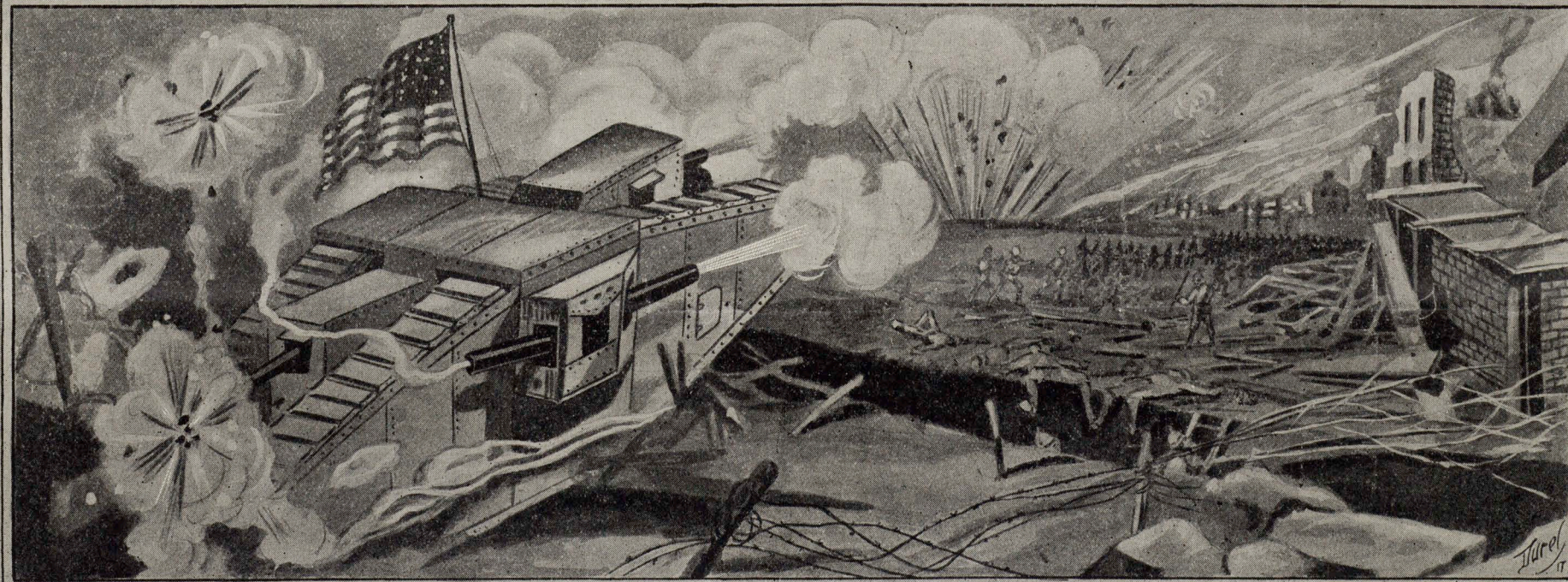

HISTORY OF COMPANY A, 108TH INFANTRY, U. S. A.

Company A, 3rd New York Infantry, National Guard, was organized in 1863, as Company E, 54th Regiment, Captain McCauley being its first commander. Captain McCauley was succeeded by Captain H. B. Henderson who was the commanding officer for over thirty-seven years. Under Captain Henderson the company saw service in the Civil War, also in 1892 at the Buffalo and Hornell car strikes. During Captain Henderson's command, the company was called out for service in the Spanish-American War. Major F. S. Couchman, who is now a major in the 108th Infantry, U. S. A., was at that time a corporal in Company A. Capt. C. A. Simmons, the successor of Captain Henderson, was in command of the company for five years, and was succeeded by Captain F. S. Couchman, under whose command, with eleven men, Bill Twiman, a negro bandit, who had barricaded himself in a house near Scottsville, N. Y., was apprehended, after having been given up by the civil authorities. It was also under his command that the company saw service in the Buffalo car strike in 1913. Captain Couchman was succeeded by Captain A. T. Smith, the present commanding officer of Company A. Under Captain Smith the company was called out for service on the Mexican Border, being mustered into Federal Service at Camp Whitman on July 5, 1916. After returning from the Mexican Border the company was mustered out of Federal Service on October 5, 1917, at Rochester, N. Y. Company A responded to the call of the President in the World War on April 13, 1917, was mustered into Federal Service on April 16, 1917, and drafted into the military service of the United States on August 5, 1917. The organization lost its designation as Company A, 3rd New York Infantry, National Guard, on September 20, 1917, and was re-organized with Company A, 74th New York Infantry, National Guard, on October 20, 1917, as Company A, 108th Infantry, U. S. A., under command of Captain Arthur T. Smith.
