

UNITED STATES COPYRIGHT LAW * In Force On and After July 1, 1909

Section 28.—That any person who wilfully and for profit shall infringe any copyright secured by this Act, or who shall knowingly and wilfully aid or abet such infringement, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment for not exceeding one year, or by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars, or both, in the discretion of the court.





*Correction to sea level adds about six-tenths of an inch. Rochester lies about 510 feet above sea level. During the year June 1, 1937—May 31, 1938 there were 86 clear days; 83 partly cloudy; 196 cloudy; rain or snow fell on 149 days to the amount of 0.01 inch or more; on 91 to the amount of 0.04 or more; snow fell on 82 days; thunderstorms occurred on 24 days; no bail; and no auroras occurred. The total wind movement was 75,858 miles; total rainfall 30.22 inches; average cloudiness 67 percent; average hundidty 68 percent; the maximum temperature was freezing or below 45; minimum freezing or below 120 days.

Average temperature for 68 years 48; average precipitation 32.88 inches.

LEGAL HOLIDAYS.

There are eleven public bolldays—New Year's Day, 1st of January; Lincoln's Birthday, 12th of February; Manigton's Birthday, 22d of February; Memorial Day, 30th of May; Independence Day, 4th of July; Labor Day, first Monday in November, or day of State election; Armistice Day, November 11th; any day appointed by the Governor of the State or President of the United States, as a day of public fast, or Thanksgiving; Christmas day, 25th of December; also every Saturday, from 12 o'clock noon until 12 o'clock midnight.

When a public hollday falls upon Sunday, the following Monday becomes a public hollday.
