Mr. Lincoln was re-elected for the Twentieth Presidential Term, to commence on the 4th of March, 1865, with Andrew Johnson, of Tennessee, as Vice President; but through the assassination and death of Mr. Lincoln, on the 15th of April, 1865, Mr. Johnson, by virtue of the Constitution, was sworn in as President, at 11 o'clock in the forenoon of the same day.
