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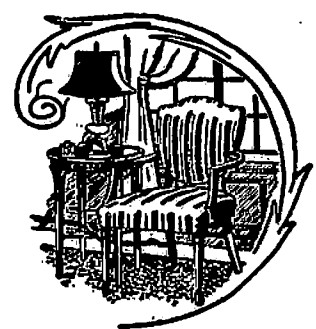

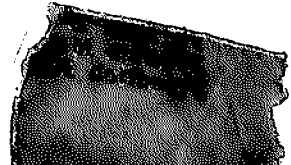

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# INTRODUCTION

## Five Major Departments

The five major departments are arranged in the following order:—

**THE MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENT**, on white paper, pages 7 to 37, presents lists of city, county, state and federal officials, post office information, schools and institutions, with officers, courts holding sessions in the city, population tables, statistical review, and manufacturing, trade and civic surveys.

**THE ALPHABETICAL LIST OF NAMES** of residents and business and professional concerns, on white paper, is included in pages 49 to 946. This is the only record in existence that aims to show the name, marital status, occupation and addresses of each adult resident of Rochester, and the name, official personnel, nature and address of each firm and corporation in the city.

**THE BUYERS' GUIDE** beginning opposite page 946, printed on tinted paper in a separate series of pages from 1 to 68, contains the advertisements of leading banking, manufacturing, business and professional interests of Rochester. The advertisements are indexed under headings descriptive of the business represented. This is reference advertising at its best, and merits a survey by all buyers eager to familiarize themselves with sources of supply. In a great commercial and industrial center like Rochester, the necessity of having this kind of information immediately available is obvious. General appreciation of this fact is evidenced by the many reference users of this City Directory service.

**THE CLASSIFIED BUSINESS DIRECTORY** is included in pages 949 to 1051, on yellow paper. This department lists the names of all business and professional concerns in alphabetical order under appropriate headings. This feature constitutes an invaluable and indispensable catalog of the numerous interests of the community. The Directory is the common intermediary between buyer and seller. As such it plays an important part in the daily activities of the commercial and professional world. 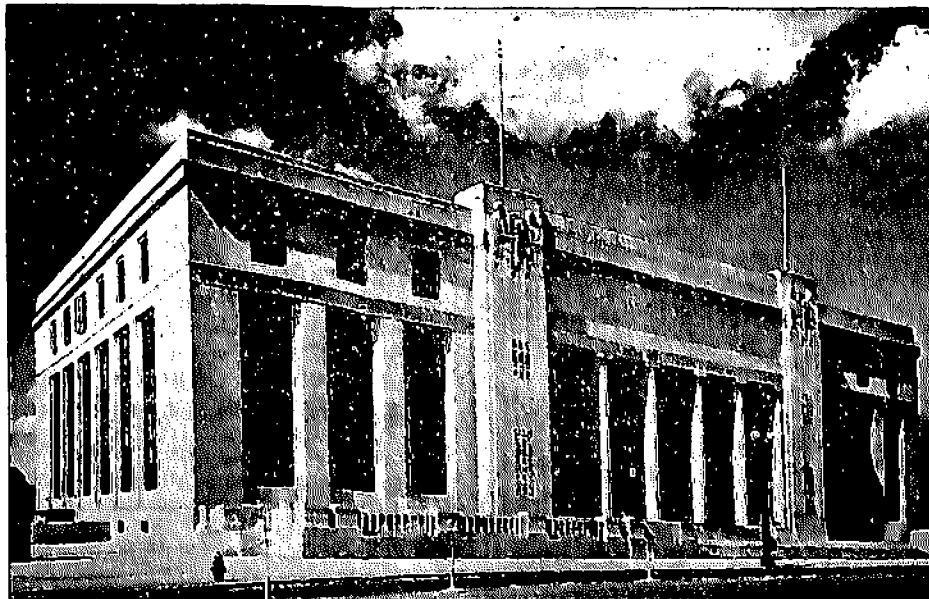

\*Correction to Sea Level about six-tenths of an inch. Rochester lies about 510 feet above sea level. During the year June 1, 1941—May 31, 1942 there were 74 clear days; 97 partly cloudy; 194 cloudy. Rain or snow fell on 160 days to the amount of .01 inch or more; on 105 days to the amount of .04 or more. Thunderstorms occurred on 28 days and hail on 3 days. The total wind movement was 94,238 miles. Average cloudiness for the year was 67% and average relative humidity 74%. The maximum temperature was freezing or below on 43 days and the minimum temperature freezing or below on 116 days. Average temperature for 69 years 48°; average precipitation for 69 years 32.57 inches.

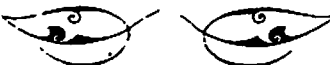

# RATES OF POSTAGE

## DOMESTIC POSTAGE RATES

### First Class

Letters, etc.: 3 cents for each ounce or fraction of an ounce. Letters addressed for local delivery 2 cents each ounce or fraction of an ounce.

Post Cards: 1 cent each, within prescribed sizes.

Business Reply Cards: Ordinary, 2 cents each; air mail, 6 cents per ounce.

Business Reply Envelopes: Ordinary 1 cent in addition to regular postage. Apply at P O for permit.

### Second Class

Newspapers and Periodicals (Transient rate): 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction of 2 ounces or fourth-class rate whichever is lower.

### Third Class

Printed Circulars: Books having less than 24 pages, catalogs, merchandise, miscellaneous printed matter, (except first and second class), weighing 8 ounces or less, 1 1/2 cents for each 2 ounces or fraction.

Books: Printed of 24 or more pages, seeds, bulbs, plants, cuttings, etc: 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction.

\*Book Rate: 3 cents a pound applies to certain types of books which are permanently bound by stitching or stapling, or by means of spiral or plastic binding, when covered with paper, cloth, leather or other substantial material, such as music books, a view book or atlas, bibles, etc. Books mailed under this rate must be indorsed by the mailers "Book" or "Books".

\*Consult Post Office concerning books mailable under this rate.

The rates of postage on individually addressed catalogs and similar printed advertising matter in bound form, consisting of 24 or more pages and not exceeding 10 pounds in weight, shall be as follows:

The rates do not apply to bulk parcels containing a number of pieces sent to one address. It will be permissible to include with catalogs and other printed advertising matter mailed at these new rates the usual loose inclosures, such as order forms, reply envelopes, loose circulars, etc., provided, such inclosures are incidental. Matter mailed under the provisions of the new regulation should be clearly indorsed in order to distinguish the same from other fourth-class mail and prevent rating such matters with deficient postage at the regular fourth-class rate. These rates do not apply to packages weighing 8 ounces or less, that is, third-class matter.

## FOURTH CLASS—PARCEL POST

Fourth Class: Includes printed matter, merchandise and all other matter weighing in excess of 8 ounces except first and second class matter. Parcels limited to 100 inches, length and girth combined.

Weight limit 70 pounds.

Insure all valuable parcels.

For quick delivery, send Special Delivery and Special Delivery air mail.

Library Books: First, Second and Third Zones, and State, 3 cents for first pound or fraction, 1 cent each additional pound or fraction.

Note—On parcels for delivery in first and second zones where shortest practicable mail route is 300 miles or more, the rate is 0 cents for first pound and 2 cents for each additional pound.

C. O. D. Delivery service is applicable to third and fourth class mail and sealed matter of any class bearing postage at the first class rate. Collections up to \$200.

### General Instructions

Pack well—wrap securely—address plainly.

Show name of sender.

Fragile and perishable matter should be so marked.

### AIR MAIL INFORMATION

Six cents for each ounce or fraction thereof. Air mail can be insured, registered, sent C O D or special delivery when the additional fees are prepaid. It may be deposited in any mail box, but must be indorsed "VIA AIR MAIL" underneath the postage stamp immediately above the address. **Ward 15**—Beginning at a point in the subway at Jay street and running by Jay to the old west bounds of the city, thence northerly by the old city bounds and Burrows street to Otis street, by Otis street to Sherman, Sherman to the extension of Bloss street, thence by said extension to the subway, by subway to the place of beginning.

**Ward 24**—Beginning at a point in the centre of Chill avenue where it intersects the easterly water line of the Barge canal, by this easterly water line to a point 500 feet west of the west line of the Leo road, thence northerly along a line parallel with Lee road and 500 feet therefrom to Lexington avenue, thence along the centre line of Lexington avenue, which is also the town line between the towns of Gates and Greece, to the easterly line of the Charlotte branch of the NYC RR, thence southerly by this line to a point 134 feet south of the south line of Emerson street, thence continuing southerly by Burrows street and extension and Oren street and extension to West avenue, West avenue to Lincoln avenue, Lincoln avenue to Chill avenue, and by Chill avenue to the place of beginning.
