

Political Polka

A favorite phrase of the congressmen fronting for the American Association of Manufacturers and the blue chip boys is "free enterprise". That according to them is the principal reason why America is great. If it were not for this great principle which according to many who hold the opposite view, has made the rich get richer and the poor get swallowed up, Cleveland would be a cow pasture, and they'd still be bowling on N. Y.'s Bowling Green.

We're not the one to propose that the profit motive be eliminated from the American way of life. It is the optimistic chase of the U. S. Buck that makes our economy "perk". However, the action and words of many of our senators indicates that their interpretation of free enterprise is strictly dog eat dog, a break down of the Anti-trust laws, and nothing more than a slight frown to the national and international cartelists. It's this type of thinking that developed the economic crisis of the early thirties and kept the Republicans out of power for nearly a generation. There still has to be some restraint on American business and while there are in the majority highly commendable business operations, American business itself is not to be trusted any more than a five year old unchaperoned in a Fanny Farmer warehouse.

When the GOP jammed through the bill to kill OPA and promised the public that returns would fall this was a "return to free enterprise" to quote Mr. Taft. We all know what happened—prices soared instead of fell. American business didn't reduce prices, it jacked them up. Reports of the first quarter earnings of 99 per cent of the country's corporations showed astronomical returns. Many were four hundred per cent better than the quarter of the previous year which was good. That was an example of how the Senate's free enterprise works. The public has to pay for it—through the nose.

The silly thing about the GOP view on "free enterprise" is that big business only wants so much of it. A great many give lip to the idea but are forever grabbing for government subsidy.

LAST CALL FOR 4th OF JULY N. Y. SUNTOUR

As this issue goes to press there are still 32 reservations open for the Gala 4th of July New York City Suntour leaving Rochester on Thursday afternoon and returning late Sunday evening.

They will be issued to the first 32 people who come to the Travel Department desk of The Rochester Sun, 133 Clinton Ave. S. or phone Stone 6000. They will be sold tomorrow until the supply is exhausted.

Included in the tour, the total cost of which is \$34.85 per person, is a round rail trip to and from Manhattan via New York Central Railroad. Special, air-conditioned coaches will be attached to Train No. 98 leaving the city at 2:10 p. m. daylight time Thursday. The train will pull into Grand Central Terminal in the heart of New York City at 9:40 p. m. Thursday evening. A full schedule of sightseeing tours in and around the city, a cruise in the cool waters around the island and an exploratory trip through fabulous Radio City in Rockefeller Center is on the schedule. Another highlight will be the trip to the observation roof of Rockefeller Center where members of the Suntour party can see what Gotham looks like from way up in the air. The tower soars more than 40 stories above the street.

While the party is in Manhattan luxurious rooms in the famous Hotel Lincoln will be "home." Each room is equipped with both tub and shower baths and an individual radio. The hotel is ideally situated right in the heart of the theatre and shopping district.

Of course, plenty of time for individual activity has been allowed so that each tour member can follow his own desires. In fact, the schedule has been laid out so flexibly that the tourists can do just about what they want when they want. They will not be confined to one party for the entire trip. (See TOUR Page 5)

KODAK OFFERS FELLOWSHIPS TO 16 COLLEGES

Sixteen educational institutions have been offered one or more of 22 Eastman Kodak fellowships in chemistry, physics, engineering, and business administration for the school year 1947-48, the company announced today. In addition six similar fellowships are to be sponsored by Tennessee Eastman Corp., Kodak subsidiary.

The fellowships were established by the company in 1939 to enable outstanding young scientists to continue their advanced studies in scientific and engineering fields. Since then they have been offered each year with the exception of 1944-45.

Twelve For Doctorates

Twelve of the Kodak fellowships are for doctoral work. Of these, each valued at \$1200, one in physics and one in chemical engineering will go to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. One each will go to physical chemistry to Columbia University, University of Rochester, and Yale University; in organic chemistry to Harvard University, University of Illinois, University of Nebraska, and University of Notre Dame; in physics to California Institute of Technology, University of Michigan, and Princeton University. MAYOR CURLEY NEEDS SERVICES OF JOE O'BRIEN

That Boston's mayor James M. Curley has never heard of former Congressman Joseph O'Brien nor his personal friendship with Attorney General Tom Clark was evidenced last week when the Massachusetts politico gave up all hope of serving out a federal prison sentence for fraud in connection with the obtaining of war contracts.

If Curley were aware of O'Brien's talents and Tom Clark's benevolent attitude toward at least some federal prisoners he would have taken his jail sentence quietly, secure in the knowledge that he would soon be returned to the bosom of his friends in Boston, released from prison as a sick man.

When a Washington, D. C. judge decided that Curley's reported illness was no excuse for remaining out of prison, the Boston mayor cried, "You are imposing a death sentence on me!"

Earlier, in the case of Amerigo Antonelli sentenced to serve two years in federal prison as a conspirator against the government in the manufacture of defective munitions, Attorney General Clark had ordered him released to a private room in Genesee Hospital here after serving five months of his term. Clark said the convicted munitions maker was released because "the government does not intend to impose death penalties on persons not so convicted." Antonelli was reported ill soon after he became a prison inmate.

Friends of Mayor Curley hope that Attorney General Clark still feels the same way. In fact many of Massachusetts officials' Rochester admirers are suggesting that he (See MAYOR Page 5)

FBI HEAD STILL LOOKING FOR 45 WAR PRISONERS

Forty-five escaped prisoners of war were still at large in the United States at the end of 1946, according to J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

He reveals that between October, 1942, and December 31, 1946, 2,802 prisoners of war escaped. Of these, 2,757 were located or returned to the custody of military authorities by the FBI.

Ninety-seven and three-tenths per cent of the people brought to trial by the FBI in the fiscal year of 1946 were convicted. The FBI sent 11,873 criminals to prison for terms totaling more than 26,000 years and collected over \$68,000,000 in fines, savings and recoveries during the fiscal year ended in 1946. More than \$31,000,000 was recovered from antitrust cases alone. The FBI obtained 140 convictions during the 1946 fiscal year, when it assumed responsibility for the investigation of such cases.

All of the 13 kidnaping that occurred during the fiscal year were solved, Hoover points out. No demand for ransom was made in any of these cases. Kidnapers were sentenced to a total of 207 years, plus one sentenced to a life term.

Of 292 kidnapings investigated by the FBI since the enactment of the Federal Kidnaping Statute in 1932, 290 have been solved, Hoover states. The two remaining cases continued under active investigation.

Increases in the number of convictions for extortion, bribery and theft of motor vehicles are shown by Hoover. Almost 11,500 automobiles were recovered in cases investigated by the FBI, Hoover says.

There were only half as many convictions for violations of the White Slave Traffic Act as in the previous fiscal year.

On June 30, 1946, the identification division of the FBI had a total of 101,578,578 fingerprint cards in its files.

Philadelphia. — While circus workers were busy erecting tents for the opening of the Ringling Brothers and Barnum and Bailey's Circus, Terrence Horgan, 14, stood by one of the bear cages. He got too close and was so severely bitten on his right hand, that a skin graft was necessary.

Two Hook Same Fish

Belvidere, Ill. — While fishing from opposite banks of the city park millrace during a fishing contest, two 13-year-old boys hooked a 10-inch bullhead simultaneously. Yanking their poles, the luckless fish dangled in the air. The boys, Clarence Countryman and Clark Wylde, however, received duplicate prizes. Wylde won the fish by a coin flip but he sold it to a sportsman who wanted it for his trophy fish.

Looked Like She Planned Shot Gun Wedding

Cambridge, Mass. — When a prospective bride applied for a marriage license and a license to carry a rifle at the same time, eyebrows were raised until she explained that she and her future husband were fond of target shooting. A marriage license was issued but no license was required for the rifle.

Public hearing on proposals to revise minimum wage standards in the hotel and restaurant industries will be held Thursday morning at 10 a. m. in Green Room, Hotel Sheraton here, Assistant Commissioner William F. Asart, of the State Labor Department, announced today.

Industrial Commissioner Edward Corsi, head of the State Department of Labor, will preside at the hearing. Local representatives of management and labor in both industries, as well as civic and consumer groups are expected to participate in the proceedings.

The proposals under consideration, recommended recently by wage boards after several months study of conditions in each of the two industries, provide minimum wage rate increases affecting the standards of some 158,000 restaurant and 91,000 hotel workers throughout the State.

Fishermen would be wise to concentrate on rock bass, small-mouth and largemouth bass and perch for good fishing results in July, according to Louis A. Wehle's New York State Fishing Guide, which shows July was the best month in 1946 for these four kinds of fish.

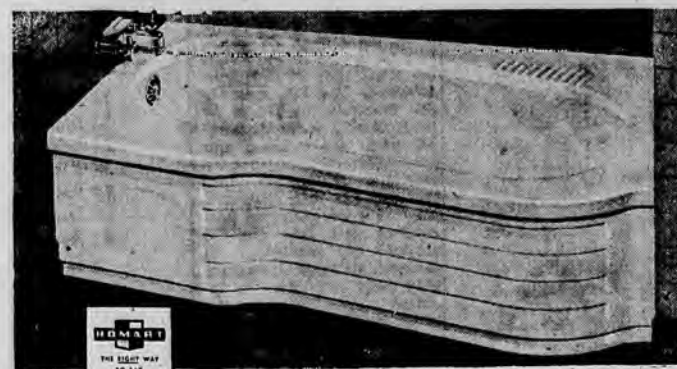

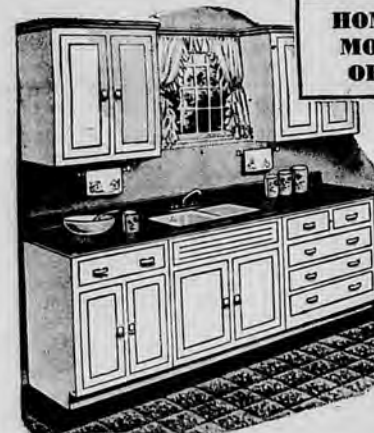

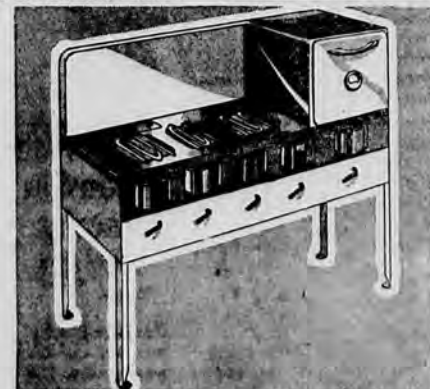

Ten fellowships for master's work, each worth \$750, have been offered as follows: in business administration, Columbia University, University of Michigan, University of Illinois, and Northwestern University; in mechanical engineering, Carnegie Institute of Technology and Iowa State University; in electrical engineering, Cornell University and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute; in chemical engineering, Cornell University and University of Michigan.

Program Recently Expanded

The Kodak fellowship program was expanded from six to the present 22 fellowships in September, 1945, to help reduce the postwar dearth of young men with advanced technical training. At that time the awards for study in physics, mechanical and electrical engineering, and business administration were added to those already offered in chemistry and chemical engineering.

The fellowships carry no provision requiring the recipients subsequently to work for Kodak.

Selection of the students is made by the university where the fellowship is awarded. The only qualifications prescribed by the company are that the student must be in the last year of graduate training for his degree, must possess demonstrated ability in his major field, a high degree of professional or technical promise, soundness of character, and financial need.

Management Speaks to Labor

An address by Alexander Printz, president of the Printz-Biederman Company of Cleveland and chairman of the National Coat and Suit Industry Recovery Board, at the June 20th session of the 26th Convention of the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union at the Public Auditorium in Cleveland:

IT IS, indeed, an honor to be invited to address this great convention. I look upon the invitation as tendered to me not as an individual employer, nor even as chairman of the National Coat and Suit Industry Recovery Board, but as symbolizing the admirable progress that has been made over the years in harmonious management-labor relationship in the industries with which your organization is identified.

As a Clevelander, who has been in the garment manufacturing business here for more than half a century, it is a source of particular pride to me that this city should be the scene of your triennial meeting. I want to join with other of my fellow citizens and the industry members of this city in bidding you welcome and in expressing the confidence that you will find Cleveland so satisfactory a meeting place that you will come here soon again.

I had the privilege of speaking at your convention in Atlantic City more than ten years ago and again at your noteworthy gathering in Boston in 1944.

Each time you have asked me to speak, I have accepted your courteous invitation, not because I felt that I could make any significant contribution to your deliberations but because it seemed to me that it was fitting and proper that a representative of management should, when afforded the opportunity, report to labor on matters of common concern.

The fact that there is a community of purpose between management and labor in the wholesome functioning of an industry was cogently expressed a number of years ago, at a time of grave depression, by the late Morris Hillquit, the able counsel to your Union and a truly distinguished figure of his time. He declared that labor was interested in the creation of proceeds by industry; that, without such proceeds, there would be nothing with which to give adequate remuneration to labor.

An Insight into Management's Role

It would, I sincerely believe, aid in the consistent improvement in worker-employer relationship for management to accord to labor an insight into management's role in the operation of an industry. Such an insight is made possible in the coat and suit industry through the National Coat and Suit Industry Recovery Board, which serves as a medium of common consideration of industry affairs by management and labor. The meetings of the Executive Committee of the Board, which comprises representatives of your Union and the employer's associations in the various coat and suit manufacturing centers throughout the nation, has been aptly described by your President, David Dubinsky, as the "Parliament of the Industry."

This is an attitude free of the isolationism that precipitates controversies and that causes the waste

inherent in suspicion and in conflict. It is a form of relationship in which neither side surrenders its individuality nor dilutes its partisanship but which recognizes the sound precept that labor and management are not traditional enemies or ingrained adversaries.

It requires courage for Union leadership to take part in such a program as that represented by the Recovery Board. It is not as dramatic or colorful as are more belligerent forms of union activity; it does not have the popular appeal of fist-brandishing or sabre-rattling. It is a broad-shouldered pattern for peaceful progress worthy of the widest possible emulation.

Constructive Interchange of Views

In those industries in which the worker-employer concord has not reached a point at which a program such as that of the Recovery Board can be introduced and developed, a beneficial purpose would, in my opinion, be served through joint conventions of representatives of labor and management. This would constitute a forum for the interchange of views and ideas, not under the stress of contract negotiation, but in the spirit of mutual enlightenment.

Not to presume upon your kindness in inviting me here today, I do, however, wish to dwell for a moment upon the true character of management's role as the marketing agent of the grist of the skill and effort of an industry's workers. An outline of management's duties in the apparel industry quickly discloses it to be a many-sided, arduous job that merits the respect, not of labor alone, but of the public as well.

It is management's task to utilize to the utmost its knowledge and ingenuity, not merely in intra-industry competition but in the broader inter-commodity rivalry.

Management in the apparel industry does not rest upon laurels of the past; it recognizes the fact that each season poses a separate challenge. Fabric and other resource markets must be exhaustively studied and conclusions concerning them must be supported by substantial investment. Management must direct extensive styling activities, hazzarding a sizeable part of its capital in the preparation of its lines. Management must engage in intensive merchandising and distribution procedure and must underwrite and co-ordinate a great many other functions that make for lasting good will and for product improvement.

Stabilized Labor Conditions Essential

To enable management to center its attention upon the capable performance of its manifold duties, orderly and stabilized labor conditions are not merely desirable; they are unquestionably essential.

The fact that there has been some unsavory union leadership does not justify any generalizations that ignore the role of organized labor in our nation's march of progress.

Leadership of High Integrity

You of the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union are to be congratulated upon the leadership of your organization—men of high integrity and proven ability. They give aggressive representation to your great organization and although we, as employers, disagree with them on many occasions, they have our sincere and enduring respect.

In closing, let me voice my belief that there is an awareness among reasonable and capable employers that strong unions, led by men of vision and probity, are indispensable to industrial orderliness and stability.

Speaking out of my own experience, I witnessed the unionizing of my firm for a quarter of a century—from 1910 to 1935. Now, after twelve years of conducting a union plant, I feel that, despite the occasional problems and differences that are inevitable in any relationship, I would not want to revert to a non-union status and I would view with regret any developments that would place unionization in our industry as a whole upon a demoralizing defensive.

The task of making way for a better tomorrow in our nation is, properly, a joint endeavor of us all. It is the common goal of worker and employer—of management and labor. Drastic curbs upon either labor or management will not attain this eagerly desired objective.

Mutual confidence and good will, as exemplified by your extending to me the privileges of this platform, are the basic essentials for lasting betterment for ourselves and for the generations to come.

***DEFINITIONS**

1. **HOTEL INDUSTRY.** The term "hotel industry" includes any establishment which, as a whole or part of its business activities, offers lodging accommodations for hire to the public, to employees, or to members or guests of members, and services in connection therewith or incidental thereto.

A "resort hotel" is one which has lodging accommodation available to the public or to members or guests of members for not more than four calendar months and 15 days in any calendar year, or is one which increases the number of employees during the four consecutive weeks from July 15th to August 15th by at least one hundred per cent over the month of May or June in that year and is located in a rural community or in a city or village having a population of less than fifteen thousand inhabitants.

The term "hotel industry" excludes a) eating or drinking places customarily offering lodging accommodations of less than five rooms to the public, to employees, or to members or guests of members; b) establishments in which lodging accommodation is not available to the public, or to members or to guests of members; c) incidental to instruction, medical care, religious observance, or to the care of handicapped or destitute persons or other public charges.

CIVIL SERVICE

If you're between 21 and 30 years of age, are fairly smart and not too decrepit physically, you may be given an opportunity to join the ranks of Rochester's smoke eaters later this month. At least you can start up the long road toward appointment some time within the next two years.

The Municipal Civil Service Commission has announced competitive examinations for firemen in the city of Rochester will start July 29 for those who have filed applications before July 21.

No indication has been given as to how soon appointments will be made from the new list which will be arranged upon completion of the examinations, but it is known that the recent appointment of 46 new fire ladders has just about exhausted the current list.

Of course you'll have a better chance at an appointment if you are a veteran — you'll be given preference in accordance with State regulations. But, you still will have a chance even if you didn't serve in the war.

Before you put down your \$2 application filing fee, you'd better give yourself the once-over. Firemen have to be healthy, sound of mind and limb and up to weight. You might swig a bit of Listerine or some other preparation inclined to "take your breath away," because the medicals can toss you out of the examination just for having "offensive breath." And you'd better walk like a man, too. A defective gait may get you the gate, according to the prospectus circulated by the civil service commission.

Starting salary for firemen is \$2200 per year. Applications for the examinations may be obtained and filed at the commission's office in City Hall Annex, 34 Court



There'll just be two classes — the poor and the Republicans. It'll be most difficult to get a vote out of the middle class when there ain't any such animal.

Five thousand city employees were made happy with raises from fifty dollars to one thousand dollars per year. Two million more for Windy City taxpayers to shell out.

MEAT CUT Quiz

Q. What is the name of this cut of meat?
A. This is a blade pot-roast of beef.
Q. Where does the cut come from, and how is it identified?
A. The blade pot-roast comes from the regular chuck or shoulder section of beef. It lies between the rib roast and the neck. It may be identified by the thin blade bone and the back-bone.
Q. How should this cut be prepared?
A. Blade pot-roast is a less-tender cut which should always be braised to produce tender and juicy meat. For additional flavor, the meat is browned evenly in 2 to 3 tablespoons of lard or dripping.
After the pot-roast is browned a small amount of liquid (1/2 to 3/4 cup) is added; the meat is covered and allowed to simmer 3 to 4 hours or until it is tender.

Over the past half dozen years the intersection has a bad record. There have been innumerable crashes and many people seriously injured at the unmarked intersection.

We recommend that the accident prevention bureau review their crash histories of Rochester corners and apply the "ounce of prevention" methods as well as they apply the "pound of cure."
If they will post the Hillside and Highland intersection within the next few days they need not worry about their budget. They can send me the bill.

parent group will take no part in the coming political campaign other than to make each candidate's attitude on the projects known to the public.
The centers were originally set up so that both parents could work in war industries. They were financed jointly by the federal government through the state, the city and the parents themselves. Parents contributed according to their ability to pay.
At the last session of the Legislature fund for the projects were withdrawn by the state effective October 1. The city then decided to close the centers as of June 26.
When parents protested the legislature's action Governor Dewey promised that funds would be made available to individual communities where it was shown a need for the centers exists.
Now the parents are trying to stir city officials to action to prove that a need for such child care centers exists in Rochester.

NEW CAR DEALERS OLD HANDS AT PROFIT-HIKING

While "The Monroe-Park News" proclaims itself to be published "in the interest of Monroe-Park Ave. sections," one item in the July 28 issue would appear to spread its interest beyond those two sections to embrace all automobile owners, or prospective owners. Such articles rarely see the light of day in daily newspapers or nationally circulated magazines for the obvious reason that thick advertising schedules from the automobile manufacturers upon recommendation of the dealers are too desirable to risk their cancellation. Apparently the Monroe-Park News does not anticipate any advertising patronage from the auto tycoons. At any rate, the article, written by Bette King, seems worthy of reprinting. Miss King says:

"The new automobile dealers are 'beefing' about used-automobile dealers charging \$600 to \$700 over list prices for late models. Some of the new-automobile dealers have nothing to 'beef' about—for 'people who live in glass houses shouldn't throw stones.'"

Back when the OPA was in control some new-automobile dealers charged over-ceiling prices. Then the OPA put the pressure on to halt profiteering. The dealers then changed their tactics. Instead of charging several hundred dollars over, they

allowed next to nothing for the trade-in automobile.

It added up the same—excessive profit. The same method of milking the public is still being used by SOME of the new

automobile dealers. Last week, for example, a dealer (who incidentally is losing many good customers because of his unethical procedures) offered \$200 for a 1941 Oldsmobile sedan as

a trade-in on a new \$2,200 automobile. Which, if the deal had been completed, would have allowed him as much profit as the new-automobile dealers want to deny the used-automobile

dealers. The customer told the dealer what she thought of him and went elsewhere for her automobile.

"The public be damned" is the attitude taken by SOME of the dealers. We do not necessarily favor excessive prices anything, but we feel the automobile dealers should clean their own house before criticizing their neighbors.

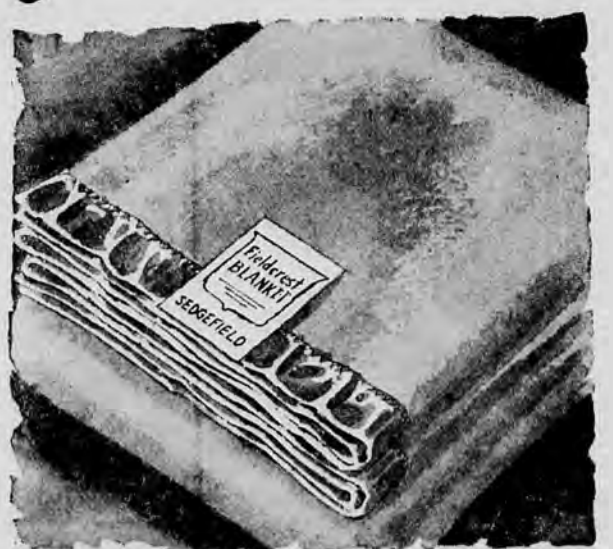

beral party, which is what might be called a "right wing" offshoot of the ALP. Rose went along with the liberals and was read out of the ALP hierarchy. Now the CIO says he is simply a "race track accountant" and does not measure up to the requirements for the rent decontrol job. Whatever may be Rose's merits or demerits for the job, only a slight glance beneath the surface shows that the labor body's opposition to him is based, not on his ability, or lack of it, but upon his current political affiliation. What its attitude would be if Rose were still chairman of the ALP is a matter of conjecture. One thing is certain — he has no less ability than in the days when he was the darling of the laborites.

Yes, politics makes strange bedfellows. It also is inclined to make party enrollment a yardstick for gauging a man's ability.

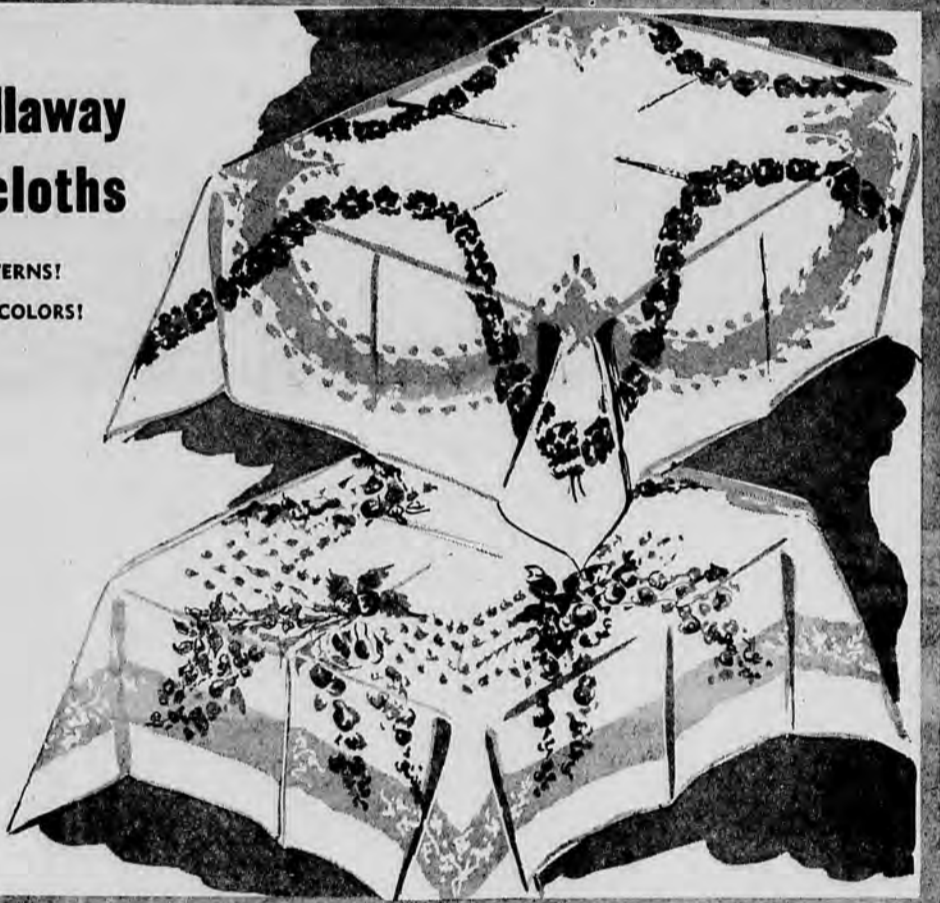

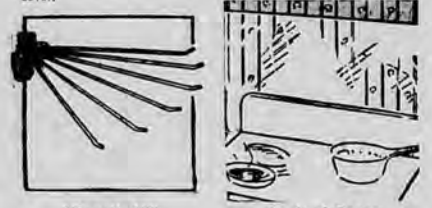

than most other automobiles on the market today, the car gets up to 35 miles on a gallon of gas at moderate driving speeds, according to company engineers.
Mechanical features which differ sharply from those of conventional automobiles include:
1. Torque converters which eliminate the conventional clutch, transmission and differential, and apply direct power to the wheels from the rear engine.
2. Precision balance achieved by lowering the frame and centering of the steering kingly in the center front instead of at the side of the engine.
3. Aluminum, air-cooled single disk brakes, tested and used for years on the Indianapolis speedway, which bring the car to a halt in 63 percent of the space required by cars equipped with conventional brakes.
4. Individual wheel suspension which allows for cushioning of the wheels by resilient action arms, actually eliminating shock instead of softening it.
5. Elimination of the conventional metal instrument panel in favor of an attractive sponge-rubber "crash-pad" cowl.
6. Construction beneath the padded cowl of a "safety chamber," made possible by the rear engine and lower frame. This space permits front seat passengers to duck into the chamber, safest place in the car, behind heavy steel bulkheads, in event of an impending collision.
7. Use of a safety-glass windshield, rubber-fastened in a sturdy frame, so that hard pressure from within will actually push the entire windshield out. Tempered glass in the windows disintegrates under hard impact without cutting edges or splinters.

Little Planning, No Vision
With all the talk, pictures and sketches of a lavish new entrance on the Brooks Ave side which the city recently proposed to construct, there actually has been little concrete planning done at or for the airport and the lack of vision with which it has been operated during the last decade is inexcusable.

Before the airport can be enlarged to handle the traffic which the city might get if it had sufficient facilities, the staff and equipment have got to be brought up to date. More "Snogos" are needed, two or three plows and at least a dozen trucks. Snogos are needed to clear runways in winter weather and several are now stationed at the airport. That, however, doesn't mean they are used for runway clearing.

Since the Department of Public Works brought so much justified condemnation down on its and the city administration's head for its incompetent handling of city street snow clearing, the Snogos are put to work in the city at large whenever they are needed. As snow falls indiscriminately on streets and runways alike—and at the same time—the only time they are needed at the airport is when they are in use in the city. They can't be both places at once.

Drainage Poor
Then there is the matter of taxi strips and drainage facilities. Anyone who can see large puddles of water standing all over the airport can realize that drainage is insufficient. And anyone who takes the trouble to look at the field in wet or stormy weather can see those puddles.

When it finally became so apparent that even the politicians could see the need for enlargement, the city undertook to purchase adjoining lands for future spreading. The purchase of property was handled in the usual political manner. Acreage that was once offered at \$200 per acre was purchased at \$600 — just triple its initial asking price. If that additional land is finally used and if the airport is enlarged as currently planned, several new problems will crop up to plague the planners. Constructing airports in a field between high tension wires on one side, a main thoroughfare on another and a canal lined with highly explosive gasoline storage tanks on another is not considered good practice in the most informed circles.

Fly Low Over Hospital
And, as if that weren't enough, consider the big planes now landing and taking off from the port. They land at approximately 100 miles per hour with an approach speed of 160 mph. Landing at a port as inadequate as Rochester requires that they "level off" at least four miles away. Even under this procedure, the runways are far too short for comfort. But in levelling off four miles away, the planes will fly directly over — and not too far over, either — Strong Memorial Hospital in Crittenden Blvd. as if when the grandiose scheme of facing the airport on Brooks Ave. is carried through. Perhaps they will erect "Hospital Quiet Zone" signs in the sky over the city's largest hospital.

Of course, if the 19th warders have their way, the entire airport will be moved away from the vicinity of their homes. They see hopes of that in the signing of "nearly 10,000 signatures" to their petitions requesting its removal. There is little chance their aim will be accomplished, however, as the city and the federal government have poured too much money into the present site to abandon it now.

19th Warders Too Late
"Complaints of the west siders are 20 years too late," said one airport representative this week. They should have done their opposing way back when the city took over the field and not wait until now," he added.

Rochester ought to have at least one good one—competently managed and efficiently operated.

But then, that wouldn't be Rochester.

ually. Then some of the property owners held a meeting in a neighbor's yard and started to growl collectively. Then they formed an official association and the growls could be heard all the way down to the zoning board's office in City Hall. Chief opposition to the project is the opening up of the residential area to commercial construction. According to Lester Tokars, chairman of the residents group, other commercial construction may be requested in the future and, if the zoning board were to approve Stromberg-Carlson's application, they would necessarily have to grant others the same privileges. This, in turn, says Tokars, will eventually lower the value of the surrounding residential property.

Other points brought out by the aroused residents are:

1. Pinnacle Rd., being 21 feet wide is too narrow to accommodate the added traffic which the station would bring to the neighborhood;
2. The tower and construction would be dangerous in view of its proximity to the Hillside Home for Children;
3. Further experimentation in television might, at some future date cause Stromberg-Carlson to abandon the site and then the buildings in the area might be used for some less desirable project. On the other hand, the company might decide to enlarge their buildings and gradually swallow up all the surrounding hillside;
4. Only 25 families were contacted by Stromberg-Carlson representatives and of that 25 14 were opposed with 11 in favor. But, says the association, of the 11 in favor, three were not property owners and four of the others lived in one house.

Officials of the radio and telephone manufacturing company of course, see things from a different angle. Up to yesterday, however, they had said not a word for public consumption. It was reported they were formulating a statement which was to be released to the press today.

Technical Supervisor Kenneth Gardner, of WHAM declared that tests already made have proved to company officials' satisfaction that the operation of the tower would not interfere with radio receivers in the immediate vicinity. He also doubted that much additional automobile traffic would be caused by the project as the buildings will house only the station itself with two employees only.

But the Pinnacle residents refused to have their fears allayed. Last night, meeting at Tokar's home on Alliance Ave. 18 executive officers and petition gatherers of the association turned petitions containing approximately 500 signatures over to the group to be laid before the Zoning Board.

Final decision on the matter is expected to be made by the Board next Thursday.

precautions to see that "it can't happen here."

These holidaymakers who expect the Unemployment Insurance Division to foot the bill are a problem that comes up every summer, a spokesman in the Albany office said, but he estimated that "relatively few" will get their checks this year.

"It's purely a matter of using judgement," observed Mrs. Depfer, yesterday, following the alerting from Albany. "We keep a pretty constant check and a pretty close guard."

Such persons as have a legitimate or "compelling" reason for being away from their home payment office when they are supposed to report must notify the bureau accordingly in advance, and leave an address so as to be available to the authorities for referral within 24 hours. Such persons get written permission to report to another office. No un-

Exceptions are made in some cases, depending on whether the claimant is considered "available for employment." A hotel worker for example may have his claim transferred into a vacation area where such jobs are available, while a longshoreman or factory worker who tried to transfer his claim in the same manner would have his benefit stopped.

Seasonal workers in an industry that is not operating likewise get more leeway to quit the local address for about two weeks, provided they are available in that time for job referral.

The usual procedure of the department has been to suspend benefit payments when a person moves to an area in which he cannot be employed since he is then considered unavailable for employment.

Political Polka

Last week's report on the machinations of the local political hierarchy and their tendency to make liquor store licenses another of their political plums brought forth a stream of letters and calls critical of the subject in general and the new Front St. package store in particular.

Sustaining last week's claim that the drink was a branded wine and that the bottles were strewn from one end of Front St. to another and that with the advent of the new "store" drunkenness had increased sharply, was a letter from the superintendent of the Rescue Mission which follows:

"Front Street Liquor Stores Rouses Food Merchants" and may I add:

"Also the Rescue Mission"

Never in the 17 years as Superintendent of the Mission has there been more bottles and more drunkenness than at the present time.

When the license was granted for a "Retail Package Store" on Front Street the proprietors assured the writer on the telephone that they would not sell their wares to the men at the Rescue Mission, yet the facts are that it would not be difficult to pick up a bushel of empty wine bottles daily within and without the buildings operated by the Mission.

Practically all such bottles come from the same store.

School Board's Report Quashing Stirs City

Rochester's need for a bi-partisan school board has seldom been more dramatically demonstrated than during the past four days when it was learned that members of the board, at the urging of Superintendent of School James Spinning, suppressed a report of the Bureau of Municipal Research showing that the city might have saved more than half a million dollars in its education budget last year had it followed the example of other cities in the state.

Shortly after contents of the report leaked out, Spinning made a sudden about-face and said he would recommend that the report be made public at the next meeting of the board. He has stalled the report within the confines of the all-Republican board since Aug. 20.

Gist of the report submitted by W. Earl Weller was that savings of \$512,400 could have been effected in the 1945-46 budget by a moderate increase in the size of classes in the public schools.

The Bureau report found the average daily attendance in the

disputed year to be 30,303 pupils, making a teacher-pupil ratio of 1 to 19.81. Had the ratio been 1 to 22.5, it was held, a reduction by 183 in the schools' teaching force would have been possible.

Attendance data was drawn from a survey made by the State Regents by the Bureau. The report declares the Regents advised a ratio of 25 to 1 minimum and 30 to 1 maximum.

Fixing the average teacher salary at "the very modest average" of \$2,800, the Bureau found that the reduction in teacher force of 183 would have spelled the \$512,400 economy.

The report came as a considerable surprise to many who during the past few years had heard from Board of Education sources

Smaller in number and output of publicity is the Liberal Party which is, nonetheless, just as vehement in condemning its political enemies.

Old Conduits Endanger City's Water Supply

Luckily for the political incompetents in charge of the city's waterworks, the average taxpayer knows little more about Rochester's water system than the fact that when he flips a faucet, water gushes out. That is, it always has up to now. How long that desirable situation continues is dependent on four or five equally worn-out men who comprise the repair crew. This skeleton crew is charged with repairing the leaks which constantly spring up in the conduits. But because the conduits are extremely aged and in a sad state of repair, and because the crew is undermanned, they never get caught up. As quickly as one leak is repaired, two or three more pop up. According to supervisory employees, the crew is always six or eight leaks behind.

When City Manager Louis Cartwright suddenly and dramatically issued orders to all Rochester taxpayers last month to cease and desist from using water with which to sprinkle lawns because of dangerous water shortage he set up a chain reaction which is expected to carry the whole water mess right into the election campaign this fall.

Roy Bush, Democratic county chairman, issued a statement condemning the present city administration's handling of the water situation and charged that the so-called "shortage" was the fault of the administration and not nature or a scanty rainfall. It does seem strange to the average taxpayer that the city, which has long boasted of its

CITY TO VIEW FUTURE TRAIN NEXT WEEK

Rochester will get its first peek at General Motors Corp. "Train of Tomorrow" next Tuesday when the 4-car blue and silver streamliner manufactured by the giant automobile concern will be open for inspection on a New York Central siding at Charlotte. The train will remain in the city for three days, leaving here early Friday morning.

Each of the train's four cars is topped by a penthouse like the Astra Dome accommodating 24 passengers.

Visitors will be permitted to tour the train from the new glassed-in observation balconies to the cab of the 2,000-horsepower Diesel locomotive. The New York Central is co-operating with General Motors in the Train of Tomorrow's eastern exhibition tour.

(Continued From Page 1) water system, should find it necessary to issue curbing orders at a time when lakes, rivers and oceans are filled almost to overflowing with water. Right here in Rochester, the weather bureau has already checked in more than a normal full year's rainfall. It is supposed that part of that lush shower has found its way into Hemlock and Canadice Lakes from which the city draws its supply.

Back of Cartwright's sudden and hysterical cry for water conservation, the "waterwise" could see his admission that the water situation is at last beginning to catch up to the penny-pinching policies of his administration. Despite the widespread acknowledgement that he is obliged to run the city to suit the Republican machine from which he takes his orders, blame for the situation is going to be laid on his doorstep — if the Democrats have their way.

Coupled with political appointments, the Republicans' much-publicized "Hold the Line '47" policy has also con-

tributed to the current state of the water system here.

Even if the three conduits which at present bring all the city's Hemlock-Canadice supply from the lakes to the Rush storage reservoir were in perfect condition, water experts say their capacity (when much of it isn't seeping into the ground through leaks) is 38.7 million gallons daily. On Thursday, Aug. 21 and Friday, Aug. 22 even after Cartwright had ordered his unenforceable ban on water sprinkling the city's consumption was 43.6 million gallons and 43.7 million gallons respectively.

Those figures, in short, tell the story of Rochester's water storage.

The city needs at least one additional conduit—immediately—if its water system is to function properly and adequately.

The three conduits now supposedly in operation were laid down between 1875 and 1918. None has been added since the days of World War I. At that time the population of the city was 248,000. Now it is more than 321,000 but has no ad-

ditional water supply facilities. Most city people do not know these facts.

But their country cousins do. They know what's going on — how the watershed is being managed — and they're talking about it. What's more, they're laughing right out loud.

In the village of Hemlock on the edge of the city's water shed, Rochester's water supply is the main topic of discussion around the general store's cracker barrel. But such talk (See WATER Page 3)

U. S. Labor Bureau Charts Food Cost Rise

This week, just about one year after Big Business and its political spokesman, the Republican party, were promising that food prices would level off in a few short months if OPA price controls were removed, the United States Department of Labor released figures showing the food prices in 56 cities had risen 93.1 per cent over the 1935-1939 average, 16 percent above that of a year ago and 106 percent above the index for August, 1939.

No immediate relief for consumers was foreseen in the report either. The Labor De-

In Rochester, milk dealers hiked the price of milk another penny this week bringing the current price to 21 cents for standard quality milk.

The index reached a new all-time high for the second month in a row, the BLS reported.

The price of eggs rose more than the usual seasonal increase, advancing 11 per cent between mid-June and mid-July.

In second place in the marathon of rising prices were dairy products, showing a net gain in the same period of 4 per cent. Again, low supplies, particularly of butter, and seasonally light production of milk, were cited by the report as contributing to the increase in price. Butter prices were up more than 8 per cent, fresh milk 3 per cent, and cheese 2 per cent.

Meats, fish and poultry prices advanced an average of 1 1/2 per cent, the BLS survey showed. The sharpest rise was made by all grades of beef cuts which increased from 2 to 3 1/2 per cent. Pork and lamb prices went up about 1 per cent, and fish was higher in price by about 2 per cent.

ONLY 1 IN 3 KNOWS PAY LAW IS ON BOOKS

Only one employer in three even knows there is an Equal Pay Law on the books of New York State. The statute which went into effect July 1, 1944 prohibits discrimination in wage rates for men and women doing the same work.

But that didn't prevent the State Labor Department's publicity bureau from reporting this week that results of the survey "indicate that the law is making a material contribution to the industrial health of the state." How it is aiding is not revealed.

A recent survey conducted by students in the Sociology Department at Syracuse University showed that of the 1,546 employers queried, only 549

professed familiarity with the law.

Less than one tenth of those who discussed the question claimed that enactment of the Equal Pay Law had necessitated any rearrangement of their businesses.

Among the 998 employers who were ignorant of the Law less than one fourth revealed employment practices which

would even bring them under its provisions. The vast majority asserted that equal rates were paid anyhow.

The upper floors are faced with Indiana limestone set up in large blocks.

The use of glass makes the whole interior visible from the street and creates an effect in the show windows of being separate from the rest of the building.

The building is fully air-conditioned and illuminated in the most modern manner with stunline fluorescent and cold cathode lighting.

Tax Sham Battle Nears Climax

While a few pieces were still missing from the jigsaw puzzle of how the administration will wiggle out of responsibility for a new sales tax shortly after election, the shape of things to come was rapidly emerging this week as the stage-managed sham battle between the Board of Education and the City Council reached another climax.

The pattern is now quite clear. Last year when the State Legislature, at the behest of Presidential aspirant Governor Dewey passed the buck to the communities in the matter of raising money with which to pay teaching salary increases, local Republican helmsmen saw they were apt to be caught in the middle.

The state decreed that the teachers should have more money. Few disagreed with that. But the state made no provision to raise the money to pay the increase. That disagreeable little task was left to the several communities.

Some communities with more courage than Governor Dewey, proceeded to levy a sales tax to raise the funds.

But in Republican Hold-The-Line '48-'49 Monroe County the administrators lacked the intestinal fortitude to instigate any new taxes—at least before this fall's election. Instead—the "brains" of the city and county govern-

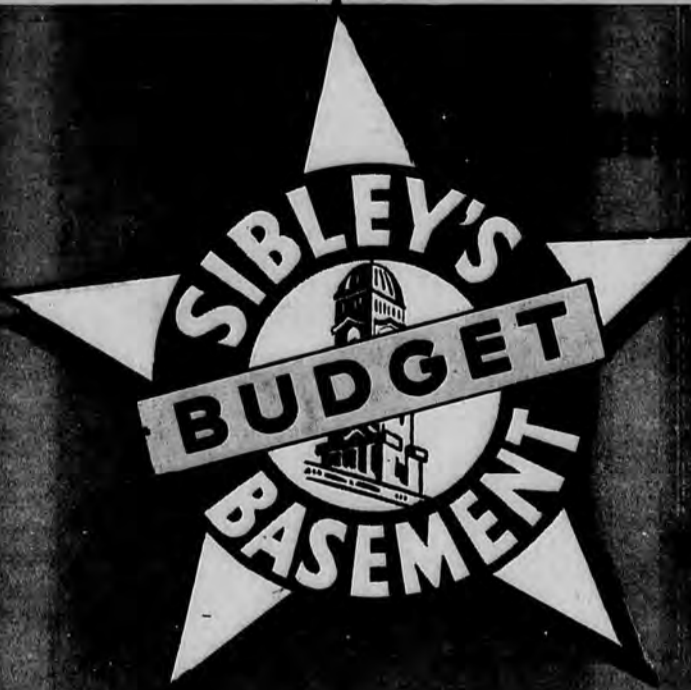

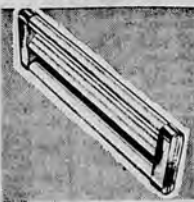

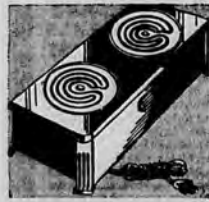

ment thought up a grand idea: Let's make the people themselves "demand" new taxes. Then the responsibility will be off our shoulders.

They even went so far as to hire the Municipal Research Bureau to come up with the idea that the Board of Education has been wasting money. Then members of the Board (all Republicans) played their part in a manner to do credit to a Barrymore. Righteous indignation! Stall! Suppress the report! My, they were wonderful.

Of course, as soon as the Research Bureau came up with the idea that classes ought to be larger, the teachers hollered to high heaven. Who, in this day and age wants to do more work when the fashion is less work for more pay?

When the teachers, through their organization spokesmen, condemned the report's findings, Parent-Teachers organizations were stirred. They wanted their kids to get the best education available and they didn't want any larger classes, either.

Meanwhile the council has said nothing. They know the scenario. One of these days the County Board of Supervisors will step into the spotlight to do the honors.

The finale will come shortly after election when it will be "found" that Monroe County's taxpayers "insist that their children have the best;" that the Board of Education is as economical as Sandy McTavish; and that the "only way out" is through the imposition of a countywide sales tax "demanded by parents, educators and all right-thinking people."

A Call To Arms

This is an editorial! It's more than that. It's a call to arms! The Sun is not in the habit of publishing editorials. It is our belief that the news columns are comical enough and tragic enough to point their own moral.

But apparently, Rochester housewives are too busy trying to beat the high cost of living to figure out morals from news stories.

There's been so much talk lately about rising food prices — and so little action toward bringing them back to somewhere near a sane level.

Even those newspapers that whooped with joy when the OPA was killed and prophesied that prices would surely level off when "free enterprise" controlled prices instead of the government are now asking why prices have skyrocketed.

In the case of food prices the answer is as plain as the nose on your neighbor's face:

Everybody, all down the line is soaking just as much as the traffic will bear.

And that goes for the farmer, the processor, and the retail food merchant.

What's more, they'll keep right on soaking us until they are forced to cut down prices.

Last year on the eve of OPA's death the Times-Union advised us to "Let American production show what it can do with the wraps off in furnishing goods at competitive prices." Two days later it promised us that "We shall get more goods, better goods and within a short time cheaper goods from a free economy than through government price-fixing, allotments and other controls."

Other voices of big business mouthed similar rosette promises. But what has happened? Instead of lower prices this same big business — along with little business, many merchants, most farmers and storekeepers have gouged and scratched, ballooned and inflated food prices so high they are setting new all-time high records with the dawn of each new day.

True, wages have risen — considerably — in the past few years. But the cost of living has far outstripped all the wage gains made by labor.

State To Pay For New City Streets

When, as and if the city and state planners can get together, the state is going to do what the city should have done years ago — modernize Rochester's street system, knock down some of the old buildings like Convention Hall, and, perhaps, pull the city out of an embarrassing hole by junking the subway and using it as a new express highway.

Yesterday Charles H. Sells, New York State Superintendent of public works unfolded the state plan to city and county officials and members of the city planning board. On Tuesday, the city planners, after cogitating for years, revealed their own plan which differs materially from that proposed by the Albany officials.

The state plan, tied in with the statewide Thruway road system calls for construction of a 47-mile arterial route system costing approximately \$40,000,000 in and around the city in addition to the thruway construction already underway in the Rochester urban area. The project would be started early next year and carry through to 1960.

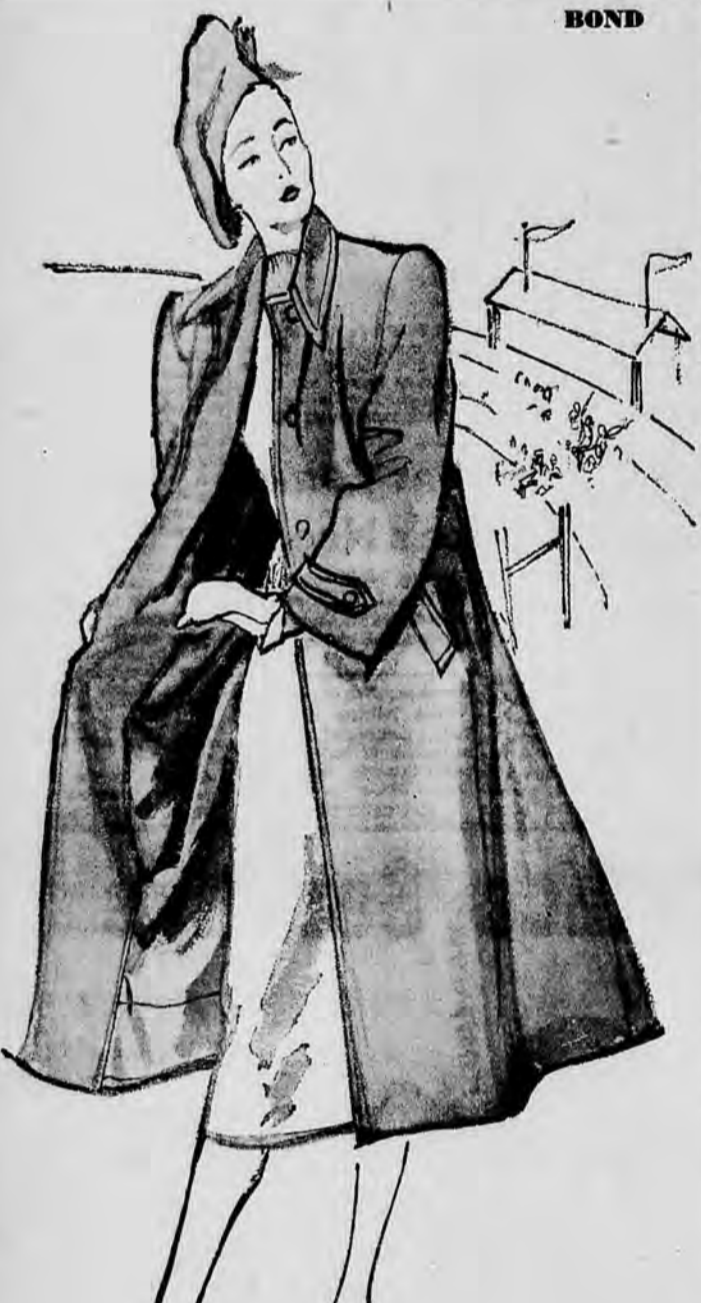

summer. That's an increase of 107 percent.
How does that increase stack up with food price increases?
In September, 1939 right here in Rochester a local food chain advertised Pork Loins at 11c per pound. Last week this same concern also advertised pork loins — at 53 cents per pound. Here are some more local 1939 advertised food prices — from chains and independents:
Roasting or broiling chickens 25 cents per pound; Hams, 25 cents per pound; Beef roasts, 19 cents per pound.
Today those same stores are asking 75 cents a pound for frying chickens, 55 cents a pound for hams, 59 cents per pound for shoulder beef roasts.
Those prices represent increases of 300 and 400 per cent AND MORE.
So don't lay all the blame for skyrocket price gouging to increased wages for labor.
Such propaganda is strictly the bunk!
Last year when controls were taken off meats Frederick M. Tobin, president of the Tobin Packing Co. was quoted in the news papers as saying: "doing away with controls is a wonderful thing."
Wonderful for whom? Surely not the housewife. Surely not for the wage earner with a family who sees more and more

of his hard-earned money going out to pay ballooning prices. Perhaps Mr. Tobin meant it was a wonderful thing for owners and stockholders of packing companies.
And it probably has been. But what about you and I? Do you think that doing away with OPA is "wonderful"? Do you think dollar-plus-a-pound-shoulder-beef roasts are wonderful; that dollar-a-pound butter is wonderful?
No, certainly not!
What can you and I do about combatting high prices?
We can band together in an organized, concerted effort to DRIVE PRICES DOWN by boycotting many of the over-priced items and by cutting

down to a bare minimum on the others. Use oleo instead of butter. Regardless of all the propaganda oleo is just as healthful, just as clean and pure as butter and many claim it is just as tasty. Use hamburger and steaks instead of steaks and ribs. And so on down the line.
One individual alone cannot influence food prices. But an ORGANIZED, PUBLICIZED DRIVE by housewives a thousand strong can accomplish wonders.
Who will organize the drive? We'll back them up with the spotlight of publicity!
One word of caution:
This is not a job for left-

wingers as such or liberals, or politicians, or the lunatic fringe — as such. It is a job that can and should be done in by plain ordinary American people.
Politicians and leftists who have their thinking directed from Moscow please stay away. This is not an opportunity to simply foment trouble. It is an opportunity to prove that real "free enterprise" springs from the people and that, in the final analysis the people have the power to say how much of and for what they will spend their money.
Who will step forward to organize and spearhead such a drive?

the state would pay all construction charges plus half the costs of right of way procurement. The city would be called upon to spend an estimated \$9-370,950 for its half of the cost of lands required for completion of projects lying wholly within the city.

Included in the proposed program would be 24 projects within the city and eight others outside the city line.

Four major elements comprise the overall program set forth by Sells. He proposes of construction of two Thruway connections, an inner loop around the central business section, an outer circumferential loop and five radial thoroughfares which would link the loops into an integrated network of arterial highways.

One Thruway connection would be known as Chili Ave. Expressway, located within a right of way generally parallel to and south of Main St. and Chili Ave. The plans as presented contemplate a four-lane divided expressway from the Inner Loop to the Outer Loop, continuing as a four-lane pavement to the west city line along Chili Ave.

The second connection would be along University Ave., proposed as a six-lane surface pavement with parking lanes, following the present alignment of University Ave. from the Inner Loop to the east of city line. From this point it would follow the old trolley right-of-way north of East Ave., connecting with the Outer Loop.

The inner loop would consist of an eight-lane surface pavement around the central business district. The proposed route in general follows Central Ave., Cumberland St., Delevan St., Union St., Monroe Ave. and Plymouth Ave. A new bridge over the Genesee River south of Court St., will be required.

The outer loop is proposed to encircle Rochester in the vicinity of the city line. In this location it will intercept traffic from all major highways entering the city, enabling much of it to bypass densely built-up areas. The planned location utilizes parts of Ridge Road on the north side, Mount Read and Genesee Park Blvds.

on the West and Elmwood Ave. on the south. Connecting spurs are proposed on Mount Read Blvd. from Ridge Rd., north to the Lake Ontario State Parkway.

One radial route will be known as the Clinton Avenue Expressway from the Inner Loop northerly to the Outer Loop, largely on new location parallel to and east of the present Clinton Ave. Provisions are made for access at major intersections, and for a connection to the future Genesee State Parkway to the north.

Another radial route is proposed along Union St., Central Pk., Webster Ave., Bay St., Martinot St., Clifford Ave. and Empire Blvd.

A third radial route would be designated as the Monroe Avenue Expressway and would be a southeast thoroughfare planned as a four-lane divided expressway paralleling the trolley subway.

The fourth unit of the radial route network consists of a six lane pavement on South Ave. to Mt. Hope Ave. and a four-lane divided pavement along Mount Hope Ave. to the city line.

A fifth radial route would be a northerly thoroughfare along State St. and Lake Ave.

The Rochester Report presented to Mayor Dicker and Chairman Bausch is contained in a 147 page volume and includes 53 maps and charts. It was prepared under the direction of B. D. Tallamy, Chief

Engineer on the New York State Department of Public Works by engineers of the Rochester District Office. Preparation of the report was supervised by Elmer C. Lawton, District Engineer, and Fred W. Fish of the Department's Bureau of Arterial Route Planning. Herbert L. Michael, assistant district engineer represented Lawton, who is ill at yesterday's meeting.

**RELIEF HEAD
DENIES CHARGE
OF 'PRESSURE'**

Fears that religious intolerance might be guiding distribution of relief to the Italian people were partially eased this week following clarification of charges by a group of 44 American Baptists now touring Europe that all relief materials sent to Italy by American Relief for Italy, Inc. were being funneled for distribution through the Vatican.

The Baptists had charged that each private relief package was stamped "American Relief for Italy, Inc. care of Myron C. Taylor, Vatican City."

While Judge Juvenal Marchisio president of the group, did not deny that the packages are so stamped, he emphatically denied that this was done to strengthen the hand of the Vatican in Italian politics. He declared that distribution has always been made on the basis of need irrespective of political or religious persuasion of the recipient.

"One can easily draw the conclusion from the Baptists' charges," said Judge Marchisio, "that the relief materials sent by our organization to the Vatican were distributed in accordance with the wishes of high clerical circles. Nothing can be further from the truth! It is a matter of public record both in this country and in Italy, since the inception of our Agency more than three years ago, has been and is distributed by the National Committee for the Distribution of Relief in Italy (ENDSI) an Agency created by the Italian Government and composed of representatives of the Italian Government, the Vatican, the Italian Red Cross, and the Italian Confederation of Labor."

Judge Marchisio explained that up until about a year ago American Relief for Italy relief supplies had been addressed to Taylor at Vatican City but only for purposes of convenience since in his capacity as the President's Personal Representative to His Holiness Pope XII, and as Chairman of the Board of Directors of American Relief for Italy, his address had been established there.

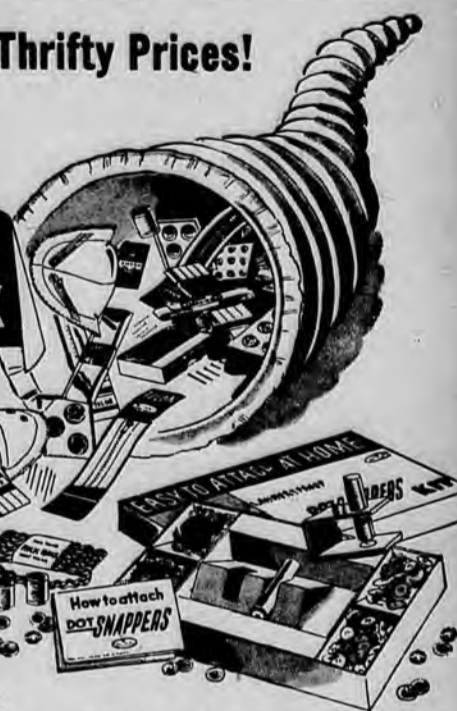

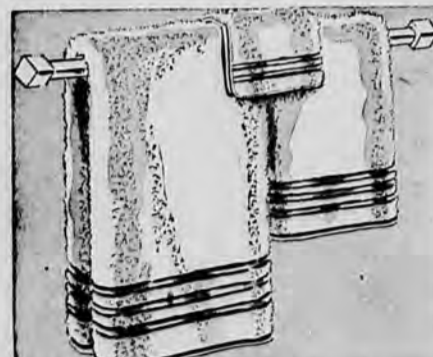

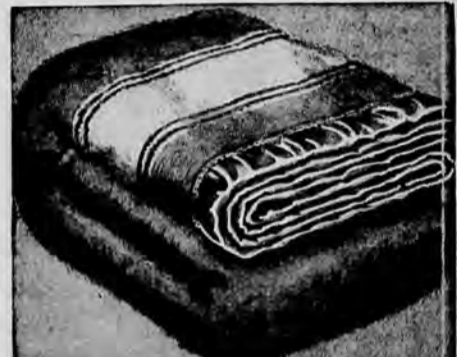

City's Fifth Radio Station Ready To Take The Air

The first broadcasting Co. in the United States to use the WV prefix series, formerly kept for private use of the Army, will take to the air in Rochester sometime next month if present construction and installation schedules can be maintained. The new station will have the call letters WVET. It will be operated by the Veterans Broadcasting Co., organized in April, 1946 by 38 veteran stockholders — 34 of whom are residents of Rochester. Four of the 38 have been engaged in radio and advertising in New York for the past decade.

Construction work on transmitter facilities has been going forward since June when the Federal Communications Commission granted the group a construction permit to operate a new 5000 watt station on 1280 kilocycles. Four guyed towers have been assembled and are being erected at the transmitter site, north of the Barge canal on Westfall Rd. between Clinton Ave. S. and Winton Rd. S. in Brighton. Studios and business offices will be located centrally in town. Included among the officers and staff of WVET is Bill Maillefert, president and general manager; Jack Houseknecht, vice-president and station manager; Fred Flaucane, treasurer; Grantier Neville, secretary; Ted Trimble, assistant secretary and assistant treasurer; Bill Baird, Sam Connor, Hall James and Harry Bennett, directors. Elmer Walz, formerly of WSAV has been named sales manager.

Food Costs Can Be Cut

One person alone cannot stem rising food prices throughout a community. One community cannot drive food prices down throughout an entire nation.

When you refuse to buy steaks from your butcher, he'll refuse to buy them from the packer. And when the packer can't sell steaks at the price he is asking HELL LOWER HIS PRICE or go out of business, and make room for someone who will sell at lower prices.

It goes right back to the farmer. The farmer wants all he can get for his livestock, beans,

Committee Organizes To Fight Food Cost

First steps to organize a united, community-wide fight on the highest food prices in local history were made Monday following a plea in The Sun last Thursday for such a demonstration.

Representatives of several labor, civic and business groups met at Powers Hotel, Monday evening to organize the Community Committee Protesting Living Costs under the chairmanship of John Walsh, former community service chairman of the Monroe County Rationing Board.

Plans were discussed for a mass meeting of protest in Convention hall early in October. The support of all fraternal, social, religious, veteran and labor will be sought for a united drive to hammer down skyhigh food costs.

Already the howls of protest being registered by consumers across the country are having their effect on the cost of setting the family table. Reports from Chicago, Minneapolis, Kansas City and other food centers show reductions in the price of wheat, corn, oats, and meat on the hoof. Right here in Rochester, meat prices were credited as "dropping slightly" during the early days of the week. Butter, eggs, apples, peaches and pears also brought slightly lower prices.

"It just shows what the consumer can do," said Walsh commenting on the price dips.

Cut out the steaks — eat stew. Cut out the butter — eat corn, wheat, etc. BUT HELD CHARGE ONLY WHAT THE MARKET WILL PAY. And if you won't pay his price he'll cut it to a level you will pay.

balance" and a dozen other assorted ways to get the sucker's money amaze the out of town visitor by their profusion and their ready availability.

The only thing that Rochester has, and wide-open Tia Juana and Las Vegas hasn't, is a Republican administration.

While Rochester may still woo the goddess of chance with few restrictions, the sins of the flesh openly sold in the Seventh Ward are at this writing reported unavailable.

No, it is not a matter of

police clean-up, nor a near-election burst of virtue — merely the political elements of the community fighting one another for control of the red-lanterned establishments.

As soon as "the boys" settle their differences and arrive at the proper division of their territories there will be "business as usual."

If you think there is going to be anything done about the sales tax to pay for increased teachers salaries before election you are "cuh-razy." One never talks about more taxes until election is passed and safely in the bag.

But right after the first of

the year all Rochester is going to have to pay a tax of probably two per cent on purchases. There are other ways out of it but a city administration which gets itself elected so easily isn't going to bother trying to find out what they are.

The dollar bus pass will also join the nickel cigar in the limbo of forgotten luxuries-after election. There will be a big show and reams of petitions, hours of hearings, and empty foolish political talk by the Dept. of Commerce's fair-haired boy — but the dollar pass is about to become a museum piece.

There is a move afoot to force the hearing on the bus pass before election — but in Rochester such things never happen.

There was an ambitious program of new streets revealed last week and the daily papers showed diagrams of how pretty they'd look and how helpful they would be. They didn't say, how impossible.

Impossible, merely because Rochester is stony broke and has been teetering on the edge of bankruptcy for years. With all the "hold the line til '49" conversation, 1949 is going to

be just the dawning of another five year plan—maybe the slogan will be "nothing more til '54."

The street plan calls for a generous contribution from the Dewey slush fund but it would still be necessary that the city fathers get together added millions. Their chances of doing that are about as good as getting Roy Bush endorsed on a Republican ticket.

They were very pretty diagrams and they would be a great municipal asset but if we have them, say twenty years from now, someone else will have to pay for them.

"when they really get their dander up and work together."

"Of course," he added, "the price cuts to date are only a drop in the bucket. If we can show a united front cutting across business, labor and religious lines, and keep up the pressure, prices will recede."
"Our big fight is still ahead of us, though," he added, "until we prove that we mean business."

He pointed to a report from New York that "manufacturers generally are unworried over the possibility high food costs might be digging too deep into consumers' buying power."
"They better start worrying," Walsh declared.
"This thing is bigger than any one group," he warned "and we've just got to work together if we are going to accomplish any real good for the consumer. We all have to eat regardless of our politics or station in life. Therefore, we all ought to be interested in lowering the cost of the food if it can be done."
"That it can be done," concluded Walsh, "is proven by the 'rollback' already accomplished."

Help from another quarter also came this week when the R. G. & E. Home Service Department announced it will feature "Purse String Menus" in a new series of demonstra-

tions starting next Wednesday. The demonstrations will be held at 2 and 7:30 p. m. each Wednesday in the R. G. & E. Home Service Auditorium.

According to Home Service Director, Irene Muntz, the new demonstrations have been planned to aid homemakers with the increasingly difficult job of balancing their food budget. Economical, yet attractive and wholesome menus will be demonstrated and recipes and other cooking helps will be available.
