Marshall Runs Out Of These Smith's

John Marshall High School won't be the same any more. There has been a steady stream of Smith's from Hollywood St. since September, 1943 when Robert Edward Smith, son of Mrs. Florence Smith and the late Galen Smith, entered in the 8th grade. The last of the six Smith's, Donna Marie, received her diploma from Principal Matthew R. Hoffman on Friday evening, June 20.

Mrs. Smith, who resides at 20 Hollywood, is proud of the record her family has made at school and in the community. Robert, a 1948 graduate, is senior engineer in research at Gleason's. He is married to the former Jeanne Little, J.M.H.S. '49.

Jeannine Anne, who was graduated in June 1953, is married to Ronald Holbrook, also a Marshall graduate in the class of 1953. He, incidentally, is a reading consultant teacher with the Medina school system.

Barry Lee Smith received his diploma in June 1958. He was the recipient of a \$3000 Gannett Scholarship and is now senior electrical engineer at the Wizard Gauge Co. His wife, the former Carol Pardee, is also a 1958 Marshall graduate.

The following June, James Alton Smith walked across the John Marshall stage with the class of 1959. He, too, received a \$3000 Gannett Scholarship and is now employed by Xerox as a senior engineer in electrical research.

After Richard D. Smith, a lab technician at Kodak, graduated in June 1962, there was a lapse of two years. The gap was bridged when the last remaining Smith, Donna Marie, entered Marshall in September 1964 and graduated with the class of 1969. She is planning to go to Monroe Community College.

Wins Scholarship To Law School

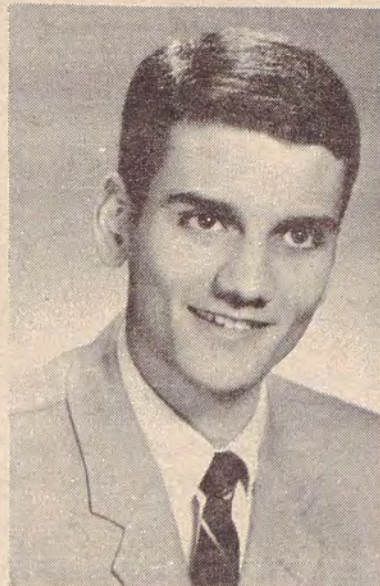

Railroad Promises Crossing Repairs

Repairs to numerous bumpy Penn Central crossings are on the way, but a novel proposal for permanent repairs has been rejected by the railroad, Councilman Stephen May reported recently. May, who for several years has pressed for smoother railroad crossings in the city, said Penn Central Division Superintendent K. J. Tomasevich has told him that the railroad "intends to repair our crossings that were not completed last year and any other crossings that may have deteriorated below standard since last year." The Councilman, noting that the railroad's housekeeping efforts have improved recently, said he welcomed the indication that re-

pairs have and will be made at teeth-jarring crossings, and urged residents to let him know of locations where further repairs are needed. Earlier this year, May suggested to Penn Central that an economical, permanent way to eliminate bumps between tracks might be to install steel plates. He said this might offer a solution for heavily-traveled crossings where repairs in the past have not lasted. In rejecting the proposal, Tomasevich wrote that "our standard crossing plans do not permit the use of steel plates."

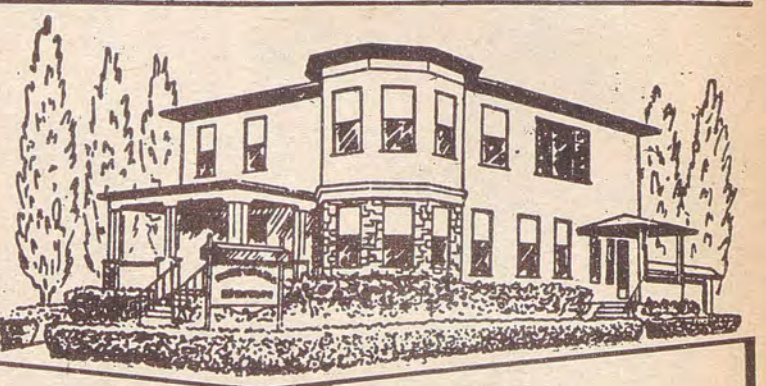

Cost Sharing Urged By Legislator

Monroe County Legislator John J. Romano has called for the creation of a committee to review the condition of city streets mentioned in the Rochester Bureau of Municipal Research report.

Romano proposed that the committee be made up of County Legislators who represent areas in the City and members of the City Council, Romano said, "the function of the committee would be to arrive at mutual cost sharing program to repair the hazardous conditions of the streets. To facilitate these repairs I would suggest that the County highway department join with its city counterpart and pool their resources of men and equipment to accomplish this task".

Because of the new population census in 1970, Romano said he feels it would be foolhardy for the city to dissipate its tax revenue at this time. "When the new census is available the city and county will be in a better position to discuss how the sales tax may be adjusted to better serve all of the residents of the city and the county", he added.

Romano said he is sympathetic to the problems of maintaining the city streets and that he is aware of the number of people living outside the city who enjoy the use of city streets.

Romano continued, "Last year I supported the county take over of certain city services with the hope that the city would cut its tax rate. My hopes were in vain because the City did not lower taxes but increased them through certain embellishment rates against each property in the city".

The campaign is primarily aimed at four groups:

1. Shutins. Persons who are not

able to go to their polling places because of ill health, can both register and vote from their homes if a doctor's certificate is obtained and filed with the Board of Elections.

2. Military Personal. Those who are serving in the armed forces can register and vote only in the locality of their last civilian residence, but can do so by mail. This can either be arranged by the serviceman with his company clerk, or by his next of kin with the Board of Elections.

3. Students. All college students must vote from their last permanent home address. They must register in person, but this can

The County Economy Task Force has been developing an immediate program to achieve cost savings through reorganizations, postponement of expenses, reduction of positions and all other conceivable means.

On July 1, this group's initial recommendations were presented to a full session of the County Legislature. The total savings in cost of County government to be achieved through these recommendations, which are the first in a continuing series, amounts to \$1,029,735.00.

The area affected by these cuts includes reduction of highway construction programs (\$831,815.00) and the first-wave of a series of personnel cutbacks totaling 24 jobs (\$197,920.00). Some of these 24 jobs are vacant now, but there are a number in which the County presently has employees.

Of course, these and forthcoming personnel reductions will hinder operations of already minimal department staffs, but it is imperative we make major cutbacks in spending during the second half of 1969 in order to live within our

austerity budget. We must somehow develop new methods to accomplish our work with fewer employees.

Those within the County who are in a lower pay scale are not the only ones who will be affected. Two of the jobs we are eliminating in the first cutback fall in the \$10,000 and \$15,000 range.

The savings will involve harsh austerity for the balance of 1969 and will produce positive cuts in expenses that will be reflected in the 1970 budget.

Careful attention to details of county administration and a willingness on the part of each department head to forego expenditures and personnel makes possible this million dollar savings as the first in a series of economy moves.

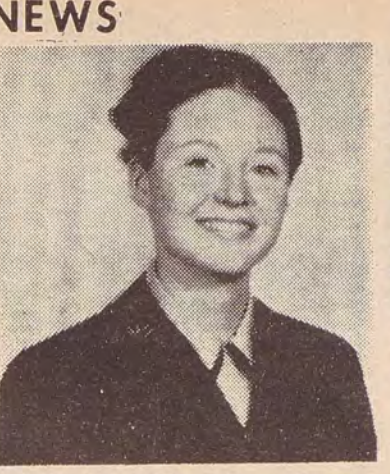

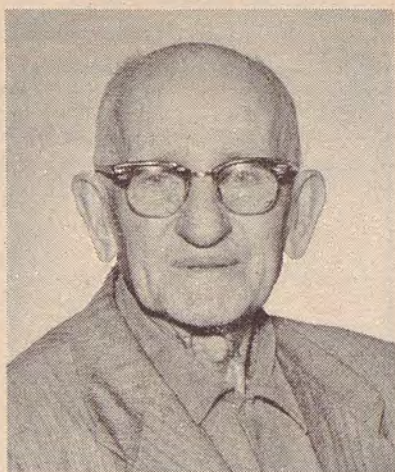

Edgerton Building Gets O.K. of EANA

"Nothing has happened to change the promise, made by Councilmen Malley, that Edgerton Park would be used for recreational purposes".

This is the reassurance given to the Edgerton Area Neighborhood Association by City Manager Seymour Scher in a letter to the association president, Alan K. Brumber, Scher also outlined all that has been done so far to update the park and also future plans.

By the end of 1972 it appears the city will have spent nearly a million dollars to improve the park and its facilities.

In view of the projected plans, Brumer and his group will no longer oppose erection of a maintenance building on the park grounds. They have been assured that the building will be "most attractive" and that it will in no way interfere with recreational activities.

The construction of a recreation maintenance and service center is not inconsistent with the promise that Edgerton Park will be devoted to recreation, wrote Scher. "You will, in fact, have a beautifully maintained recreation area as a result of this operation being located close to Edgerton Park", he explained.

Brumber had previously addressed a strong letter of protest to Scher and had been joined in protest by Councilmen Robert Wood and Stephen May. Councilman William Malley had pledged a cleanup of Edgerton Park at an earlier meeting of the Edgerton Association and had made the promise that the park would be given over to the recreational needs of the community. Councilman Andrew Celli also had participated in the park cleanup discussion by advocating removal of the car pound, which has been done.

Improvements to date have cost the city \$241,900, Scher stated; further improvements in the next three years will cost \$350,000; and \$339,000 for what Scher refers to as "recreation service facility" completes the list for a total of \$930,000.

Charles House Group Says Hold The Line

The following resolution was passed by the Charles House Area Neighborhood Council at the executive meeting recently. The resolution will then be passed on to each of the Neighborhood Associations for general acceptance and reads as follows:

"We the residents and the Planning Committee of the Charles House Area Neighborhood Council, hereby, do resolve to hold the line and to protect our neighborhood; rather than give up by moving to another area. Being an old neighborhood obviously there are houses with age. However, age does not necessarily reduce the value of a house, in spite of the belief to that effect.

"The goals we seek are a phasing in of the necessary stabilizers that will upgrade the attractiveness of our neighborhood; so that it will be in a position to compete in a real-estate market oriented to private enterprise. We seek the planning and clarification that will make the residents of our area face the future with confidence. The feeling that money spent in maintenance seems money thrown away... must be eliminated! This feeling has been greatly reduced by those who have already made sizable investments in their properties. However, we have scattered sites of neglected property and blight conditions that are detrimental to the needed attitude for residential stability.

"We, the members of the Charles House Area Neighborhood Council and its Planning Committee, do want to make it known, that we must be notified before any future plans are made for the area... that we must be part of the future planning of the area... that we must have a voice in the final decisions... that sufficient power be given to the neighborhood

in policy making affecting our area.

"City Planning must identify the future of our area and help establish the means of rejuvenation. Our community quite readily lends itself to a conservation program which would accelerate through private enterprise, private investment, if the proper incentives and guidelines are established. The time is here for a comprehensive study oriented to our purpose and objectives."

Penalize Slumlords Says Councilman

Rochester is not presently enforcing the provisions of the multiple residence law which had been enacted by the New York State Legislature for cities the size of Rochester, says Councilman Robert F. Wood.

"The lack of enforcement has been going on for several years", he added. "One of the provisions of the multiple residence law provides for a complete registration of landlords which would enable the Department of Buildings and Property Conservation to keep a closer eye on those landlords who own several pieces of property in the city and who are presently violating the property code.

"There are also many provisions of the multiple residence law

which provide for stiff penalties for those slumlords who violate the law and the city of Rochester is not presently enforcing those provisions of the multiple residence law."

Wood stated that he would introduce a resolution at the next City Council meeting, Aug. 12, calling upon the City Manager to "immediately start enforcing the provisions of the law in order to protect the thousands of people in Rochester who live in multiple dwellings.

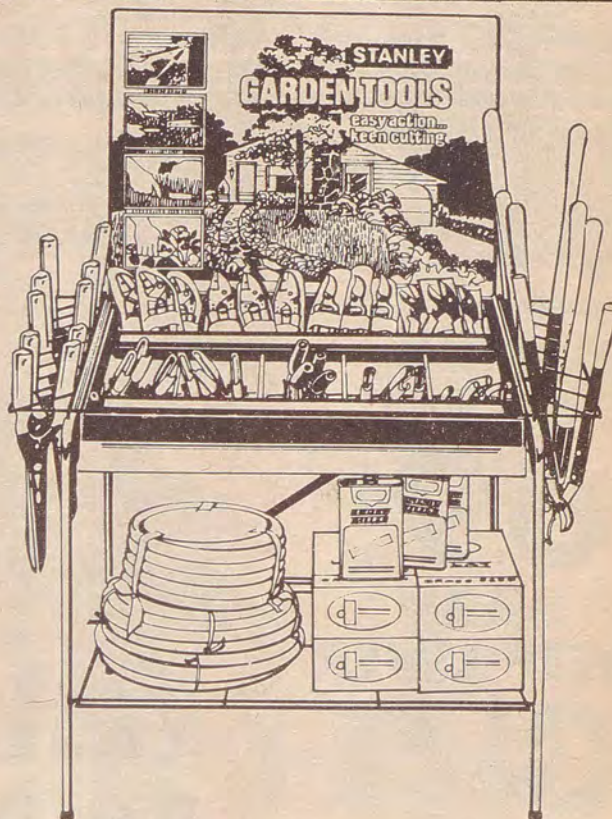

Lake Avenue Re-Zoning Protested; Association Promises Meeting

Daily newspaper stories on the proposed re-zoning of Lake Ave. to provide for high rise apartments in the area between Driving Park Ave. and Flower City Pk. have resulted in protests from at least three different sources and although Maplewood Neighborhood Association proposals have been attacked, the awakened interest of affected property owners is welcomed by John R. Saxe, the association president. He plans a meeting of the association within the next month for more discussion.

"It is true", says Saxe, "we have gone along with the R-4 re-zoning plan of the City, but if the people don't approve no re-zoning will be done. The present method of builders seeking zoning variances for each project would then apply. We don't think the end results will be as good".

Lake Ave., in the affected area, will eventually be largely high rise apartments or will go commercial, in Saxe's opinion and this apparently is the thinking of the City. The R-4 classification would in effect mean the residential character of Lake Ave. will be maintained, since apartments are strictly residential, although multiple dwelling, type, he states.

A letter to the editor in the Sunday Democrat & Chronicle from Mr. and Mrs. Josef Wagner, 107 Flower City Pk., says "We do not accept the idea of high density apartments between Ridge Rd. and Flower City Pk. Perhaps John Saxe of the Maplewood Association would like them on Dewey, from Ridgeway to Magee". The letter went on to point out the Wagners' desire to call for continuation of the "residential atmosphere, tree-lined streets, the park nearby, schools close enough so our children could walk and the small neighborhood stores nearby on Lake Ave." The park, they claim, is now "ruined by all the road and bridge construction".

Mrs. Frederick Schlitzer, 148 Gorsline St., also took exception to the R-4 zoning in a statement to the Tenth Ward Courier, and called for an association meeting to get the "true sentiment of the people". She took occasion, at the same time, to complain about the pedestrian crossing over the Veterans' Memorial Bridge. No provision has been made, she said, for crossing

College Study Courses At "Y"

The YMCA is tackling the problem of the college dropout, a national dilemma which plagues school administrators and dashes parents' hopes for their children's success.

Maplewood Branch of the "Y" will offer a course this month on "How To Study in College", for high school graduates expecting to enter college this fall. Instruction will be based on the premise that, with proper preparation, an academically bright student will make a good adjustment to college life.

The course, to be given Aug. 18-22, in five two-hour evening sessions, will deal with the major transition from high school to college, says Orian Wilber, YMCA Youth Director, "It's a big change from high school to the rigors of academic life at college, and we hope to make the way a lot easier for those who enroll."

The course is one developed by R. F. Schwarz, director of the Purdue University Barker Memorial Center, and Howard D. Murdock, associate professor of chemistry at Purdue, after some careful inquiry into the college dropout problem. They found that many dropouts become that way because of an almost total absence of study techniques.

The course, taught by Raymond M. Bobillo of Purdue University, will deal 75 percent with study skills and 25 percent with adjustment to college life.

A \$20 fee will be charged for the course which will be held at Maplewood from 7 to 9 p.m. each evening. Interested persons are asked to call the Y for registration details.

City Announces Local Projects

District Councilmen Urban Kress and Andrew Celli have announced that several public works projects will be undertaken in the area of the Ninth and Tenth Wards in the summer and fall months.

Heading the list of projects, they say, is the re-surfacing of Dewey Ave. from Lorimer St. to Emerson St., and the repainting of the foot bridge over the railroad tracks at the west end of Electric Ave.

Most sizeable of the projects however is an extensive program of tree removal and sidewalk repair. Many of the tree removals are the result of the Dutch Elm disease, affecting 258 trees in the northwest part of the city including 11 on Augustine St., eight on Bryan St., 28 on Lake Ave. and 24 on Seneca Pkwy. In a separate operation, an additional 83 trees will be removed on the west side because of old age, weakened limbs, and sidewalk damage. These are widely scattered but include 6 on Rand St., 5 on Glenwood Ave. and 5 on Goodwill St.

These trees and many previously removed have caused serious damage to sidewalks in many areas. Thus, the summer public works program calls for the replacement of well over 700 flags of sidewalk on the west side of the city. Major concentrations of work will include 87 new sections of sidewalk on Rand St., 50 on Steko Ave., 47 on Flower City Pk., and 35 on Clay Ave.

The councilmen, in announcing the projects, pointed out that all of the work is financed by the City and is paid for from city taxes, that the County does not in any way share any of the cost of the work.

More Improvements For Edgerton Park

Further details of the City's plans for Edgerton Park were announced over the weekend by Councilman William Malley. In addition to a new recreational building to replace the Stardust Room, \$150,000 will be spent for landscaping and other improvements, he states.

The Stardust Room is no longer adequate for present needs, he says. The new facility will provide "adequate space" for small group

activities, arts and crafts and senior citizen programs. This is part of a three year program, says Malley, including better lighting for the park.

He also revealed that a \$50,000 appropriation will be authorized at the next City Council meeting on Aug. 12 for immediate improvements on the site of the old RIT dormitory in Bloss St. This will provide for horseshoe, shuffleboard and bocci courts and also a children's play area.

Communitistic State Described By Cuban

"I believe it is my duty to tell you about the Communist system", writes a Cuban woman who has lately come to make her home with her husband and family in Rochester. "The Communist system is not only the abolition of private property, there is a secondary problem. They go beyond this. They destroy the human soul and make a thing out of each person".

"I cannot tell you more", she writes, "because my English is very limited". The Communist

system is cruel and causes pain and suffering, she concluded.

The woman identifies herself and reveals that she and her family are living in a run-down area of the Seventh Ward and are doing work which they have never done before. They evidently are well educated, but apparently fled their native country and are trying to get started over again in the U.S.A.

The woman's letter asked no assistance. She only wanted to convey a first hand impression of life in Cuba as it is today.

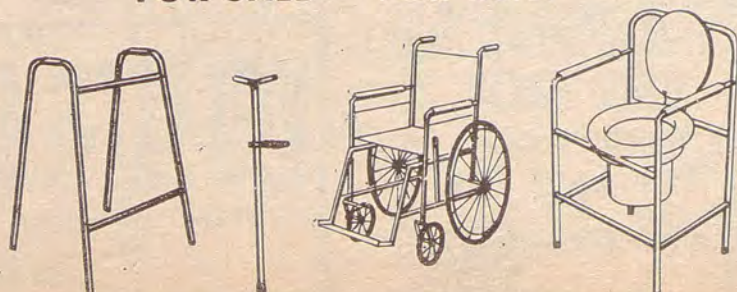

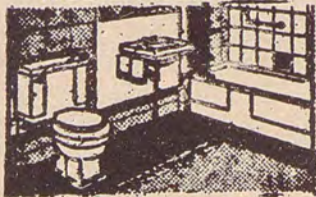

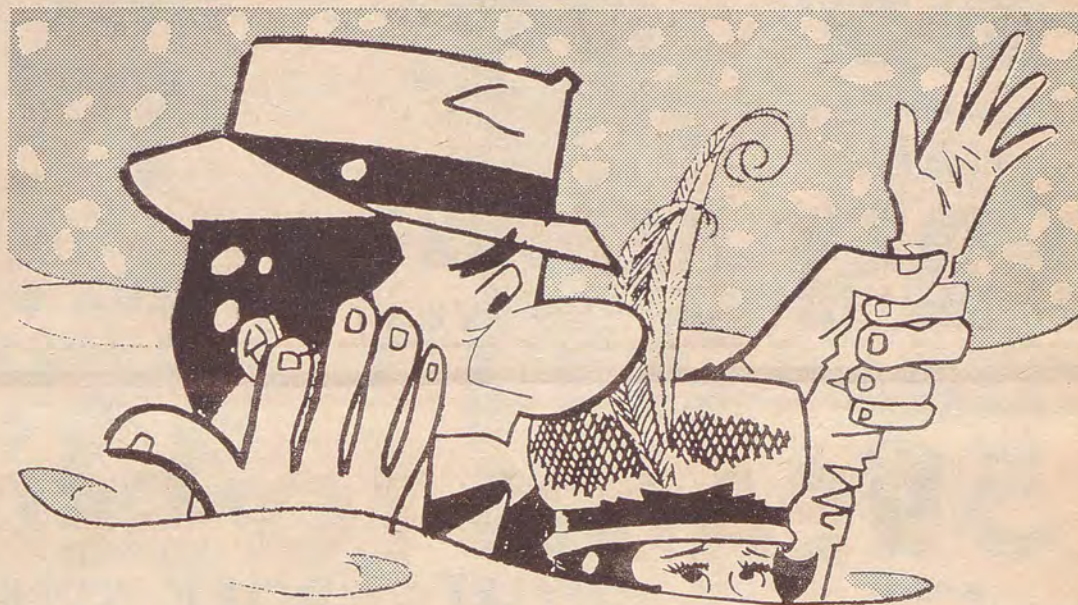

Combat Reaction Speaker's Plea

Warning about "forces of negativism" at work in American cities, City Councilman Stephen May recently called for "a politics of reconciliation and for rejection of a politics of divisiveness". He said it is time to stress the many more things we hold in common than the relatively few things which divide us.

Addressing the Finger Lakes Conference, a statewide meeting of Episcopal clergy and laymen at William Smith College, May said "America today is a nation divided--and as a result, we are entering an ominous period for American politics."

He noted that "in city after city, powerful forces of negativism, fear and divisiveness are at work" and that "promises to turn back the clock and appeals to the baser instincts of the electorate have become increasingly popular among major party candidates."

He added, "the backlash vote, with all its ugly connotations, has become a potent political reality." May called on all citizens to join in combating the "forces of reaction and backlash which threaten to overwhelm us." Continued the Councilman, "we must stamp out the apostles of bigotry, violence and extremism and end America's mood of hostility."

May said it was vital to eliminate "bitterness and misunderstanding" among our people if we are to achieve progress in eliminating the problems within our nation. "We must bring to the great battles for justice, equality and progress a renewed sense of partnership and of common purpose," he stressed.

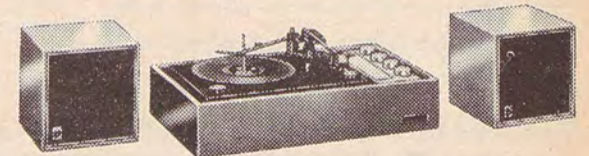

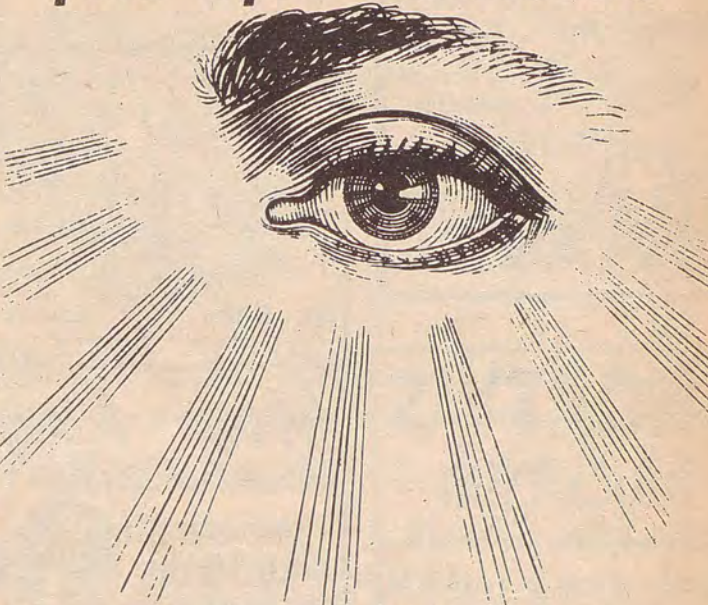

"Close Dump" Candidate Urges

Republican City Council candidate Merwyn Kroll has demanded that City Hall close down the Emerson St. landfill, site of numerous fires. Kroll called the City Dump "a fire and health hazard to west side residents and an eye-sore to the community".

Kroll criticized the City Administration "for not using soil cover in layers over the dumped garbage in the landfill and not keeping adequate quantities of soil and cold ash on the site". He estimated that the City used two to three million gallons of water to extinguish the landfill fire and called this a "flagrant squandering of the taxpayers' money".

Kroll said the landfill should not be re-opened until the City devises a safer and more efficient means of refuse disposal. He said the City should find a means of disposing of refuse in dry form, and in the meantime, haul the garbage out of the City to a private dump or gravel pit.

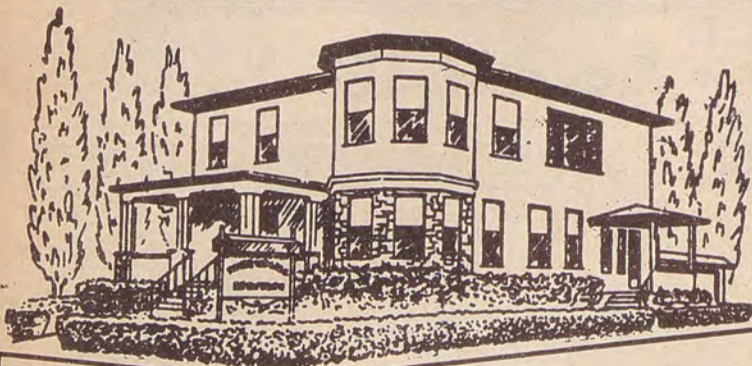

County Seeking Foster Homes For Men, Women 65 and Older

If you have extra space in your home and are interested in adding to your income, you might consider operating a foster home for adults.

There is a critical need for such homes in Monroe County, particularly for persons over 65 years of age, according to Dr. Donald K. Stockdale, Deputy County Health Director and Medical Consultant for the Monroe County Department of Social Services.

Officially, these homes are designated "Family-Type Proprietary Homes for Adults". They serve 2 to 5 persons, and they provide board and room and personal assistance.

The Monroe County Department of Social Service pays 5.50 per day for the care of each person.

Dr. Stockdale said there is a

heavy demand for family-type homes for adults here because of the high population of persons over 65 years of age.

"Because we have only three such homes in our community", he continued, "many older persons, including recipients of public welfare, are forced into higher-cost facilities, such as nursing homes. This intensifies the shortage of nursing home beds and adds to the costs of taxes and medical care".

Dr. Stockdale explained that "many older persons are widows or widowers who are no longer able to live alone. They don't require nursing or medical care. They just need to be looked after. They simply require room and board and some personal assistance."

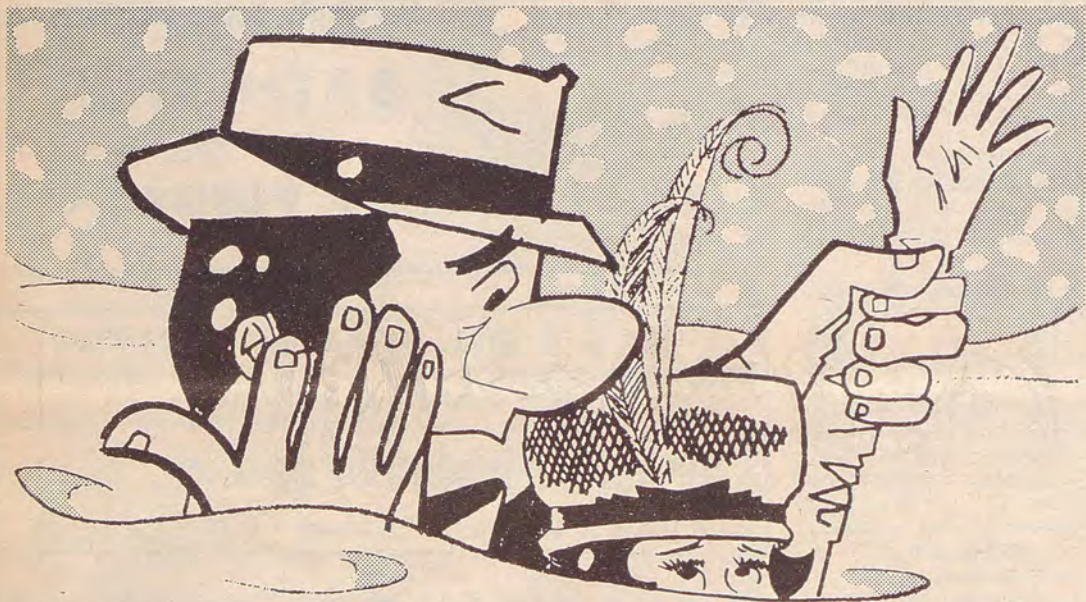

Residents Discuss Zoning Changes

The City's recommendation for zoning changes in the old Tenth Ward were aired at a meeting last night of a property owners' committee called by the Maplewood Neighborhood Association. This was the first step in a move to get the neighborhood involved and to sound out the pros and cons of the changes.

People from Alameda, Albarmarle, Seneca Parkway, numerous streets west of Dewey and other areas where single houses predominate were present at the meeting held in the Dewey Branch Library. It is hoped eventually to get petitions circulated expressing the wishes of the property owners as to zoning changes.

President John Saxe of the Maplewood Neighborhood Association assured those present that the new zoning setup would not affect assessments, although it could possibly affect property values. Existing doubles would not be disturbed by the changes, he pointed out, but streets where single homes are in the majority would be kept that way.

Saxe also announced that a general meeting of all interested in the Lake Ave. re-zoning would be held in September. There has been some dissent over proposed changes which would allow high rise apartments and it is promised that a representative of the city planning staff will be present to join in the discussion since the City is interested, as is the Maplewood Association, in rigid stipulations such as for parking and landscaping. The date and place of this meeting will be announced soon, says Saxe.

Emerson Landfill As Others See It Again In News

The recurrent fires in the Emerson St. landfill, one of the City's biggest headaches and a source of nagging annoyance to nearby residents, made the headlines again during the past weeks as the flames broke out again and a Republican City Council candidate came out with yet another possible solution.

Merwyn Kroll, the candidate, proposed a new system modeled after a refuse disposal idea which he discovered in Lancaster, Pa. The system is to compress the refuse into one fifth its bulk while being loaded on tractor trailers and then carted to a landfill remote from the city. In Lancaster the dump is 17 miles away.

"The Lancaster transfer station and landfill costs \$3.20 a ton to operate, compared to \$13 to \$15 a ton for our incinerator system", says Kroll. "Its introduction here would mean a saving of hundreds of thousands of dollars which could be passed along to city residents in the form of lower property taxes".

Kroll also said that a report is expected in about a month from consulting engineers in Chicago who are working on a solution to Rochester's dumping problem.

Dailies Now Take New Signal Light At Dewey-Emerson Ads For Liquor

Alcoholic beverage advertisements, long taboo in Rochester's dailies, made their appearance last week in the Times-Union and the Democrat & Chronicle.

The long-standing ban on beer and liquor ads imposed by the late Frank E. Gannett was lifted, it is rumored, as a result of demands from stockholders. The Gannett company recently went public and its shares are now listed on the New York Stock Exchange.

The Gannett change in policy, by coincidence but apparently unrelated, came about the same time as sweeping changes were made in rules governing so-called discount liquor stores by State Liquor authorities. The word discount, as well as "sale", "lowest prices" and other similar terms is banned as of Sept. 1, on or near the premises of retail liquor stores.

Strict rules as to price signs, particularly in store windows, it is believed may prove somewhat of

The busy Dewey and Emerson corner is being doubly guarded these days by two systems of signal lights. 18 Families Trying "Welfare" Living

Eighteen non-welfare families in Monroe County are living on welfare budgets in an experimental project that is being carried out in cooperation with Monroe County Department of Social Services. Social Services Director J. Barry Jesmer said the families, which are of varying sizes, volunteered to participate to help the Department evaluate the adequacy of current welfare grants.

The participating families, all of middle incomes, have been supplied with a packet of printed materials, including instructions, expense sheets, daily menu forms, surplus food sheets, and questionnaires. The materials were prepared by Joseph S. Sanfilippo, casework supervisor, who heads up the Social Services Department's welfare budget information center.

The test is for two-week periods. At the end of that time, the families will provide Sanfilippo with a record of their experiences, together with the completed questionnaires. He will compile the data in a report to Jesmer.

Sanfilippo said other families interested in living on welfare budget may obtain the necessary details by calling him at 442-4000, Extension 2724.

Woods Calls For New Pension Plan

City Councilman Robert F. Wood says that in order for the City of Rochester to increase the number of qualified applicants for the police bureau and the fire bureau, a greater effort must be made to increase starting salaries and fringe benefits for City Policemen and Firemen.

"One method of inducing more men to apply for these delicate and vital jobs is to raise salaries and provide more attractive pension and retirement benefits," he said. "The City should make available a 20 year retirement program whereby a policeman or fireman can retire after 20 years of service at one-half pay. Such a pension plan should be non-contributing insofar as the men are concerned."

"In a day when crime is increasing, this community and every community needs qualified, intelligent and dedicated men and women in the area of public safety. Communities are experiencing great difficulties in recruiting young men, and the basic facts are that we are not doing enough for our police and firemen by way of salaries and other benefits."

"The New York State Police and other city police departments in the state have such a pension plan, and the time is long overdue for Rochester to provide such

Reduction of Noise At Airport Noted

The Federal Aviation Administration has commended the County of Monroe for its efforts to reduce, as much as possible, aircraft noise at the Rochester-Monroe County Airport.

In a letter to County Manager Gordon A. Howe, FAA Manager W. E. Cullinan, Jr., stressed the cooperative efforts of the FAA, County of Monroe and the airline "to minimize noise resulting from operations in and out of the airport." Cullinan also said, "by expanding the Runway 4-22 to the south, the County was improving the noise condition since aircraft operations would be farther away from some sensitive areas."

Cullinan continued, "We are well aware of your efforts to make your airport a good neighbor. I believe that these efforts have achieved a reasonable degree of success."

The county manager said that the county department of Public Works is installing lighted signs on the runways to remind pilots at the runway ends of the noise procedures as another effort to do everything possible to reduce the noise at the airport for the convenience of nearby residents.

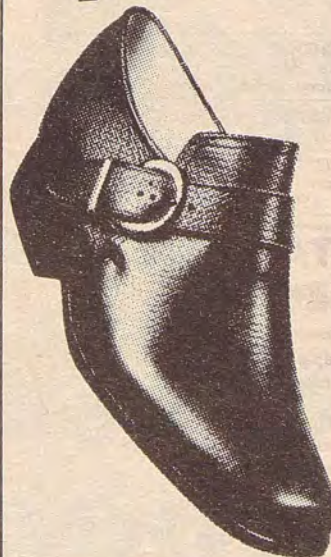



May Advocates Lower Bus Fare

City Councilman Stephen May has reaffirmed Republican support for reduced bus fares for senior citizens and predicted City Hall will back down from its opposition to the plan. The Councilman said the "whole point of public ownership of the bus company is to respond to pressing social needs of the community", such as lower rates for the elderly.

May said last week's Council of Social Agencies recommendation for reduced bus fares for seniors in non-peak hours will help stimulate action on the resolution to that effect introduced in June 1968 by Republican Councilman Robert Wood.

May also said he agreed with Council of Social Agencies Executive Director Kenneth Storaardt that lower rates will lead to increased revenues because senior citizens now deprived from using buses will do so at the reduced rates.

May said other progressive cities, most recently New York City, have lowered rates for the elderly and said Rochester "with the highest percentage of senior citizens of any American community" should waste no time in catching up.

**Social Security Celebrating
34th Anniversary This Month**

With over 24 million Americans receiving \$2.5 billion a month in social security benefits and 20 million people insured by Medicare, the Social Security Administration is celebrating this month its 34th anniversary.

The anniversary is being observed with ceremonies and special displays in many social security offices throughout the country as well as at the National Headquarters in Woodlawn, Maryland, just outside Baltimore. At the headquarters an historical room is being opened this week showing mementos of the agency's history including the desk used by all the heads of the Social Security System since 1935.

When President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed the Social Security Act into law on August 14, 1935, he called it "the cornerstone of a structure which is being built but is by no means complete."

The original law provided for old-age benefits to retired workers in industry and commerce only. Over the years, the Social Security Program has expanded so that it now provides financial protection for virtually everyone in the country.

The first benefits to retired workers were paid in 1940. By that time, amendments to the law had been passed to provide additional benefits for the dependents and survivors of insured workers.

In 1950 and thereafter, coverage was extended to millions of other people who were not covered under the original law -- farm workers, State and local government employees, domestic workers, ministers, self-employed doctors, professionals and members of the armed forces.

In 1956, disability protection was added to cover the thousands of people who could no longer work because of serious illness or injury.

"In its first quarter of century," said Joseph Tomaino, district director, "Social Security had already grown into a program that protected a worker and his family in the event of his retirement, death, or disability. But it didn't stop there."

In 1965, Congress created Medicare to help people 65 and older pay hospital, doctor, and other medical bills. In just 3 short years, Medicare has covered 17 million hospital stays of elderly people. And there were more than one million admissions for posthospital extended care. Older people have also received visits in their homes from visiting nurses, physical therapists, and other health care specialists, paid for by Medicare.

Payments under the Hospital Insurance Program totaled \$10.9 billion for the 3-year period, and a total of \$4.6 billion has been paid under the Medical Insurance Program, which helps pay for doctor bills and other medical services.

In 1967, still other changes were made. Disabled widows became eligible for benefits at age 50, people disabled before 31 needed less work to qualify for benefits, and children became eligible on their mother's earnings record on the same basis as on their father's.

Through the years, increases in monthly benefit amounts were made to keep pace with the rising cost of living. Today's average monthly benefit to a retired worker is \$95, compared to \$63 ten years ago. The average benefit for a retired couple is \$166 a month, compared to \$111 ten years ago. "One out of every four beneficiaries is well below retirement age -- young widows, children, and disabled workers and their dependents," said Tomaino. The protection afforded American families in the event of a worker's death has a face value of \$960 billion in potential survivors' benefits. "Ten million people are kept above the poverty level in this country because they are getting social security benefits," Tomaino said. "Since they have paid into the program for years, they have earned the right to receive their benefit checks -- and do so with dignity."

New Moon View At Planetarium

Would you like a view of the moon as only two people in all recorded history have seen it? This experience awaits visitors to the Strasenburgh Planetarium. Thanks to a new piece of scientific equipment now on display in the Planetarium lobby, on loan from Bausch & Lomb.

The view featured is the lunar surface as seen by our Apollo astronauts, based on pictures taken by the crew of Apollo 8 with a specially-designed Hasselblad camera.

Schools Opening Next Wednesday

All Rochester Public Schools will open next Wednesday, Sept. 3. Morning sessions for all grades will be held on Wednesday and Thursday and Friday will be a full day of school.

Kindergarten children should be accompanied by a parent on Wednesday. On Thursday morning only those kindergarten children scheduled for morning sessions will report for the entire half-day session.

Children entering kindergarten must be five years of age on or before Dec. 1, 1969. If a kindergarten or elementary school child has not pre-registered, he should register at the school in his district on Thursday, Aug. 28, or Friday, Aug. 29. If a child is unable to register on these dates, he may register on the opening day, Sept. 3, between 8:30 and 11:30 a.m. The birth certificate and health information must be presented to the school at the time of registration.

Parents wishing information concerning the schools their children should attend are asked to call 325-4560, and ask to be connected with the Division of Administration.

A student entering a secondary school for the first time should register as soon as possible at the school which he will attend, but not later than Friday, Aug. 29. Hours of registration are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Birth certificates and health information must be given to school officials at the time of registration. A student entering ninth grade from a parochial school should bring the diploma from that school.

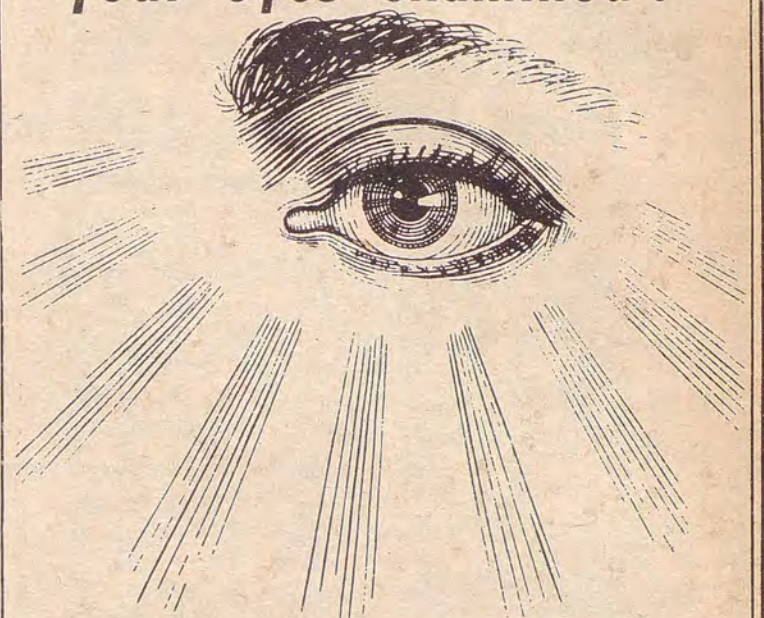

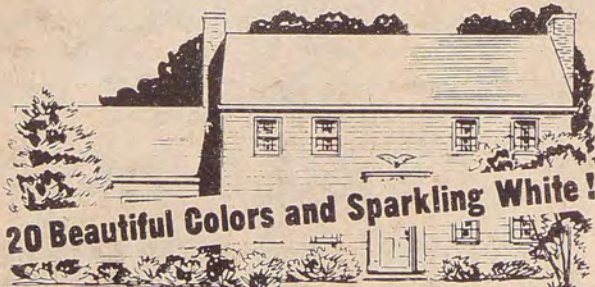

All Agreed—Emerson Dump Must Go, Neighbors Form Association

Everyone is agreed that the Emerson Landfill must go, Democrats and Republicans alike. The Republicans are sharply critical of any further delay and the Democrats are blaming the GOP for starting the landfill in the first place and also for not coming up with another landfill area so that the Emerson dump can be closed.

In the meantime, residents of the area have organized their own neighborhood association and are raising their voices in a demand for early action.

Statements have been issued by all concerned. Two Republican candidates for City Council, Mervyn Kroll and John Parrinello, have suggested use of a piece of privately owned land in Livingston county, near Caledonia which

they say would accommodate city refuse for the next 20 years. (A county legislator from that area, also a Republican, has come out against this proposal since it would involve large truck movement through nearby towns on their way to the proposed dump).

"The two Republicans have been making a lot of noise", says Councilman Andrew Celli, a Democrat. He says the landfill is a creation of the Republicans (in 1956) and claims "the city could close the dump tomorrow if the Republican county legislature had kept its word and had sanitary landfills in operation in the towns for both city and town use. Obviously the Republicans in the county don't even let the Republicans in the city know what's going on".

First Democrats' Dinner On Sept. 19

The First Ward Democratic Organization is having its annual candidates' campaign dinner and dance at the Maplewood Party House Friday, September 19th at 6:30 p.m. Expected to be there are Democratic County Chairman Robert Quigley, candidates for city councilman at large, Mayor Frank Lamb, Vice Mayor Moris Pirrello, Councilman William Mallory, Dr. Louis Cerulli and Laplois Ashford. Many other party officials will also attend.

The First Ward, which is split into two County Legislative districts, will also honor its two County Legislative candidates, William Terra from the 27th district and Harold (Jeff) Wilkin in the 28th district.

William Dady, county committeeman for many years in the first district of the ward, is running for constable on the Democratic slate. Ralph Annucci has been constable since the new ward boundaries were created in 1963. Annucci

Council Candidates Urged To "Resign From School Board"

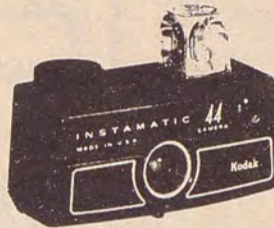

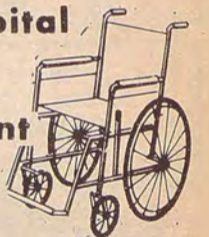

DEAR FELLOW CITIZENS:

Taxes unquestionably are a matter of great concern to all of our citizens today. The taxes on property have been subject to an uncommonly high increase from 1968. It is important for every taxpayer to understand the reason.

Property is taxed for a variety of services - - fire, water, sewer and lighting districts to finance these special services. You also are familiar with the school tax and the combined State, County, Town tax bill.

In all, a total of some \$139 million is collected in various kinds of taxes on property in Monroe County. The County government is responsible for only 20 per cent of this - - only \$1 in \$5 of the total tax burden.

While County taxes have increased from 1968 to 1969, Monroe County still has the second lowest tax rate of any County in the over-500,000 population class in New York State. Other counties have encountered the same kind of cost increases that have affected this community.

Every effort is being made to check rising taxes. Your County Legislature cut four million from the basic budget for 1969; I was one of the foremost advocates of this action.

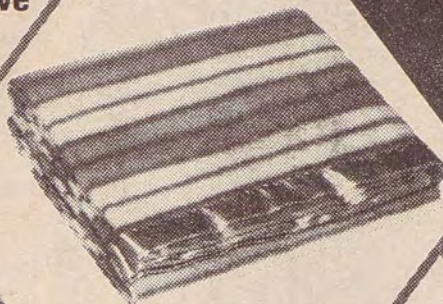

Trash Disposal Political Issue?

Disposal of the city's trash which has been a sore subject for many years could well be a factor in the 1969 elections, according to some political observers. The Emerson landfill or dump (depending on the political point of view) continues to make the headlines.

City Manager Seymour Scher has come out with a flat prediction that the Emerson landfill will be closed down next spring and that another dumping ground will be found. Republicans are pressing for an earlier solution and several hundred people whose homes are in the affected area stormed City Council chambers last week and intend to continue their protesting until the closing is an accomplished fact.

Scher says the city plans to ask construction bids for a refuse disposal transfer station on the site of the West Side incinerator by the end of October. He says the city is looking for landfill sites outside the city and a Democratic-sponsored resolution calling for creation of a countywide refuse disposal district has won unanimous support from the council.

Vietnam Efforts Win Commendation

A letter of commendation from the commanding general of the U.S. Army Support Command in Vietnam has been presented to John F. Manfreda of the Electronics division of General Dynamics. Manfreda, of 411 Flower City Pk., has just returned from a 12 month tour of duty in Vietnam where he served as field service representative for military radios manufactured by the Electronics division.

Manfreda was primarily responsible for the AN/GRC-106 radio set built by the Electronics division for the U.S. Army. The lightweight radio provides ten times the effective signal power and twice the range of previous equipment although it is only half the weight.

Brigadier General James W. Gunn said Manfreda's efforts were "directly responsible for achieving a high operational readiness rate of this vital tactical communications equipment, and his contributions have materially assisted our counter-insurgency effort in the Republic of Vietnam."

The commendation cited Manfreda for his "valuable technical assistance provided during the past

12 months." Due to the wide dispersal of General Dynamics equipment, considerable travel was required frequently through hazardous, unsecured areas throughout the tactical zone.

General Gunn stated that Manfreda "displayed initiative, endurance and an attitude of genuine cooperation. He not only gave direct assistance at field sites to restore equipment to operation, he also organized and conducted classes of instruction for operators and maintenance personnel."

This was Manfreda's second tour of duty in Vietnam as a field service representative of the Electronics division. He has served a total of 17 months in this capacity. Field service engineers at the division are currently providing field engineering and training support for more than 7,000 items of equipment throughout the world.

Mr. Hill expressed annoyance at the baseless rumors which he said have greatly upset his family.

"We are not racists", says Mrs. Urquhart "and we are not opposed to open housing. There are black families here now and our children play with their children. What we are asking is that our children be allowed to go to school here in our own neighborhood and not be bused elsewhere."

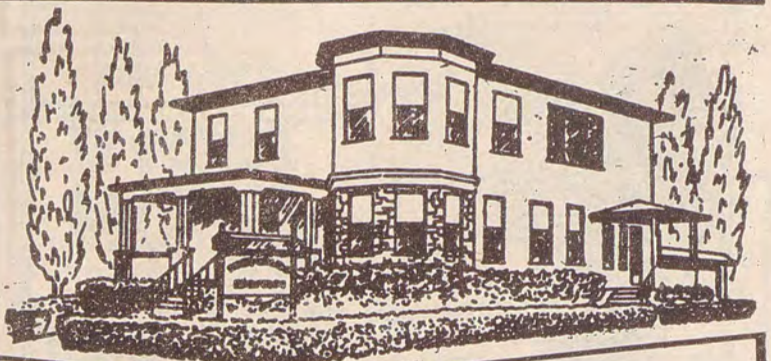

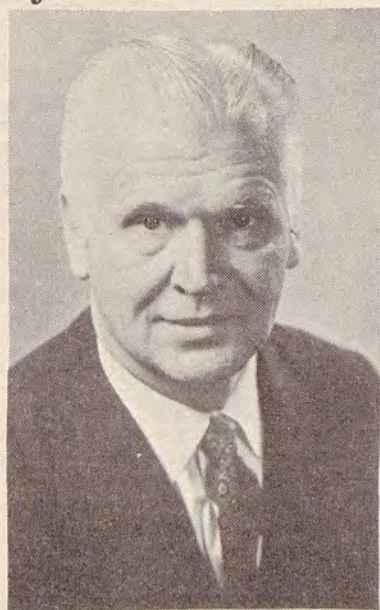

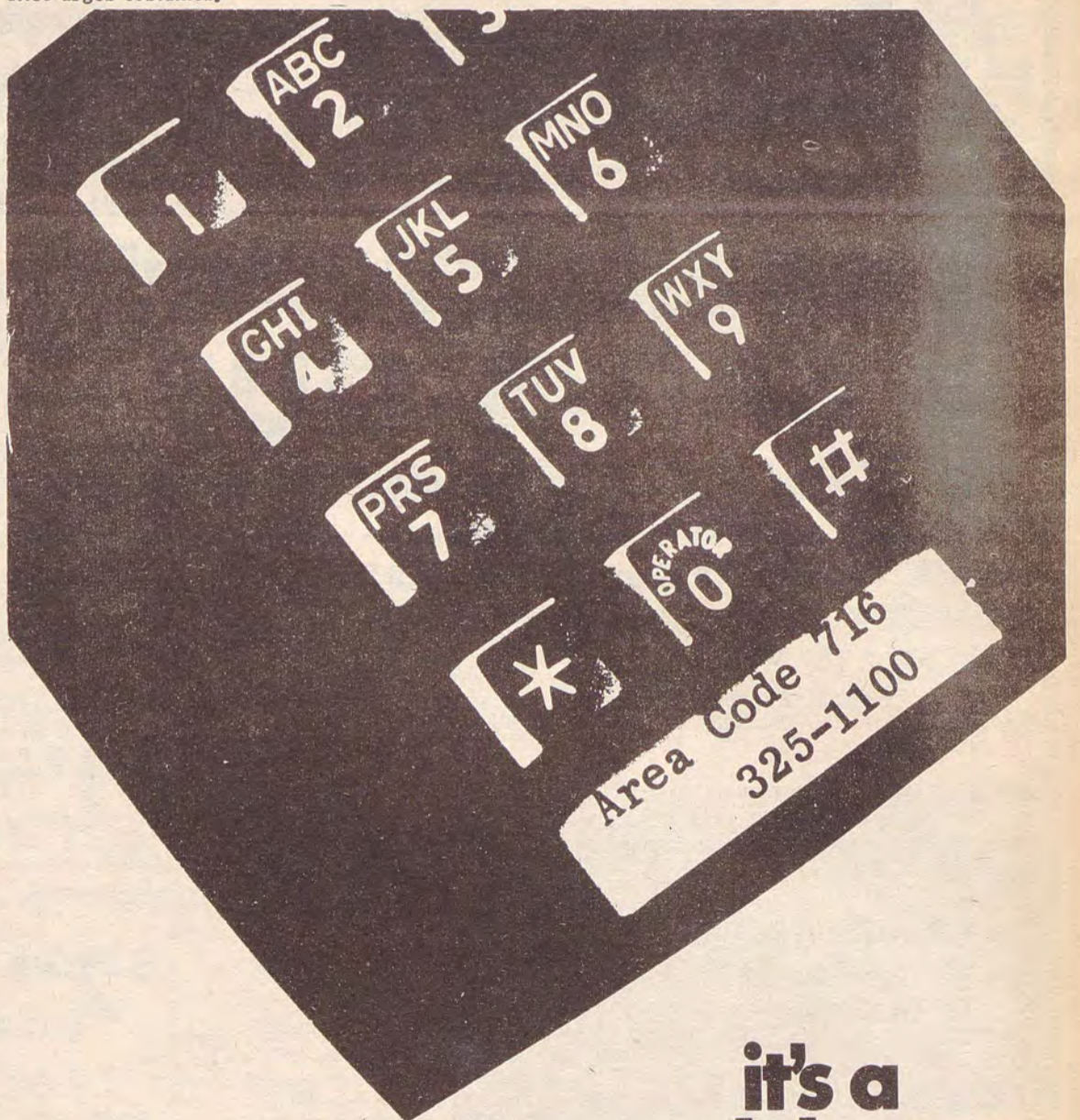
