Dear Anna D.M.

We arrived safely this A.M. an hour late – took breakfast and Sister Mary the Doctor & Mrs. – the sister of Mr. Ricker – were ready for a start -- -they intend to accomplish the Library, the Monument -- Mount Vernon & Arlington to day -- this afternoon – but I guess they won't – as for me I went to bed – though I had a very good night in the cars -- at 1 P. M. or 2 -- got up – took a bath – dressed – and then walked over to the Shoreham—and the Normandie – to tell the clerks I was at the Riggs – but then Mrs. Harper came – and I have been out with her all the afternoon two hours & more –

The day is beautiful – so warm you do not need a wrap – well I can't tell you all Mrs. H. said – but she enquired often you – and I told her how kindly you came in and helped us off – Sister Mary & Co. have not got home yet – though it is five o'clock – I guess they will be tired enough when they do come --

I thought of you seeing to everything & locking up the house –when you go down, Mary left a pail in the bathroom – it must not be emptied into any of the places in the room – but it should be carried out & poured in the ground -- she felt very much chagrined at leaving it there –

I shall stay here over Sunday – Shall keep quiet all the day – so as to be ready to go on Monday at 11 o'clock – we shall get to New Orleans, at the New St. Charles Hotel – remember Friday night – for at least two weeks – but we will keep you posted --

You had better have a box to put all my letters in – open all of them – and send none on --unless you think them important -- Put on each letter at the top of first page – the amount in the letter – so as to make it doubly sure – then you may send the check or post office orders to me – and I'll sign them & return – Any word you send will be gratefully received – I hope you got the Dem & Chronicle -- this morning.
