We, the Trustees of School District number *two* in said town, in conformity with the statutes relating to common schools, do certify and report, that the whole time any school has been kept in our district during the year ending on the date hereof, and since the date of the last report for the said district, is *nine months* and that the time during said year and since the date of said last report, such school has been kept by *qualified* teachers after obtaining a certificate of qualification, according to law is *nine months*

that the amount of money apportioned to our district by the Town Superintendent of Common Schools during the said year and since the date of the said last report, excepting library money, is *forty-eight dollars and two cents*

and that the said sum has been applied to the payment of the compensation of teachers employed in the said district and licensed as the statute prescribes.

and that the sum paid for teacher's wages, over and above the public moneys apportioned to said district, during the same year, amounts to *fifty-four dollars and forty-eight cents*

That the amount of library money received in our district from the Town Superintendent of Common Schools during said year and since the date of said last report, is *seven dollars and twenty three cents.*

To the Town Superintendent of Common Schools of the Town of *Wheatland*

We, the Trustees of School District number *one* formed partly of said town, and partly out of the adjoining town of *Chili*

do, in conformity with the statutes relating to Common Schools, certify and report:

That the school house in said district is situated in the town of *Wheatland*
That the whole time any school has been kept in our district during the year ending on the date hereof, and since the date of the last report for said district, is *one year* and that the time during said year and since the date of said last report, such school has been kept by *competent* teachers after obtaining a certificate of qualification, according to law is *one year*

That the amount of money apportioned to our district by the Town Superintendents during the said year and since the date of the said last report, excepting library money, is *Two Hundred & Twenty Seven & eighty cents*

and that of the said sum of money so as above stated to have been apportioned to our said district, to be applied to the payment of teachers' wages, the sum of *Two Hundred & Twenty Six & eighty cents* was apportioned for and on account of that part of said district lying in said town of *Wheatland* and the sum of *one dollar*

for and on account of the other part thereof lying

and being in said town of *Chili* and that the said sum has been applied on our order to the payment of the compensation of teachers employed in said district and licensed as the statute prescribes. That the amount of library money received in our district from the Town Superintendents during said year and since the date of said last report, is *forty one dollars*

forty five cents and that the said sum has been applied to the purchase of ** Available books for The Library*

That of the said sum of money so as above stated to have been received in our said district for the purchase of a district library, the sum of *forty one dollars and fifteen cents* was received for and on account of that part of said district lying in said town of *Wheatland*

and the sum of *thirty cents* for and on account of the other part thereof lying and being in the said town of *Chili* That of

the number of volumes belonging to the district library and on hand on the last day of December last was *four Hundred and forty eight*

That the number of children taught in said district, during said year and since last report is *three hundred and three* (See Schedule A.)

That of the said children the number residing in the town of *Wheatland* is *three hundred and three*; the number in the town of _____ is _____; and the number in the town of _____ is _____

That of the number residing in the town of *Wheatland*

That there were on the last day of December last, *two hundred and eighty two* children residing in said district between the ages of five and sixteen years, as stated in Schedule B, hereto annexed; and the names of the parents, and other persons with whom such children respectively resided, and the number residing with each, are contained in Schedule C, hereto annexed.

And we do further report, that our school has been inspected by the Town Superintendent during the past year *two* times. That the sum paid for teachers' wages in said district, over and above the public moneys apportioned to said district, during the same year, amounts to *three hundred and forty seven and seventy cents* of which *three hundred thirty nine* dollars and *twenty nine* cents were paid by that part of the district lying in the town of *Wheatland* and *eight* dollars and *forty one* cents, by that part lying in the town of *Chili*.
