



Standard-Bearer and Custodian

The ceremony of the transfer of the flag was inaugurated by the George H. Thomas Post of the Grand Army of the Republic on Washington's Birthday in 1889. Now, not one of the noble men who helped to establish this beautiful ceremony is still living. But standard-bearers and custodians of the flag are still appointed with the continued hope that the ideals of patriotism which these Civil War heroes fostered may continue with our youth and be reflected in the perpetual honor of our flag.

Official recognition of the custodian of the flag was given by the American Legion of Monroe County following the close of the World War. The purposes and basis for the appointment of the custodian are the same as for the standard-bearer. The standard-bearer is the high honor boy in his class; the custodian the high honor girl. They are selected by the faculty because of high scholarship and outstanding qualities of citizenship. The teachers of the school join in extending congratulations to Theodore Colborn and Elizabeth Collins upon their selection for these high honors. We are especially pleased to do this because they have been able to render conspicuously worthy services to the school community as well as to maintain high scholastic records.





- DEC.—Ezra Winter hired to paint the Murals—but when? WHEN??


