symopsis,

Part First.

Scene 1—Persian Chorus. Homage to Haman. "Behold this Mordecai in scorn." Haman's anger kindled against the Jew, Mordecai.

Soene 2—King Ahasuerus. Haman's plot to punish Mordecai by destroying the Jews. "A Song of Joy." Enter Prophetess. Tableau.

Scene 3—Mordecai, Esther and the Jews bewailing the impending destruction, "Woe is me." "Israel, O Israel, for thee do I tremble." "To Thee, O Lord, I raise my cries." Solo and full chorus—"He that goeth forth and weepeth."
