



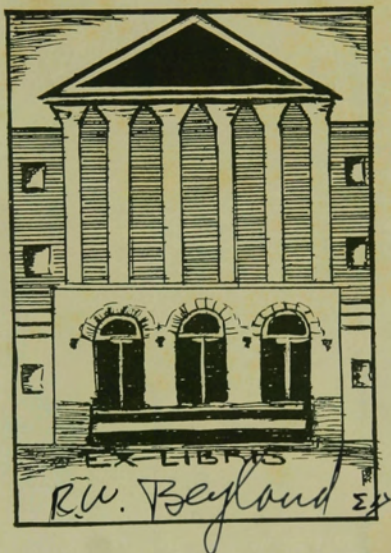

It represents the combined efforts of the staffs of January 1929 and June 1929 to record the life of Monroe.

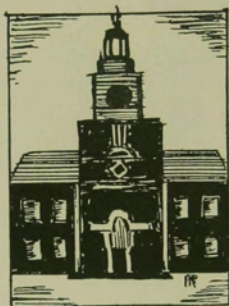
