REPORT

By the Town Superintendent
Of the Commissioners of Common Schools.

I, the Town Superintendent

We, the Commissioners of Common Schools of the town of *Whittand* in the county of *Monroe* in conformity to the statutes in relation to common schools, do report: That the number of entire School Districts in our town, organized according to law, is *Seven* and that the number of parts of School Districts in said town, is *(Six)* that the number of Joint Districts, the school houses of which are situated wholly or partly in our town, is *(5)* *five* that the number of entire districts from which the necessary reports have been made for the present year, within the time limited by law, is *(7)* *Seven* and that the number of parts of districts from which such reports have been made, is *(6)* *Six*. That the number of schools for colored children taught in our town during the year aforesaid, for four months or upwards, by a duly qualified teacher, was

And we, the said *Superintendent* Commissioners, do further certify and report, that the whole amount of money received by us, or our predecessors in office, for the use of common schools, during the year ending on the date of this report, and since the date of the last report, for our town, is *\$975.12* *nine hundred and seventy five dollars twelve cents* of which sum the part received from the County Treasurer is *(325.04)* *three hundred twenty five dollars and four cents* and the part from the Town Collector is *(650.08)* *six hundred fifty dollars and eight cents*

and that we have collected the sum of

That the said sum of money has been apportioned and paid to the several districts from which the necessary reports were received by the Commissioners, for the purposes and in the proportions following, viz:

The sum of *(845.10)* *Eight hundred & forty five dollars ten cents* for the payment of teachers' wages, and the sum of *(130.02)* *One hundred and thirty dollars and two cents* for the purchase of district libraries.

That the sum of was apportioned by us to District No. for colored children in said district between the ages of 5 and 16 years, who have attended a school taught in District No. in said town, by a duly qualified teacher, for four months during the preceding year; and to District No. for colored children so attending in said District; and that we have deducted the said several amounts from the sums by us apportioned to the said Districts No. and respectively. And we further certify that during the year before mentioned, we have collected the following penalties and forfeitures, viz:

Gentlemen :

I HEREWITH forward to you the blank used in preparing your annual report to the Commissioner. The circular accompanying it will enable you to do this without difficulty.

Great pains should be taken to report *every* item correctly, especially that of the "average daily attendance."

Whenever a fraction occurs in the average daily attendance, *that fraction, however small, should in all cases be reported.*

On the completion of the report, it should be deposited with the Clerk of the town in which the school-house is located. This must be done between the *first and fifteenth day of next October.*

Districts joint with other *counties* are to be reported to each Commissioner having jurisdiction.

I have sent to the Town Clerks of your respective towns copies of the new School Law, the Daily School Register, and the Blanks for the Report of Teachers, all of which you should obtain before the next term of school begins.

Circumstances are such as to oblige me to resign the office of School Commissioner, the first day of October. The annual Institute, however, will be held as usual, at Spencerport, under the supervision of my successor. It will commence the 29th of October, and I have most ample assurances from the State Superintendent that the very best instructors to be found in the country will be present. There can be no question as to the utility of this gathering, and I trust that you will use your best efforts to induce teachers to be present during the entire session. Such a course will be a decided benefit to the schools, and a great encouragement to the new Commissioner. The Law authorizes you to exercise a proper liberality in regard to the wages of teachers who sacrifice time and money, in order to fit themselves more perfectly for the work.

As this will close my official relations with you, allow me to return my thanks for the kindness and co-operation which you have always extended towards me. Together we feel a deep interest in the cause, and hope, under the enlightened administration of our State Superintendent, to see it advance to perfection. Trusting that another year will see the schools of the Empire State entirely free,

If it is not thus made and deposited, the district can not participate in the distribution of the school moneys; and the Trustees, by such neglect, become personally responsible for the amount thus lost; and every Trustee willfully signing a false report, for the purpose of causing the School Commissioner or School Commissioners to apportion to his district (or neighborhood) more than its just proportion of public money, shall, for each such offense, forfeit the sum of twenty-five dollars, and be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

INSTRUCTIONS TO TRUSTEES.

1. Every district report must be made in form to the School Commissioner. It should be signed by the Trustees of the district, and be deposited by them in the proper Town Clerk's office, between the first and second Tuesdays of October. The omission thus to make and file the report works a forfeiture of the right of the district to participate in the distribution of the school moneys; and the Trustees, by such neglect, become personally responsible for the amount thus lost, and every Trustee willfully signing a false report, for the purpose of causing the School Commissioner or School Commissioners to apportion to his district (or neighborhood) more than its just proportion of public money, shall, for each such offense, forfeit the sum of twenty-five dollars, and be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.
2. No district is a joint district unless it lies partly in two or more counties.
3. One report only should be filed by the trustees of every district not joint; and such report should be filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the town in which the school-house is situated.
4. The trustees in every joint district must make out a financial report of the entire district, and statistical report of that part of the district which lies in the same county in which the school-house is located, and deposit the complete Report, comprising these, in the Town Clerk's office of the town in which the school-house is situated. They must also make out and file in the Town Clerk's office of each town in any other county, in which town any part of the district lies, for the Commissioner in whose district such town lies, a statistical report of that part of the district which lies in such town. The financial report, in case of a joint district, is made only to the Commissioner in whose district the school-house is situated.
5. A separate neighborhood must be reported for only so much as lies within this State.
6. Trustees must not include in their report, on the 2d page, in any of the items from 11 to 15 inclusive, the attendance of any children while they were under 5 or over 21 years of age.
- Where there have been different departments in a school, or separate district schools in the district, the number of days to be given in items 16, 17 and 18, on the 2d page of the Report, should be the number for the department or school which was taught the greatest number of days.
7. The average daily attendance to be given in items 11 and 12, on page 2, will be found by dividing the number of days of attendance given in items 13 and 14 respectively, by the number of days school was taught, as given in item 16 on the same page.
