## Greenhouse Gets Flytrap

A plant that eats flies and oth-  
er insects has been added to the  
stock of the Greenhouse.  
In the coast region of North  
and South Carolina, this strange  
plant called the Venue Flytrap  
or the *Dionaea muscipula* grows.  
Each of its leaves resembles the  
half of a huge butter bean, and  
all along the outer margin which

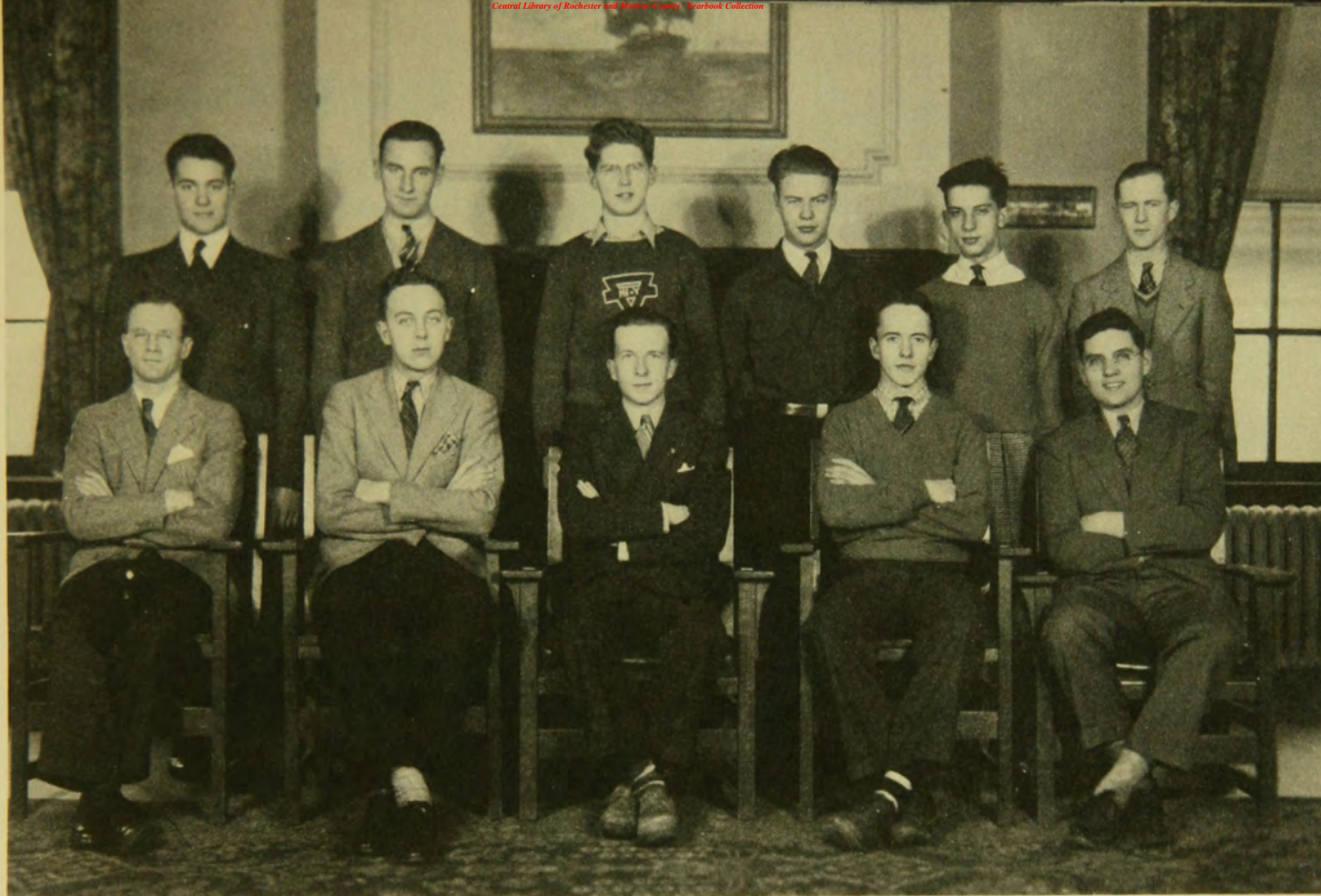

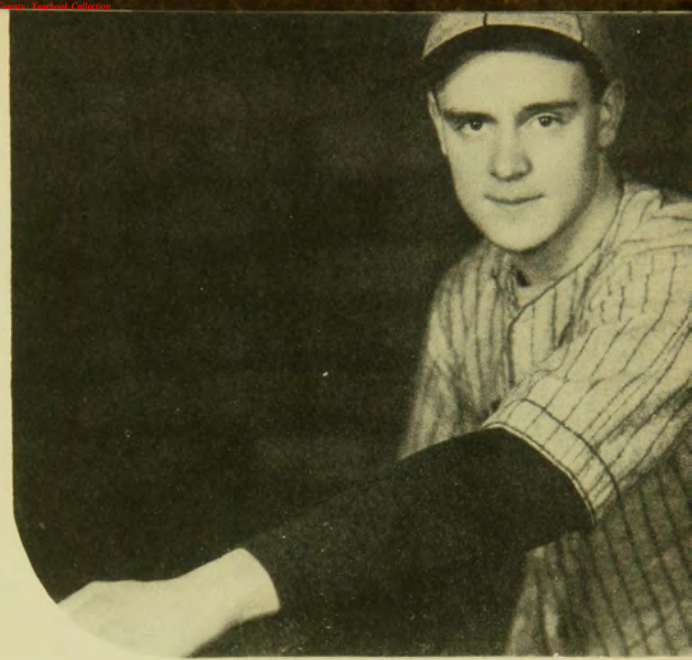

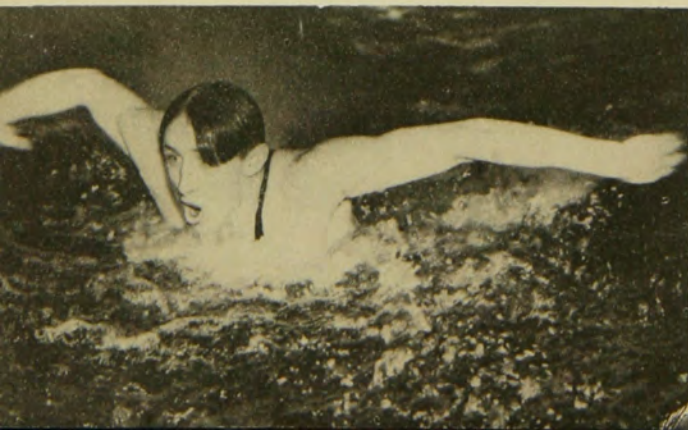
