What a lovely woman you are - and how lovely are those dear "children" - to talk over the needs of me & my many object needing financial help - and their responding in such a liberal way- I am sure you have made me happier than you can possibly be by ther act - notwithstanding the old maxini that "it is more blessed to give than to receive" -well it was good - is good - that by your splendid decision -I was able to send a check of \$250 - to the little Sculptor -who landed just a week ago - which made up the \$500- the needed to pay off her home debts & her passage home-she had to loan the \$500 - there - and leave the busts as security-but this with the \$140 - I had sent her-which has reached her bank since she sailed - makes her all right -

Then then were \$20.50- more than the 350 - which I sent in a bonus draft - & told her that was the beginning for

her time & skill!!

I place \$50. of your check in the Bust Fund - and the other half - I am sending to my binder - in Washington D.C. for binding the last 400 copies of the International Council report - of 1888- one of which I am placing in every Library where I place the history of Woman Suffrage -- And our dear Mrs Rachel Foster Avery gives me the Transactions of the National Council -so that I can present each library with a copy of that also- So my dear-tell "the children" - they made my heart glad in two ways-helping me to help Miss Johnsonand to pay off a bill for said binding--all for the furtherance of education on the line of equality of rights for women -Well-you are lovely-and your dear mother& sisters & all of "the children" of the children- I have to leave home Saturday nights train - butO sister Mary will be at home - and glad to see you & Sarah on your way to Nassar

Oh yes - Our dear niece Maude came on Mr Britanci- & was held in Quarantine out two days- she and her father & mother are now and will leave tomorrow for their house *
