Communications for the greater part of Upper Canada, are sent to Lewiston, and by this route those for Toronto now reach that city on the evening of the second day after leaving Rochester—those for Coburg and Port Hope on the third day, &c. This remark is made to account for delays in mail communications with Canada—as many persons are seemingly unaware that there is as yet no mail route established by the steamboats plying between the city of Rochester and the Canadian ports. A similar remark may be made with reference to the communications with the American and British towns on Lake Ontario and the St. Lawrence eastward and northward of Rochester—as those communications are carried on only by a tri-weekly route, and not as yet by steamboats plying between Rochester and those ports.
