No. 7 School March-Over Scheduled Tomorrow

Tomorrow will be the last day in the old school at No. 7. The boys and girls will pick up their books and follow their teachers, parents and a long line of invited guests into the smart new building which the city has built next to the old one.

The "march-over" is scheduled for 2 p.m. and ceremonies suitable to the occasion will take about 45 minutes. Then school will be dismissed until after the Easter recess and the children will go home. The invited guests will be received after the ceremonies in the multi-purpose room on the second floor of the new school, now to be known as the Virgil I. Grissom School, after the famed astronaut.

Superintendent of Schools Herman Goldberg will lead the procession followed by members of the Board of Education, past principals, Mrs. Ray Savage (wife of an early principal), one room mother for each class (representing symbolically all parents), Mayor Frank Lamb, Councilman Urban Kress, former School Superin-

tendents James Spinning and James Wishart, about a dozen department heads in the school system and representatives of the TV and news media.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance and singing of the Star Spangled Banner, Ben Richardson, No. 7 Principal, will welcome and introduce the guests. Superintendent Goldberg is scheduled to make the principal address. Then will follow the school song; lowering of the flag to the accompaniment of a drum roll by present and former members of No. 7 School Orchestra; procession to the new school; flag raising by the standard bearer and guardian of the flag, salute to the flag and call to the colors played by No. 7 pupils; and finally entrance into the new school.

School Named For "Gus" Grissom

Lieut. Col. Virgil I. (Gus) Grissom for whom the new No. 7 School is being named, was one of three astronauts burned to death in their space capsule on Jan. 27, 1967, a tragedy which ended their attempts to begin the final series of flights which would place a man on the moon.

His wife Betty and two sons, Scott and Mark, survive him. They or some member of the family close to Col. Grissom are expected to be in Rochester next September when No. 7 is formally dedicated and it is hoped will take part in the ceremony.

The colonel had 3000 hours of flying time to his credit, including 100 missions in the Korean conflict. He was a test pilot and had at least one narrow escape when his airplane crashed and burned. He was not injured in that mishap.

He was the second man sent into space in a Redstone powered Mercury capsule in July 1961 and at the splashdown nearly lost his life. This suborbital mission paved the way for future outer space

flights. In April 1965 he became the first man to enter outer space for the second time. With John Young he piloted a "Titan" powered Gemini spacecraft three times around the earth at an altitude of 139 miles, changing orbit three times and proving the potential of maneuverability, an essential feature in man's quest to reach the moon.

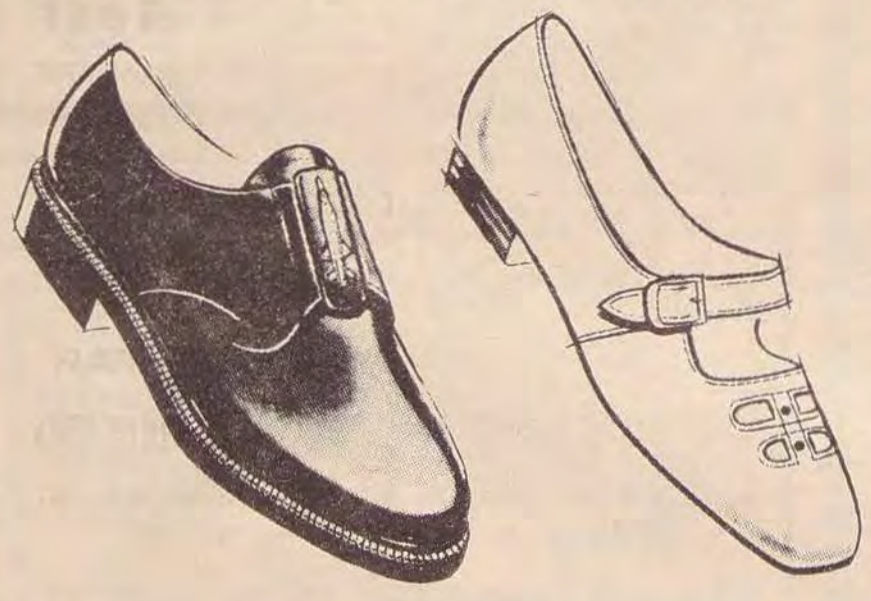

TIPS from the LAB

By Dr. Herbert R. Ulrich, Director Monroe County Health Department Laboratories

With Spring just around the corner, we offer this suggestion to homeowners: When putting in plants, attach metal or wooden tags telling the botanical names.

The reason? Because there have been many instances of actual or suspected plant poisonings where identification was unduly delayed.

Invariably in such cases, a small child consumed a berry or a leaf of a plant, and parents were so distraught they were unable to describe or identify the plant. The result was a loss of precious time.

With the botanical name attached to a plant, identifications and determination of its toxicity can be readily made.

Councilman Stephen May has urged student leaders to dissent, protest, demonstrate and generally get involved in public issues about which they have "a special competence to advise adults", such as the 18-year old vote, minimum drinking age, the draft and school policies. But May warned about the dangers of "senseless cavorting for causes" and advocated thought, research and constructive effort by young people on appropriate problems.

Addressing a Youth Convention sponsored by the Teen-Agers League for Responsible Citizenship at Eastridge High School, the Councilman also urged his audience to study the success of student power in the recent New Hampshire pri-

aries and to be actively involved in politics. The success of young people in New Hampshire, he said, "has rekindled their faith in democratic machinery and the efficiency of the ballot" and may "channel their energies into constructive political effort, rather than letting them explode in street and campus demonstrations".

In a free society such as ours, he said, the right of dissent and protest is indisputable and inseparable from our vitality and well-being. But true involvement and genuine desire to evolve solutions require far more than carrying a placard or participating in a demonstration.

**Celli Calls For
Income Levy**

Rochester has reached the point of no return in its fiscal crisis and a decision must be made now, Councilman Andrew G. Celli told 19th Ward Democrats in a speech last week.

Pointing out that the city "serves as a source of revenue, income, pleasure, education and culture to some 350,000 residents of the towns surrounding the city", Celli came out for a levy on all non-residents of the city who derive their income within the city limits.

"It is only equitable", said Celli "that those people who are demanding that tax exempt housing be built within the city limits; that those people who demand continued snow removal from city roadways; that those people who demand increased police and fire protection within the city; that those people who demand adequate lighting and traffic control facilities in the city, be made to pay their equitable share of the costs of maintaining the same.

"This action should be taken by an immediate resolution to come from the County legislature. A resolution should be passed for legislation to be introduced in the State legislature which will allow the implementation of such a tax in this community.

"Any attempt to do away with any of the services presently being supplied to the residents of this city would in my opinion, be detrimental to the health, welfare and safety of this community. As a matter of practicality, any attempt to pare the budget by the reduction of service would reduce this city to second class status in comparison to cities of comparable size in the nation today."

The Old and The New

"Whether the United States should be in Vietnam and how the war should be ended" will be the subject of a discussion on Sunday, April 28, in Wesley Methodist Church parlor. All interested youth and adults are invited to an open Teach-In for information and discussion about American involvement in Vietnam (from 5 to 7 p.m.). Four men will speak on the subject for about 15 minutes each, then there will be time for questions from the audience.

Coffee and dessert will finish off the Teach-In.

The four speakers are Dr. David John, M.D., an authority on the history of Vietnam and a member of Voters for Peace, Rochester; Edwin Gordon, member of Corn Hill Methodist Church who has spent some time in Vietnam, and supporter of the Johnson policy in Vietnam; Father Joseph O'Rourke, teacher at McQuaid High School, who will give the moral implications of American involvement in Vietnam; and Jay M. Friedman, lawyer, who in 1966 spent three months in Vietnam working as a consultant to the State Department.

The Social Concerns Commission hopes through the Teach-In to provide a better understanding on Vietnam. Literature from the United States government and Voters for Peace will be available before the meeting and also on Apr. 28. Babysitters will be provided for children at no charge.

GOP Card Party Expects Sellout

Republicans of the 24th Ward are expecting a sellout attendance next Wednesday, Apr. 24, for their annual card party. It will be held at the Avery Hall in Lyell Ave.

It will be an evening of fun, but with the political pot boiling due to a Presidential year, many prominent Republicans outside the ward are expected to put in an appearance.

James LeCesse is chairman; Emma Cervini, co-chairman; and ward leader Michael Andolina heads the reception committee.

School Closing Is Protested

It has been a sad Easter for many of the parishioners of Most Precious Blood Church. A group of them have been meeting almost continuously and they have taken part in at least four protest marches against the proposed closing of their elementary school in June; and they have bought large ads in the dailies to state their case.

The superintendent of Catholic Schools, Msgr. William M. Roche, as spokesman for diocesan school authorities, has stated that the school is sub-standard; that doubling up two grades in one classroom is out of step with modern education methods. If the school closes, Most Precious Blood pupils will be attending either Holy Apostles or St. Anthony's next fall. (About 100 of the pupils are reported as living in the area between Emerson and Otis Sts.)

Father Sebastian Contegiacomo, backed by his school board under the leadership of Richard Triano, is against the closing. The school is self-supporting, serves a definite need and is able to continue its teaching mission indefinitely if the Catholic school system will only continue to make nuns available for the faculty, he states.

Most Precious Blood Church is aptly named, according to its supporters. As one man stated, "It was built with pennies, nickels and dimes and largely with the blood"

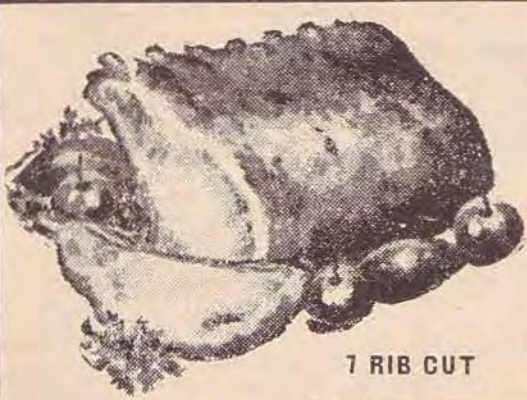

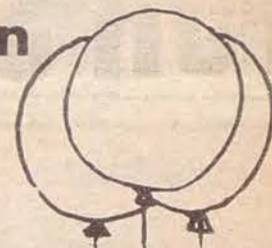

Old No. 7 School Passes With Pomp & Ceremony

Old No. 7 School, opened in 1902 practically in the middle of an apple orchard, closed its doors last Thursday and the new school which replaces it on adjacent land was unveiled to the public for the first time. It was a nostalgic occasion in some respects, but few old timers were there and most of the emphasis was on a march-over to the new and modern edifice.

Principal Ben Richardson sketched the history of No. 7 to a large assembly of school children, city and school officials and a few invited guests on the lawn in front of the old school on Pierpont St. He pointed out that No. 7 dates back to 1842; that it was located on Lake Ave. near the Big Hollow and was known as the Glenwood School at that time. They had a march-over in 1902, said Richardson. Five of the pupils who made the 1902 march-over have been located and two of them, Eleanor Fonda and Mrs. Clela Humphrey, were present Thursday. Elwood and Herbert Schulz and Mrs. Henry Dieffenderfer were the others. Marjorie Miller who had graduated from Glenwood School No. 7 was among those present.

Superintendent of Schools Herman Goldberg, who spoke briefly, was high in his praise of the new school. It is one of four new schools that will be opening in Rochester by next September, he said. He also took occasion to assure the teachers present that the new salary scale will move them from "third from the bottom to the top of the list of public employees where they belong".

The Parents Teachers Association of No. 7 is planning open house at the school next Wednesday Apr. 24. The public is invited and will be taken on a tour of the building with PTA guides.

Authority Seeking Housing Units For Low Income Family Subsidy

The Rochester Housing Authority is seeking standard housing units which could be leased by the Authority for the purpose of making such units available to low-income families by use of available rent subsidies. This program allows the RHA to pay the difference between the property owners rent and the maximum rent a low-income family can afford. Anyone interested in leasing property to the Authority should contact the Rochester Housing Authority, 57 City Hall, 30 Broad Street West, or phone 546-2060.

The Authority will consider any housing type including single-family houses, duplex units, or an apartment in a multi-family structure. The units may be older standard housing, rehabilitated units or new construction.

Lease agreements can be written for a period of one (1) year to five (5) years with a renewal option. The Lease Agreement with the Authority guarantees the monthly rental to the owner for the period of the Lease and the Authority assumes responsibility for the Tenant occupant.

Funds are immediately available for this purpose under the following conditions:

1. The property must be located within the City of Rochester.
2. The dwelling structure must meet minimum standards of space and facilities; be in compliance with building codes and ordinances;

and be in a standard residential environment.

3. The monthly rental required by the owner must be within the limits of fair market rental value.

This leasing program includes consideration of an existing Tenant (within Public Housing income limits) in standard housing who cannot afford the established rental and might otherwise be forced to move.

The Authority reserves the right to reject any and all rental units offered.

"Now when we talk of redevelopment", said Celli, "we're talking exactly the language that interests the City government. That's why we want you to become involved."

"I think this is the right way, the democratic way, to accomplish what all of us really want, and that's a better Brown Square neighborhood, an end to blighting influences, improved housing, better public facilities and, in short, a North-west area we can all be proud of. "It isn't going to be an easy task. It isn't going to occur overnight. But I promise you that I will do all in my power to work with you and our City officials to make your dreams and the dreams of the City Administration become a reality".

Protests Continue On School Closing

The protest marches go on and the school board of Most Precious Blood parish still has hope of reversing the closing order, Msgr. William M. Roche, superintendent of parochial schools, will be back from a Pacific coast school conference and has promised to meet with the protesters on May 8.

In the meantime, every morning up to next Wednesday, mothers of the school children are being bused to Chestnut St. to march with their banners in front of the KofC Building office of the bishop. 

The so-called schools, six sessions in each, are to meet as follows: Sunday evenings, Dewey-Presbyterian; Tuesday evenings, Sacred Heart; Thursday evenings, Holy Apostles. All classes begin at 8.

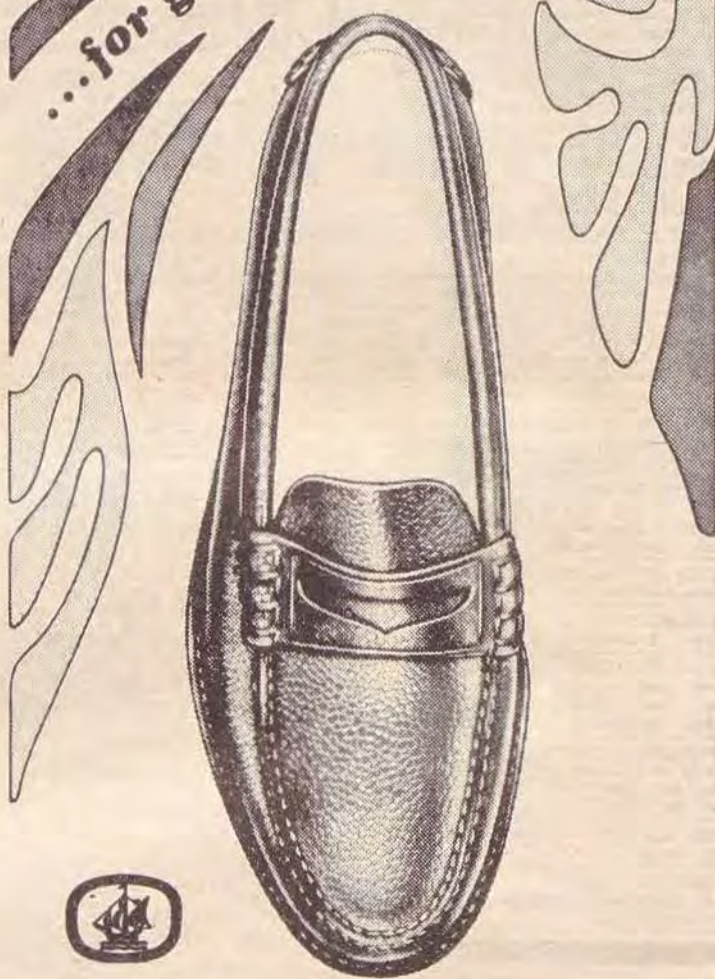

Speaking before a meeting of the Rochester Regional Hospital Auxiliaries at the Dresden Hotel in Penn Yan, I proposed that professional group practice might be successfully employed to help alleviate the critical shortage of doctors and nurses and the high medical costs which are currently posing grave problems not only for

New York State, but for the entire nation. A Group Practice Act allowing physicians and related health team members to incorporate has many advantages, such as providing the necessary inducement for doctors to join with their colleagues in the team approach to meeting today's ever growing medical needs.

Five methods, which I feel would be particularly effective in meeting our immediate medical needs are:

1. Efficient use of our active personnel.
2. Expand training of present physicians, nurses and paramedical specialists.
3. Promote and encourage medical personnel to advance as far as their abilities allow.
4. Provide programs to reactivate inactive members of the health team - this is especially true of nurses.
5. The development of physicians assistants such as that being sponsored by Duke University Medical Center. These assistants develop special techniques such as kidney dialysis, use of hyperbaric equipment and intensive care procedures.

In substance then the field of medicine will become more specialized. More and more paramedical aides will be involved in activities which are now largely under the jurisdiction of the M.D. The general practitioner and the local independent doctor will largely give way to the health team and the medical facility concept. All of these trends will result in better health care for the individual and better utilization of the physician's time, and an increase of personnel in the health care field.

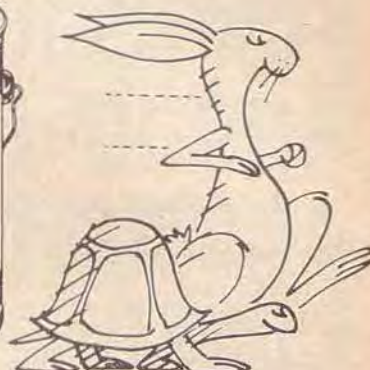

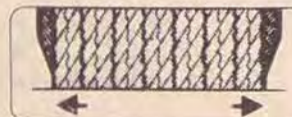

Some 60 to 70 huge truckloads of debris was piled at the curbs and hauled away to the city incinerators and dumps. Both householders and DPW crews won high praise from the Maplewood Neighborhood Association, sponsor of the Clean-up, Toss-out Drive.

Twenty city trucks were in service all day, two of them working as late as 7 p.m. Two streets, reportedly, gave up four truck loads. Many residents had their trash at the curb Friday night as requested and most had it out Saturday before the trucks came through. Some, however, did their tossing out after the trucks had passed. On Monday morning, an extra pickup was ordered and most of the area was cleaned up.

Cooperative Effort
The city DPW extra pickup on Saturdays is a specially budgeted item and is well organized, even to the extent of radio communication between the crews and supervisors. Members of the Maplewood Association, led by President John Saxe, cooperated and were on the streets all day Saturday.

The association's poster and the Tenth Ward Courier and Vicinity Post were credited with most of the success of arousing the public and getting cooperation. Mayor Frank Lamb presented prizes to the poster contest winners in a ceremony seen over TV. Steven and Mary Roberts, 134 Alameda St., co-winners, and Mary Rayome, 607 Magee Ave., won \$5 each. Honorable mention went to Anita Palskis, Christian Redman, Catherine Marsh, Donald Martone, Terrance Jones, Mary Forman, Margaret Bishop, Ann Marie Howard, and Anne Fritsch.

Lamb Candidacy Draws Criticism

The ambitious plans of Mayor Frank Lamb to become a state legislator in addition to holding his roles as city councilman and mayor will involve several thousand voters in the Northwest area. The 133rd Assembly district, to which he aspires, includes parts of several local wards.

The Mayor's bold decision to make the run for Assembly, as well as hold his city posts, has raised a storm of criticism from Republicans and the news media. Some Democrats are also rumored to be opposed to the idea.

Assemblyman Frank Carroll, Republican and Conservative candidate, against whom Lamb will be running, attacked the Mayor in no uncertain terms for his plan to "wear three hats".

"I am shocked by my opponent's opening statement of his candidacy", said Carroll. "After demanding of his fellow councilmen a raise to \$15,000 plus expenses because of the back-breaking demands of his office, he now states publicly that he is only a part time city employee. He says in the same breath that the office of state assemblyman is a part time job, one that he could handle along with his part time duties as mayor. This statement clearly shows that he does not understand the nature of the job he is seeking, but also that he misled the public in seeking a substantial raise as mayor".

Carroll says he will continue to devote full time to the job, if elected.

Councilman Robert F. Wood, has sent a blistering letter to

Policeman Wins Bravery Award

An Award of Merit for alerting nine people and possibly saving their lives has been awarded to police officer Mario Parente of Emerson St. The award was presented last Friday at a dinner dance given by the Rochester Fire Fighters Association at Mapledale Party House.

The citation, given by the firemen's local, states that Parente noticed smoke coming from the second floor at 74 Adams St. while making a trouble call next door at 2:45 in the morning of June 25, 1967. "He immediately notified the Police dispatcher", the citation continues, "and proceeded to the scene of the fire".

He roused nine people and went searching for another person reportedly still on the second floor.

"Without personal regard", says the citation, "he re-entered the building, which was now fully charged with smoke, and proceeded to search room by room, in some cases having to break down the doors to the rooms. Upon reaching the room where the fire originated Officer Parente was driven back by the flame and smoke. Had he been able to enter this room his own person would have been in jeopardy because Fire Fighters later found the floor had been burned through".

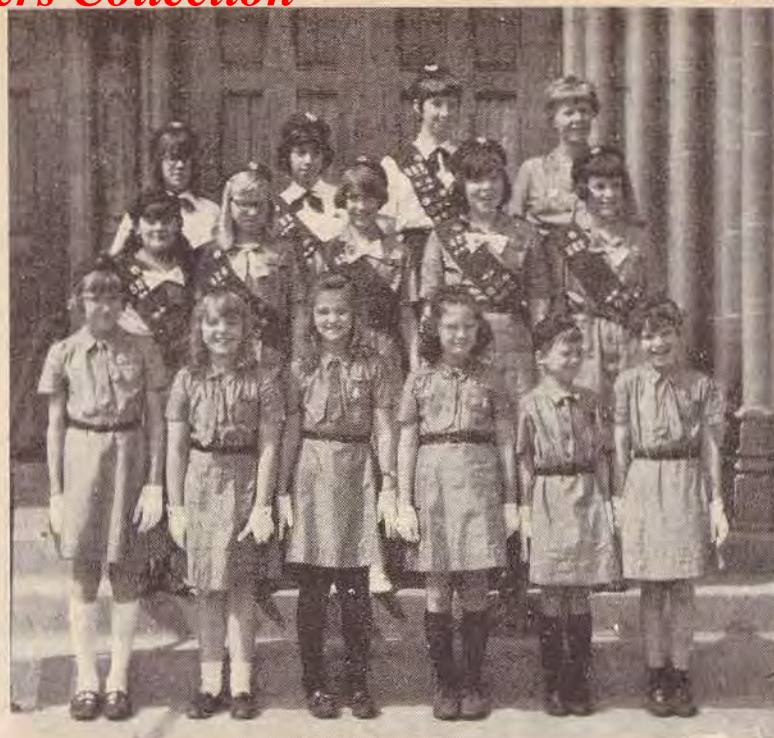

Problems Plague Maplewood Ave.

The city's experiment slowing down and controlling traffic on Maplewood Ave. has many side effects.

It has dead-ended Maplewood Ave. and made the area between Rose St. and the Municipal Rose Gardens a private thoroughfare and potential playground.

It has resulted in a new turn-around pattern for buses feeding Nazareth Academy. They now go up Rose St. to Maplewood to Seneca Parkway and back to Lake Ave.

It has created a problem for Hawk-Eye workers and for others coming south on Lake Ave, who must turn left to cross on the Driving Park bridge. Presently left hand turns are prohibited there during the rush hours.

Residents of Maplewood near the barrier (called a cul-de-sac or turn-around) must back track through Rose St. to get to the bridge or to head uptown.

If the road block is made permanent, the wide circular area on the north end of Maplewood Ave. could be marked off and used as a parking lot for the Rose Garden.

Traffic engineers are studying the situation and are not as yet committed to a permanent solution. They may try the experiment of another signal phase, for left hand turns at Lake and Driving Park, but this would tend to slow Lake Ave, traffic which would be undesirable in their opinion and undoubtedly would evoke protests from motorists who have long been unhappy with the slow pace on Lake Ave. at certain times.

Civil Rights "Classes" To Start Next Week

A program sponsored by the Northwest Clergy Association and the Northwest Interfaith Lay Committee which aim to rally public support for the Civil Rights program was announced this week. Classes are being formed at three neighborhood churches and those interested are invited to take part.

Rev. Philip J. Billotte, assistant pastor at Sacred Heart, who is coordinating chairman in the Northwest area, issued this statement on the purpose:

"In our Northwest area, as well as other areas throughout our

nation, there is an urgent need for every man to take a close look at his attitudes and views concerning the grave problem of Racism. God has been speaking loud and clear, but for some reason His followers have not been listening."

Under the heading of "An Emergency Educational Program" (attested to by an ad paid for by supporters on Page 3 of this newspaper), three six week courses are starting next week; at Dewey Ave. Presbyterian Church on Sunday nights; at Sacred Heart on Tuesday nights; and at Holy Apostles School Hall on Thursday nights. Classes start at 8 p.m. on May 14, 16 and 19 respectively.

Teachers will include laymen and clergymen, as well as representatives of the black community. Subjects will include a study of the Negro in America, specifics on the problems of housing and the black economic development and solutions, according to Father Billotte.

Art Festival At School 40

A three-day Festival of arts will be held at John Warrant Castleman School No. 40 on May 13, 14, 15. It will be climaxed by a special presentation for parents on Wednesday evening, May 15, at 7 at the school in LaGrange Ave.

The evening will include tours of exhibits and displays, followed by a program of musical and dramatic offerings in the auditorium. The choir will present a varied program of religious and secular songs, some with special instrumental groups. A group of Kindergarten children will give a "Toy Town" special event, and the first grade rhythm band will perform. "Winnie the Pooh" will be featured in a fourth grade operetta, written by the students.

During the three days of the festival, the school children will be visiting classes to view demonstrations and artistic efforts of the various grades, and will also participate in assemblies of dancing presentations and other dramatic and musical events.

The festival has been planned by the faculty and presented by the Parent-Teacher Association. Installation of P.T.A. officers will also be held at the evening program.

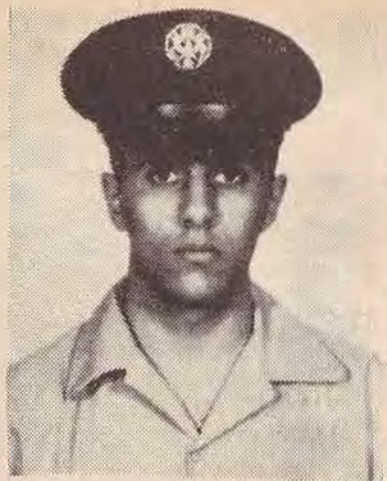

Aquinas Festival No. 30 PTA Plans Announced Due To Fold?

Thousands of Rochesterians will be given an opportunity to promote Catholic education in general and Aquinas Institute specifically this month. The 60-year old institution will hold a festival on the grounds of Aquinas Stadium, Ridgeway Ave. from June 20 to 22.

Proceeds will help the Basilian Fathers' school meet its pressing financial obligations. A deficit of \$70,000 is anticipated for the school year of 1968-69.

The festival is sponsored by ASPACE (Aquinas Parents Action Catholic Education), an army of some 1200 parents which work untriflingly for everything that Aquinas represents. According to Edward F. Shaffer, president, the perpetuation of educational excellence permeated with Catholic thought is the goal of ASPACE. The continuation of Aquinas Institute is presently their immediate concern. The Aquinas festival will bring to a conclusion a highly successful, program begun last September.

On the Feast of St. Thomas Aquinas last March, Father Leon G. Hart, C.S.B., principal, wrote to Aquinas graduates and parents inviting them to make a small contribution to their Alma Mater. Nearly 2000 replies netted an encouraging response of \$33,000. The Aquinas Festival will enable other members of the community to assist Aquinas.

A lay teachers' salary increase will account for nearly \$30,000 of the predicted deficit. But, according to Father Hart, the necessity of having qualified teachers requires periodical wage increases.

Due to lack of interest on the part of both parents and teachers, according to information received by the Post-Courier, the PTA organization at No. 30 School may lapse after this month. Any who may be interested in keeping it active are asked to contact the school principal.

Officers of the PTA whose term is about to expire are: Mrs. Edward Shartran, president; Sigurd Loehr, treasurer; Mrs. Fredric Cornell, secretary. Committees are headed by Mrs. Rocco Neri, Mrs. George Hart and Mrs. Harold McKechney.

"The American people have begun to realize that if they are going to achieve excellence in education and have outstanding educators, they must establish adequate pay schedules, accord teachers professional recognition, provide retirement systems, insurance programs and time and tuition refunds for in-service training."

During the past decade the average annual salary of all public school instructional staff members increased nationally by more than 65 percent. Aquinas has established a minimum starting salary of \$5900 for professional prepared teachers, with annual increments large enough to double the starting salary within 10 years with in-service training.

The Aquinas Festival will provide amusement booths, kiddy rides and refreshments. Arnold Morrison and Kenwood Block are co-chairmen. Father Michael Blondi, C.S.B., is the faculty moderator.

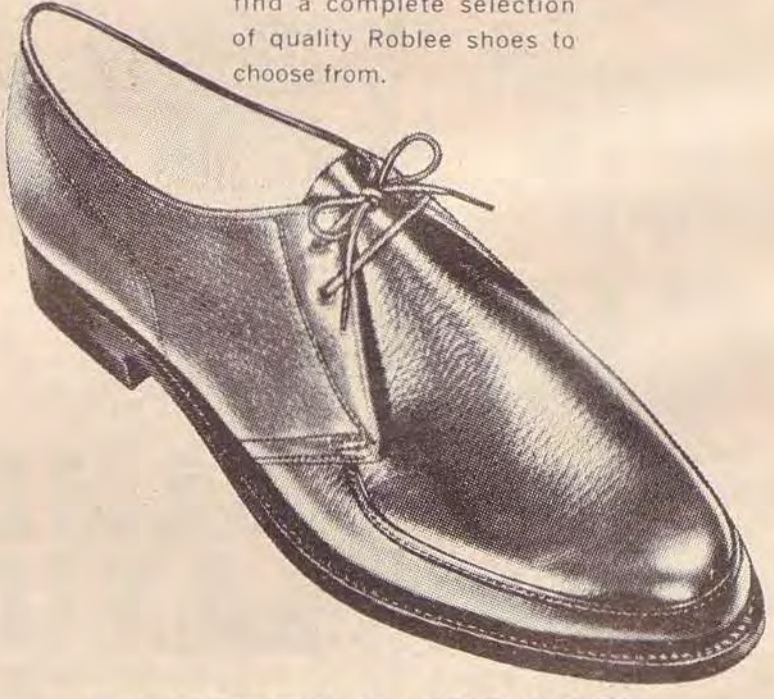

ALBANY REPORT

By Senator

The Legislature has now adjourned for the 1968 Session. In the coming weeks I will illustrate some of the significant legislation which passed, as well as legislation which, in my opinion, is significant but failed to become law. In every session there is legislation which receives great support, as well as legislation which is highly criticized. This year was no different in this respect, but let's take a look at a few issues:

MEDICAID
The State Medicaid program was cut 300 million dollars. I have fought for Medicaid cuts over the past two years, and so I do feel that this legislation is a step in the right direction. In this area we all want the highest level of health care, and under the present health program those suffering from poverty will not fail to get the right health care. However, the Legislature made certain restrictions so that people who are financially able to take care of their own health needs no longer will be covered by the government.

COURTS
The Legislature established 125 new judgeships in the state. This

action was of major significance because of our overcrowded court calendars. Most observers ap-proved of this action in view of the fact that, for a change, the Legislature put politics aside and did what is necessary if we are to keep the high level of justice which all of our citizens have a right to expect.

EDUCATION
In this area, many measures were passed by the Legislature but, in my opinion, the two of the greatest significance are:

1. State aid distributed in the schools of New York State was increased from \$660. per pupil to \$760. per pupil.
2. A special measure was pass-ed which involved the expenditure of 26 million dollars. This was allocated solely to urban schools to meet the problems of poverty connected with the inner city.

CONSUMER PROTECTION
The Legislature passed a "Truth in Lending" bill which provides for full disclosure to the consumer of all credit charges, including annual interest rates. Shoppers are generally aware of the cost of an item. However, because financing costs are less fully explained, the shopper often knows how much he is paying per month but does not know the actual credit costs.

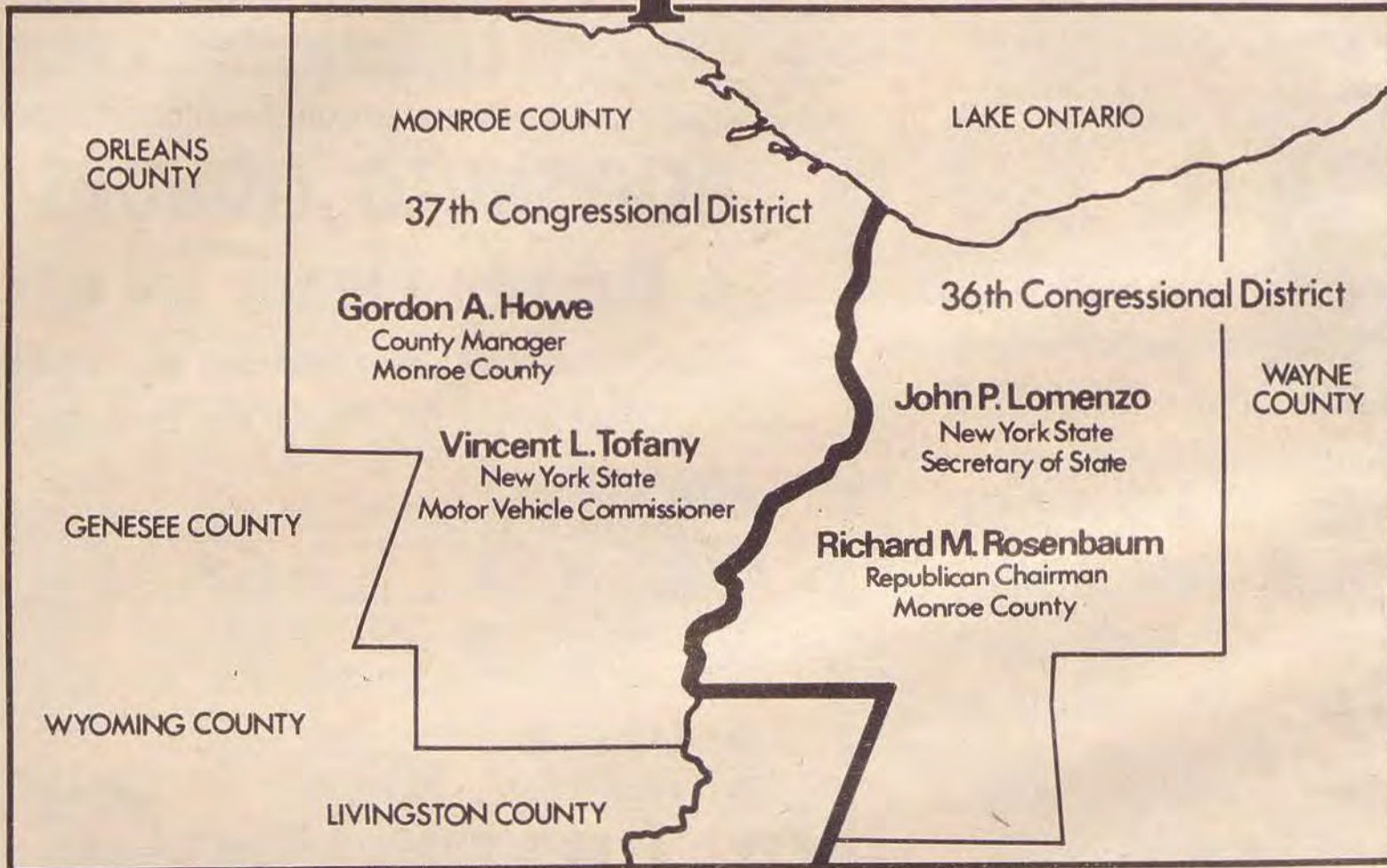

Moving Hazards Outlined By B.B.

It's that time of year when the increasingly "on the go" American family packs up and changes dwellings. Sometimes it's just across town, but often a company transfer takes the family clear across the country, or even overseas.

Wherever they go, nearly one out of every five families will be making an interstate move this year. If you're among them, here are extra tips based on Better Business Bureau files that should be considered.

Schedule the move at other than peak periods if at all possible. The end and first days of the month, holiday weekends - - these are the times which push movers' efficiency to the limit. Avoid them if you can.

An estimate is not a firm price. Because so many people choose their mover on the basis of the lowest estimate, it is a great temptation to some bidders to make their estimate unrealistically low. And besides, exceptionally low bidders will often be correspondingly inefficient. They will cause delay and damage to your possessions, and can be very difficult when it comes to settling your claims.

Be present during loading and unloading, as well as at the time of weighing, since interstate movers charge by the pound. Unscrupulous movers weigh the van empty, then toss in dollies, chains and other heavy equipment (and even members of the crew) when weighing the load. Be sure items in good condition are not listed at the time of loading as chipped, scratched, etc. At the time of unloading, be sure to note the

condition of the shipment in the presence of the driver and crew. And know your mover. Is he responsible? Does he have an established location or does he operate an office "out of his coat pocket?" Information about the reliability of a mover can be obtained from the BBB office, which can also supply pamphlets containing additional information on the subject of moving.

Maplewood Avenue Closing Reviewed

Councilman Stephen May is seeking "the reaction and comments" of residents in the area of Maplewood Ave. regarding the closing of one end of the street to through traffic. He has not taken a position on the matter, but has released a letter from City Manager Seymour Scher on the subject.

The City Manager presents the city's point of view in this manner:

"The present barricade treatment on Maplewood Avenue at the northerly end of the Rose Garden is a trial treatment, and may or may not become permanent. The trial was undertaken to determine the feasibility of such a treatment as a means of overcoming two problems we are confronted with. Should it become permanent our objective would be to reconstruct the roadway with a proper turn-around for Maplewood, and a positive separation from the park area.

"Maplewood Avenue, the southern end between Rose Street and Driving Park is relatively narrow and lacks sidewalks along both sides for most of its length. This requires people to walk in the street, and is hazardous during inclement weather periods. Because of the park, YMCA, nearby employment centers, etc., a sizeable volume of pedestrian traffic is generated.

"Maplewood bisects the Rose garden and creates some hazard in the widened portion when park activities are ongoing, and traffic is passing through. The temporary barricade prevents the through volume, yet enables residential access and park functions.

"Should it prove workable we would eliminate pedestrian-vehicle conflict, regain a residential environment along the street and reunite a bisected park."

Residents of the area around Maplewood Ave. have complained to him, says May, about the City's action in closing the street to through traffic. He asked the City Manager for a full explanation and asked why "some other device was

Arrive At No Decision On LaGrange Housing

To build or not to build on the 15 acres of vacant land in the LaGrange Ave. area near Mt. Read Blvd. was the question at a public meeting called by the Maplewood Neighborhood Association, last Wednesday. And there was no decision.

Henry Botts, representing the Friends of FIGHT, said yes, as did a resolution prepared by the Rev. G. Kent Keller, assistant pastor at Dewey Presbyterian Church, on behalf of the elders.

Father Gennaro Ventura, speaking for the Rochester Housing Authority said no and gave a number of reasons. Sentiment among the 150 or more in the audience seemed divided, with those in favor having the edge.

Father Ventura revealed that the Housing Authority is considering take-over of the heavily mortgaged Arborwood Apartments in cooperation with the Council of Churches; 26% to be construed as low-housing and 74% as fully taxable moderate income housing. If this plan goes through, the Authority would not want to add more low-cost housing (the 15 acres) due to its policy of "scatteration" of low-cost housing. He stressed, however, that his Arborwood plan was only tentatively advanced; also assured present Arborwood residents there that their occupancy would not be jeopardized.

Reclaiming the wooded, swampy land in the disputed 15 acres would be entirely too costly for low-income housing, especially if done by the Housing Authority, Father Ventura pointed out. Cost of sewers alone could run as high as \$7500 per unit, he has been told, and the Housing Authority, hemmed in by Federal regulations would be in a high-cost bind. The only possibility would be so-called "turn-key" development by private builders who would turn the finished units over to the Authority. U. S. standards allow only a

Swimming Tips From Red Cross

Sixty per cent of Americans who drown do so because they have fallen into the water accidentally, the Red Cross said today.

"If they had been able to swim, they could have saved themselves," Al Justus, local director of Red Cross Safety Services, declared.

Justus issued safety advice for the 100 million Americans expected to use the water for recreation this summer. He said that drownings have increased in each of the last three years for which records are complete, - 1964-66 - and that the latter year was the first since the early 1930's that water fatalities reached the 7,000 mark.

"Even though that is 3,000 fewer than the 10,000 a year average of 55 years ago, when few people participated in water sports and before the Red Cross and other organizations became active in water safety education, the figure is still too high, he added.

"Hence, the first water safety precaution is learn to swim", Justus said. "If you can swim, learn to swim better. Your Red Cross chapter can tell you when its next swimming classes are scheduled.

"Next, and this is aimed primarily at parents, WATCH SMALL CHILDREN MOST CAREFULLY around the water, even in supervised and guarded areas, and even at shallow wading pools. Mere seconds of inattention can be fatal".

Other swimming safety tips are these, Justus said:

1. Always swim with a companion - never alone. On a long-distance swim, arrange for someone in a boat to accompany you.
2. Swim in a safe place. The presence of lifeguards usually indicates the area is safe for swimming. Stay away from the area immediately in front of the diving board and do not swim near piers or pilings.
3. Before diving, make sure the water is deep enough and there are no hidden objects such as submerged rocks. In pools look for depth markings before entering.
4. If you have not been swimming since last summer, take it easy

5. Wait at least an hour after eating before swimming, and don't swim when overtired or overheated.
6. Make certain that reaching poles, buoys, and similar rescue equipment are readily available at your swimming area.
7. Don't depend on an inflated innertube or toy to hold you up. They may slip away from you.
8. Whenever a storm approaches get out of the water - it is a conductor of lightning.

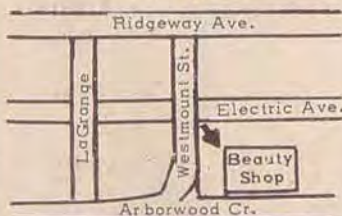

Primary Results Add To Confusion

Results of last week's Primary in the Northwest area wards were just as confusing and inconclusive as elsewhere. In the battle for delegates to the national convention in August, local voters were seriously divided.

All six wards favored the Humphrey slate, which represented the county Democratic organization's choices, but the Kennedy and McCarthy slates also drew big support and a combination of the voting strength of the two groups would have overcome the Humphrey forces.

The showing of Henry E. Gillette, running on the ticket dedicated to the principles of the late Senator Kennedy, was regarded as a setback to the organization Democrats. Gillette ran ahead of the other two on his slate in the six local wards, but his greatest strength was in other areas of the 37th Congressional District.

Only the 24th Ward rode with the winner, Paul Dwyer, in the nomination for U.S. Senator. The other five wards favored Nickerson. Resnick also drew a large vote in all six wards.

The Republicans had their close calls, too, in the convention delegate battle. The organization ticket, headed by County Manager Gordon Howe and Motor Vehicle Commissioner Vincent Tofany, won but not by big margins. The 1st, 15th and 20th were safely in the fold, but the 9th and 10th were too close for comfort and the 24th made it almost a tie between the Rockefeller and Nixon slates.

Swimming Rules Outlined By "Y"

More than 40 million Americans will seek fun in the sun through water sports this summer, but only a fraction of them will know how to get the most out of swimming.

"Learning how to swim is the first rule for enjoying yourself in the water," says Bernard L. Davis, director of Physical Education of the Maplewood Branch YMCA. "It's easy, it's fun and the best time to learn is now," he suggests. He points out that about half of the 7,000 swimmers who drowned last year were in the water by themselves. "Even good swimmers," reminds Davis, "use the

buddy system. Make sure you and your kids use it also."

"Comedians belong on the stage, not in the water, where they may find themselves unexpectedly injured," says the YMCA director. "So stay away from water wrestlers and don't worry about getting applause from spectators.

If danger comes, keep calm," says the YMCA expert. "Take advantage of your body's natural buoyancy and float. Try to grab on to something until help arrives."

ALBANY REPORT

By Senator

James E. Powers



During the 1968 Session of the Legislature we tightened the penal code in favor of the law abiding citizen and the police officer. I spoke on the Senate floor on behalf of these bills because I had felt that the rights of the law abiding citizen were often jeopardized by attempts to bend over backward to protect the rights of these people involved in illegal activities. I do believe, however, that the source of crime and disregard for the law is found in the attitude of the individual. We have too long accepted the assumption that all parents teach their children to respect the law. Unfortunately, this is not the case. With this in mind, Assemblyman Lill and I submitted legislation at the last session of the Legislature to amend the education law to provide for a course of instruction in law enforcement.

This bill provides that under the direction of the Commissioner of Education a course of instruction would be developed to teach law enforcement. It would be taught to all children eight years old and older. Considering the crime rate among school dropouts, it seems imperative that this law enforcement instruction be given at the elementary school level.

This course of instruction in law enforcement would include the following:

A - The function of law enforcement agencies in the structure of government in the local community.

B - The citizen's responsibility to assist the police and thereby to serve the community in the treatment of crime as a social problem.

C - The penalties of law breaking, not only in respect to the immediate effect on the life of the offender, but also in respect to the

long range effects which can be detrimental in adjusting the life of the individual to meet public acceptance.

D - The specific terminology used to identify certain criminal acts (such as assault, theft, and vandalism), as well as an understanding of the penalties attached to a guilty verdict.

Aquinas Festival Plans Announced

Thousands of Rochesterians will be given an opportunity to promote Catholic education in general and Aquinas Institute specifically this month. The 60-year old institution will hold a festival on the grounds of Aquinas Stadium, Ridgeway Ave. from June 20 to 22.

Proceeds will help the Basilian Fathers' school meet its pressing financial obligations. A deficit of \$70,000 is anticipated for the school year of 1968-69.

The festival is sponsored by APACE (Aquinas Parents Action Catholic Education), an army of some 1200 parents which work untringly for everything that Aquinas represents. According to Edward F. Shaffer, president, the perpetuation of educational excellence permeated with Catholic thought is the goal of APACE. The continuation of Aquinas Institute is presently their immediate concern. The Aquinas festival will bring to a conclusion a highly successful, program begun last September.

On the Feast of St. Thomas Aquinas last March, Father Leon G. Hart, C.S.B., principal, wrote to Aquinas graduates and parents inviting them to make a small contribution to their Alma Mater. Nearly 2000 replies netted an encouraging response of \$33,000. The Aquinas Festival will enable other members of the community to assist Aquinas.

A lay teachers' salary increase will account for nearly \$30,000 of the predicted deficit. But, according to Father Hart, the necessity of having qualified teachers requires periodical wage increases. "The American people have begun to realize that if they are going to achieve excellence in education and have outstanding educators, they must establish adequate pay schedules, accord teachers professional recognition, provide retirement systems, insurance programs and time and tuition refunds for in-service training."

During the past decade the average annual salary of all public school instructional staff members increased nationally by more than 65 percent. Aquinas has established a minimum starting salary of \$5900 for professional prepared teachers, with annual increments large enough to double the starting salary within 10 years with in-service training.

The Aquinas Festival will provide amusement booths, kiddy rides and refreshments. Arnold Morrison and Kenwood Block are co-chairmen. Father Michael Biondi, C.S.B., is the faculty moderator.
