Did I tell you that he went into the taylors that very evening that dropped out from amonst us - to try on a new army suit - that he was getting made and one of his Army Post men told me he was calculating to come east this summer! -- But all is over - here with his goings & comings - save only in our thoughts - and he is more constantly in my mind than I could ever have dreamed!! Lucy E. Sister May and I broke bread with niece Anna O. last evening. She got up a beautiful dinner - & seemed very, very happy - as did her husband.
