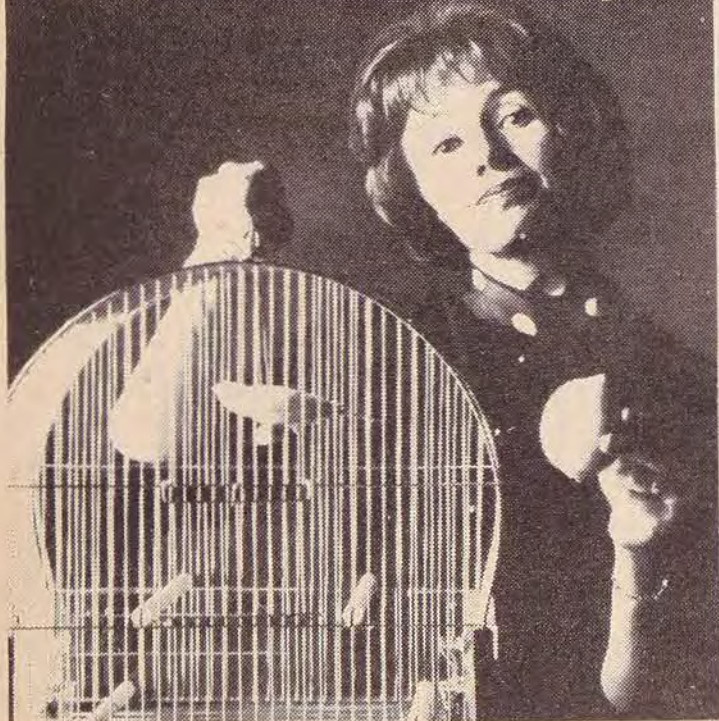

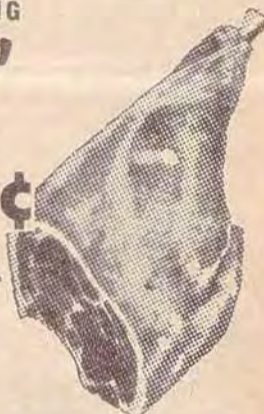

Entertainment is to be provided by the Joyce Winters School of Dance. After the entertainment, refreshments will be served by the hospitality committee.

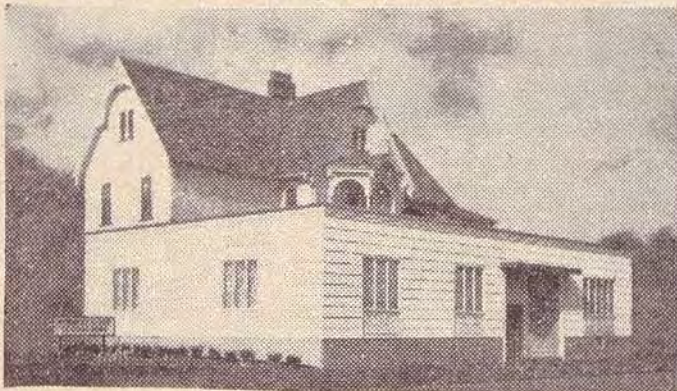

Tax Relief For Working Mothers?

A good deal of debate has taken place on the question should the State and Federal governments allow a tax deduction for the care of children while the mother is working.

We know, in today's world that many working mothers work not out of choice, but of necessity. The high cost of college education for their children often makes two salaries an absolute must. Moreover, in an endeavor to provide a nest egg for a home, business investment or other goals, a single salary will not suffice. It should also be noted that as a result of divorce, death, or physical impairment of a husband, a wife has no choice but to enter the business world. When no children are involved, she, of course, needs no special consideration. But when she must work and take care of children, is a tax deduction for the expense not reasonable? In other words, is not the cost of child care as much a business expense for her as the cost of power tools to the building contractor?

Groups who oppose such deduction state that it would encourage women to leave their primary obligation of raising their own children and since the majority of families exist on the income of one supporter it would be unfair to give additional aid to those families who already have a higher combined income.

This group also feels that if a woman elects to enter a "man's working world", she should not receive special consideration.

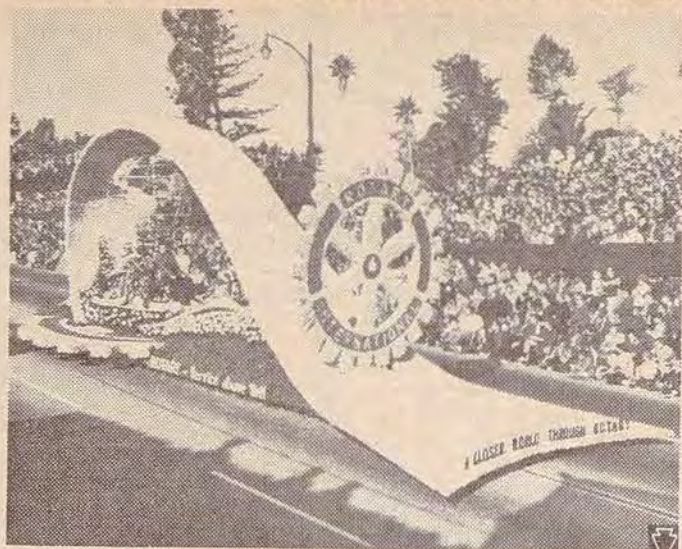

Christmas Greetings Going Overseas To Soldiers, Courtesy Of Y.M.C.A.

American men and women in uniform, particularly our fighting forces in Vietnam, will hear the "world's biggest Christmas greet-

ing" aimed at them on Dec. 25.

The greeting will come from the YMCA of Rochester and Monroe County and 1800 other YMCA's and their five million members of the United States, according to Henry G. Ellis, the Y's General Secretary here. Cooperating to send the greeting will be the country's radio and television broadcasting industry.

Named the "Operation Merry Christmas", the YMCA is furnishing all radio stations and TV channels in Rochester a special recording of the Christmas message to our fighting forces, Ellis said. The record is going to every radio and television station in the U. S. as well as to the Armed Forces network and the Voice of America, he added.

The record features special arrangements of "We Wish You A Merry Christmas" and "Silent Night", together with a greeting by George E. Gullen, Jr. of Detroit, president of the YMCA National Council.

Although the greeting is being beamed at all American servicemen wherever they may be stationed, our forces in Vietnam will come in for a special share, Ellis said.

He also pointed out the tradition of YMCA service to our fighting forces dates back to the Civil War, when it was the first civilian organization to work with troops. A forerunner of the present-day mobile canteen was the YMCA "Coffee Wagon", a huge iron vehicle that was trundled right up to the lines in the Civil War. Coffee, hot chocolate and tea, solace, help with letter writing and religious tracts were passed out to the men.

The YMCA was one of the founders of the USO in World War II and Y executives still staff some USO's including those in Vietnam. Y canteens were familiar to American doughboys in World War I. The YMCA still maintains Armed Services Y centers in the U. S. and at military posts overseas.

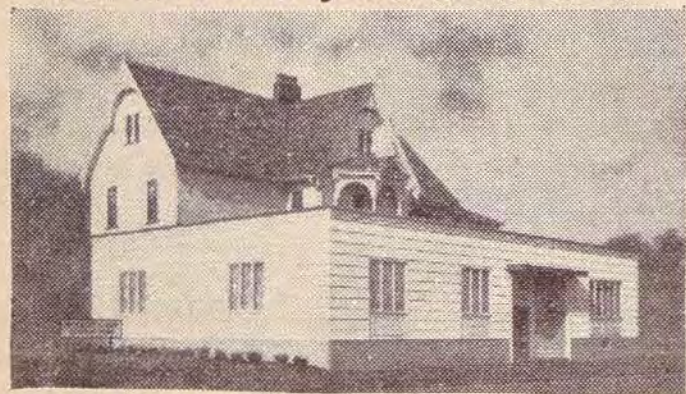

IF YOUR SON NEEDS "ROUNDING OUT"

(This is one of a series of articles written for our readers by executives and other staff employees of Community Chest Red Feather agencies and offering counsel in specialized family living, health, child care, and youth service fields. They are presented as a public service, and in appreciation of generous Community Chest support, over many years, by the people of this community.)

We Americans are younger than we used to be; one-third of our nation's population is under 15. In Monroe County there are about 58,000 boys 8 to 16 years old. The majority of them, 35,700 of them, live in the towns and villages outside of Rochester. Possibly this number includes one or more of your own sons.

By and large, our sons go to better schools than their parents did. Modern medicine has conquered many of the diseases that used to threaten us. They're probably better nourished than we were.

But Johnny -- and his parents -- may still have some problems. Johnny's general health may be good, but sometimes his parents shield him too much from fatigue and effort and inclement weather. He may think he is less rugged than he really is, may actually be less durable than he could and should be.

He may be unsure of his abilities and his capacities. He may be dubious about his leadership gifts. He may be unaware of the merits of teamwork. He may be too fearful or too aggressive, or not aggressive enough. Antagonistic, perhaps, toward parents, teachers, adults generally.

Now, these lacks will not necessarily make him a failure as a boy or man. But they may, to some degree, hold him back, delay the attainment of maturity, keep him from going as far as he should go and could go. And they may confuse and baffle and anger parents, who often just don't know what to do about them.

I have a suggestion. . . TRY A THOROUGH APPLICATION OF SCOUTING.

Scouting is a tested, established program for boys beginning at age 8 (and sometimes continuing for a lifetime.) It is designed to fill an important part of his free time with interesting activities that toughen muscles; teach teamwork, co-operation, consideration for others. Scouting teaches leadership, initiative, good citizenship, reverence; and he shares in the teaching process. He is offered a wide choice of activities that provide him with special skills and special wholesome interests.

Naturally, Scouting does its best job, and succeeds best, when the parent provides interest, encouragement, and when needed, participation.

Scouting, of course, doesn't take the task of rearing a boy out of the hands of his parents, the teaching of a boy away from the school, the moral training away from the church. Rather, it is deliberately planned to be an ally of and supplement to the home, the school, and the church. It is not, and cannot be, a substitute for any of the three.

It helps the three in the boy's "rounding out" process, and shows him that how far he can go is a lot farther than he thought.
