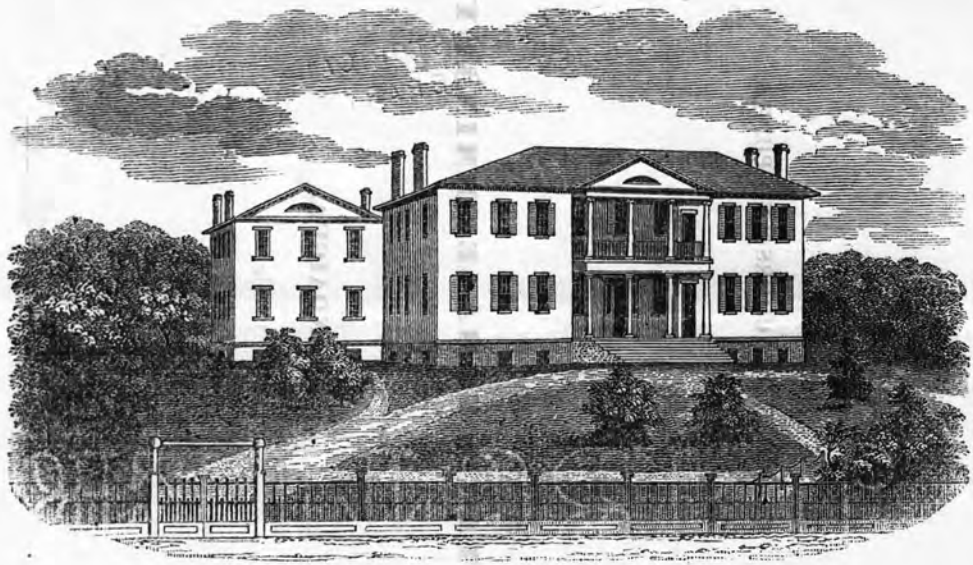

Course of Instruction.

PRIMARY DEPARTMENT.

- 3d CLASS. } Reading, Spelling, Mental Arithmetic, Plain
 Sewing, Parley's Geography.
 2d CLASS. } The same, with Grammar, Writing, Woodbridge's
 Geography.
 1st CLASS. } The same, with delineation of Maps, Writing
 from Dictation, and History.

The Instructors will occasionally read to the pupils, portions of Sacred, Profane and Natural History, of which they are required afterwards to give some account in writing.

COURSE OF ENGLISH STUDIES, IN THE UPPER ROOM.

- 3d CLASS. } Arithmetic, Grammar, Geography, Penmanship,
 Putnam's Sequel.
 2d CLASS. } Arithmetic, Grammar, Geometry, Botany, Nat-
 ural Philosophy, Chemistry, use of the Globes.
 1st CLASS. } Grammar, Algebra, Trigonometry, Smellie's Phi-
 losophy of Natural History, Rhetoric, Paley's The-
 ology and Evidences of Christianity, Astronomy.

An advanced class will attend to a review, or a continuation of any of the above, together with Kames' Elements, Intellectual Philosophy, &c.

Latin, French, Spanish, Music and Drawing, are attended to during the whole or any part of the course that parents may direct.

The pupils are exercised in English Composition once in each week.

The pupils in French are required to converse in that language, to present written translations, and occasionally to write original French compositions.

The Patrons of the School have furnished a select and valuable Library, and the young ladies will have the advantage of a course of classical reading, under the superintendence of a teacher.

TERMS.

Tuition, for the whole course of English Education, \$30 a year; for French, Spanish and Latin, \$15 each; Music \$40, use of Piano Forte \$8; Drawing \$16. Tuition in the Primary Department, \$16 a year.

Board, including room rent, fuel, candles, and all other incidental expenses, \$2 a week—Washing, 37 cents per dozen.—Each Pupil must provide herself with bed clothing and towels.

The academic year is divided into terms, of 22 weeks each.—Pupils are received at any time during a term, and charged from their entrance to the end of the term; but no deduction will be made for absence after entrance, unless occasioned by sickness.

Pupils are required to attend punctually such Church, on the Sabbath, as their parents and guardians may prefer.

The Summer term will commence on Wednesday, the 7th day of May, 1834.
