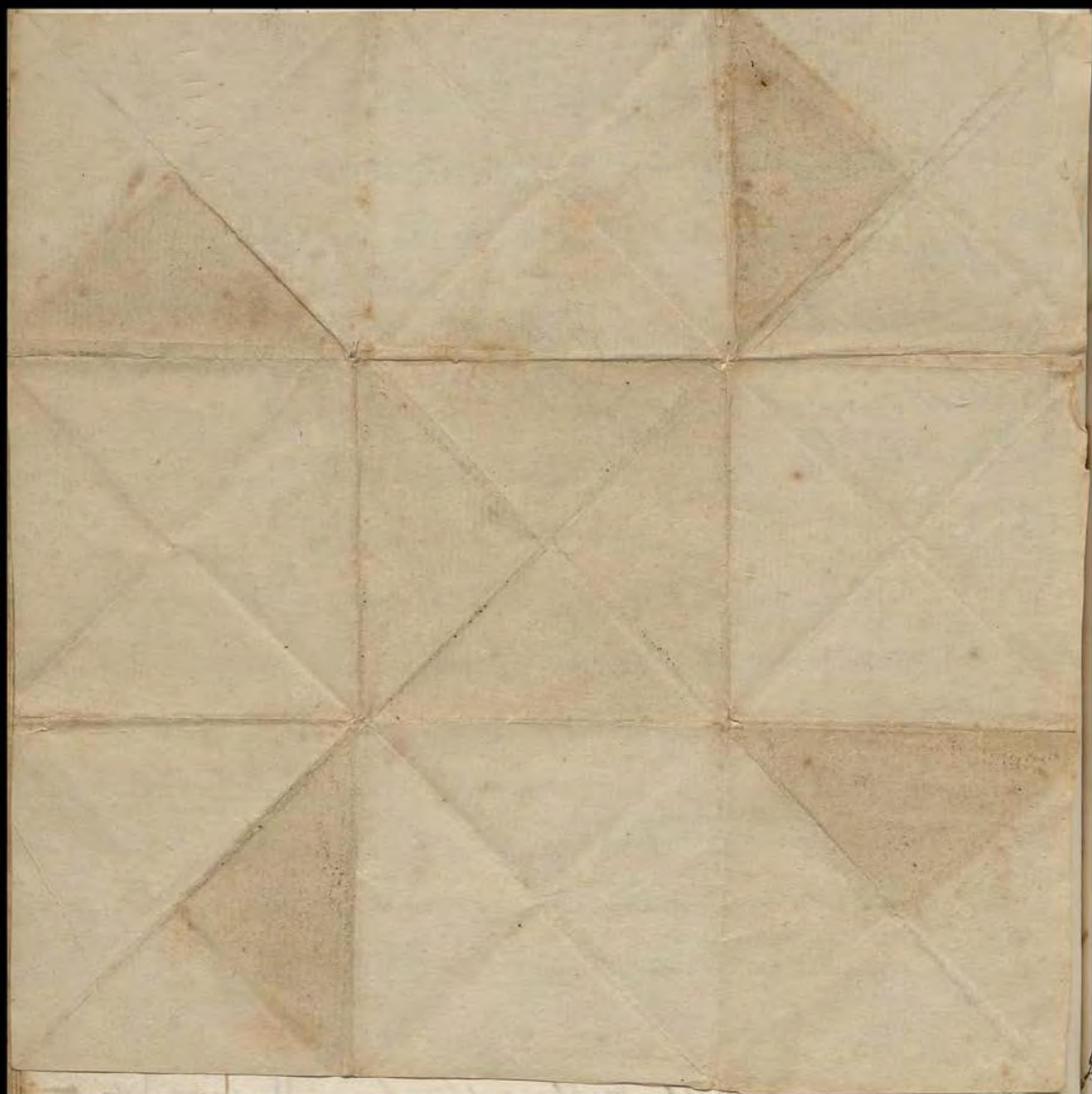

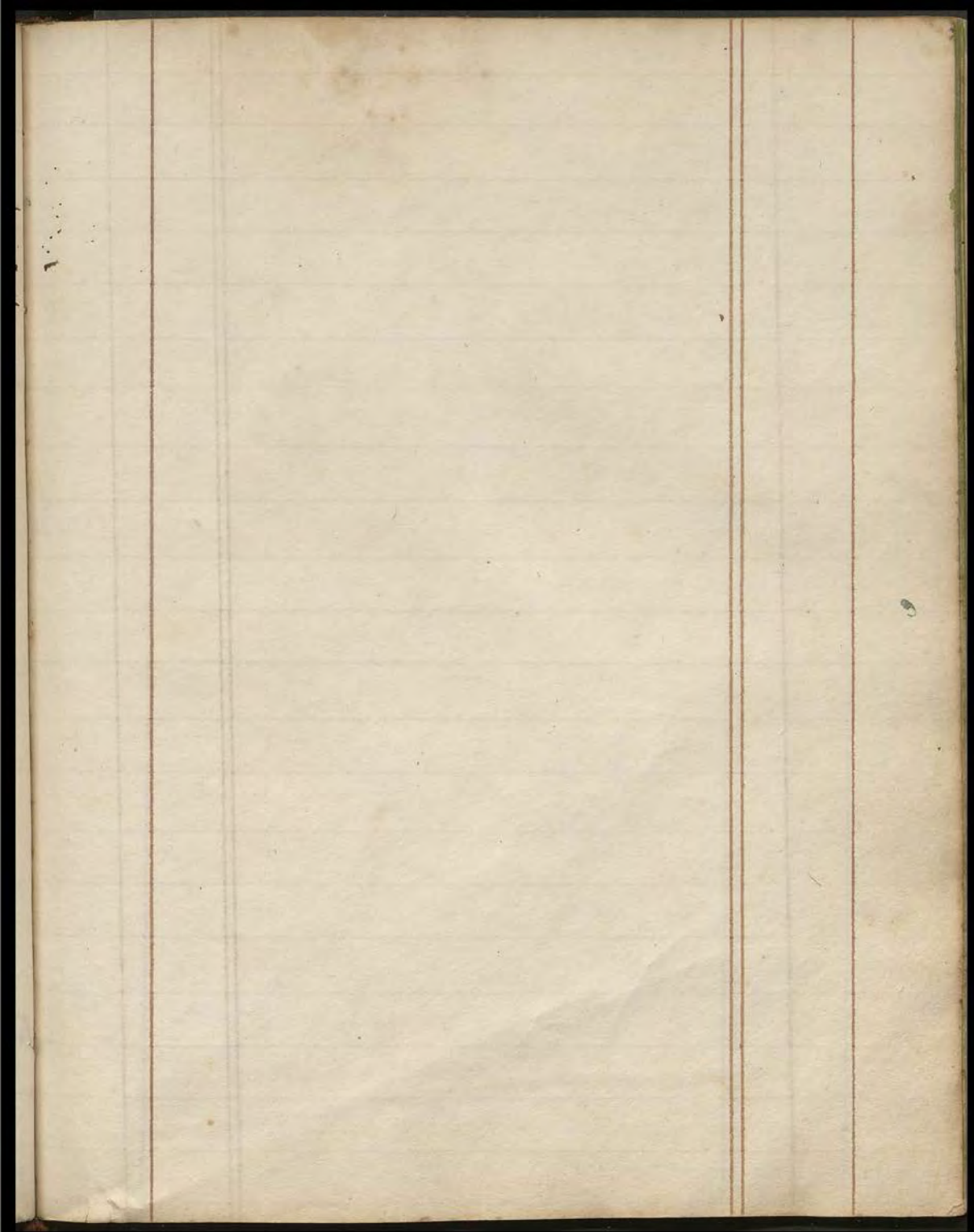

Composition

Take 2 pounds of the Bayberry root bark, 1 pound of the inner bark of Hemlock, 1 pound of Ginger, 2 ounces of Cayenne, 2 ounces of Cloves, all pounded fine, sifted through a fine sieve, and well mixed together.

No 6. Rheumatic Drops.

Take one gallon of good fourth proof brandy, or any kind of high wine, one pound of gum Myrrh, pounded fine, one ounce of No 1 ^{Cayenne} and put them in a stone jug. Shake it up every day for 5 or 6 Days.

No 7 for Canker. Take bayberry root bark white pond lilly root and the inner bark of the Hemlock equal parts of each, pound and mixed well together.

CANADA THISTLES.—Our farming friends need to be told how difficult it is usually found to extirpate the Canada thistle from soil in which it has once obtained lodgment, and there are very few who will not regret that the recipe which we are about to give, could not have been published sooner. It was on a memorandum made many years ago by the gentleman who handed it to us, and who was an eye witness to its efficiency during two successive seasons in Cayuga county—as long since as 1837 and 1838.—The paper was, however, supposed to be lost, and it is only within a few days past that it was brought to light again—too late to be of use this year. Our friend had been unable to recall to memory in the meantime, the precise date mentioned in it. After this rather long preamble, we have only to state that the recipe reads thus:
“Cut Canada thistles the second day after the full moon in July.”

We clip the above from the DEMOCRAT and AMERICAN of July 10th, last year. It was published then, too late to allow our readers to try the efficacy of the recipe, and we are bound this year to be in time. Those who think it worth bearing in mind for the purpose of experimenting with it, should cut it out, and “paste it in their hats.” The gentleman who gave it to us is quite confident that the result will be satisfactory to those who follow the direction, as he has seen the thing tried on a great many occasions.
