MEDICAL COURSES



Some Experiences THE LAFAYETTE GAME

On October twenty-sixth the Lafayette High School team of Buffalo met West High in perhaps the hardest fought and best contested game in which the Occidentals have participated this season. The Lafayette team had made a fine record defeating, but one week previously the Cleveland University School, champions of Ohio. Thus the Buffalonians were confident of their team's success and the result a victory of 11 to 0 for West High was a rather bitter pill. West High supporters attached special interest to this game because of the fact that Lafayette was given the championship of Western New York last year, an honor which West High claimed with good reason. A large crowd witnessed the game which was fast and clean throughout. The Buffalo lads put up a remarkable fight, with their captain disabled and out of the game most of the period of play, and altogether made a very favorable impression on Rochesterians by the fine spirit they showed during the contest. West High gave the Lafayette people a royal reception, meeting them at the station and escorting them to the school where all took lunch together. One of the features of the game was the cheering on both sides.




On October twelfth the West High team and a large supporting delegation invaded the "Windy City" to the downfall of our old rival Masten Park, who were taken into camp at the rate of 22 to 0. The game itself was somewhat of a disappointment. being marked by rough play and many disputes which became exc edingly tiresome, especially since the periods of dispute s en ed always marked by a down-pour of rain. In spite of all th's, every Occidental supporter was satisfied with the result of the game and the trip as a whole was a distinct success. Our game was played directly after the Carlisle-Syracuse game which has been declared by many authorities one of the best exhibitions of the year of the new open game of football. The trip on the train both ways was made enjoyable by the usual singing and cheering. After the game the West High people marched downtown and dispersed for supper. Leaving Buffalo at seven they arrived in Rochester about nine. The bunch formed in line and marched, chanting the score, to the four corners where, after a few final touches in the form of yells, the line was broken.
