Lake Avenue Gets Mayor's Attention

(Mayor Stephen May addressed a Lenten luncheon at Ascension Church on March 19 and a partial report was in last week's issue. Further excerpts from his talk are included in the accompanying article).

"Both the State and the City are cooperating on traffic signal system improvements all along Lake Avenue, so that the movement of pedestrians and vehicles will be smoother and safer.

"I'm confident the wicked traffic bottleneck at Lake Ave. and Ridge Rd. will be eliminated within the next few years. The extension westward of the Keeler St. Expressway is inevitable, and it promises tremendous relief for long-suffering residents, businesses, motorists and pedestrians. We've had many long consultations about this problem with the State Department of Transportation and will continue the discussions.

"I want to emphasize that these talks are very preliminary, in fact, exploratory. When we are able to present to the people of this area and to the public, generally, a proposal, you can rest assured it will expose our city to the least possible disruption and the maximum benefit. Right now, I repeat, we're only talking. But is sure makes sense to do away with the confusion which exists today and we'll keep you informed of progress."

Turning to other problems, May stated:

"There is no Republican and no Democratic way to meet the demands of the people who finally are letting it be known that they want environmental protection. So we're going ahead with \$50 million improvements to the Main Sewage Treatment Plant. We're examining the recommendations of consultants on cleaning up filthy overflows into the Genesee River. We're planning to phase out the Mt. Read-Lexington dump and to erect a compacting and transfer station. We're working with county officials to curb air pollution and we're investigating ways of getting rid of the junk car plague."

CORRECTION

The Session of Christ Presbyterian Church has released a statement of regret over "confusion" which resulted from a recent article in the Tenth Ward Courier. The inference of any connection between the stand of the Session with regard to the plan for reorganization of the public school system and that of the Edgerton Area Neighborhood Association was erroneous and unintended, says the statement.

The statement goes on to explain that the Session did support the reorganization plan, even though it realized this stance was "in direct opposition to the vast majority of our neighborhood residents."

The Session has "moved to a new position", it continues. "We are still insistent that the Rochester school system as it is presently organized gives our children less than an adequate education. Therefore we must be involved in correcting that inadequacy. We therefore will support with our staff, time and money the formation of an Education Committee within the E.A.N.A. to the end that real and serious forms of citizen participation in the policy decisions of our neighborhood schools (No. 30 and No. 34) can be developed and to the end that all of our children might receive a quality education."

City Proposes \$75 Million Program For West Side Industrial Park

Development of the Mt. Read-Emerson Industrial Park is included in the program agreed upon between the city administration and the New York State Urban Development Corp. About \$75 million investment in the area is anticipated, according to Mayor Stephen May.

This is part of a \$225 million investment program projected for Rochester during the next five years. It would be carried out by private developers with UDC aid. A resolution on the program was introduced at this week's City Council meeting.

ustrial park are 4100 to 4500 dwelling units in the Southeast area of Rochester, within the city, and scattered housing units for the elderly and handicapped throughout the city in a quantity designated as "significant".

For the Mt. Read - Emerson Development, UDC already has a preliminary development program prepared by E.B.S. Management Consultants, Inc. The general plan is outlined as follows:

"The objective of the city, the County of Monroe and UDC is to improve an undeveloped, unattractive and unsanitary tract of approximately 215 acres on the city's West Side with new public improvements and to use the improved land for the development of an

Industrial Park Plan Unfolded

attractive, well planned industrial park providing additional employment within the city, particularly for persons of modest means, and additional tax revenues for the city and the county.

"The County of Monroe is being asked to construct Lexington Ave. as a five-lane street and to improve Lee Rd., the latter being dependent upon the State of New York reconstructing its Lee Rd. bridge over the Barge Canal.

"UDC or its subsidiary will buy the project land from the city for \$1; encourage the state to reconstruct the Lee Rd. bridge; establish a five year program for development of the site in cooperation with private industrial developers and real estate brokers; establish a management corporation or make such other arrangements with private industrial developers as may be needed to sell and maintain the area; construct all project improvements, such as water lines sanitary sewers, storm sewers and streets, with the exception of Lee Rd. and Lexington Ave., study the feasibility of providing a site for and constructing a material process center in the area; acquire from the state excess Barge Canal lands within the project area and assist in the financing of industrial construction".

"The cost of site improvements, including the acquisition of some additional land, is estimated at \$4,225,000, plus the cost of a refuse compacting-transfer station. The

costs will be shared this way: The city will pay an estimated total of \$200,000 for land acquisition, plus the cost of the compacting-transfer station. The county, if it undertakes the road improvement projects, \$1,375,000. UDC or its subsidiary, other site improvements estimated at \$2,650,000.

"The City will provide public information and initiate community consultation and review of the general plan programs with neighborhood residents, civic and business groups within the affected neighborhoods."

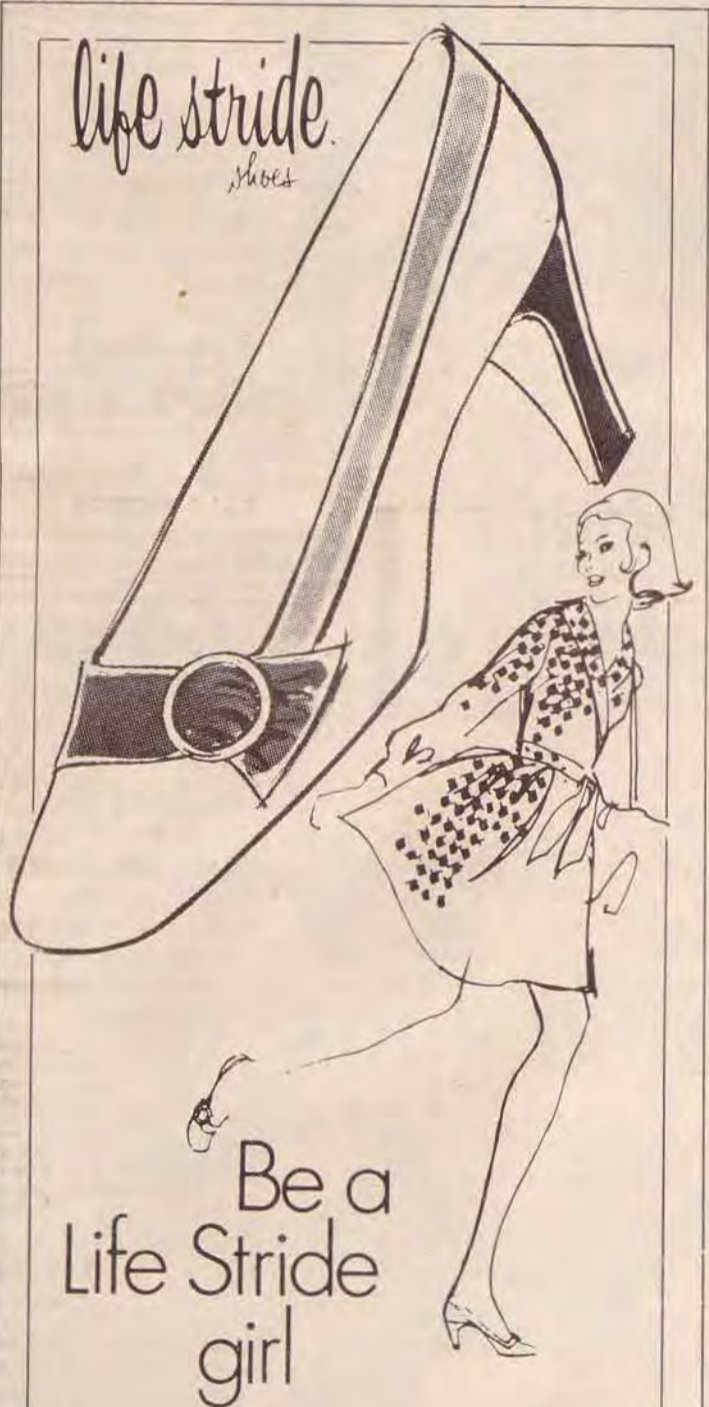



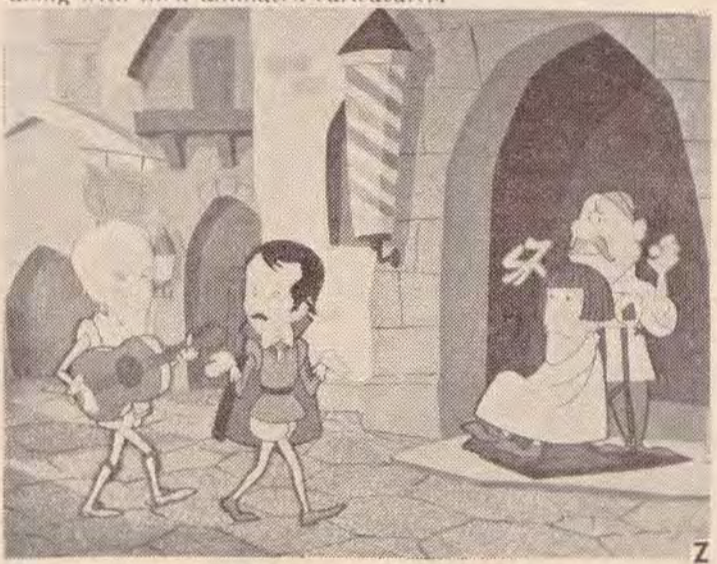

John Bareis, president, noted that 25% of the members are over 80 years old, and another 25% are over 70. Over 100 oldsters are active in this chapter which meets at Edgerton Park, under auspices of Rochester Recreation Bureau.

FROM OUR MAILBAG

TO THE EDITOR:

The recent controversy over the reorganization of the Rochester Public Schools has brought to the surface many of the inadequacies of our public educational institutions. In the northwest this has led to a negative feeling toward education by most parents. We feel that now positive and constructive attitudes must be built. We intend to proceed in building such attitudes. What do we mean?

Examination of pupil achievement records for the neighborhood schools in the northwest area show clearly that our children are receiving less than an adequate education.

For example, in schools No. 7 and No. 17, the percentage of pupils educationally disadvantaged increased as the children moved from first to third grade. After the children completed three more years in those two schools, moving from third to sixth grade, the percentage of children educationally disadvantaged remained the same. The schools had not added to the achievement success of the child.

Though the statistics taken from the 1968 New York State Pupil Achievement Programs and others we have examined, such as the drop-out reports of Madison, Jefferson and Marshall High Schools, are not comprehensive in scope, they do indicate the need for change within our neighborhood schools. We also feel that this requires greater participation by the neighborhood residents in their neighborhood schools.

The leadership of the participating northwest organizations express their joint intention to proceed to work in the area of upgrading our neighborhood schools and assuring community participation in that upgrading process. Task forces for research, planning and negotiation will be established in each of our organization by any and all concerned citizens of our neighborhood who want to be constructively involved.

Let us be very clear. We will establish effective and serious forms of community involvement in the policy-making process of our particular neighborhood schools to the end that all of our children might receive quality education.

Gary Natale Wins Three Citations For Devotion To Duty In Vietnam

Gary J. Natale, 20 year old son of a Jay St. barber, has distinguished himself in the service of his country in Vietnam. He has won three citations for meritorious performance of duty, including two Army Commendation Medals and one Air Medal.

"For heroism in connection with military operations", says one citation, "PFC Natale was serving (on January 4) with his unit on a reconnaissance in force mission five miles northwest of Lai Khe. As the unit maneuvered through the treacherous region, it made contact with an undetermined size enemy force. When several members of his unit were wounded by friendly artillery blocking fire, PFC Natale immediately radioed the artillery direction center and requested a check fire. After the artillery had ceased firing, the friendly unit was able quickly to reorganize and made a sweep of the contact area".

"Throughout the encounter", the citation continues, "PFC Natale efficiently maintained radio contact which was instrumental in keeping the unit organized. His courageous initiative and exemplary professionalism significantly contributed to the success of the mission".

The second Army citation praised young Natale for "selflessly working long and arduous hours and for "unrelenting loyalty, initiative and perseverance".

Apparently promoted to Specialist Four rating, Natale was cited under this title for "active participation in more than 25 aerial missions over hostile territory" and outstanding professionalism and devotion to duty. For this he has won the Air Medal. Although an Army man, his service record indicates action with the Air Force but his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Natale of 453 Jay St., have little information about his duties.

Gary will complete his year of duty in Vietnam in June and will have about four months of his enlistment to serve in this country. He is a graduate of Aquinas Institute and the R.B.I.

Gary's father is a veteran of World War 2 and both he and his son are members of Lt. Kirke Otis Post, Veterans of Foreign Wars. Young Natale earlier this year was granted a membership in the post, of which Frank Scarfone of Orange St. is commander.

Having done this, you will not so easily slip back into depression again."

Thousands of victims of nervous stress in Europe, Australia and America have already responded with remarkable success to these and other techniques set forth in the book. A best seller in England, the volume has also been published in France, Germany and Holland.

In the book, which presents information on the treatment and cure of many nervous disorders, Dr. Weekes observes that the first step to recovery is true acceptance of the illness. The sufferer must first accept his symptoms for what they are, and live with them for the time being. Equally important is the principle of "floating," which enables the nervously ill person to be flexible and relaxed—"to go with the feelings nervous reactions bring instead of trying to withdraw from them or force his way through them."

More and more nervous persons are waking up to this sensible advice.

County Manager Explains Rehabilitation Services

"Monroe County government expends much time, money and effort in areas which are extremely important to those residents of our community who require services of a social nature," says Gordon A. Howe, county manager. He points out that the United Cerebral Palsy Association of Rochester is conducting a school rehabilitation health program in No. 29 School and Jefferson High School.

This program includes initial evaluation of potential candidates for the Orthopedic Units, periodic review of pupils, physical and occupational therapy and such services as the Director of the Association and the County Health Department deem necessary and proper to protect, promote and improve the physical health of the children enrolled in the program in Monroe County. The County's allocation to the Cerebral Palsy Association is approximately \$37,000.

County government also funds an Alcoholism Information and Referral Center. The cost of this center is \$22,000 -- \$16,000 is contributed by the County and \$6,000 by the Community Chest. The center's major work is connected with families where there is evidence of alcoholism. The center attempts to educate and motivate the problem drinker in the family to seek professional help.

These clients have a significant symptom defined as a resistance to 1) facing life without alcohol, and 2) seeking professional help (medical, religious, legal or social agencies). It is these resistive clients in the early stages of alcoholism who are educated and motivated through the center's efforts to seek professional help for these people. The center also helps clients who have resumed problem drinking and discontinued treatment to be less ashamed and return to their clinic, physician,

etc., for further treatment.

"This is not a treatment center," says Howe. "The information center is an important link in the network of Rochester area services for alcoholism education, treatment and research. More than 760 families are served by the center annually.

"These are two of many services your County performs for all the residents in an effort to rehabilitate those persons and families who experience physical and emotional health illnesses."

Narcotics Subject At Holy Apostles

Detective Frank LaChimia will speak on the subject of narcotics and drug addiction and will show the movie "Marijuana" at the Holy Apostles Mothers Club meeting on Monday evening, April 30, at 8:30.

Lt. LaChimia, an expert in his field, has received five commendation awards for his work in the field of narcotics.

This topic is of such importance all area residents are invited by the club and are urged to hear Lt. LaChimia at this time.

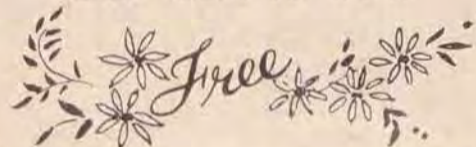

Western Gateway Plan Outlined By Mayor May

The Western Gateway Urban Renewal Project centered around Lyell Ave. on the city's outskirts, is still being evaluated, but it could be part of the five year plan recently announced by Mayor Stephen May. The ambitious plan has been advanced in agreement with the UDC, the state's Urban Development corporation.

The objective of the Western Gateway project is to determine the feasibility of using, primarily for new industrial and public purposes, an undeveloped tract of land on the city's west side adjacent to the proposed Mt. Read-Emerson Industrial Park.

The industrial park, taking in some 215 acres north of Lyell Ave., would transform this undeveloped Mt. Read-Emerson area into productive use although it has long been considered economically unfeasible to tackle.

"The City will prepare, in consultation with UDC or its subsidiary and its consultants", says May, "an urban renewal plan for the area indicating proposed land uses and development controls and an application for Federal urban renewal capital grant indicating existing site conditions, proposed land acquisition, public improvements and land subdivision and the estimated cost and timing of the project."

"UDC or its subsidiary will prepare an analysis of the market and financial feasibility for the project and a development program acceptable to the City, including

staging plans, policy guide lines and recommended procedures for UDC, City and private participation in the program.

"Based upon the results of these preliminary studies, the City and UDC or its subsidiary will determine whether their continued participation in the project is feasible. If the answer is favorable, UDC or its subsidiary will undertake an industrial project or projects and the City will designate UDC or its subsidiary as the developer.

"The City is involving community interests in consultation and review and will undertake a public information program".

Mayor Calls For State, Federal Aid In Rochester's Budget Crisis

Rochester's current budget crisis and the lack of local revenue sources to deal with it other than the real property tax, dramatically illustrate the need for greater state and federal assistance to cities, Mayor Stephen May said last week.

"Rochester, along with other major urban centers, is flooded with demands for services, but we are drained of resources to supply them", he contended. "The state and federal governments, with their more elastic and dynamic tax bases, can and must come to our rescue", May added.

Addressing the Shrine Lunch Club at Eddie's Chop House, the Mayor said the tragedy of Rochester's present fiscal problems is that the real estate tax "which is a regressive and exhausted source of revenue" is about the only place city government can turn for funds. He called for sweeping changes in relations between Albany and Washington and Rochester to "help save our cities".

May said he will continue to press, as he has this year with the Big Six Mayors, for a gradual state takeover of the non-federal costs of welfare, state financing of education while retaining local control, and a program of state-city revenue sharing.

In addition, he called for greater federal help on welfare costs, "since this is obviously a national problem requiring federal help", substantially increased federal participation in financing education, and establishment of a national universal health insurance program covering work performed in hospitals and doctors' offices.

"Prompt fiscal relief from Albany and Washington is needed if we are to continue to meet legitimate human needs," May contended. "We can't ask real property owners to shoulder a much greater burden without driving them out of the city", he added.

Emerson Dump Closing Still A Year Away?

Bids are due this week from private waste disposal contractors in an effort to finally dispose of the Emerson Street dump, but it is estimated that it will be at least another year before the closing will be a reality, despite prodding of city and county officials by County Legislator Joseph Esposito and Councilmen Andrew Celli and John Parrinello.

(Councilman Celli revealed over the weekend that he had asked intervention by the federal government in an appeal to Robert H. Finch, head of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.)

The contractors will have 60 days to submit their replies. Then after bids are evaluated it will require considerable time to carry out the final plan agreed upon.

The city expects either to convert the dump to a transfer station or to build an entirely new station. City refuse collectors would con-

tinue to haul to the transfer station where giant trailer trucks would remove the waste to a landfill site outside the city. It is hoped to close the present incinerators, both on the west and east sides of town.

A delaying factor is also seen in the possibility of a merger of city and county sanitation departments.

More fires are springing up in the dump regardless of efforts to avert them and city firemen, called to the scene describe the rats which inhabit the area as big enough "to sock you in the face".

Partial Closing For Emerson Dump Promised By City Administration

The first step in the closing of the Emerson St. dump has been promised by the city administration and should be an accomplished fact by the end of next week. People living in the Emerson - Mt. Read area were told last Saturday that the eastern half of the landfill, near the homes, will be closed, covered with dirt and surrounded with a chain link fence to prevent private dumping. Mayor Stephen May and Councilmen John Parrinello and Robert Wood, William Legg and Michael Roche met with the property owners at Most Precious Blood Church Saturday and gave their word that

the closing is about to take place. The western half of the dump will be kept open for another year, however, until a transfer station can be built. The city intends to provide two large bulldozers to cover up the refuse with dirt and slag at the end of each day to minimize the bad effects of dumping. The city will advertise for bids on the transfer station this week and expects to let the contract in July or August. Another neighborhood eyesore, the junked car graveyard in the Grenville and Harcourt Rd. areas will also be cleaned up immediately, says the city administration.

The Bloodmobile made its semi-annual visit to the First, Ninth and Tenth Ward units last Friday and departed with 88 pints of blood. Steinfeldt Explains Budget Items

ALBANY - - Assemblyman William Steinfeldt has compiled a breakdown of the new state budget for 1970-71 as it affects this Assembly District.

"I am pleased that Monroe County fared so well in light of the \$517 million cut from the Governor's original budget", said Steinfeldt.

Assemblyman Steinfeldt said, "Reviewing the budget breakdown

RG&E Head Explains Need For Increase

"Rochester Gas and Electric Corp. has applied to the New York State Public Service Commission for permission to raise electric rates for all of our customers: residential, commercial and industrial", says DeWitt Pike, RG&E president.

"We did this reluctantly, but the increase in revenues is essential to meet rising operating costs, increased taxes and higher interest rates on the money we borrow to build the facilities necessary to serve our customers. The proposed increase has been held at the minimum that will permit us to maintain a financially sound company and enable us to attract new capital to meet growing power demands.

"This is the first time we have sought an electric rate increase in 12 years. During this same period, Rochester Gas and Electric has reduced its electric rates twice. These reductions came about when prices of almost all other consumer commodities and services were increasing. For example, during the past 12 years the cost of food has increased 26 percent; home ownership, 39 percent; medical care, 55 percent; and wearing apparel, 27 percent. "On the other hand, the average cost per kilowatt hour to RG&E's residential customers' monthly bill is higher today, but this is because he is using almost 70 percent more electricity than he did in 1958".

Urging all First Ward residents to turn out tonight, a committee of property owners has put out a circular and in an ad in this issue of The Vicinity Post saying "We would appreciate your presence at the Avery Bowling Hall on April 22 at 7 p.m. Remember we are all involved. The plan as now proposed will mean:

- "1. Excessive traffic and noise.
- "2. Sewage disposal overloaded.
- "3. Over crowded schools.
- "Let past performances be your guide. Act now. Screaming later will do no good."

The committee has hired Joseph

Attardo, an attorney, to advise them and if necessary to start legal action.

City officials, headed by Mayor Stephen May, are expected at tonight's meeting. Councilmen Andrew Celli and John Parrinello and County Legislator John Romano are among elected officials who have indicated they will be there.

Thomas Hasek heads the residents' committee with Sam Geraci as vice chairman and Mrs. Samuel Tantino as treasurer. Others on the committee include Marco Favata, Pat Di Pozzio, Carmen Carusi, Sam Danno and C. Wooding.

Originally, it is claimed, the Glenwood Gardens idea was exclusively for senior citizens and there was not much opposition. But provision for the 40 units for low income families was "quietly" added at the last moment before Council approval, according to the committee and they don't like it.

Radio Tower Controversy

A radio tower erected at 73 Louise St. is the subject of controversy between a nearby resident and the Fontaine Two-Way Radio Service. The ultimate decision on whether the tower is to stay or be removed apparently will be decided in the courts.

Joseph DiLella whose home and yard at 86 Pool St. backs up to the 180 ft. tower claims that zoning laws "specify certain restrictions" and that the location of the tower does not meet these requirements, yet the city issued a permit.

After the tower was one third completed, says DiLella, the area residents complained to city officials and a hearing was scheduled before the Board of Appeals on March 19, 1970. The variance was denied, he states, and contrary to the Board's decision the radio tower was completed April 17. He asks why.

Arthur Fontaine, owner of the business, maintains that there was no denial by the board. He also points out that numerous similar towers have been erected in the immediate neighborhood and that his particular tower will not occasion any difficulty in the way of radio or television interference. It is used for emergency communication with trucks and other vehicles equipped with two-way systems.

Feeling the Food Price Squeeze? Try "Mini-Gardening"

A new trend is sweeping the country among modern homemakers. It's "mini-gardening"—the practice of raising a few home-grown vegetables in a wee amount of space.

Soaring food prices have apparently brought it on. And millions of homemakers who would rather "grow than pay" are turning to miniature gardens. Recent surveys show that more Americans than ever before are taking up gardening to fight inflation and high food prices.

One study showed that the number of gardeners growing their own vegetables doubled between 1967 and 1969. And, with food prices continuing their climb, the trend is expected to catch on even more this spring and summer.

According to homeowners who gave "mini-gardening" a try last year, it doesn't take much space to save a lot on your food budget. If you have a windowsill, a balcony, a planter or a patio, you have enough space to grow a few modern-day vegetables.

You can grow up instead of out with today's vegetable plants because many of them are bred to be more "vertical" in stature. This accounts for the compact prolificacy of modern "mini-gardens". Even apartment dwellers, using window boxes or pots, are joining the fold and enjoying "fresh from the garden" vegetables.

"I never grew anything in my life," says one Illinois housewife. "But last year, when food prices kept climbing, I decided to try a packet or two of seed in a little bare spot next to the house. Not only did I save money, but it was a whole new experience for me and the children. Now I'm hooked—I'm going to grow twice as much this year."

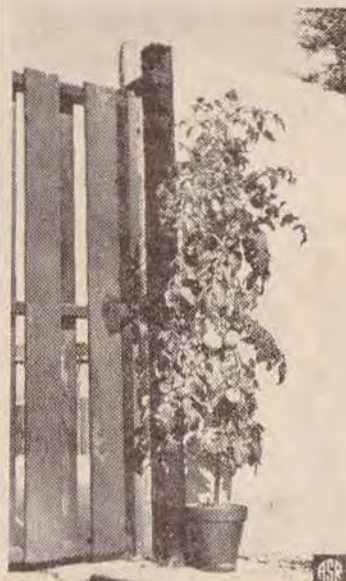

Medicare Clarifies Rule On Nursing Home Care

"Medicare does not cover the care of everyone who must go to a nursing home or extended care facility directly from a hospital", Joseph Tomaino, district manager of the district office, stated in an attempt to clarify misconceptions about this type of coverage under the law.

It does cover relatively short term skilled care of a patient in an extended care facility.

The beneficiary must have been hospitalized for a least three days, transferred to the extended care facility within 14 days of hospitalization and require continuing skilled nursing service ordinarily available in a hospital, but not the ready availability of all the costly medical services and equipment provided by hospitals. Where the patient's condition requires less than this high level of care, it is not covered by Medicare even if it is furnished in an "Extended Care Facility".

"Due to the newness of the 'extended care' concept when Medicare began, a number of developments became available to us", Tomaino said. "The first was that all too often beneficiaries (and even

some physicians and extended care facility operators) were under the impression that Medicare paid for almost every case in which a hospitalized beneficiary was transferred to an extended care facility with his physician's approval.

"Actually, after a hospital stay, some people may just need help in bathing, eating, dressing, walking and taking medicine at the right time. Perhaps, now and then, they may need some skilled nursing care such as changing a surgical dressing once or twice a week. Medicare cannot pay benefits when this is the only kind of a care a person needs and is receiving in the extended care facility, because it is not skilled nursing care on a full-time basis - and that is a specific requirement of the Medicare law. This is why benefits have to be stopped after only a few days or weeks in an extended care facility and why they sometimes cannot be paid at all."

In an effort to achieve greater uniformity in decisions, the Social Security Administration issued more detailed guidelines resulting in closer examination of extended care stays.

According to Tomaino, there has been an increase in the number of cases in which the levels of care necessary to qualify for Medicare reimbursement have not been met. Tomaino points out that these decisions are made by Medicare intermediaries such as the Blue Cross plans and insurance companies who act as agents for the government.

"A better evaluation by the nursing home operator and more complete medical data will result in earlier identification of non covered cases and minimize the problem of delayed unfavorable decisions".

According to Tomaino, those beneficiaries who do not qualify for full time skilled nursing care in extended care facilities may nevertheless be eligible for home health benefits under Medicare which provides intermittent nursing care and restorative services.

Tomaino urges beneficiaries and others on their behalf who have questions about the level of care they are receiving to discuss their cases with the people at the Extended Care Facility. He also pointed out that when Medicare is denied, the beneficiary has a right to question the decision. Assistance is available at the Rochester social security office at 107 Clinton Ave., N. The telephone number is 325-6640.

Record Savings By Bank

Glenwood Gardens To Be Dropped?

City Council action is to determine the fate of the Glenwood Gardens housing project. (The action, expected to be referral back to committee, came too late for this edition of the Tenth Ward Courier).

A large turnout of affected property owners last Wednesday night at an unofficial "hearing" got the sympathetic ear of city officials and the move to halt and possibly annul the entire program appeared to have bi-partisan support even though the proposal had been given hasty approval in December by both the Rochester Housing Authority and City Council.

Both Councilmen John Parrinello and Andrew Celli, who with Mayor Stephen May are on the Housing and Urban Renewal Committee of the council, were present at the meeting and a suggestion by County Legislator John Romano that the bill be referred back to committee where it would automatically die at the end of the year, was enthusiastically endorsed by Celli.

The U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development has appropriated 2.26 million on March 3 for the project which involved 80 units for Senior Citizens and 40 low income housing units.

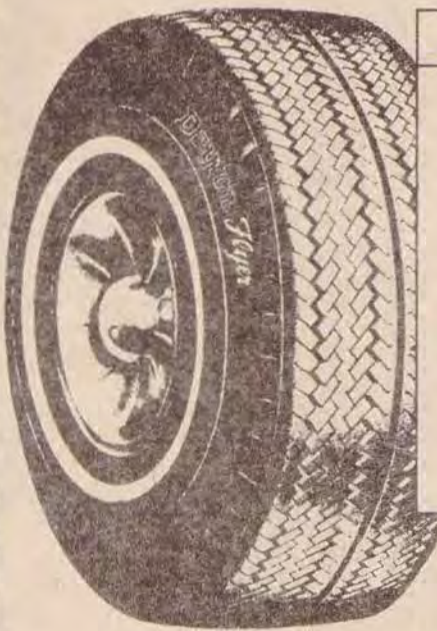

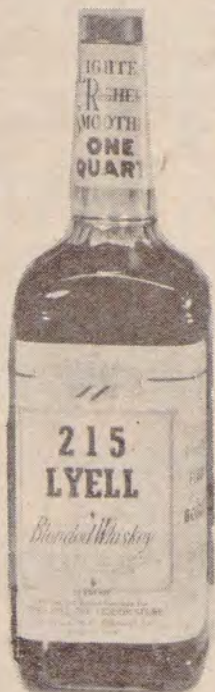

Special Bus Rate Getting Support

The reduced bus fare plan for Rochester's Senior Citizens is off to a successful start, Mayor Stephen May reports. He and leaders of the Senior Citizen's Action Council urged elderly riders to continue to take advantage of the program so it can be made permanent.

The reduction to 15¢ plan began a 3-month trial run on March 15, with experts forecasting revenue losses of over \$200,000 a year.

A report released by Rochester Transit System Resident Manager James E. Reading on the results of the first five weeks of the program revealed that rather than the predicted \$20,000 loss, increased patronage by elderly riders kept the revenue reduction to a mere \$335.

The report, based on a study of revenues for the five week period prior to Mar. 15 and the five week following, compared with similar periods one year earlier, showed a loss of only 7/100 of one percent.

Clifford Outlines City-County Merger

Last week the County Legislature moved in a positive direction toward the consolidation of services when it approved the merging of the City and County purchasing departments, according to County Legislator Jeremiah F. Clifford (R-29th Dist.).

"It has been proven to my satisfaction that the City-County Purchasing Consolidation will produce savings resulting from larger volume purchases; savings in personnel by the reduction of the total staff; and greater efficiency that will result from improved procedures in bidding, purchasing and the handling of necessary paperwork related to buying of materials used by local governments," he said.

"This consolidation is only the beginning of a series of events which are expected to follow and which will be designed to save hundreds of thousands of dollars to the taxpayers of Monroe County. In the near future we hope to study the possibility of including other governmental unit purchasing, including school districts, in the giant, modern purchasing system of the County of Monroe," Clifford said.

"It must be realized that in order to be legally acceptable all other units of government, be it a town, village or school district, must request, by resolution of its governing body, to be included in the

countywide purchasing system. We have had several inquiries from other governmental bodies in the County, and, hopefully, they will come forward with resolutions. The County Administration and the Legislature are perfectly willing to assist with studies and eventual implementation of such a merger," he said.

"In my opinion it is a sure way to hold down the cost of supplies, equipment and other materials to benefit the taxpayers of the entire County."

"The County of Monroe is now proceeding to study other areas of consolidation such as Civil Service, Police Departments, Data Processing, Traffic Engineering and others. All of the consolidations will be in the direction of savings for ALL the taxpayers of Monroe County," Clifford said.

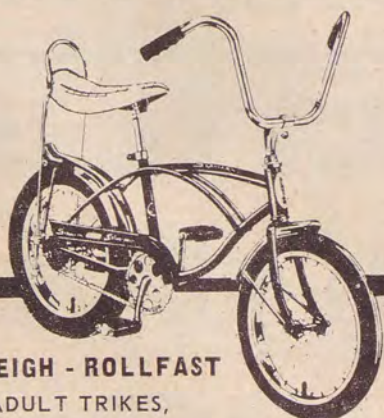

PARENTS RESPONSIBLE NOW FOR CHILD'S ACTS

Governor Rockefeller has signed a bill sponsored by Assemblyman William Rosenberg making parents liable up to \$500 for the damages caused by vandalism by their children. Rosenberg states that the purpose of the bill is to provide better guidance in the home by making the parent aware of his liability for "malicious damages" caused by his children.

"It is our hope", says Rosenberg, "that some of the wilful and deliberate destruction of personal property that we read about each day will be curtailed by the passage of this legislation. Rules For Water Safety Outlined By Red Cross

Over 60 per cent of the drownings each year result when people who have no intention of getting wet fall into the water from docks, boats, bridges, shores or pool decks, frequently only a few feet from safety, the local Red Cross reports.

40 per cent drowned while swimming or playing in the water, again many of them almost within reaching distance of safety.

"Most drownings result because people violate or ignore good water safety practices", states John Loomis, the local Director of Red Cross Safety Programs. "Drown-

ings can be reduced if people will learn to swim and develop skill and knowledge that will contribute to safety in, on, and around the water. Red Cross hopes through its swimming and lifesaving courses, to create in every individual an awareness of accident causes and ways in which accidents can be prevented".

Statistics reveal that drownings around the home - pools, bathtubs, wells, cisterns, and cesspools - claim over 700 lives each year.

Three chief causes of home pool drownings are temporary lack of qualified adult supervision, absence of, or inadequate safeguards such as fences and rescue equipment, and the inability of victims to float or swim.

The home pool drowning rate is highest among children under four, the safety director said; therefore home pool owners should take regular precautions around the pool site and make the area "kid-proof".

Mr. Loomis stressed that one way to make sure children can't accidentally fall into the pool is to erect a fence of sufficient height around the facility, keeping the gate locked at times when there is no supervision available for swimmers.

The shallow and deep ends of the pool should be clearly marked with buoy lines. Breakable items such as glass and bottles should not be allowed around the pool area. And pool rules should prohibit running or "horseplay" near the pool edge.

"No matter how many safety

measures are taken", said Mr. Loomis, "the best way to help insure that accidents don't claim lives is through training. Someone in the family should know how to give artificial respiration. Youngsters should be taught to float and swim at an early age, and simultaneously they should be made to understand their limitations."

Since the majority of drownings occur within a few feet of safety, it is often possible for a non-swimmer or an untrained swimmer to perform a nonswimming rescue safely, the Red Cross official said.

The rescuer should limit personal contact with the victim and always maintain firm contact with the shore. The rescuer's weight on the shore or pool deck should be kept low or slanting backward. If the victim is within arm's reach, the rescuer should lie flat on the deck and extend one arm, holding the deck or dock with the other arm. He can then grasp the victim's wrist or arm and draw him to safety.

Should the victim be beyond arm's reach, the rescuer can extend such items as a shirt, towel, coat, branch, or pole, and allow the victim to grasp one end and then pull him to safety. A line, ring buoy, or an innertube can be thrown to a victim who is beyond reach of an extension rescue, Mr. Loomis added.

"A swimming rescue should only be attempted by someone who has had lifesaving training", concluded the safety director. "Otherwise a double drowning can occur".

Following the ceremony there will be a brief meeting of both the men's and women's First Ward Republican Clubs, headed by John Hogan and Mrs. Jean Barone.

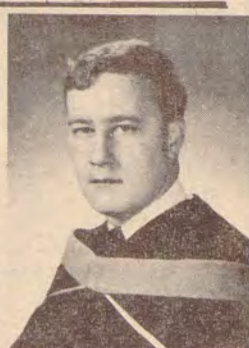

Cathedral Organist Wins Music Award

William Ferris, organist and choirmaster of Sacred Heart Cathedral has won the first Leo Sowerby Memorial Composition Contest sponsored by the Chicago Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. The panel of judges including Dr. Paul Callaway, organist and choirmaster of Washington National Cathedral, and Miss Stella Roberts, chairman of the composition department of the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago, was unanimous in awarding the prize to Mr. Ferris's sacred cantata, "Out of Egypt". The work, scored for mixed chorus, tenor and baritone solos and organ is composed on a text by John Vorrasi adapted from the Old Testament book of Hosea.

The competition in memory of the Pulitzer Prize winning composer who died in 1968 was open to all U. S. citizens. Along with a cash stipend of \$500, Mr. Ferris's work will be published by the

H. W. Gray Company of New York City, and will receive its premiere performance in Chicago next season.

Mr. Ferris's orchestral works have been performed by the Boston Symphony Orchestra, the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, members of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, and the Rochester Chamber Orchestra. His liturgical compositions, many of which are published by major publishing houses, are regularly performed throughout the country and he has received commissions from universities and private schools. He is at present at work composing his first full length opera. He is a member of A.S.C.A.P.


"Changes are coming about today," May added, "not on the scale of the problems and not fast enough to satisfy the protesters, but progress is being made never-
