Ellsworth S. Beeley of Ridgeway Ave. has been re-appointed as chief of the Auxiliary Police Service of Rochester. Beeley, 51, had served previously in this capacity under the directorship of Col. Robert N. Abbott, retiring after the latter's death in 1964.

Auxiliary Chief Beeley's first official duty has been to issue a call for volunteers who are needed to perform the service of traffic control at special events and church services, and assist regular police officers in other assignments. New Postoffice Ready in Spring?

The new branch postoffice replacing the station on Driving Park Ave. will be ready in about six months if there are no unforeseen problems. This is the plan of the Nosilla Corporation, the holding company formed by Michael Piehler to do the building.

The old garage at 376 Lexington Ave. will be razed as soon as possible to make way for the post-office building which will have about 4,000 square feet of floor space. Parking space will be provided alongside the building. The house at 386 Lexington Ave. also is included in the plot plan for driveway and parking purposes.

A ten year lease with option of renewal is being taken by the government. Rental is reported to be \$21,800 per year. Piehler estimates that the building and land will cost about \$185,000, but this is not definite since selection of the builder is in process.

Another move necessitated by the changes in the Dewey-Driving Park area was indicated this week when Samuel DiJune announced that his fruit and vegetable store, about to be demolished for addition to the Wegman land holdings, will be moved to another, as yet undisclosed site in the same general area.

Tips From The Lab

Cardiac patients and others who are on salt free diets should keep in mind that there are sources of sodium other than table salt.

One other source, for example, is monosodium glutamate, which is present in products designed to enhance the flavor of meats and other foods.

Another is of water softener, which substitutes sodium for certain minerals to make "hard" water "soft".

Some baking powders often contain sodium, and so do some sweetening agents.

If you are on a salt free diet, you should consult your physician about these other sources of sodium.

Vietnam Protest Joined By Church

Christ Presbyterian Church, by vote of its Session, is supporting the National Moratorium today and has urged its parishioners to participate. The church building in Locust St. is open for all groups today.

The Session passed a resolution encouraging friends and fellow workers to take a stand on the war in Vietnam and to write their congressmen. All are urged to wear black armbands today in mourning for the war dead.

The resolution also stated:

"Whereas the war in Viet Nam has already claimed 45,000 American lives, 94,000 South Vietnamese lives, and 547,000 North Vietnamese lives, and has brought, not freedom for South Viet Nam, but instead misery for all Viet Nam;

"Whereas this utilization of our human and material resources to destroy and kill comes at a time when they are needed here on an unprecedented scale to relieve suffering and hunger, to reunite our people, to save our cities;

"Whereas those who govern and determine our policies must listen if enough of us speak out together, and must act if enough demand it together;

"Whereas October 15, 1969, and days in each month thereafter have been chosen as days of national moratorium on the war in Viet Nam, days for all of us to stop "business as usual" and speak out against this senseless war, demanding that our military presence in Viet Nam be withdrawn,

"Be it therefore resolved that Session support this National Moratorium on the war in Viet Nam and urge members of the congregation to participate."

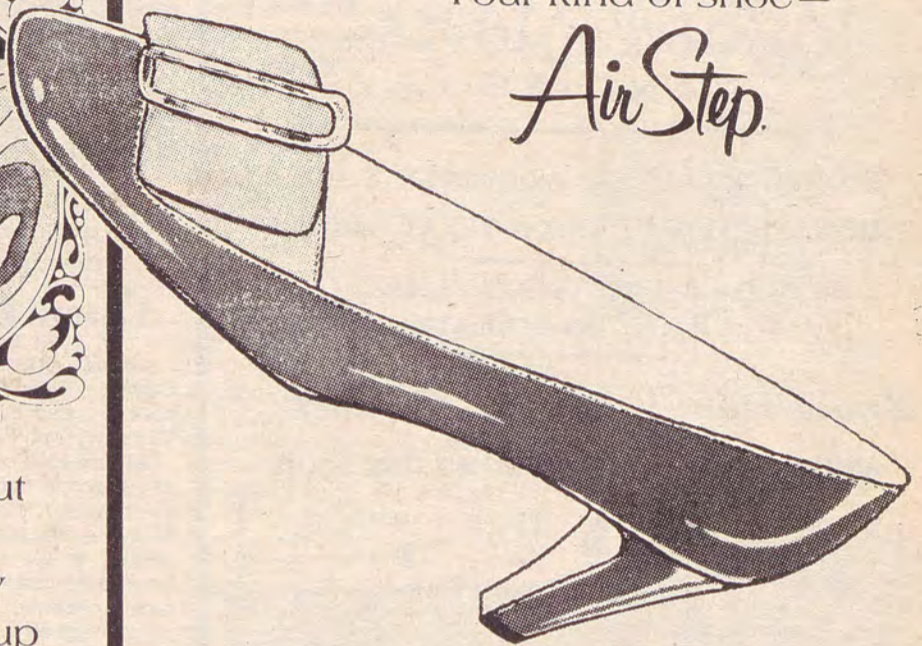

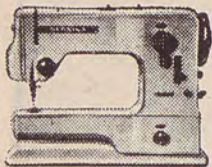

City and County Control At Stake Next Tuesday

The six wards in the Northwest area of Rochester could play a deciding role in the outcome of the elections next Tuesday, in the opinion of some political observers. The local results as far as control of city hall are concerned could mean the difference in a close election.

In the county legislative race, the Republicans could lose all four seats, the 26th, 27th, 28th and 29th and still retain control since they have a 24 to 5 edge now. But in the City Council battle with only five seats at stake and ten strong major party contestants anything could happen in the Northwest area which is heavily weighted in favor of the GOP enrollment-wise, but quite often independent and sometimes Democratic in its leanings. The Republicans must elect four Councilmen to get a 5-4 majority. The Democrats must elect only two Councilmen to retain control.

Some voters are understandably confused as to which county legislative district they are in since the dividing lines are quite jagged. If in doubt, they should consult candidates, their ward leaders or committeemen; or call the Board

of Elections.

A State Assemblyman is also being elected to take the place vacated by Charles F. Stockmeister. John Damico (D) and William Steinfeldt (R) are making strong bids for the post and both the Democratic and Republican State organizations are anxious about the outcome since it could affect control of the closely-divided Assembly.

Also to be chosen Tuesday are two family court judges, three school commissioners, a district attorney and a county clerk. There are constable candidates in all six wards, but there are contests in only the First, Ninth and Tenth,

AMENDMENTS ON THE BALLOT

There are four proposed Amendments to the State Constitution on the ballot. Each has been passed as prescribed by the Constitution. To become effective, an Amendment must also be approved by a majority of the voters who cast a vote on it.

LOANS FOR HOSPITALS AND RELATED FACILITIES

No. 1

This would permit the loan of State or municipal funds or credit for the construction of Hospitals and related facilities. At present public money or credit may not be given or loaned to a private individual or organization for this purpose. The Amendment would make long term, low interest loans available for the improvement and construction of non-profit and limited profit health facilities.

JOB DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

No. 2

The State-guaranteed borrowing power of the New York Job Development Authority would be increased from \$50 million to \$150 million if this Amendment is approved. The Authority, established in 1962 to stimulate industrial development in New York, it makes loans to non-profit community corporations to finance new businesses or to expand or rehabilitate existing ones.

CONSERVATION, THE STATE NATURE AND HISTORICAL PRESERVE

No. 3

This Amendment would add a "Bill of Rights" for conservation to the Constitution, making it State policy to conserve and protect our natural resources and scenic

beauty. It would allow the State to acquire new lands for these purposes which could not be disposed of unless two legislative sessions approved. The Legislature would curb air and water pollution and unnecessary noise; protect agricultural lands, wetlands, and the shorelines; and develop and regulate water resources. Present "Forever Wild" provisions of the Constitution would be continued.

APPORTIONMENT

No. 4

This Amendment would require the State to count all residents in setting up State Senate and Assembly districts, as it does for Congressional districts. Aliens are now excluded in figuring the population of each legislative district.

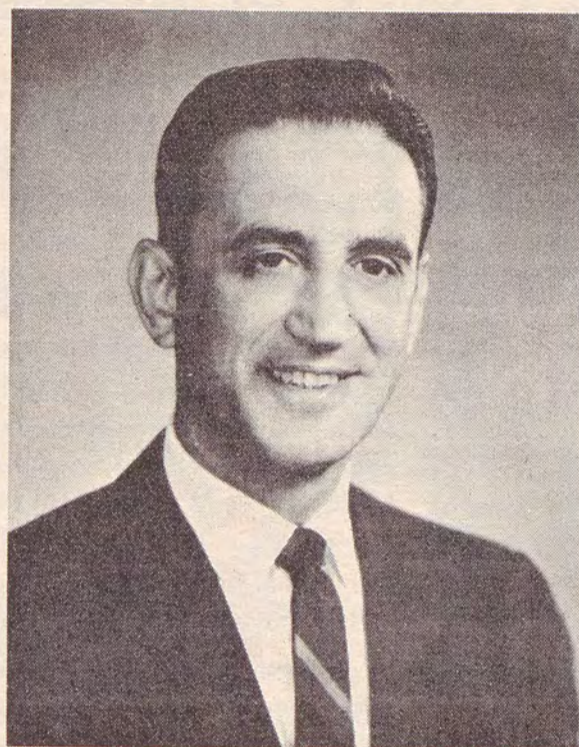

"Twenty-Eight" TOPICS

Many times during the current campaign I've been asked to tell voters just what the County Legislature has done for city residents. It can be simply stated:

Through the efforts of the Republican majority, services worth more than \$2.4 million were transferred this year from the City budget to the County budget, eliminating this cost from the city tax bill and spreading it more fairly throughout the entire county.

During the past year the County Legislature approved the transfer from City to County the Stutson Street Bridge (\$70,000), Probation

Dept. (\$130,000), Weights and Measures (\$98,000), Central Library Services (\$1,216,000), Museum (\$387,000), and Vital Statistics (\$41,000). Also transferred to the County was an estimated \$530,000 in debt service for these consolidations, making a grand total of \$2,472,000.

I voted for all of these transfers because, along with other members of the Republican majority, I believed they would bring about lower city taxes and benefit the people of my district. I felt these services - used by the entire county - should be financed by the entire county. Rather than lower taxes, the Democratic city administration actually put through a concealed tax INCREASE through the use of embellishments or fees for services. Call it taxes or fees, every city property owner paid MORE than last year, despite these transfers of services to the County budget.

But the County Legislature has not stopped there in its attempts to ease the tax burden. I recently traveled to Washington with other Republican members of the Legislature (at our own expense), to ask for a larger share of federal tax money to be returned to New York State and Monroe County. We also urged federalization of the Social Services structure, in the firm belief that programs mandated by the federal government be financed by the federal government.

Back home, the Economic Task Force and the Courtney Commission (made up of industry, business and bank officials) have been hard at work on the task of reorganizing the County governmental structure and cutting costs wherever possible. The Task Force alone has recommended the elimination

of jobs and services totalling over \$2 million. These jobs are not all unnecessary, but we firmly believe that the taxpayer of Monroe County has reached his limit. Cuts in services must be made, and the place to make them is in programs which benefit only a small percentage of the County population.

What has the County Legislature done for city residents? We have tried to reduce taxes for people living in the city, to cut costs and to obtain more help from the federal government. I am proud to have been a part of these programs to keep the county working for the city, and I hope you'll allow me to continue on our behalf for another term.

Next Tuesday, pull down levers 8A or 8C, and cast your vote for a real voice in County government.

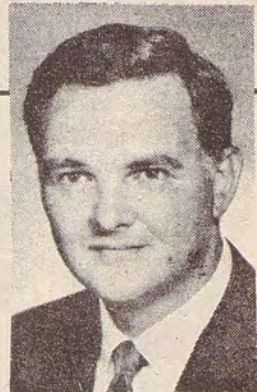

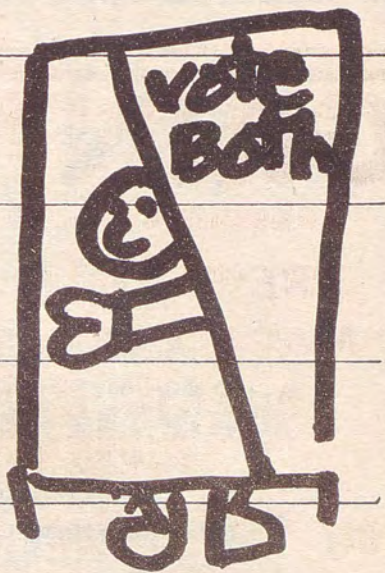
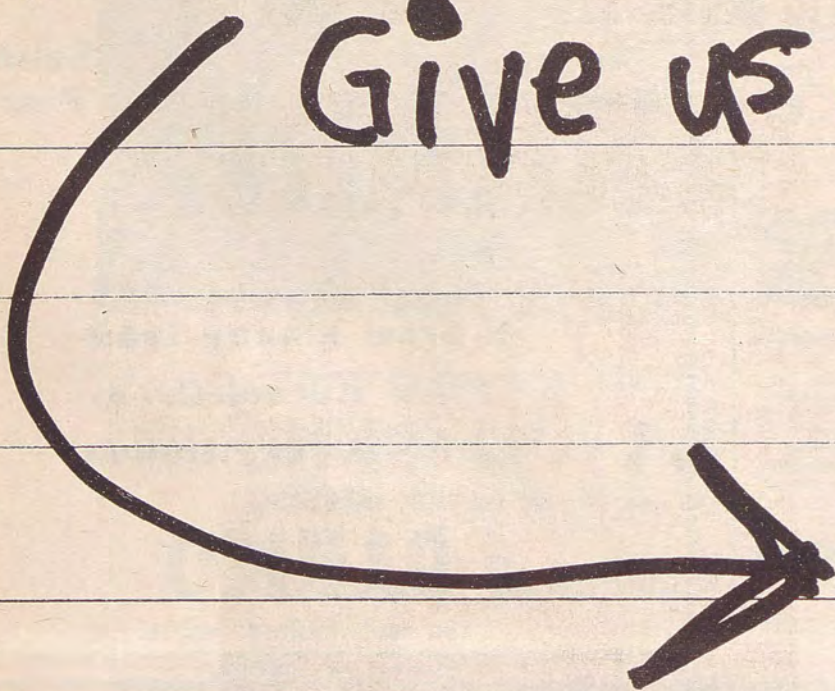

Community Savings Notes Centennial

Mayor Frank T. Lamb presented a commemorative scroll to The Community Savings Bank last Friday, citing the bank's one-hundred years of service to the Rochester community. John E. Schubert, Community's president, accepted the citation in his office at 235 East Main St.

The presentation by the Mayor marked the opening of the bank's two-week centennial celebration.

Community started its long history in November 1869 as the East Side Savings Bank. Assets have increased from \$50,000 the first year to \$371,000,000 today.

In 1944, East Side merged with the Mechanics Savings Bank and became The Community Savings Bank of Rochester.

John Schubert joined Community in 1944 (the year of the merger) and was elected president in 1965. Three presidents have directed the successful course of the bank: Joseph H. Zweeres was the first to take office and served until July, 1946, when he relinquished the position to Charles W. Carson. Carson's tenure covered 18 years.

When the name "Community" was chosen for the merged banks, it was intended to be descriptive and significant. It was hoped that the bank would serve not only the whole Rochester Community, but smaller neighborhood communities as well.

This hope has been realized in the opening of neighborhood offices when and where permitted to do so by the New York State Banking Department, says Schubert. The bank now has seven locations with an eighth on the drawing board. In 1950 Community was the first savings bank in Rochester to open a branch office in a shopping center (Waring Road) and the first to locate a branch office outside the city limits when the Pittsford office was opened in 1960.

In accepting the centennial citation, Schubert said, "In our many endeavors we are proud to represent our thousands of customers who are truly the Rochester community. As we enter our second century of service, we believe there will be even more opportunities for public service in our forward-looking city and county."

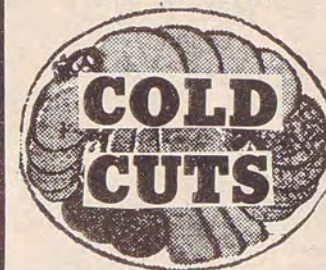

The following article is published as a public service at the request of the Real Estate Board of Rochester.

One small light bulb can help a citizen show his opposition to violation of the law - - - a porch light will do it or even a candle in the darkness.

The Real Estate Board of Rochester is concerned about the statistics which show an increasing number of crimes; most of them committed under the cover of darkness. It has been proven that lighting our property can appreciably cut these statistics; therefore the Real Estate Board, through its Make America Better program, proposes a "Light the Night" campaign in Rochester.

Lighting up the night is one of the most effective and inexpensive ways of showing your opposition to crime. For pennies a day, acts of violence which cost this country billions of dollars annually, can be drastically cut.

Recruiting Women For Health Aides

Volunteers are being sought by the Monroe County Department of Health and the Rochester-Monroe County Chapter of the American Red Cross for a program that County Health Director Dr. Wendell R. Ames said will save taxpayers many thousands of dollars.

Under the program, the Red Cross is recruiting women to assist Health Department physicians and nurses in clinics, in public and parochial school health offices, and in vision screening tests. The Health Department will train the volunteers in administrative and record-keeping duties necessary to the operation of such services. Each volunteer will contribute two half days per week.

"This program is an excellent example of how voluntary agency can help a public agency in the provision of vital services to the community," Dr. Ames said. "The volunteers will relieve physicians and nurses of an increasing amount of administrative work. Their help will save thousands in tax dollars."

The sessions are designed to encourage group discussion and mutual support. Information about smoking and health will be provided by films, physician lecturers and other health educators.

You now have the facts. You now know that lights are a hindrance to crime. You now know that the cost to you is minimal, but that the price you may pay if you don't light your property tonight could be your life.

The cost of porch lighting, as prepared by the Rate and Economic Research Department of Rochester Gas & Electric Corp.

Average cost per month to burn a lamp 4 hours each night, 60 watt lamp - 12¢ month; 75 watt lamp - 15¢ month; 100 watt lamp - 21¢ month.

The above estimates are based upon a customer's use falling within the 300-800 kilowatt hours per month range. Smaller use customers will pay a little more; while those who use more will pay a little less. Any customer using over 100 kilowatts per month can use any size up to 100 watts for 4 hours per night for less than one cent per night.

ELECTION RESULTS ANALYZED

Republicans Rejoice; Democrats Depressed

The surprising Republican clean sweep at the polls on Election Day was aided and abetted by the six Northwest wards, Nos. 1, 9, 10, 15, 20 and 24. The four GOP city councilmen-elect did very well here as did most of the successful school commissioners and the three Republican County Legislators now representing this area, together with a fourth, all won election.

Here are the county legislator winners:

Joseph Ferrari over George Scialdone by about 500 votes in the 26th; Joseph Esposito over William Terra by about 1100 votes in the 27th; John Romano over Harold (Jeff) Wilkin by about 500 votes in the 28th; and Jerry Clifford over William Petrella by about 850 in the 29th.

Democratic leaders blamed a smaller than usual turnout of supporters at the polls and the Republicans credited their victory to hard work. Regardless, the county and city are now firmly in Republican hands for at least two years and there will be many changes at least in top personnel at City Hall on Jan. 1.

The First Ward, which incidentally was the only one to elect a Democratic constable, went strongly for John Parrinello (R) and Mayor Frank Lamb (D) with Stephen May, (R), Dr. Louis Cerulli (D), Robert Wood (R) and William Malley (D) about even. It went Republican by a narrow margin for school board, but gave a good margin to John M. Regan (D)

over Jack Lazarus (R) for district attorney and to John Damico (D) over William Steinfeldt (R) for Assemblyman, 134th District. The Ninth and Tenth Wards had a strong Republican flavor in every contest. The Ninth preferred May, Wood, Parrinello and Roche with only Cerulli and Lamb coming close. In the Tenth, all Republican Council candidates including Merwyn Kroll, the lone GOP loser, came out ahead. May was an outstanding favorite by over 250 votes. In the school board race, it was a walkaway for the Republicans and likewise for all the other contested offices. The 15th Ward stayed in the Democratic column except for a big vote for Parrinello; and a No. 1

rating for Republican Emilio Serrano for school commissioner. Serrano, a Tenth Warder, apparently has won by 13 votes, but Republicans are awaiting the official count by the Board of Elections before claiming his election and a clean sweep of the school board. The 20th Ward which often has Democratic tendencies favored most of the Republicans and in the race for City Council chose all the winners and placed them almost in the same order they finished, including Lamb in the fifth position. The 24th Ward had mixed emotions. In addition to endorsement of favorite son Esposito, it favored many Republicans. For Council, it gave pluralities to Parrinello, May and Roche of the GOP and Democrats Cerulli and Pirello. For the school board it voted for Dorothy Phillips (R), Gordon DeHond (R) and Catherine Kelly (D). It was Republican in all the other races except a narrow plurality for John Damico in the assembly contest. Assemblyman-elect Steinfeldt got his big support in the town of Greece, but he carried the Ninth and Tenth and came close in losing the First, 15th and 24th. His district does not include the 20th.

Austin Grapenstetter in the 24th and Sandy Macaluso in the 15th, both Republicans, won uncontested constable roles. William Dady (D) won in the First; Sam Bommatei (R) in the Ninth; Ellsworth Beeley (R) in the Tenth; and Alfred Memminger (R) in the 20th.

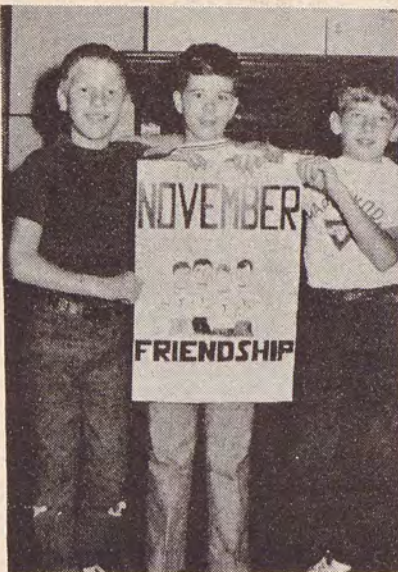

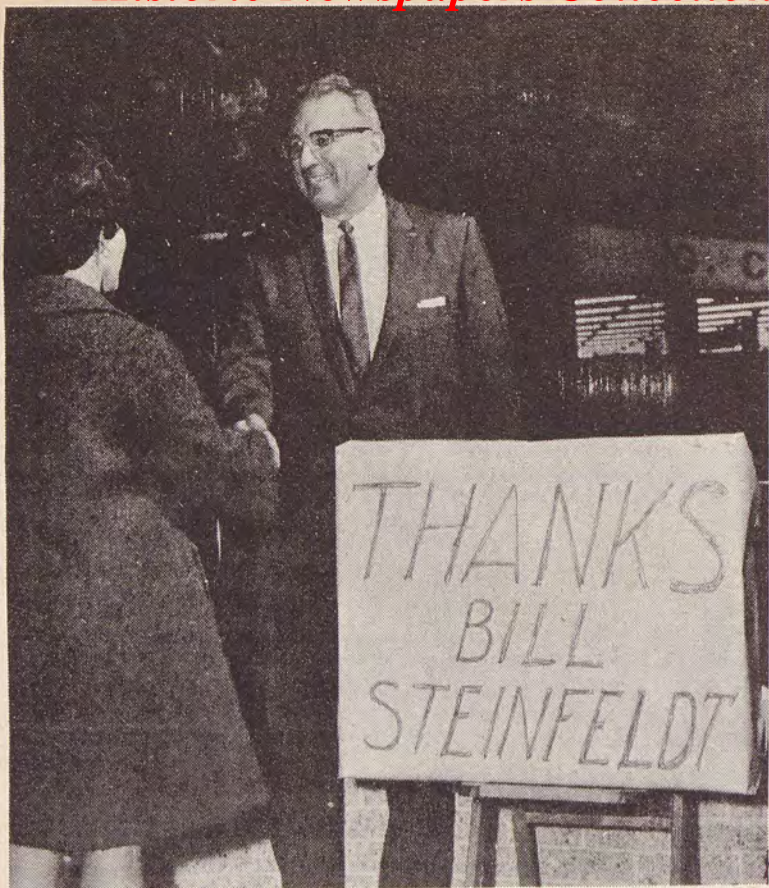

Biafra's Plight To Be Discussed

An Irish missionary who served nine years in the Eastern Region of Nigeria, now called Biafra, will visit Rochester to speak at a public meeting set for 8:30 tonight (Wednesday) at Sacred Heart School, 311 Flower City Pk.

The open forum: "Biafra's Plight... and What's Happening Here" will be sponsored by a Rochester - area citizens' committee, "Emergency Relief for Nigeria/Biafra", organized here over a year ago. The voluntary group has donated \$35,000 to a variety of relief operations including food and medical relief airlifts, and funds to send nine doctors and a nurse for volunteer service for victims of the notorious Nigeria/Biafra famine.

The Rev. Joseph M. McHugh, C.S.Sp., a native of Galway, Ireland came to the United States from Biafra in July. He has coordinated refugee and relief operations in the blockaded enclave, and will show a sound and color film. He is in America under the auspices of Catholic Relief Services and Joint Church Aid, an interfaith consortium which operates the only major airlift still getting food into the famine area.

Also speaking will be a representative of Emergency Relief for Nigeria/Biafra, reporting actions to provide relief and help end the war. ERN/B takes no sides in the African civil war and is neither pro-Biafran nor pro-Nigerian.

Master of ceremonies will be Larry Attinasi, co-chairman of Operation Medicorps, a Rochester based medical relief group. The Rev. Richard Norman Hughes, executive director of the Rochester Council of Churches, Inc., will give the invocation. Rabbi Allan Levine, Temple Emanu-El, will give the benediction.

**Republican Plans For Young People

A plea for more participation in city government by the younger people of the community expressed by Councilman and Mayor-elect Stephen May in a talk he gave at the induction of Honor Society members of West High School last Friday, is reprinted herewith:
"In your school work you have sought and achieved excellence", said May. "All of us in government have an obligation to be no less zealous in seeking excellence - - in terms of personnel, programs and performance."

"Rochester needs excellence in its city government if we are to overcome our version of the urban crisis.

"I believe we can blend an improved performance by city government with the increased involvement of private enterprise and an interested citizenry to make this a better city. No community is better equipped with people, resources and civic pride to do the job.

"With the newly-elected City Councilmen averaging 33 years of age, we will have a young majority on City Council. Young people will play a major role in the new city administration, in appointive as well as elective office. We hope to attract bright, young employees with new ideas to city government.

"The newly-elected Republican city team feels that the young people of this community represent an untapped source of ideas, energy and enthusiasm which should be harnessed actively in the cause of good government. We hope to make citizen participation in city government a reality, for young and old alike.

Sears Distributing Funds To Colleges

Grants totaling \$1.5 million will be distributed to privately supported colleges and universities this week by The Sears-Roebuck Foundation, T. J. Coffey, local representative of the Foundation, said today.

More than 950 private, accredited two and four year institutions across the country will participate. They will receive \$1 million in unrestricted funds and an additional \$500,000 through a new Sears Foundation program to assist college and university libraries.

In New York State, 96 colleges and universities will receive grants totaling \$117,300. In the Rochester area, The University of Rochester, St. John Fisher, Rochester Institute of Technology, Roberts Wesleyan College, and Nazareth College of Rochester will receive grants totaling \$12,750, he said.

The unrestricted funds may be used by schools as they deem necessary. Funds through the college library grant program are designed to supplement the normal book acquisition budgets of the participating institutions, Coffey said.

In addition to its grant programs, The Sears Foundation will invest more than \$700,000 during the current year in various student financial aid and other educational programs. This will bring higher education expenditures by the Sears-Roebuck Foundation to more than \$2,225,000 in 1969.

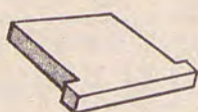

Kodak Opens New Medical Facility

A convenient new medical facility has opened on Weiland Rd. to serve the 8,000 Kodak Park Division employees who work within the plant's expanding western areas.

The new facility occupies 11,000 square feet in the northwest part of the new Industrial Relations Division branch building, a structure that also houses employee photo sales, a large cafeteria, training classrooms and an Eastman Savings and Loan Association office. The medical area is entered from the main floor lobby.

The medical unit's professional staff includes physicians, an optometrist, nurses, a laboratory and an x-ray technician.

Medical services include x-ray, clinical laboratory, electro-cardiography, and emergency treatment room, whirlpool and diathermy, eye examinations, eyeglass fitting and repair, audiograms, and part-time nutrition counseling -- all the services already available in Building 2, about four miles distant on the east side of Kodak Park. The medical department in Building 2 opened in the middle thirties and now serves the 21,000 employees not served by the new western medical unit.

Transportation to the new facility is available by regularly scheduled bus or station wagon from all the areas it serves. Emergency transportation will be supplied, as required.

The current upsurge in the use of copper bracelets has been helped along by a number of show business personalities who have worn and demonstrated them during television appearances says the B.B.B. Often, charges the B.B.B.,

**Debate Troubles
In City Schools**

Trouble in the schools continues to be a subject of hot debate with Dr. Louis Cerulli, member of the School Board, saying that schools are going from bad to worse and that "he wouldn't send his kid to a city high school, and I don't blame anybody who wants their kids taken out of schools or transferred. As far as I am concerned, all the schools in our system are bad".

Dr. Cerulli has threatened to resign his seat on the Board, but is reported as re-considering due to a difference with the Democratic organization over whom his successor might be.

In the meantime Councilman Robert F. Wood has charged Dr. Cerulli as being "irresponsible and says Dr. Cerulli is doing the Rochester city schools a disservice. "Any person who honestly believes what you appear to believe should not remain on the School Board", says Wood. In a letter to Dr. Cerulli, Wood wrote:

"I firmly believe that all incidents of violence should be reported at once, but I also believe that something should be done in a positive manner about the problems in our schools, other than talking about them. Last year, Commissioners Phillips and Roche solicited your support for my resolution, which I introduced in City Council, calling upon the City Council to meet with the School Board to review the recommendations of the Meagher Report and to implement some of them. You refused to lend support to that resolution.

"Please be advised that I will reintroduce that resolution at the Council meeting Tuesday, Nov. 25. If you are as concerned about our schools as you claim, then use your influence to have the Democratic majority on the Council support the resolution. If the resolution is voted down, I will reintroduce it after January 1, 1970 when I know it will succeed. I feel, however, that such a matter should not wait until January 1."

The Better Business Bureau says the notion that copper will activate certain body processes is without a scientific basis, although it is an ancient belief that was once widely held. According to the B.B.B., false advertising or labeling claims for the arthritis bracelet have involved the Post Office Department, Federal Trade Commission and Food and Drug Administration in recent years.

The Bureau says some promotions offer copper identification chains, cuff links and other jewelry as arthritis cures.

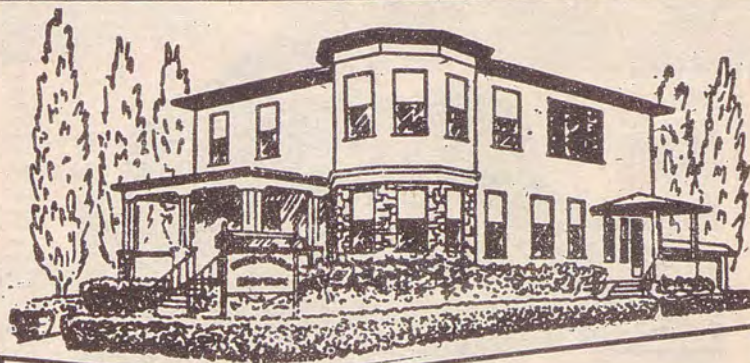

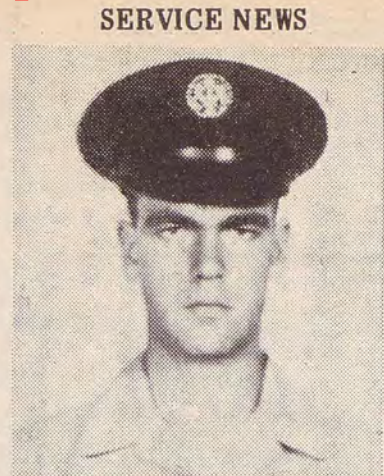

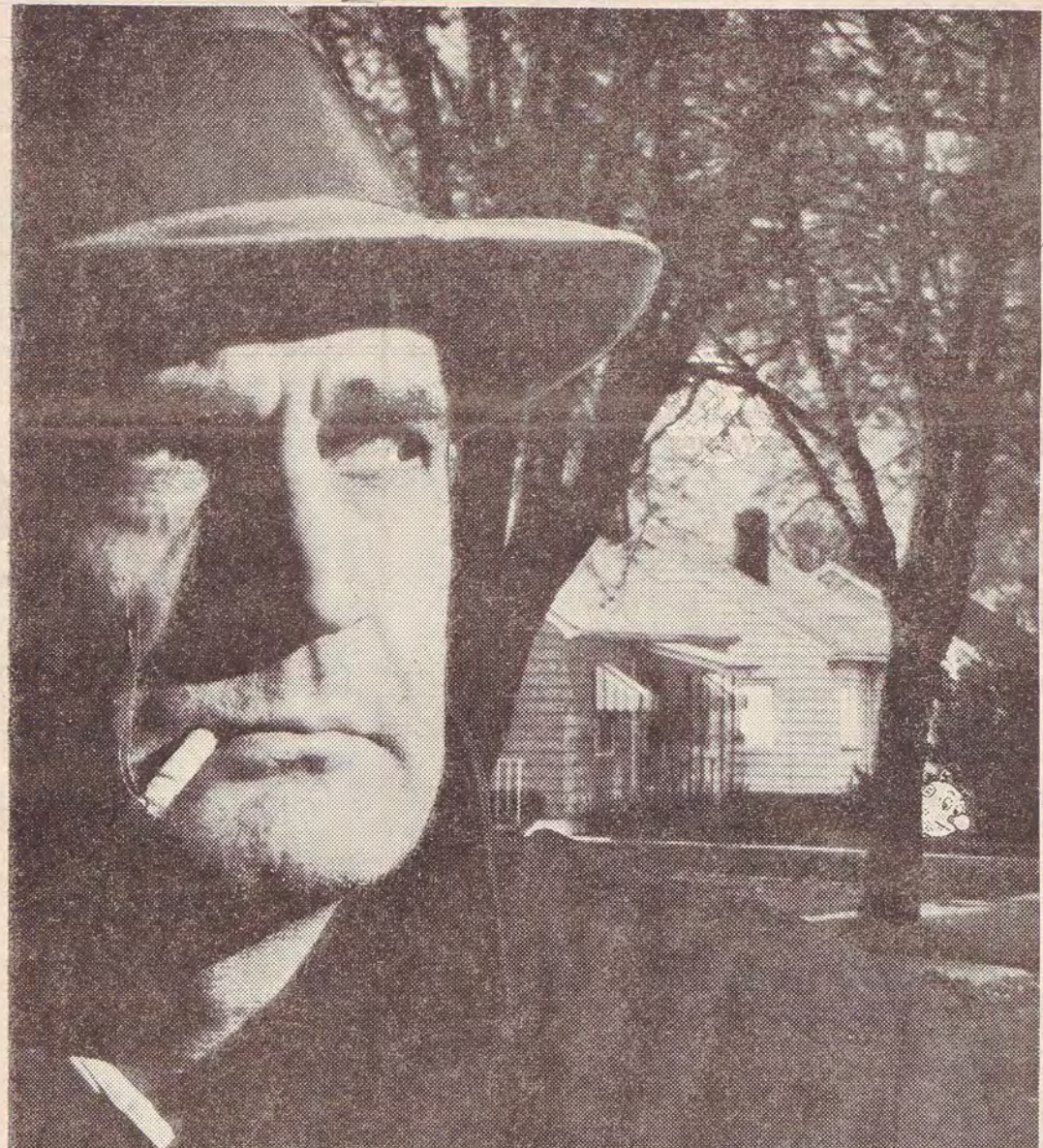

"I feel most strongly about this situation and I feel some positive action should be taken to correct this unhealthy problem. The people responsible should be apprehended and severely dealt with. I am appealing to the parents and the residents of our area to cooperate. If a vandal is seen causing damage to a car, a home, or building, please call the police and if you recognize the person, alert the parents. Be concerned, we live in a good area, help keep it that way.

"I have written the commissioner of public safety, and the chief of police to alert them of the situation. The police have done an outstanding job in our area, and I am certain they will continue to cooperate and assist in every way possible. However, in order to do their job, we must do ours -- be on the lookout, so we can apprehend those responsible for this unwarranted destruction of our property."

RG&E Now Delivers By Atomic Means

The first electricity generated locally by nuclear means flowed into the lines serving Rochester and surrounding communities last week Tuesday. The power was the first to be generated from the Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation's new Ginna Station, located about 16 miles east of Rochester, in Ontario, N. Y. The plant will be operated intermittently at limited power levels for extensive testing and evaluation prior to operation at the maximum licensed capacity of 420,000 kilowatts.

Designed and built by Westinghouse Electric Corp. the plant was completed in the record time of 43 months after the start of construction in April, 1966. Francis E. Drake, Jr., chairman of the board of RG&E, attributed the fine construction record to the "maximum cooperation among Westinghouse, Bechtel Corporation, Gilbert Associates and Rochester Gas and Electric personnel."

Drake also commented that, "After further tests and verification, the plant will become a base load generating source for the Rochester system. It will also provide much needed capacity for the New York Power Pool in 1970".

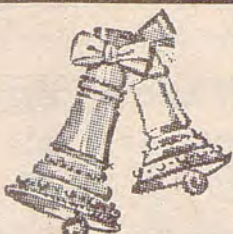

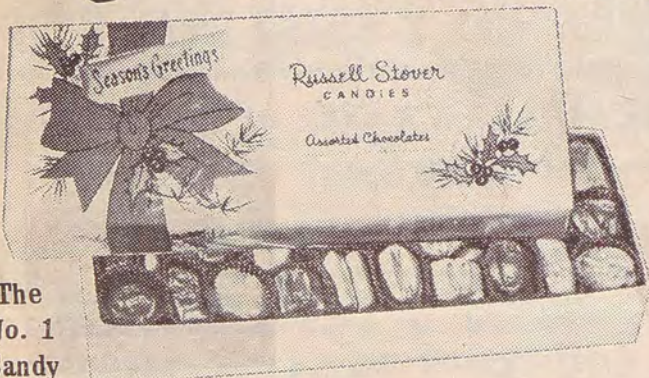

**Better Business Bureau Says
'Watch Out For Gyp Artists'**

Shoppers are warned by the Rochester Better Business Bureau to be watchful of the gyp artists who flourish during the Christmas buying period.

Bureau Manager Robert C. Hildreth said there are a number of schemes that crop up every year. They are according to the Bureau:

- - Unordered merchandise, often sent in the name of an unknown charity or as an outright commercial venture.
- - "Bargain" offers for perfume, cologne or toilet water falsely sold under established brand names or which are said to be a famous brand under a different label.
- - Telephone appeals from unknown charitable organizations for

funds, clothing, food, etc.

- - "Seasonal" stores that open in vacant store rooms for the Christmas season only, selling cheap watches, ties, perfume, toys, gadgets and other shoddy merchandise.

- - Attempts to collect for C.O.D. packages for a neighbor who the deliverer says is not home.

- - Phony pricing on gift items, especially cheap perfume and jewelry and toys.

To avoid Christmas buying problems, the Better Business Bureau offers the following suggestions: Deal only with reliable sellers. Examine all purchases before Christmas Eve.

Remember that "seasonal" stores and itinerant vendors will not be around after the holiday to hear complaints.

Before buying, investigate whether the time can be exchanged and if a guarantee is involved, get it in writing.

When solicited by a charity, check its reputation first.

Beware of the bargains that seem to be too good to be true. The BBB warns that they usually are.

WHY ARE HOSPITAL COSTS SO HIGH?

By Senator James E. Powers

Medical costs have always been concern to the people of New York, however, in recent years the cost of a room at a hospital, which has reached fifty, sixty, and seventy dollars a day, seems outlandish.

Improved medical care has brought increased cost. At one time we could do little to save the dying. Now we can do much, but the use of costly new equipment and specialized experts means an ever increasing expenditure.

A second factor which influences hospital costs is wages and fringe benefits of employees. In fact seventy per cent of all hospital costs are allocated to payroll expenses. Only a few years ago hospital employees were grossly underpaid, and in effect subsidized the patients' costs. Now with the tight labor market and unionization of hospital employees, salaries and fringe benefits have advanced rapidly.

Often I have been asked why one hospital charges fifty, seventy-five, or one hundred per cent more per room day, than another hospital. Hospitals, although all involved in caring for the sick, do not provide the same services and so the costs at one hospital will vary greatly with another hospital. For example, if one hospital provides elaborate and sophisticated facilities to meet every conceivable malady, we can assume this type of expense would have to affect the room per day charge. If one hospital maintains a staff of highly specialized personnel to handle rare but complex maladies we can assume this will increase the room per day charge. If one hospital has a lower ratio of nurses to patients, we can expect an increase in the room per day charge, and certainly if a hospital caters primarily to those patients with long term acute illnesses, their room per day charges will also be higher.

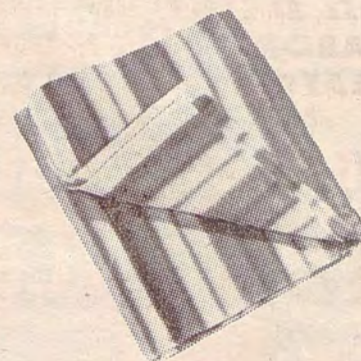

Community Plans Another Branch

Community Savings Bank is making plans to open another branch on the west side of town it was revealed in the end-of-the-year statement by the bank president, John E. Schubert. It will be in this area at 100 West Ave. Opening is set for next February.

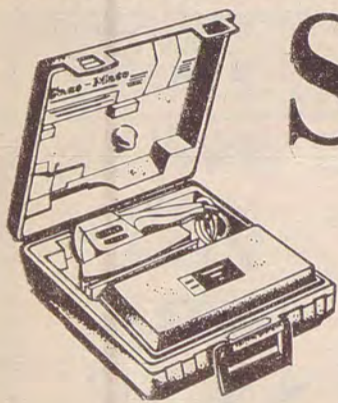

They continued their flight to Japan and came home from Yokohama, as originally planned, on the S. S. President Cleveland.

Verna Volz, the daughter, is now making Bangkok her permanent home and last saw her parents in Holland in July, 1966.

She had arranged for them to see much of Thailand, as well as to experience native customs. One of their biggest thrills came from taking part in an actual wedding ceremony at which Mr. Volz placed crowns on the heads of the bride and groom, making them man and wife. Mrs. Volz placed a lei around the bride's neck as her part in the wedding. "A Moslem groom, a Buddhist bride married by a white Christian layman" is the way they described it.

**Hungarian Refugee Now Engaged
In Water Purification Research**

This is about water, and purification research to make it fresh and drinkable.

When Andrew Davidhazy was a little boy-on-the-run at six, dodging Nazi gunboat shells, any future association with the Royal Photographic Society of Great Britain would have been wishful dreaming indeed.

Or any association as distillation research photographer at 50 Main St. W. in faraway Rochester, N. Y. Hungarian born Andy Davidhazy, who now lives with his wife and two children in Henrietta, was forced to flee with his parents from their native country in the early 1940's.

Caught in the middle of a German Russian tug-of-war, they were trying to escape in a fighting boat to Belgium, then head for South America where there was no immigration quota. They almost didn't make it. Andy still remembers the Nazi gunboat lobbing shells from some 500 yards away at their little craft off the German coast, with the shells just missing the churning up waves. He was a sick little boy, hoping to stay alive. Water, ugh!

The Davidhazys did reach South America finally, spending 10 years there before their goal, the United States, was materialized.

Young Davidhazy was 17 then, interested in cameras. He matriculated at Rochester Institute of Technology, where he earned three degrees - an associate in applied science, bachelor of fine arts, and master of fine arts. His majors were in photo science, photo illustration and graphic design.

Now at 28 Davidhazy had an intricate photo sampling of distillation phenomena hung in the Royal Photographic Society of Great Britain's prestigious annual exhibition (late 1969) in London. A duplicate exhibit went on display at RIT's Wallace Memorial Library. In addition, Davidhazy was granted a Royal Photographic Society associateship, and has published several papers in photo science journals.

During his undergraduate years, the young man from Hungary obtained a part-time job as assistant to Dr. Kenneth C. D. Hickman, who directs RIT's Distillation Research Laboratory at the Institute's Downtown Center, 50 Main St. W. Today Davidhazy is the laboratory's research photographer.

Techniques developed in Dr. Hickman's laboratory are highly photogenic. Hence the camera becomes a main investigative tool, useful to the technology of desalination - the process of turning sea water or brackish water into potable water.

Objects most often photo-analyzed are large masses of water, named boules, that will float on a superheated surface for long periods. The size of the boule and the length of time it will persist before bursting and merging with the liquid underneath provides continuing valuable information.

The RIT distillation lab is supported by a grant from the Office of Saline Water, U. S. Department of the Interior. It is ironic and, perhaps, prophetic that Andy Davidhazy - who survived turbulent seas as a youngster after fleeing his native land - still is up to his photographically scientific ears in water. Desalination, that is.

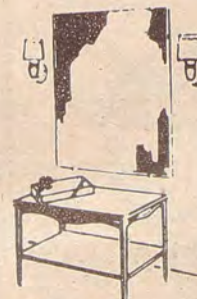

Program For Senior Citizens Gets Attention Of Republican Regime

Mayor-designate Stephen May said recently the incoming Republican city administration will develop a far-reaching program for Rochester's senior citizens. It will include a countywide plan for senior citizens housing construction, reduced bus fares for the elderly, expanded recreational activities and state legislation to liberalize tax exemptions for moderate income homeowners.

Addressing a Council of Social Agencies Delegate Assembly at the Rowntowner Motor Inn, May said the city government has special obligations to Rochester's aging, who constitute the second highest percentage of senior citizens of any American city. He stressed the plight of many elderly citizens caught in the "cruel squeeze" between the rising cost of living and fixed personal incomes.

May termed the housing needs of the moderate-income elderly "desperate" noting that 4,000 units are needed in the city alone and an additional 500 will be required annually. He called for an end to "hit-or-miss planning" and the formulation of a countywide plan based on need and population projections. Such a plan must include the suburbs, he emphasized, so that the elderly will have a choice as to where they want to live.

The Mayor-designate reiterated his belief that a properly developed reduced fare plan for seniors need not result in a revenue loss. He stressed the need for careful advance efforts to sell the advantage of bus use for senior citizens, to insure maximum utilization during non-rush hours when they run half-empty at present.

May said the new city administration will seek means to expand recreational opportunities for senior citizens. State and federal aid may be available for demonstration projects, he noted, including funds for the construction of community centers for the elderly.

The Mayor-designate stated he will urge action by the State Legislature to broaden and liberalize the 50% tax exemption on real property owned by moderate-income senior citizens. He proposed increasing the earning limitation from \$3,000 to \$5,000 and waiver of the five year occupancy requirement for property owners relocated from former homes by urban renewal or highway construction. "The elderly homeowner living on a small, fixed income is hard

pressed in these inflationary times", May observed. "Legislation to help him continue home ownership must be current and realistic", he added, terming the \$3,000 income limit "absurdly low".

Social Security Information

Medicare benefits are payable even if a person continues to work full time and is not collecting his social security benefits. "People nearing 65, whether or not they plan to retire, should visit the social security office," says Joseph Tomaino, Social Security Administration District Manager. It is important, he noted, to apply during the 3 months before you turn 65 to be sure that your Medicare protection will begin as soon as you reach 65. Otherwise, you may lose coverage of some of your medical bills.

Mr. Tomaino explained that Medicare is divided into two parts. "One part is hospital insurance," he said. "This paid from social security contributions made during your working lifetime. Virtually every employed person now reaching 65 is eligible for, and has paid for hospital insurance protection. And if a worker is eligible, so is his wife at age 65."

This part of Medicare helps pay for your care in a hospital and for certain kinds of care you may need after you leave the hospital.

"But that is only half of the Medicare story," he continued. "The other half is the supplementary medical insurance that helps pay doctors' and surgeons' bills and a wide variety of other medical expenses. You pay half the cost of the medical insurance through a premium of \$4 a month. The Government pays the other half. It is particularly important that you apply for your medical insurance coverage before you reach 65 since this is a voluntary program with limited enrollment periods," said Tomaino. Mr. Tomaino added that doctor bills were the main medical expense covered by this insurance. However, he said, medical insurance under Medicare covers many other medical services and supplies. These range from home health care visits to ambulance service and the rental or purchase of durable medical equipment.

Mr. Tomaino urges those who want more information about Medicare, and those who are nearing 65, to visit his office at 107 Clinton Ave., N. The office is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. every day, Monday through Friday, and until 9 p.m. every Thursday evening.

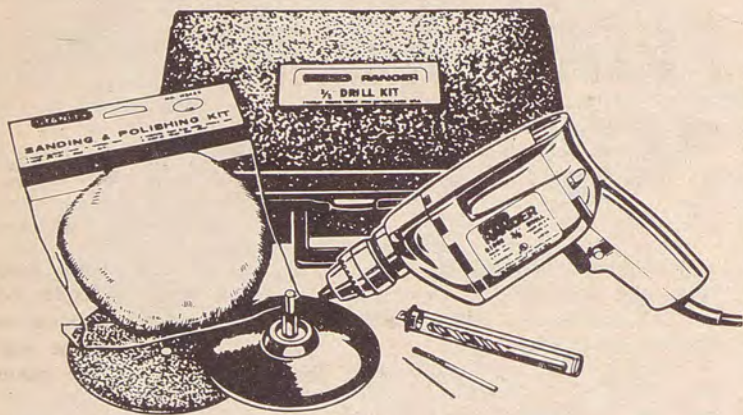

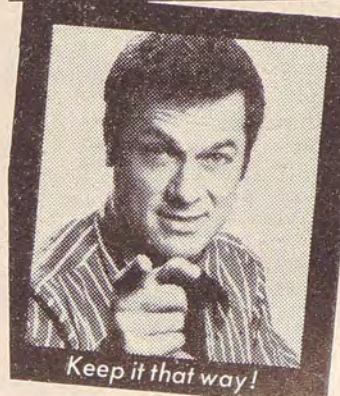



**Symbolic Floral Arrangements
Key Christmas Decor In Home**

Christmas is a family festival. We celebrate it by making our homes colorful and bright, singing carols, providing rich feasts, and giving gifts in the tradition of the Wise Men of the East. In keeping with the spirit of the season, cut flowers and plants are wonderful to receive and give at this time. Figurines in the shape of angels, shepherds, Madonna and Child, the three Kings, musicians, reindeer, etc., as well as candles, bells, and Christmas balls are all appropriate reminders of the holiday, and are traditionally incorporated within the design of floral arrangements.

During this season, few Christian homes seem truly



decorated without a wreath at the door, in the window, or perhaps as a focus in some living area other than that in which the Christmas tree is placed. The round form (of the Della Robbia wreath) symbolizes eternity, while the flowers and fruits are symbolic of the cycle of the seasons. In milder climates, FTD florists suggest that the feeling of the first Christmas, which occurred in a mild climate, may be captured with palms, magnolia, poinsettias, and other foliage and blossoms of the East. In colder climates, winter wonderlands can be made of cones, greens, and ribbon to bring the joy of the season into the home.

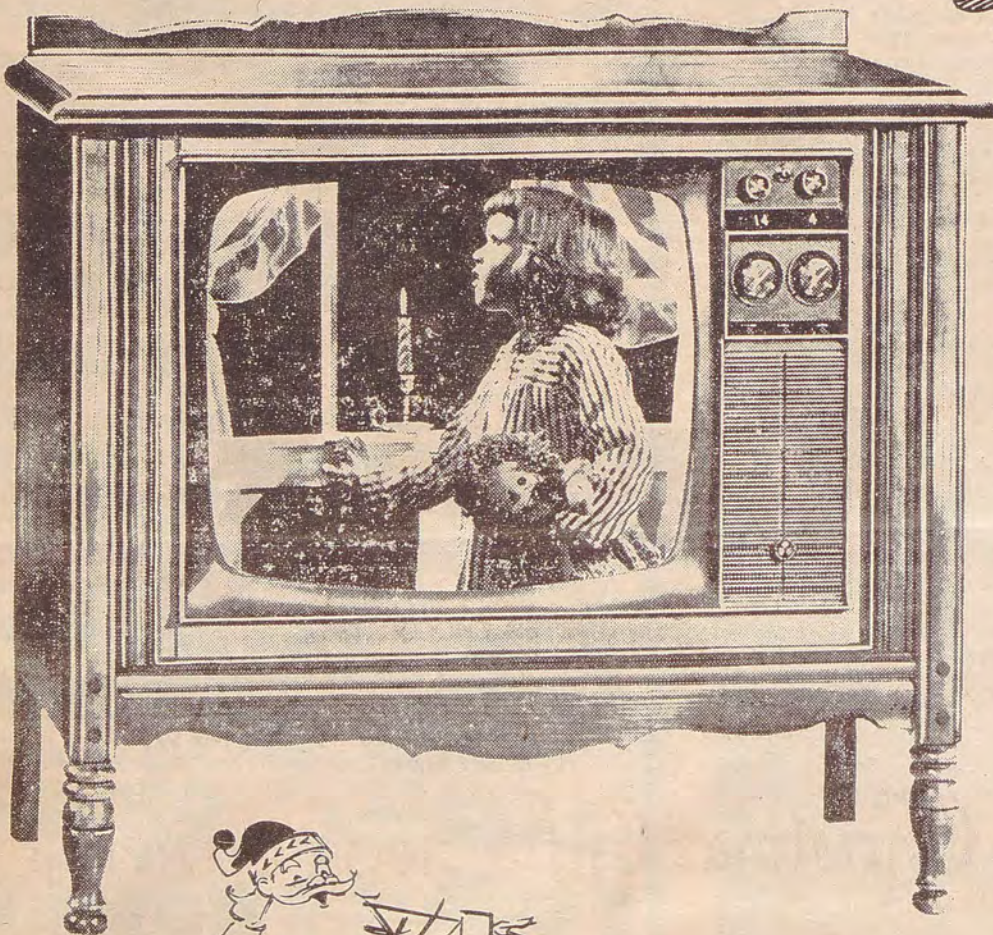

HEART ASSN. ADVISES:

Immunize Against Flu Before Vacation

Winter is a great time of the year, if you're taking a vacation in some far off sunny clime. Unfortunately for most of us winter only conjurs up visions of dreary days, icy winds, snow drifts to be shoveled and, of course, influenza.

Since persons with heart or circulatory problems are more likely to be seriously affected than others if they develop the flu, the Genesee Valley Heart Association recommends that those persons check with their physician as early as feasible about the advisability of vaccination.

The Public Health Service has noted that until good protection is provided consistently by influenza vaccine, it is not recommended for healthy adults and children -- only for those persons of any age with chronic debilitation conditions. These include:

Rheumatic heart disease, es-

pecially mitral stenosis (a narrowing of the valve opening).

Coronary heart disease and high blood pressure, particularly with evidence of inability of the heart to perform its function properly.

Asthma, chronic bronchitis, cystic fibrosis, bronchiectasis, pulmonary fibrosis, pulmonary emphysema and advanced pulmonary tuberculosis.

Diabetes mellitus or Addison disease.

Older persons, who may have incipient or potential chronic cardiovascular and bronchopulmonary disorders, also should be considered candidates for vaccination.

Flu vaccine is administered in two doses, about two months apart, the Genesee Valley Heart Association notes. However, the interval can be reduced if an epidemic threatens. Those vaccinated within the past two years need only one booster dose.
