Tuesday 26.
In camp Tarrentown Junction. Drilling

Wednesday 27.

Went from W. Junction toward Manasses 4 miles. Laid on arms short time and returned to Warrentown Junction (No tents for night).

Thursday 28. Marched to within 4 miles of Manasses camped without tents fighting close by all day. Hot and water scarce & all rolly.

Friday 29.

Marched and countermarched. March being near battlefield but no chance in. Met the 23rd and shook hands with Elijah (some initial but cannot tell what). Camped within hearing of of muskets in battle. Jackson retreats at night.

Saturday 30.
Came to Centerville. Rested a few minutes and went West 5 miles/s
to battlefield and went to fighting 4 P.M. Jeff Hadley killed.
8 or 8 wounded. Desperate fighting fell back to Centerville.

Sundey 31.

Laid at Centerville all day. But little firing heard. Much cheering at evening said to be caused by the arrival of Gen. McClelan. Rained some. A.E.Kinner & Chas. Allen left Ranks while marching Sunday night.

Monday Sentember 1.

Remained at Conterville ready to march - Hard thunder shower atm dark rained much of the night. No tents or shelter. Cold & unpleasant.

Tuesday 2.
Started for Fairfax at 1 A.M. Went on to vicinity of Chain
Bridge. Marched without rations had no supper. Killed cow for
breakfast. Many men tired out and sick. Firing heard near
fairfax.

Marched about 7 miles & Camped. Got some crack rs & very little rice coffee & sugar. Gold at night. Slept on ground with Rubber blanket. Boys feet sore & they tired - 11

Thursday 4.

Ley in camp & rested boys out up brush to lay under. Canonading 3 or 4 miles from us - Put out pickets, Camp undisturbed. No teams yet - Heard Captain Bennet was dead.

Friday 5.
Sent out 200 men from Regt on foraging expedition. (7) This was crossed out)
Lay in camp.

Saturday 6. Sent over 200 men scouting ballance of Regt neld in readiness to march & started 2 1.M.

Sunday 7. Came to L.ng Bridge thence to Alexandria thence to camp nearby. Started 2 A.M. Went to fairfax Sem. & staid till morning. Men tired & falling out by the way.

Monday 8. Marched most all day Rested a little while & marched again at night.

Tuesday 9. Marched about 2 miles & camped. Had few tents. P.M. was reviewed in Brigade.

Wednesday 10. Went to fort Barnard to Report for duty only 5 divisions. No tents.

Laid in breast works of fort for support in case of attack - Mead Hadley came to camp - He used (?) from Teneck & Jacob.
Paroled prisoners.

One letter and two portions of letters written by Captain Nathan S. Baker, Co. G., 86th Regt. N.Y.V.

Camp Near White Sulphur Spring
Va. August 10th 1863

My Dear Wife

In accordance with former promises I now commence a short a/c of our March, description of country etc. from our Camp near Falmouth Va. to the Battlefield of Gettysburg Pa. -During the Winter & up to about the time of the Chancellorsville battle the two Armies lay quietly confronting each other. The Rebel Army on the W. & our army on the E. benk of the Rhapshannock River with Pickets on either side. The country occupied by our army is quite broken. The original woods have mostly disappeared but the second growth timber (mostly Yellow Pine) covers a large part of the country. The land had been used until the soil was nearly exhausted & then left to recuperate as best it could - The country occupied by the Rebel Army (so far as I could see & judge from my standpoint) was not so broken & was under much better state (of) cultivation. There is quite a broad strip of land along the river which looks good & from this strip a gradual but smooth elevation runs back for a mile or so containing several benches upon which/their works Batteries etc./

The City of Fredericksburg is situated along the base of this hill occupying the ground to bank of river. The city has an old & at present shabby appearance partly on a/c of the shelling it has had from either army. One peculiarity of all buildings in this vicinity is that the chimneys are built on the outside of the houses. Falmouth is a little higher up the river and on the opposite shore nearly hid by surrounding Hills. It is a small unpleasant place desolated & torn by the ravages of war. Two bridges have formerly crossed the river at these two places. A R.R. bridge at lower end of F- city & a bridge for public as travel at Falmouth both are in ruins now. A Monument in memory of Martha Washington the Mother of Geo. Washington stands near the city of F- --- June 6th P.M. We started up the river we went through rain & mire till 2 A.M. of 7 June & bivouacked near Hastwood Church. - this place contains a country church without steeple & two or three tolerably good dwellings & is fifteen miles from Falmouth. The country is mostly without improvement & the roughest & poorest I have ever seen. We were up & off early next morning passing through a pretty rough country though better improved & more inhabitants. This day (June 7) we arrested & took with us all mail inhabitants capable of carrying news, as we did not went the enemy to know of our whereabouts. The women are feeling bad along the road some entreating us not to take their Husbands & sons. others execrating us for taking them but all to no purpose as our orders were strict & had to be obeyed. We arrived at Bealton

Station about 4 P.M. where we halted for the night & I was sent out in Command of a detachment of 100 men from 86 & 124 N.Y.V. on Picket duty. While here some of the women came up to their friends, that were in our care bringing eatables etc. We kept the men till next day & let them go as it was then to late for them to interfere with our plans. On the P.M. of the 8 June we marched to River bank, or near it, at Beuesg (?) ford. We were joined on the way by a large body of Cavalry. We only marched about 4 miles this day. Next morning (June 9) we were up had breakfast & were off by 52 A.M. & by six the engagement became quite active and general. Our calvary crossed before us & were driving the enemy while we were crossing the river the balls whistleing around us in the mean time pretty lively. Our calvary drove them about one mile ere we came up to them & should judge they had disturbed the morning map & early repast of a Rebel Camp from the looks & the things left there when we came up to our advance calvary, but as I have already given you a description of this fight, so far as my observation extended, I will pass it over in this and as the PayRolls have just come for signing by the Co. & as I am also detailed for Picket duty I must close for now & will send this hoping to have an undisturbed & more convenient time to finish. We shall probably receive pay as soon as relieved from Picket. Had ford good Prayer meeting last night. Yours, N.S.Baker

while writing 3 page on first sheet (9½ evening), our camp was Alfa alarmed as the Pickets had been atacked (6 killed) & we had to pack up & form line very hastily which will account for the mussing of this letter but my baggage, paper, etc. is with the train & you must except of such as I have with me. We came back soon & are/now (4 Dec.) -

We lay in line of Battle here where we had fought till toward morning when we were ordered back & joined our Brigade. I had Taylor's body carried back to a farm house & burried about 2 miles from where we crossed the river. Our Corps was now moved toward Chancellorsville where we joined the rest of the army, there was some skirmishing but not much fighting on the way. When the Army were fairly together & formed in line we expected soon to have a general engagement but the enemy had fallen back to a strong position & fortified so strongly that it was not safe to attack them in front so one Corps the 2nd was sent to flank them on the right & as soon as there were engaged our Brigade was to lead our div. & storm their works & my Co. was ordered from the skirmish line in front of our Regt. Lt. Stanton was to command the Co. & I was to acta as field officer & take charge the left wing of Regt. the order was given to be ready to make the assault at 3 F.M. Sunday. We piled our Knapsack & were ready at the hour for but for same reason unknown to me the flanking party did not open the engagement & we were not ordered forward - we

remained in readiness till dark & were ordered to make coffee which was more agreeable. - There were many long faces in our Brigade when the order came detailing our Brigade for the storming party at such times my christian hope buoys me & I am enabled to look forward with completency let the result be what it may. We had been having some good prayer meetings & death looked something like the gate to heaven & with fervency I prayed God to take care of my wife & family if I fell. In my views of heaven, how it brightened up when I thought I should have my dear wife & children ever near me. - On Monday morning our Brigade advanced as skirmishers. I was sent off with the left of our Regt. & Lt. Stanton had change of Co. which was in reserve. We only had two men wounded & about noon were called in. Since then we have not been under musketry fire, We remained in position for battle the rest of the day & night & the next day till dark when the Army commenced recrossing the Rapidan River. We marched hard all night & crossed just daylight. Remained near ford until P.M. then came toward this place marching most of next night & reaching here just at break of day on Thursday. While we were over the river we had a very cold & pretty hard rain making the roads very bad & this is the only reason I can give for recrossing the River, without a general engagement. We had packed up a few days before & got ready to advance & a rain storm stopped us. I cannot give any further accounts of the fighting & do not know which army had the best of the fight only where we fought we beat them. Some of the men who passed over the ground in our front next day after the fight said there was 150 dead Rebels. Our loss in Regt. was about 40. Three of which were killed the balance wounded, one of which has died. I think we shall not be likely to fight much more this winter as it is very difficult for either army to move - I have been stopped twice since I commenced writing this letter. Last time we had to go to witness the execution of another Deserter from 3rd Maine Regt he was shot as the other one, I wrote you about. Mail has come in but no letter from my wife - have not got our pay yet - With a little more rest we shall all be comfortable again - I am harty as ever - hope to see you before a great while, in the meantime I remain as ever Affectionately Yours N.S.Baker

Love to all & kisses besides to wife & babies.
