





The band, orchestra, "A Cappella" Chorus, and glee clubs, while endeavoring to familiarize the students with the best in musical literature within their scope, are likewise often called upon to create the necessary musical atmosphere at the many social, dramatic, and athletic functions in which Monroe participates.

During the year just past, these various organizations have performed some very remarkable work, for which their alma mater is very proud indeed.



The team played 15 outside games of which they won 13. In 25 games Monroe was victorious in 19, scoring a total of 733 points while holding their opponents to 492.





This fact, together with inexperience caused the downfall of the Monroe matmen before the onslaught of opposing school teams. 


