

Historic Newspapers Collection Medicare Issues Camp Openings New Handbook

A new edition of "Your Medicare Handbook " has been mailed to elderly people in the Rochester area, according to Joseph Tomaino, Social Security District Manager.

The new edition includes the many important changes in Medicare enacted in the 1967 Social Security Amendments. In addition, every attempt has been made to make it easy to read and understand.

In an introductory letter at the front of the new Handbook, Tomaino said, Robert M. Ball, Commissioner of Social Security, points out, for example, that new term, "bene-fit period", is used in the new edition, because there was confusion about the definition of "spell of illness", the term used in the

Many people thought the term had something to do with single illness or a particular sick spell. The new edition of "Your Medicare Handbook" points out that a "benefit period" is simply a period of time for measuring your use of Medicare's hospital insurance

The first time you enter a hospital after your hospital insurance starts under Medicare will be the beginning of your first benefit period. Your first period ends as soon as you have not been a bed patient in any hospital (or any facility that mainly provides skilled nursing care) for 60 days in a row.

After that, a new benefit period begins the next time you enter a hospital and you become eligible for a second round of hospital insurance benefits - - 90 days of hospitalization, 100 days of posthospital extended care, and 100 posthospital home health visits.

The Medicare beneficiary need not bother to keep track of how many "days" or "visits" he has used in a benefit period, the Handbook notes. He (or she) will get a notice from the Social Security Administration after he has used any hospital insurance benefits, telling how many days or visits he has left.

Only a very few people will need these medical services long enough to use all the benefits they have for a benefit period. But for those who do, an extra "lifetime re-serve" of 60 additional days of hospitalization has been added under the Social Security Amendments of 1967.

Old Electric System Discontinued

One of the oldest electric systems in service anywhere in the country has been discontinued. It was part of the Edison three-wire, direct current network, first established in Rochester in 1886, and has been in continous service

for 82 years. Francis E. Drake, Jr., board chairman and chief executive officer of RG&E, opened the switch, shutting down the system, Commenting on the network, he said, "This system was one of the real workhorses of its day. It was very adaptable for use in electric motors, and as such played a very important role in the development of industrial uses of electricity."

The Edison system was one of the first in the country to bury its wires, thus becoming the forerunner of RG&E's vast underground network. It was also the start of RG&E's steam system, which now provides heat for nearly 500 customers. Exhaust steam from the engines driving the original 125 volt generators was used for heating adjacent buildings.

Touch-Phone Service To Alter Dial Tone

Beginning last Sunday, a slightly different dial tone went into effect at Rochester Telephone's Lexington Ave. switching center.

About 17,000 residential and business customers whose telephone numbers begin with 254, 458 and 647 are served by the Lexington center.

The new lower-pitched tone is a result of modification of existing equipment that will enable residential and some business customers served by the Lexington center to use Touch-Phones.



Your Medicare Handbook

By: Joseph M. TOMAINO District Manager

The new edition of "Your Medicare Handbook" points out that in each benefit period, an older per-son's hospital insurance under Medicare can help pay for up to 90 days of bed patient care in a participating hospital. Medicare pays for all covered services in the first 60 days, except for the first \$40. For the 61st through the 90th day, it pays for all covered

services, except for \$10 a day. The additional "lifetime re-serve" is like a bank account of extra days to draw on if the older person ever needs more than 90 days of hospital care in the same benefit period. For each day of his "lifetime reserve" that is used, Medicare pays for all covered services, except for \$20 a day.

When an older person is a bed patient in a hospital, Medicare can pay for the following services: Bed in a semiprivate room (2 to 4 beds) and all meals, including special diets.

Operating room charges. Regular nursing care, including intensive care nursing.

Drugs furnished by the hospital, Laboratory tests. X-ray and other radiology ser-

Medical supplies, such as splints

and casts.

Use of appliances and equipment furnished by the hospital, such as wheelchairs, crutches, braces etc. Medical social services.

Services Not Covered Some services that Medicare cannot pay for are:

Charges for a telephone, radio, or television, furnished at the patient's request and other similar items of personal comfort or convenience.

Private duty nurses.

Any extra charge for use of a private roome, unless needed for medical reasons.

Doctors' services (the volun-

tary medical insurance part of Medicare helps pay for these). Care that is custodial, rather than medical.

concerns me is the recent wave of vandalism in our parks. Park protection must be increased and heavier penalties given to vandals.

I hope we can press for immediate action in this area.



In my address to the Greece Chamber of Commerce at its Installation of Officers on Saturday, June 29th, I emphasized the importance of the business community's role in solving the problem of the hardcore unemployables.

The American economy is based on the concept of the free enterprise system. The only permanent solution to the problem of qualifying the unemployable for today's job market lies in a partnership between private business and government. In the past year Rochester Jobs, Inc. has successfully placed 1,386 people in the job market, many of whom were thought to be unemployable. Lockheed Aircraft Corporation has also been successful in seeking out and qualifying heretofore unemploy-

If the unemployables remain unemployed society faces three adverse results: First, human beings who could be beneficial to themselves, to their families, and to our community will instead be nonproductive and hostile detriments to our society. Secondly, the unemployed individual is not able to care for himself and his family. This increases the already huge government outlay for various forms of welfare. As you may know, the biggest cost of welfare is the aid to dependent children category, and these children need aid largely because their father is not in a position to discharge his obligations. Thirdly, the unemployed is a non taxpayer, and everyone knows that government costs are skyrocketing higher every day. The more people we have who contribute to the tax roles, the lower the rate of taxes each one of us will pay.

And so, in substance, when the hardcore unemployable becomes a member of the working force his human dignity is enhanced,

the welfare roles are reduced, and the tax revenue collected by the government is increased. Not to mention the fact that, as a consumer with an increased income, the employed man can afford to buy the products we as businessmen produce, and thus, everyone's situation is enhanced.

Job placement and job education for the unemployable is not an easy task. The problems involved are unique and the traditional approaches to employment and on the job training are not applicable. However, in the words of James D. Hodgson, Vice President for Industrial Relations at Lockheed, these programs have not hurt production nor increased employee turnover. "So we think from a company standpoint it is a success. From the standpoint of the nation, people who have been thought unemployable have proved to be employable."



Removal of City Dump Now A Possibility?

Something may be done about the all too-familiar smoke screen eminating from the Mt. Read-Emerson city dumps which for many years has been the nemesis of the immediate area and occasionally making life miserable for other parts of Northwest Rochester.

City Manager Seymour Scher and other city officials have agreed to "move quickly for the completion of studies now being carried out by consultants, so that alternatives can be found for the deposit of incinerator residue, garbage and rubbish".

Prominent political figures have clamored for years for relief. City firemen, unhappy about the long stand-by tours of duty, fighting a losing battle a-gainst smoke and flames for weeks on end, have complained

bitterly.

The death of a fireman who had been at the scene of the fire for considerable time recently will add further complication if it is decided that smoke inhalation was a contributing factor.

Now Northwest Councilman Andrew G. Celli has taken a militant stand and has called for immediate removal of the landfill operations, including transferring it to a location remote from the city.

Skeptical and long suffering home owners are nevertheless hopeful that the city is about to take action.

Councilman Celli's communication to the city manager on the subject reads as follows:

The bad situation which has intermittently occurred at the Emerson landfill was culminated with intermittent fires throughout the landfill which required the dispatch of four fire pumps, a truck company and battalion chief to work for twelve hours to bring this intolerable situation under

An unhealthy, unsafe and danger-

ous condition resulted from these fires by reason of huge clouds of smoke, dust and polluted air, which covered the residential areas in the Northwest District, a number of miles from the landfill.

This situation endangers the health, safety and well being of the residents of my district, as well as residents of other adjoining areas.

By reason of this, I am asking you to consider the immediate closing of said landfill for the dumping of combustible materials, which have evidently been coming from the incinerators throughout the City. I believe that it is imperative that action be taken for the location of a landfill area which would be located far enough away from the residential areas of the City. This solution may come about by cooperation with the County of Monroe with regard to the problem of refuse disposal.

The seriousness of this problem requires your immediate attention. I would appreciate your contacting me after you have discussed the matter with the Commissioner of Public Works.







Historic Newspapers Collection Damage To Grass "Black Comedy" Due To Drought?

Don't be alarmed, says Monroe County Cooperative Extension, if your lawn browns out during mid-July, For well-built bluegrass and fescue lawns normally "brownout" during mid -summer if not watered. They will recover quickly when cooler, more moist fall weather arrives, advises Kirkwood

E. Personius, turf specialist. Lawns that will not survive ordinary summer drought without watering probably need rebuilding since they undoubtedly contain a proportion of undesirable annual, shallow rooted grasses and weeds,

says Personius.

The appearance of lawns can be improved by watering, but they can also be ruined by frequent light waterings which encourage undesirable annual grasses and weeds. Thus, Cooperative Extension advises, that if you do water, apply one inch of water at weekly intervals or two inches of water every two weeks if your soil will absorb this much water in a 24 hour period without excessive run off, Coffee cans placed at random around sprinklers are an excellent method for measuring the amount of water applied.

Whether you water during the day or at night makes no difference to the lawn, Just be certain that when you do water, you moisten turf soil thoroughly to a five to six inch depth, Personius says.

May Proposes Code Changes

Councilman Stephen May recently introduced at a City Council meeting amendments to the City Zoning Code to require that 20 (rather than 10) days' notice be given of zoning hearings, and to increase the notification area from 200 to 500 feet from the property in question.

May said adoption of the proposals would increase the ability of groups and individuals to promote sound neighborhood development and protect against unwarranted zoning variances and special ex-

istic of the American people, who take pride in converting discarded items into usable forms. Some-times, however, there may be a danger to this practice.

For instance, an enterprising do-it-yourselfer obtained a wire shelf from an old refrigerator and used it as a hamburger grill. He ended up poisoning himself and his family.

This happened because the wire shelf was plated with cadmium, a toxic element. When the shelf was heated, the cadmium contaminated the hamburgers.

It would be wise, therefore, to do a little investigating before using castoff items for some purpose other than that for which they were intended. Make sure you are not creating a booby trap.

BBB Advise: Know What You Sign

If the salesman says, "You can cancel this contract any time you want", his promise is meaningless says the Better Business Bureau, unless you find it stated as a contract provision, Regardles s of whether it is a long formal contract or a simple-appearing little order form, the BBB says you had better read it carefully before signing.

In most cases the BBB says you won't find any written provision for cancellation unless, possibly, a heavy penalty is charged. But you are very likely to read, "This constitutes the entire agreement. I have read and understand all the terms and agree to abide by all such provisions thereof".

Such clauses clearly rule out the salesman's oral assurances and the Better Business Bureau says if you run into a situation like this, where a salesman's pitch differs from the contract terms, you had better check with their office before committing your signature.

A new mumps vaccine, just licensed for use, is now on tap. It will, no doubt, be a real asset in thwarting epidemics. Young adolescents and adult males should be the first to take advantage of the protection. At present, however, there is no protective serum that produces permanent immunity. The Public Health Service reports that the length of effectiveness of the new vaccine is not known.

The vaccine, as a result, is not recommended for young children. For pre-adolescents, it is still wisest to suffer the usually mild symptoms of mumps; high fever, headache, pain in the back, loss of appetite and scratchy dry mouth. (Fever and swelling around the ears and jaws may last for as long as a week to ten days. And sometimes children should be kept quiet for a week following the disappearance of all symptoms.)

Some day soon there may be a vaccine for mumps that protects for a life-time. Then everyone will be a lot happier. In the meantime, the present vaccine can prevent some unhappy complications for adolescent boys and adult males.







Legislature, the law in reference to license revocation for driving while under the influence of alcohol or a drug read as follows, "Any person who operates a motor vehicle or a motorcycle should be deemed to have given his consent to a chemical test of his breath, blood, urine, or saliva for the purpose of determing the alcohol or drug content of the blood, pro-vided that such test is administered at the direction of a police officer having reasonable grounds to believe such person to have been driving in an intoxicated condition or while his ability to operate such motor vehicle or motorcycle was impaired by the consumption of alcohol or by the use of a drug as defined in this chapter and in accordance with the rules and regulations established by the

The law later stipulated that if an individual refused to submit to the test, the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles could revoke his license or permit. I strongly sup-port this legislation because no

police force of which he is a

member".

Birthday Surprise

George Nunn got a very pleasant surprise Monday night. It was his 95th birthday and he hadn't been doing very much about it until a bunch of neighborhood youngsters came marching across the street to George's home at 479 Colvin St, and presented him with a bouquet of roses and sang "Happy Birthday". Needless to say, he was delighted.

George, despite his years, is still quite active. He painted his porch a week ago and still cuts his own lawn. He lives with his wife, who is 86, and his daughter Edna at the Colvin St. address which has been his home all his married life. The Nunns also have two sons and numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

However, at the 1968 session of the Legislature, we amended this law by including the following lan-guage. "No license, permit or nonresident operating privilege can be revoked because of a refusal to submit to such a chemical test if the hearing officer is satisfied that the person requested to submit to such a chemical test had not been warned prior to such refusal to the effect that a refusal to submit to such a chemical test may result in the revocation of his license or operating privilege whether or not he is found guilty of the charge for which he was arrested.

This amendment is important because it is possible that an innocent person would become so indignant when he is charged with an offense which he did not commit, that he would refuse to do anything until he had spoken with his attorney. Obviously the police cannot make a chemical test a number of hours after the incident. For this reason, the individual should be made aware that his failure to submit to such a test may result in his license revocation, even if he is found innocent of any other charge.





Ridgeway Area Sewer Investigation Subject of Council Resolution

"Resolved, that the City Manager and the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works commence an immediate investigation into the storm and sanitary sewers in and about the area of Ridgeway Ave. adjacent to Aquinas Stadium, including: Parma, Riga, Perrinton, Hamlin, Mendon, Pittsford and Ramona Streets, and report to the Council at the next regularly scheduled Council meeting, what steps can be taken to prevent future occurrences of flooding in that area of the City."

This resolution, proposed by Councilman Robert F. Wood, has passed the City Council, A report from the city manager is expected at the next meeting of the Council

next Tuesday, Aug. 13. Wood also had written a letter to Alfred S. Ancello, commissioner of public works, about the sewer conditions and in a separate communication had asked for repaying of Parma St., need for which he had noted during a tour of inspection in the area.

Wood's letter about sewers reads as follows:

"This letter is in reference to the resolution which I introduced at the July 23, 1968 City Council meeting relative to the investigation which I have requested into the storm and sanitary sewers in and about the area of Ridgeway Avenue adjacent to Aquinas Stadium, including Parma, Riga, Perrinton, Hamlin, Mendon, Pittsford and Ramona Streets. As the resolution indicates, we are to have a report from you and the City Manager at the next regularly scheduled City Council meeting, Aug. 13, 1968.

"On Saturday, July 20, 1968, I met with several of the residents in this particular area of the City, and they showed me the extensive damage which was done to many of the homes as a result of the flooding which occured, I believe, on Wednesday, July 17th.

"There are different opinions as to what causes the problem, but there appears to be an inadequate number of storm sewers on Ridgeway Ave. and the existing sewers on Ridgeway Ave. do not accommodate the drain off of water from the land by Aquinas Stadium, Perhaps additional sewers could be installed in that area,

"There are some apartments located at 1000 - 1020 Ridgeway Ave. which also may be causing part of the problem. It appears as though these apartments have been allowed to connect into the City sewer system, and I would appreciate your investigation into this particular problem.

"Once the flooding occurred, there was also a tremendous amount of back-up from the sanitary sewer system into the cellars of many of the homes in this particular area of the City. What is the connection between the two?

"I also noticed that many of the storm sewers in the area had not been cleaned in years. As a matter of fact the lids on these sewers have been covered with tar and obviously had not been removed in some time. These sewers, I believe, should be cleaned out immediately.
"In any event, I look forward to receiving your investigation re-

port at the next City Council meeting. This is a problem which I feel should be corrected immediately"

Playgrounds Need Cleanup Says May

Terming conditions in "numerous" City playgrounds "deplorable", City Councilman Stephen May recently called on the city government to do a "better job of equipping, maintaining, protecting and cleaning up" these areas.

He said that any visitor to a representative sample of City recreation areas can testify to their 'littered, rundown nature'. He said "it is cruel and in some cases downright dangerous to the youngsters involved to open up these areas and provide either inadequate or unsafe equipment or permit them to become littered with trash, debris and broken glass".

May noted that some of the vandalism which causes these conditions is beyond the control of the Police and Recreation Bureau, but added that "poor upkeep and unsound equipment simply cannot be tolerated in the playgrounds which play such an important part in the lives of so many Rochesterians".

The Council man urged City Manager Seymour Scher to initiate promptly an "intensified effort" by the Police to protect recreation areas at night and by the Recreation Bureau to maintain and keep them up during the day. He suggested that greater use be made of





Historic Newspapers Collection YOUR MEDICAL HANDBOOK

The new edition of "Your Medicare Handbook" (now being mailed to about 65,000 older persons in the Rocheater area) is evenly divided into explanations of the hospital insurance and medical insurance parts of the program, Last week I summarized the information on inpatient hospital services covered under the hospital part of the program.

Today's article is about the medical insurance part of Medicare, sometimes called "doctor bill insurance".

The new Handbook explains in easy-to-understand terms the 17 changes in medical insurance brought about by the 1967 Amendments to the Medicare Law. These are indexed on the back cover, and each section of the text that describes them is marked with a special symbol.

of greatest interest to users of the Handbook is the one that provides that when a physician does not wish to apply for the medical insurance payment, the Medicare beneficiary may now send in the claim himself, whether or not it has been paid. All that is needed is an itemized bill - - paid or unpaid, Previously the bill had to be paid before the beneficiary could apply for the payment, which often resulted in financial hardship. As before, however, if the pysician agrees that he will apply for the medical insurance payment, the payment will be made directly to him. This is called "assignment" of the benefit payment,

The Handbook explains that medical insurance will help pay for all covered services received in the United States, subject to a \$50 annual deductible, with the beneficiary paying only 20 percent of the reasonable charges over and above that amount for the rest of the years. Payment can be made no matter where the treatment is received - in a hospital, the physician's office, an extended care facility, the beneficiary's home, or at a group practice or other clinic.

A series of 4 charts in the Handbook lists what medical insurance will and will not help pay for, For example, one chart brings out that under the 1967 Amendments, medical insurance helps pay for services by podiatrists that the profession is legally authorized to perform by the State in which they practice, but not for routine foot care and treatment of flat feet, sprains, or partial dislocations furnished by the same practition-

Under one of the 1967 changes in medical insurance, payment can be made for either the rental or purchase of durable medical equipment for use in the beneficiary's home - wheelchairs, hospital-type beds, etc. Under the old law the medical insurance covered only the rental of such equipment. In a question and answer, the Handbook points out that, when considering purchase, particularly the expensive equipment, a beneficiary should keep in mind that Medicare payments are made over a period of time, and that these payments stop when the need for the equipment ends. It is suggested that the beneficiary talk over the matter of whether he should rent or buy with the pysician prescribing the use of the equipment to get an estimate as to how long it will be needed. Otherwise he may find himself obligated for the balance of payments on equipment for which



Happiness is a warm puppy, say the Peanuts folk. But there is not much joy involved if you happen to be allergic to animal dander. If, in other words, you have "hay" fever.

The flaky skin from animals triggers an allergic reaction in some people. Ragweed, dust, and mold spores can also cause severe sneezing symptoms. Swollen nasal passages and teary eyes can sure spoil the fun of summer the season when lots of plant pollen is swirling around in the air.

The happy thing is that there is something to be done for resis something to be done for respiratory allergies. Sometimes antihistamine drugs, prescribed by a physician, may offer relief. The drugs, though, don't affect the underlying sensitivity. Avoiding underlying sensitivity. A voiding the substance that triggers the

the best way to control hay fever.
There is another way. Identifying the offending allergies. This may involve a long series of scratch tests with suspected substances. If the right one is dis-covered, there is some hope.

allergic reaction is, of course,

Injections containing a minute amount of the allergen can be administered. Tiny doses can be increased to larger ones. And the body may gradually develop a tolerance. If the injections are begun before the hay fever season continued for about three months, the allergic reaction may be prevented. The injections, though, may have to be repeated

every year. If continued for several years, complete desensitization to the offending substance may result. But not always.

For the hay fever sufferer, quick cures and quack products can be disastrous. The only sure way to treat his allergy is with a doctor's advice.







Postoffice Seeking 1968 Congressional Elections Seen As Unusually Important

WASHINGTON, August 15, - - At national convention time congressional elections seem remote, and in some ways they are. It is likely at this point that Congress will be meeting for at least a month-and-a-half longer when it reconvenes in early September. Some states have not yet even had the primaries in which congressional condidates will be chosen. And, of course, nobody thinks very much about congressional races when the big prize is up for grabs.

For this year's election the congressional interest will be centered in the House of Representatives. Nobody really expects the Senate to be a battleground of significance. There are 63 Democrats and 36 Republicans in the Senate, and with only one-third of the Senate subject to election every two years, the Republicans have no chance of seizing control.

House Seats Important

In the House, however, the Democratic margin is 247 to 187 and a shift of 31 seats to the Republicans would give them control of a house of Congress for the first time since 1954. Every House seat comes up for election every two years, and in a presidential election year no seat can really be considered safe. The Republicans have raised large amounts of money to put into the election campaigns in those districts where the Democratic incumbent holds his seat by a narrow plurality, and of course, the Democrats are responding in kind.

The circumstances of the presidential election give added interest to some of the House races, George Wallace is expected to gather the electoral votes of several of the deep South states. If the two major party candidates split the rest of the country fairly evenly, it is possible that no candidate would get a majority of the electoral vote, so that under the Constitution the President would have to be chosen by the House. If the decision goes to the House for this reason, each state's delegation, however numerous, would get only one vote.

Thus New York's 41 Representatives would cast one vote, according to which party has the majority of the Representatives from New York, while Alaska's one Representative would also cast one vote. If a state has the same number of Republican and Democratic Congressmen, the vote would be nulli-

As presently constituted the House has 18 delegations that are predominantly Republican, 29 that are predominantly Democrat, and 3 that are tied. Viewed in the light of the possibility of the presidency being decided by the House, it will be seen that some marginal House seats have considerably more significance than others, and we can expect the parties to vary their support of their candidates accordingly.

Presidential Impasse?

What if the Wallace people in the House are sufficiently numerous to keep a majority of the state delegations from choosing a President? The resulting impasse could leave us with only an acting President (the Vice-President chosen by the Senate) for two years. For this reason a move is being made to try to get incumbent Representatives to agree that if the presidential decision is thrown into the House, they will vote regardless of party for the presidential candidate who has the largest national popular vote. George Wallace, who wants the bargaining power a bloc of electoral votes can give him in a close election, says this effort is proof "there's not a dime's worth of difference between the two parties".

I think the possibility of such an impasse developing is slight because I expect one party or the other to have a clear advantage at the polls this fall. But the American people should consider the implications of a constitutional deadlock in terms of our democracy, and once they have done so, feel sure they will support reform of our electoral college system for future elections.

dreth said the caller who is not a BBB representative asks whether the family owns their own home, where the husband and wife are employed and how much money they earn. He said the identity of the caller is not known to the BBB and it is also not known how he intends to use the information he collects.

Hildreth said that personal information should never be given to unknown callers and emphasized that the Better Business Bureau never solicits information of this type via the telephone.

Lawns' D-Day Now at Hand

Late August or early September is the ideal time to plant new lawns or renovate old ones in the Rochester area, according to Monroe County Cooperative Extension.

Kirkwood W. Personius, local Extension Agent specializing in turf, points out that fall seedings are better than spring seedings because they have a maximum good growing weather before crabgrass and other summer lawn problems appear. "Even late fall seedings made at any time before the soil freezes are a better risk than

spring seedings", Personius says.

Therefore, urges Personius, if
you plan to renovate or plant a lawn, now is the time to get started so you'll be ready to seed by Labor Day. By starting work now, a good seedbed can be prepared, allowed to settle for easier grading and some weeds destroyed.

Cornell Extension Bulletin 922 provides complete lawn planting and care information. It is available from the Monroe Co. Cooperative Extension, 249 Highland Ave., Rochester, 14620.

The group, Emergency Relief for Biafrans, headquartered at 402 South Ave., plans a massive telegram and mail campaign to pressure the U. S. government into taking immediate action, includ-ing action through the United Na-

Citizens are being asked to wire President Johnson, using a special service furnished by Western Union, urging him to demand an immediate emergency meeting of the United Nations to move large amounts of food and medical supplies into Biafra without delay. Western Union will send the wire, up to 15 words long, for a cut-rate charge of 90 cents added to the user's phone bill.

Patrick G. Farren, 24 year old Rochester teacher and journalist recently returned from Peace Corps duty on the Ivory Coast in western Africa, is E.R.B.'s coordinating secretary.

"We feel we have only days to work in", Farren noted, "From two to three thousand people trap-

AIN'T NECESSARILY SO

A dab of paint or the addition of a little padding may be all that's needed to salvage a lure that is not producing fish.

Color and size are extremely important in influencing the decision of a fish to smash a certain plug, say the fishing authorities at Mercury outboards. But, the lure in your hand may appear entirely dif-ferent when scanned by the critical eye of a roving largemouth. He may not be impressed by either its size or color.

Instead of disposing of an ineffective plug, try changing its apparent size by painting it a different shade.

Skin divers have noted that lures painted yellow appear much larger when viewed from beneath the surface. This aberration is apparently caused by reflection, plus the magnifying effect of water. The same model in a different light-absorbing color might appear nearly normal.

Yellow and white and red combinations have long been favorite topwater choices: their effectiveness probably derives from the reflective qualities of these colors, not the colors themselves.

But color is not the only way to achieve a false dimension. There are other ways to pad out the girth of a lure without actually adding bulk.

Ordinary flyrod bugs with stiff hackles attached so that they stick out at right angles can create the effect of a larger apparition. The same feathers placed on the tail give the appearance of a longer lure. Neither alteration affects the casting or fishing abilities to any degree, but both create an entirely different impression on

Historic Newspapers Collection MEDICAL HANDBOOK

By Joseph M. Tomaino, District Manager

Sometimes an older patient no longer needs the intensive care which a hospital provides, but still needs full-time skilled nursing care and other health services which cannot be furnished in his home.

The new edition of Your Medicare Handbook, recently mailed to people 65 and over in the Rochester area, explains that in these cases, the doctor may transfer the patient from the hospital to an extended care facility. An extended care facility is a specially qualified nursing home or other health care facility which is staffed and equipped to furnish fulltime skilled nursing care and many important related health services.

The handbook notes that the hospital insurance part of Medicare pays for all covered services in an extended care facility for the first 20 days such services are received in a benefit period, and all but \$5 a day for up to 80 more days in that same benefit period -- if all of the following are true:

1. A physician determines that such care is needed and orders such care;

The patient had been in a participating (or otherwise qualified) hospital for at least 3 days in a row before his admission; 3. He was admitted within 14 days after leaving the hospital;
4. He was admitted for further treatment of the condition for which

he was treated in the hospital; and

5. The care is not custodial care. The Handbook describes custodial care as that needed primarily to help patients meet the demands of everyday living, such as assistance in bathing, dressing, eating, walking, or taking medicine on a regular schedule. Important as custodial care may be to many people, the law permits Medicare to pay for care only when its primary purpose is to meet the medical needs of the patient and when the patient requires health services of a curative nature which can be provided only by trained and skilled professional health personnel.

The net effect of Medicare's

providing posthospital care in extended care facilities has been the release of scarce hospital beds for the care of patient needing the type of treatment only hospitals can give; and the upgrading of hundreds of nursing homes to meet Medicare's health and safety standards, and the opening of many new facilities especially designed with Medicare in mind.

Another type of benefit provided by Medicare outside the hospital is home health care. After a person has been in a hospital (or in an extended care facility after a hospital stay), his physician may decide that the continued care he needs can best be given in his own home through a home health agency. The agency can send skilled people to his home to provide health care services such as parttime nursing, physical, occupational, and speech therapy, and part-time services of home health

The hospital insurance part of Medicare pays for all covered home health services furnished by a qualified home health agency -for as many as 100 home visits -for a period up to a year after the beneficiary's most recent discharge from a hospital or a participating extended care facility.

Home health benefits are also available under the medical insurance part of the Medicare Program, with the difference that the beneficiary does not have to be hospitalized first. The 100 home health visits in a year under hospital insurance, and those available under medical insurance, are separate benefits, and the visits received under one do not affect the number available under the other. In fact, when a beneficiary has exhausted his quota of home health visits in a benefit period under hospital insurance, up to an additional 100 visits in the calendar year may be available to him under his medical insurance protection.

Bad Luck At The End Of This Rainbow

Health Association Press Release

Fortune is supposed to lie at the foot of the rainbow - but for dieters, intent on shearing off the pounds, ill fortune in the form of ill health can result from the rainbow pills sometimes prescribed for the purpose of losing weight.

The multi-colored pills include barbiturates, diuretics, digitalis, amphetamines, laxatives, and thyroid drugs. Such drugs are potent and their effects, according to some medical experts, can seriously damage health or in some cases, even cause death,

A recent Washington inquiry drew attention to certain types of drug houses that push the rainbow pills, and to some "diet doctors" who prescribe them more or less indiscriminately. Some of their practices, it was brought out, are mere assembly line operations: with inadequate emphasis on medical examination and excessive reliance on the pills.

At a recent conference of American Medical Association experts, according to Medical World News, some participants thought that "the pendulum has swung back to the 1920's, to a stress on the need for regular exercise and physical activity to counteract our excessive eating habits and sedentary ways".

Others maintained that a warm, friendly social environment encouraged eating in the obese individual more than it did in persons of normal weight. There is also growing support for the theory that purely physiologic differences exist between those inclined to be obese and the naturally slim.

Despite all fads and "crash programs" the first step to safe and effective dieting is a consultation with your family physician. Your Christmas Seal association, concerned with general health as well as with the fight against tuberculosis, emphysema and air pollution, suggests that the key to proper dieting remains what it has been: less food with a balanced

A unique chance "to talk back" followed the Sept. 15th appearance of the Negro Baptist minister, Rev. Martin Chandler, in the pulpit of Sacred Heart Cathedral. On the following evening, Sept. 16, Rev. Chandler, met with a group of about 50 in the rectory hall and "handled questions and challenges for close to three hours with disarming charm, tact and frankness" in the words of one of his listeners. Points he made included:

The white man needs to know more about the history and psychology of the black man,

Self-help agencies need Community Chest funds which are not forthcoming.

There must be sustained insistence on having people from the black community come to white areas to speak; and eventual balanced integration, whites and blacks living side by side. Neighborhood associations

should be organized to prevent "block-busting" and allay fears.

White people must examine their "real feelings" about blacks and why they have reservations about open housing or intermarriage.
