Medicare Now In Effect

About 19 million older Americans are now protected under medicare's hospital insurance program. More than 17 million -- the 9 out of 10 -- who have signed up for the supplementary medical insurance also have protection for the payment of doctor bills and a wide variety of other medical services, even if they do not go to the hospital.

The Social Security Administration, the agency responsible for running medicare, has been hard at work since last summer informing American 65 or over of their rights under medicare, enrolling them in the voluntary medical insurance plan, and setting up the machinery.

Hospitals, doctors, insurance organizations have been consulted and have taken part in formulating the policies for the health insurance program, and all policies have been considered by the Health Insurance Benefits Advisory Council, a 16 member group, appointed under the law to advise on medicare policy.

Records have been set up for everyone 65 or over who is eligible for hospital and medical insurance under medicare, and

health insurance identification cards have already been sent to the people who have signed up for both parts of the medicare program.

Also sent to medicare beneficiaries was "Your Medicare Handbook," which contains all the information each person over 65 should need to take part in medicare.

The medicare handbook explains how the two health insurance plans work and tells what services are covered and how payments will be made. It also includes a copy of the simple form to be used in requesting payment of doctor's bills under the medical insurance program.

The handbook also has a listing of all the Blue Shield and private insurance organizations that will be handling medical insurance claims, so beneficiaries can quickly see where to send their payment claims for doctor bills, home health services, and other services included in the supplementary plan.

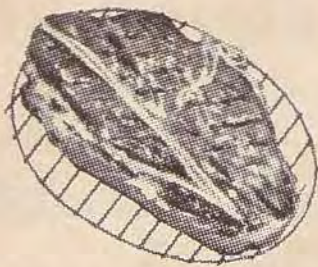

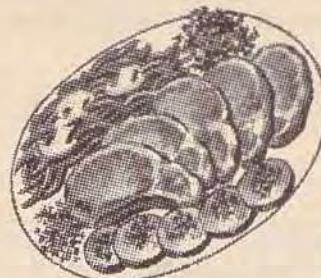

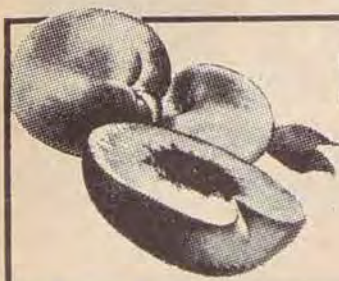

REPORT From ALBANY

CHILI-SCOTTSVILLE ROAD SIGNAL LIGHT

I have received a letter from Lloyd A. Maeder, Chief Traffic Engineer with the State Traffic Commission, in reply to my request for a signal light at Chili-Scottsville and Beaver Roads. He states in part "that an investigation of conditions has been initiated to determine the feasibility of the requested signal."

LONGEST SESSION SINCE 1911

As the 1966 Legislature enters its closing days, it has the distinction of being the longest session since 1911. I have always campaigned for longer sessions to deal with our complex problems. It has always seemed irresponsible to me to run down to Albany three months a year and imagine that we are giving careful attention to the ever growing problems of our state. However, increasing the length of a session does not necessarily indicate that the time is spent as effectively as possible.

As a teacher, I have often told students that sitting with a book before their eyes was not necessarily studying. In the same light "being in session" does not necessarily indicate intensive research. The legislature must use its time more effectively. I support and will work in behalf of the following reforms:

1. More public hearings are necessary on bills of major note. These hearings would not only give the legislators who must vote on the bill greater insight into its ramifications, but it would also allow the public-at-large an opportunity to evaluate legislation and to inform their representatives of their particular feelings.

2. Committees of the legislature should personally visit areas of the state, be they economic, geographic or social, to have a first-hand knowledge of their problems. For illustration, the Legislature makes huge appropriations for mental hospitals. It must see in action the use to which their money is allocated. We have passed major legislation on narcotics addiction, and yet few of us have direct knowledge of this area. Public housing bills are passed and only certain legislators from certain areas have first-hand knowledge of their impact.

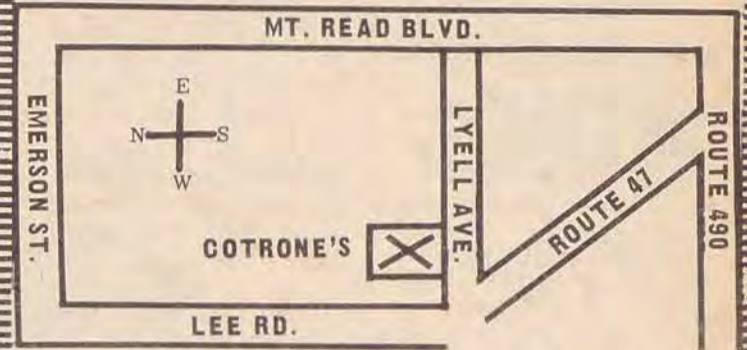
In substance, rural and suburban legislators vote on bills affecting the city with little more than written reports on which to make judgments. Urban legislators vote on bills affecting town and village government and agriculture as a whole with almost no first-hand knowledge in this field.

Senators and Assemblyman alike carry the title of STATE LEGISLATOR. It is time for legislative procedures to insure that first-hand knowledge accompanies the title.

Safeguards Outlined By Red Cross For Accident-Free Vacationing

As millions of Americans prepared for their annual summer holidays, the American Red Cross today urged them to take every possible safeguard to insure accident-free, healthful, and relaxing vacations.

"Commonsense precautions will prevent experiences that can be uncomfortable, painful, or downright dangerous," declared Wilbur M. Mauk, local director of Red Cross Safety Services. He recommended that at least one member of every family take the Red Cross first aid course, and also offered these safety suggestions for a vacation outdoors free from unpleasant mishaps!

1. Play it safe from the start by making sure your car's brakes, lights, signaling devices, steering mechanisms, and exhaust systems are in good working order, and the tires, including the spare, are sound. Pack your car so that the driver has perfect visibility in front, rear, and sides. Drive carefully and make allowances for the chances less careful drivers will take.
2. Select camp sites that are well away from such hazards as steep cliffs and banks. If you have small children, inspect the area of deep holes and dangerous waters.
3. Be sure the drinking water supply is good. In state and national parks, the tap water is sure to be. But many lakes and streams are polluted.
4. Wear clothing appropriate to the environment, including proper shoes or boots and trousers in brush areas.
5. Avoid overexposure to the sun.
6. Take along a good repellent to combat insects.
7. Identify - - and keep children away from - - poisonous plants in the area; those dangerous to touch, such as poison oak, poison ivy and sumac, and those, like wild berries and toadstools, that look edible but are poisonous.
8. Learn about the wildlife in the area - - large animals that are dangerous, and venomous snakes.
9. Be sure that any campfire you build is in a completely cleared area and when you have finished with the fire, extinguish it with water, then shovel earth on top of it.
10. Make sure knife blades are sharp. When using, cut away from you. Keep knives in sheaths or stored in separate compartments from other utensils when not in use.
11. If you use a charcoal grill for cooking, never use it in an enclosed patio, tent or cave, or inside a building, because of the danger of asphyxiation by carbon monoxide.

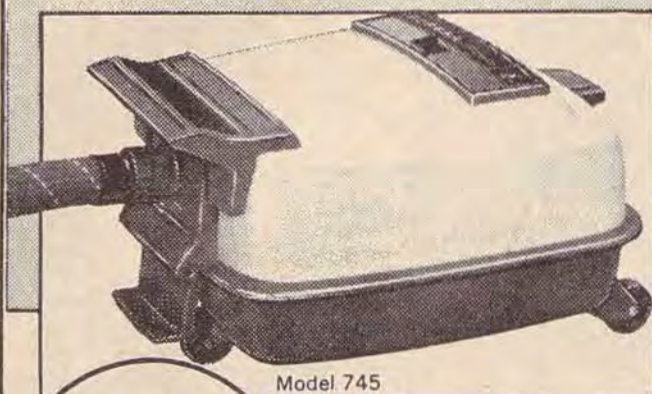

St. Joseph's Villa Needs Foster Homes

Over the past few years the need for some after care facility has become increasingly more evident to those affiliated with the work of St. Joseph's Villa, which cares for neglected, dependent and emotionally disturbed children up to about the age of 14. Once he reaches this age the adolescent has outgrown the Villa program, and his stay would really be detrimental to him. On the other hand, however, many of these adolescents for one reason or another, are not able to return to their own home or use foster care.

The only solution seems to be some type of "half-way" house or extension to the services of St. Joseph's Villa, so that the time, money, and emotional investment spent at the Villa will be of continuing help to the adolescent.

An ordinary home will be used to accommodate from four to six boys who will be going to high school. Needed, however, are house parents to act as mother and father to these adolescents. The husband, would continue his

normal employment. They will be liberally paid, enjoy many benefits, including two days a week off and vacation time, and given full maintenance of food, housing and utilities.

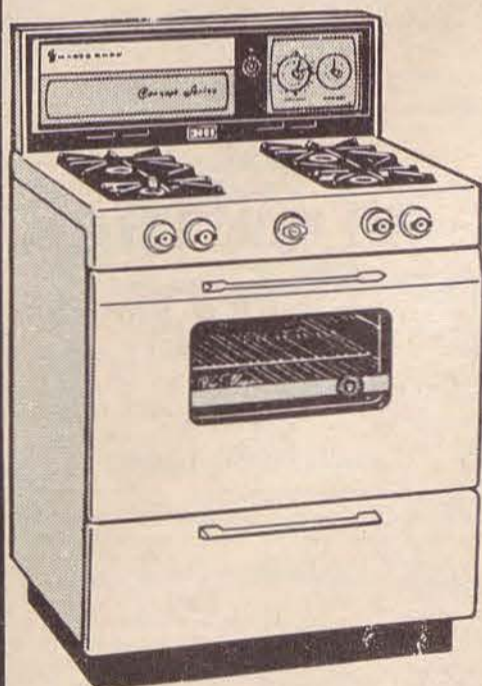

when we found that we could bypass it, stopping only long enough for lunch at a modest, but comparatively new little restaurant where they put up a good ham and cheese sandwich and hard-boiled eggs no less!

WE WERE A FEW kilometers inland, at this point, and the scenery was not too impressive. The farms didn't look too prosperous. The land was not exactly verdant and the outcropping of rocks all over the place undoubtedly made it difficult to till. The farmers that we saw in this area didn't even seem to have much equipment and were hacking away at the ground in primitive pick and shovel style. A few of the luckier ones had oxen and plows that had seen better days. It seemed a pity to work so hard for such meager returns.

We headed back toward the Atlantic Ocean and soon came to Aveiro, the Holland of Portugal. It has many canals and plenty of boat traffic. The boats were a type that we had never seen before; very long, perhaps 25 or 30 feet, and only about a yard wide. Each was propelled by a single individual with a long pole in a fashion somewhat reminiscent of the Venice gondoliers. The boats were carrying cargo, principally something that looked like peat moss and smelled like fertilizer.

WE DROVE UP and down along side a couple of the canals, took some pictures and then made a bee-line for Oporto. Another tourist whom we had met suggested that we had better stay in Aveiro since Oporto hotels were badly jammed due to some sort of a student festival going on there. Having no reservations, we were a little worried, but not too much. In several trips to Europe, with few reservations ahead, we had never yet slept in our car.

We drove right into the center of the city and looked for a travel bureau rather than to begin shopping for hotels. Our luck held out. We found a travel agency and a young girl behind the counter who spoke English. She got on the phone and after three or four calls had us reservations; took our deposit; gave us explicit instructions and a street map; and we were on our way.

TRAFFIC WAS something like Lake Avenue when Kodak lets out, but the gal's directions were good and we got to the street where the Grand Hotel do Porto was. We had to turn left onto one of the narrowest, busiest streets we had ever seen. And as we made the turn, we suddenly sensed that the red arrow meant no left turn allowed, but realization came too late and as we pulled up in front of the hotel, who do you suppose was there to greet us? A policeman, of course. He didn't ask whether I spoke Portuguese or not. He read the riot act to me even though I kept telling him in my best sign language that I did not comprehend. Finally he ran out of breath, the doorman at the hotel came to my rescue and I didn't get a ticket.

The hotel we found elegant, but old, and in the process of being restored. A good size, comfortably furnished room with bath, right in the heart of the city, cost us \$7.40 for two (including continental breakfast). We ate dinner at the hotel -- the usual soup, fish, meat, salad, dessert, fruit and wine -- for less than \$2.00 a person.

THE NEXT DAY we spent hiking around the town, getting acquainted with the layout and doing a little shopping. In mid-afternoon we noticed that the crowded sidewalks were getting to be almost impassable and the people were congregating along the curbs. Then it dawned on us that we had been forewarned that there was a festival in progress.

It turned out to be the crowning event in "Spring Week" for the college students and they had just about taken over the center of Oporto. Soon there was to be a parade. We didn't have a very good vantage point, but neither did anyone else. By the time the parade came by there must have been 50,000 men, women and children crowding the sidewalks and overflowing into the streets.

The paraders, all college students, were dressed in crazy costumes, high hats, clown outfits on some; and on others black suits with swallow tails, black bow ties, capes, very formal looking. The various colleges of the university each had their own flower-draped floats which threaded their way through the crowds, an inch at a time. It was the most disorganized parade you ever saw, yet the participants and the onlookers both were enjoying it tremendously. High jinks were the order of the day.

THE NEXT DAY we drove to the other side of the Douro River, down a steep embankment into the Warre Wine Cavern. Oporto is the port wine center of the world, and this was a must.

The origin of port wine, we were told, goes back to the 17th Century when two British merchants started shipping wine from the north of Portugal to England. In order for the wine to arrive at its destination in good condition, brandy was added. It became very popular in England and later in other markets, including America.

THERE ARE FOUR distinct types our guide informed us; Ruby, tawny white and vintage. Tawny port is popular in France as an aperitif; dry white port is becoming increasingly favored in England. They keep one variety as long as 60 years in vats, although none of this very old port is ever shipped out of the country.

At our guide's invitation we sampled several types including the 60 year old product, but nibbled at crackers in between each sip, at his suggestion.

WE THOROUGHLY enjoyed just meandering around Oporto for another day and then packed our car and started on the road again, heading east toward Spain.

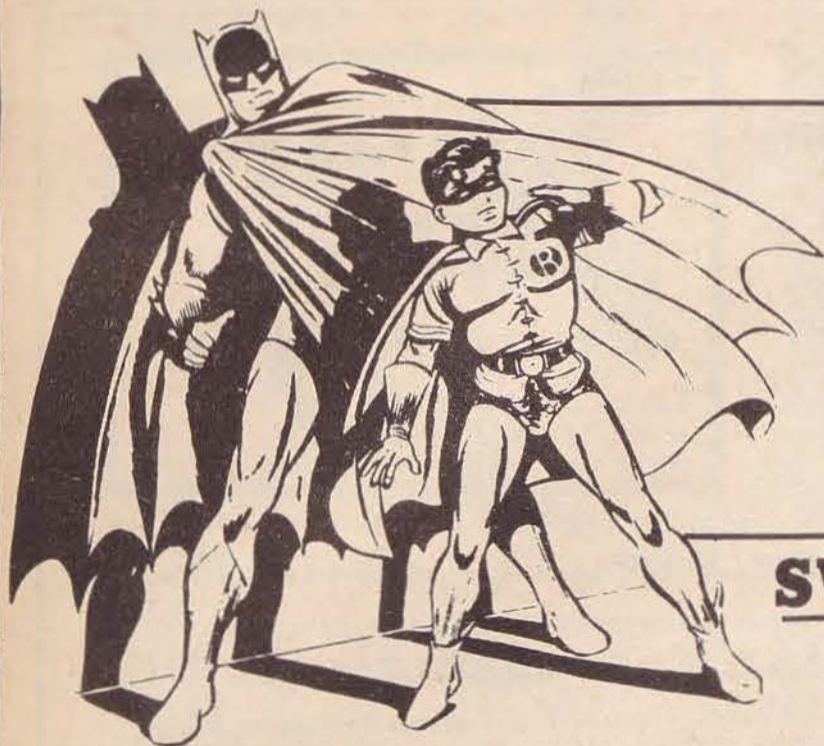

**UPSTATE WINS BATTLE
FOR MEDICAID AMENDMENTS**

Over the past month and a half the majority of upstate Legislators both Republican and Democrat, believed that certain amendments to the New York State Medicaid Program were necessary. Public hearings, discussions, and newspaper research indicated certain shortcomings in the original bill.

I am happy to announce that upstate votes during the last few days of the season, pushed through amendments to modify the Medicaid program and made it more workable.

The amendments included three bills to eliminate fraud and penalize people who lied on their applications. Another and most important amendment provides for a deductibility clause for those under Medicaid. That is, those people who receive medical aid from the state -- who are not actually on welfare -- must pay a part of their medical cost out of their own pocket. The amendment is of major significance because of the following reasons:

1. People who do not genuinely need medical aid will not bother doctors when they must pay part of the bill themselves.
2. Administrative costs will be cut because the state will not pay for every bottle of pills or \$5 dental filling.
3. People will want to retain private health programs to take care of the deductibility factor.

REVIEW OF 1966

As many of you know, the 1966 Legislative session was the longest in modern history -- the longest, in fact, since 1911 when President Franklin D. Roosevelt was a young New York State Senator out of Dutchess County.

In the coming months I will be writing a detailed account of the major bills which came before the Legislature and were signed into law by the Governor. I hope that this will give you greater insight into the activities of your government and permit you to give your voice of expression to guide us in the future.

No article will appear next week, however, because I am taking a vacation and I gave my wife Lu, my son Scott, and my daughter Valerie my solemn promise not to even mention politics or legislation for the next seven consecutive days.

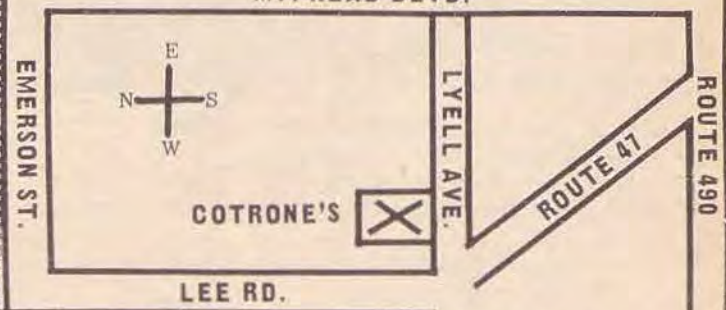

Spain & Portugal As Seen By Editor

Portugal is quite mountainous as you move in from the coast, but if you don't mind the winding roads it's a picturesque ride from Oporto to the Spanish border and probably could be driven in half a day if necessary. We took our time, however, in order to enjoy the scenery and also because we truthfully were a little loathe to depart the country.

Only recently "discovered" by tourists, Portugal is as yet unspoiled in many respects. It was early May and spring was in the air. The countryside was in full bloom and as we hit the high spots on the road the view for miles around was often reminiscent of the Alps and Dolomites. We stopped frequently to take pictures; lingering a while for lunch at Viseu and used up the better part of a day to get to Guarda, a town founded in 1109 and nestled at an altitude of 3500 feet in the Estrella Mountains. It is the highest town in Portugal and is known as the "City of Health".

A NEW WING had only recently been completed at the De Tourimo Hotel and we were apparently the first paying guests to ever sleep in our room, which incidentally had every modern convenience. Our casement window opened out onto a courtyard and just below us there was a public market right in the hotel's back yard. It was 5 p.m. and the vendors were packing up their wares and taking down their big tent.

Looking beyond the courtyard, we could see most of the town on the hillside below us and out beyond stretched the countryside. It was a clear, sunny day and we could see

probably for 15 miles down the valley. That night there was a full moon, too, and we hardly needed a light in our room.

BEFORE DINNER we went strolling through the town and discovered that most of the public market was still in operation. We found a great big open air shoe store high on a wall overlooking the town. The footwear was quite modestly priced, but considering the quality and the styling was far from being a bargain. There were plenty of customers, however, and they were doing their own fitting as well.

A nearby area we found was a veritable shopping plaza, although most of the merchandise was strewn on the pavement and ran the gamut from ladies' garments and men's suits to hardware, household necessities, baskets, trinkets and what have you.

GUARDA had two cathedrals, one of them dating back to the 15th century. We took a few minutes to look around inside. (Like most tourists we enjoy looking at the altars, the paintings and the stained-glass windows, but having seen quite a few we content ourselves just to admire them and go on our way.)

Then we hiked back down the cobblestone road, (probably very ancient) to our hotel where we had an excellent dinner. And so to bed.

SPAIN AND PORTUGAL

Continued From Page 1

THE NEXT DAY we were at the Spanish border in a few minutes and although we had to turn over some documents for our car we were held up only momentarily. We were still in the mountains, but we were within an easy day's journey from Madrid.

Being in no particular hurry, we studied our map looking for a little adventure. We had heard about an old hunting lodge at Gredos, somewhat off the beaten path and high on a mountain. That, we decided, was for us. We followed the main road through Salamanca and went on to Avila where we had tortillas (omelets) for lunch principally because that was the only item on the menu we were

sure of; and they were very good indeed.

WE LEFT the main route outside of Avila and were agreeably pleased to find the side road well paved, although just about wide enough for two small cars to pass. 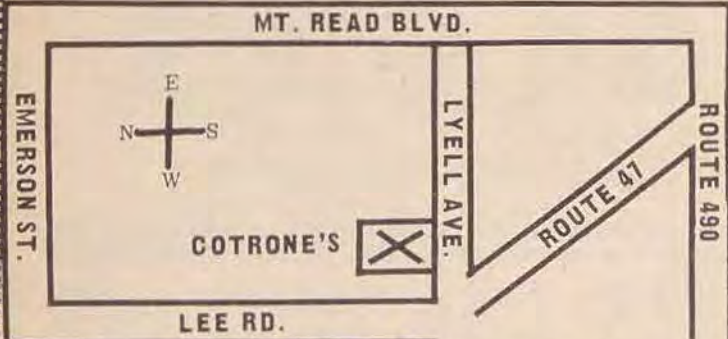

**CLARIFICATION ON THE REAL
PROPERTY TAX LAW FOR
PERSONS OVER 65 YEARS**

I have received so many calls
and letters in reference to the
real property tax break for senior
citizens that it is best for me to
give a detailed account now.

WHO IS COVERED?

Real property owned by one or
more persons each of whom is
65 years of age or over shall be
exempt from taxation by any municipal
corporation in which located, to
the extent of 50% or 1/2 of the
assessed valuation thereof, provided
the governing board of such
municipality (village, town, city or
county) after public hearings
adopts a local law, ordinance, or
resolution providing therefore.

**HAS YOUR TOWN OR CITY
ADOPTED THIS LAW?**

Since this article appears in
various newspapers which reach
the residents of Rochester and
nine towns on the westside of the
city, a definite answer cannot be
given. Moreover, by the time this
article appears in print, more
towns may have adopted the program.
However, if you will call
your village, town or city clerk,
he will be happy to inform you of
action taken or planned by your
municipality.

**IF YOUR MUNICIPALITY
APPROVES THE LAW, IS
EVERYONE OVER 65 COVERED?**

No. Here are the further
qualifications you must meet:

1. No exemption from taxation
for school purposes shall be granted
in the case of real property
where a child resides, if such
child attends a public school within
the school district.

2. No exemption shall be
granted:

a. if the combined income of
the owners exceed \$3,000 for the
12 consecutive months immediately
preceding the date of making
application for exemption. Such
income shall include social security
and retirement benefits, interest,
dividends, rental income, salary
or earnings, and the income from
self-employment; but shall not
include gifts or inheritances;

b. Unless the applicant has
owned the property for five years
prior to the date of making
application for the tax exemption.

c. Unless the property is used
exclusively for residential
purposes.

d. Unless the property is the
legal residence of and is occupied
in whole or in part by the owner or
by all of the owners of the property.

**IF YOU MEET THE
QUALIFICATIONS, IS THE
EXEMPTION AUTOMATIC?**

No. Application for such
exemption must be made by the
owner or owners of the property
90 days before the day for filing
the final assessment role.

**WHERE DO YOU OBTAIN
THE APPLICATION FORMS?**

Application forms will be
furnished by the city, town or
village Assessor's office.

Hearing, Vision Clinic At No. 7

ches greeted us at the door. He didn't speak any English, but I sensed he was asking whether we had reservations. We were a bit worried at this point, but relieved when he finally motioned to me to park. We followed him into the lobby and waited while he went into the office. and an atmosphere that really WAS fit for a king.

FROM GREDOS it was only a half days run into Madrid and it turned out to be a stroke of luck that we decided to go directly into the city by the southern route rather than through EL Escorial which we wanted to visit, but saved 'til later. For we had no reservations---as per our usual custom---and every hotel was booked solid, we discovered, when we got to the tourist bureau.

VERY OBLIGINGLY, two office girls got on the phone and must have made at least a dozen calls before they came up with a vacancy for us. It was an apartment hotel, almost new, on the outskirts of Madrid but very accessible to downtown. The tourist bureau sent along a man to guide us and all we had to pay was his taxi fare back into town.

It was a real break because we had a bedroom, living room and bath, plus a flower bedecked balcony all our own---and for about half the going rate for a hotel room in the center of town. We spent three days there before going to Majorca and three more days when we came back and thoroughly enjoyed it.

IT WAS ONLY a 15-minute drive to the Prado and to most of the attractions for which Madrid is famous, but after a couple excursions on the boulevards and up and down the main streets we surrendered our car and went to taxis. We have seen wild drivers before, but the Spaniards are in a class by themselves. Courtesy, right of way and common decency are for the birds. The typical Spaniard is a wonderfully friendly, helpful guy, but behind the wheel, ugh!

To see a bullfight, of course, is a must in Madrid. And our apartment manager did all the arrangements, including seats on the shady side of the arena, a sight-seeing trip before and a Flamenco dance exhibition right after the bullfight.

WE RENTED PILLOWS on the way in---and were glad we did. The seats were solid concrete. The arena accommodates about 28,000 and we didn't see an unoccupied seat. The people filling in were all polite and orderly, with many women and children in evidence. The hawkers were selling ice cream on a stick, peanuts and soft drinks. The atmosphere was for all the world like at an American football game.

We came away with considerably more respect for the bull fighters than we had anticipated. The gory sight of six or seven bulls meeting their doom is modified by the very artistic approaches of the matadors, the picadors and the bandilleros. All these men are colorfully dressed in expensive briches and braided waistcoats. And they have a certain finesse in the various stages of inciting and then subduing their quarry that intrigues an outsider like me; and produces a near state of hysteria among the Iberians.

THE BULLFIGHT, we found out, is a drama in three acts. The gate opens and the bull comes bounding in. He prances around the ring for

a few moments, gets a little excited when several red capes are waved at him. He is learning. At first he charges anything that moves, especially the picador and his well padded horse. As he attacks, head down, and ferociously charges the padding with his horns, the man on the horse pierces the bull's neck with a long spear; then the bandilleros take over and risk their very lives as they dart alongside the bull, plant their knives---or banderillas as they are called---in the neck muscles to correct any hooking tendencies by having something painful on the same side which the bull likes to hook to.

Amateur matadors, three of them, alternate in attracting the animal by waving their red capes and gracefully side-stepping as the enraged bull makes a pass at the cape, only inches away from the matador's legs.

THE THIRD ACT, that of the kill, is the most dangerous. The professional matador wraps a sword in his cape, makes a few passes to establish his mastery of the bull and then rises to his full height, rigid and on tiptoe, plunges the sword into the bull---hopefully to finish him off with one fell swoop. All but one of the matadors missed with the first thrust and had to make two or three more attempts. The hero of the afternoon was the lone matador who dispatched his bull to eternity with one thrust. And every person in the stadium rose to his feet, waved his white handkerchief and shouted ole, ole and some more ole's (pronounced "olay").

THE ANTICS of the crowd---the same as at a baseball or football game---are as much an attraction as the bullfight itself. We agreed with other tourists, after it was all over, that the experience was worthwhile, but we wouldn't relish it as a steady diet.

Recommendations to the State Democratic Committee For Platform Proposals

STATE AID FOR SUMMER SCHOOL AND ADULT EDUCATION
Education in the 1960's cannot be restricted to six hours a day, five days a week, ten months a year. To make effective use of our school buildings and facilities and to meet the educational demands of our citizens Summer school and adult education programs must be expanded.

In the last century it might have been argued that the need for children on the farm would have precluded substantial attendance in the summer. This certainly is no longer the case. Moreover, the great increase in knowledge and the great demands put on our students often demands attendance in summer school for a complete preparation for entrance into college. In substance, I contend that summer school is no longer just an aid for those students who failed during the regular academic year but a needed program for the good student who wishes to take additional subjects or improve a passing grade in a completed subject.

Adult education is the only real help we can offer the high school drop-out. When drop-outs recognize their mistake but are too old or have too many financial obligations to attend a regular day school course we must offer a complete and satisfying adult educational program.

With the afore-named considerations in mind, the state must aid school districts which offer summer and adult education at the same rate it compensates the standard academic program. However, at the moment each school district must bear the complete cost of these programs with no help from the state.

Prior to the elimination of the special aids for summer and evening programs by repeal in 1962, school districts received apportionments based on the extent of the programs offered. Some districts offer none of these programs

while others provide many of them to youth and adults. Under the present share-cost formula, all school districts receive aid on the same basis whether they provide these valuable programs or not.

As a result of the financial burdens on the taxpayer, Rochester, and I'm sure many other districts, have had to restrict the summer programs at a time when these programs should be expanding. In Rochester, for example, the complete elementary summer school program was eliminated this year. The High School program was also reduced by eliminating all doubles classes with the exception of English. A doubles class is a class for students taking a course for the first time.

The school districts that wish to use their facilities effectively and meet the growing needs of our population should be encouraged and not penalized. Summer and evening school programs must be aided by the state at the same rate per student hour of daily attendance as the standard day program.

Along with writing some articles of less publicized bills which became law this session, we have many, many bills which never become law. Perhaps it should be noted that only one of every nine bills introduced by a legislator becomes law. Here are a few bills which I supported that failed to become law because they were killed in committee, failed to pass both houses, or were vetoed by the governor.

SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION

I strongly supported and worked with my colleague Charles Stockmeister on a bill which made mandatory registration at the local police bureau of all people who were convicted of a sex crime.

This was a good bill, it protected the public because a convicted sex offender would hesitate to commit further crimes when the police were aware of his residence and past criminal record. However, it respected the privacy of a reformed sex offender inasmuch as only the police department was aware of his past record.

We often note that where sex murders have taken place, the guilty party had a long list of arrests for lesser, though serious sex offenses. The Stockmeister bill would not end all sex crimes, but in my opinion they would be reduced and sex criminals would be more readily captured and removed from society.

DIRECT PRIMARY BILL

We law makers make sure everyone pays taxes as you well know. The first article you buy in New York State, you pay a sales tax. The first week you are employed, you pay a state income tax, and as soon as you buy a home you find yourself on the tax assessor's rolls. But I am afraid we do not make it so convenient for you to be a registered voter. The only time you can register in your own home town is on the two or three days in October which are set aside for this purpose. To register any other time, you must personally appear at the Board of Elections on State Street in Rochester. I introduced and, if returned to Albany as your Senator, will re-introduce a bill to provide for local registration at the town hall. I strongly favor this bill because the greatest single right in a democracy is the right to vote. Only by electing people with whom you have confidence can the complex problems of our times be solved, but you cannot vote if you are not registered.

Since we in the legislature make sure you live up to your responsibilities in paying taxes, we should make it just as convenient for you to exercise your privilege to vote.

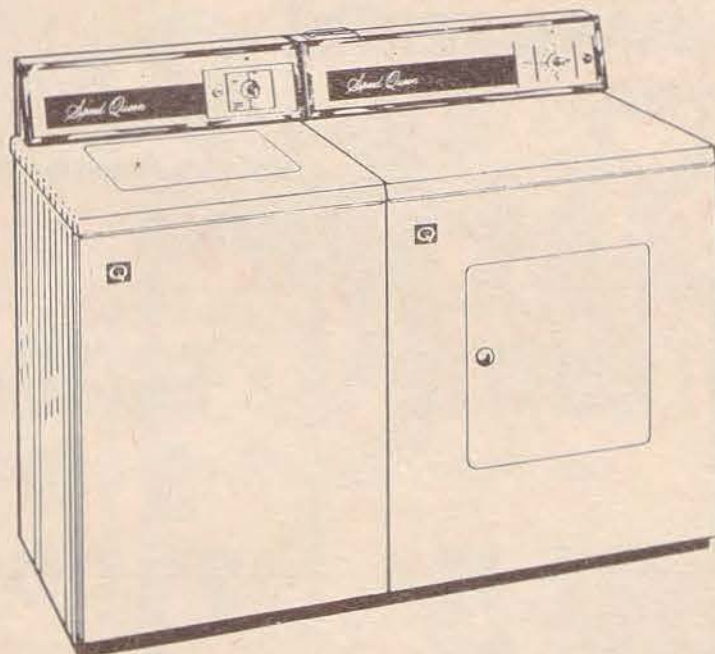

Spain & Portugal As Seen By Editor

By FRED R. METZINGER, Post-Courier Editor

One of the cardinal principles in our European travels has been to stay out of big cities as much as possible, but for a number of reasons we made Madrid an exception to this rule. First of all, there were so many interesting places close by, some of which we got time to visit. And then the city itself was very exciting and offered attractions that we just could not pass up.

We have mentioned the bullfight, which took up the better part of one day. Then there was El Prado, the gallery housing some of the world's great art treasures. A day there is only an aggravation. You wander through scores of rooms, viewing the works of the masters all too hurriedly. You could spend hours in every room even though you are a rank amateur when it comes to paintings. You never cease to marvel at the lifelike creations of such famous artists as El Greco, da

Vinci, Rubens, Van Dyck, etc., etc. WE ARE INCLINED to be choosy about cathedrals and monasteries after having seen quite a few of them, but we decided to take a trip out to El Escorial one afternoon and we had no regrets. As we traveled along the highway we could see in the distance the huge cross, a monument erected by Generalissimo Franco to all casualties on both sides of the Spanish Civil War. It is 500 feet high and 300 feet across the arms, visible for miles and a real tourist attraction. We chose to spend our time wandering through the fabulous setup at El Escorial rather than pay a visit to Los Caidos where the cross is situated.

THE MONASTERY of San Lorenzo, we were told, took 21 years to build and we wondered how they could ever have done it so fast and so beautifully back in the 16th Century. It consists of a series of buildings stretched around a huge courtyard. (They call it a paralellogram). One side is the temple and the palace of Phillip II, a combination of nine towers, 15 cloisters,

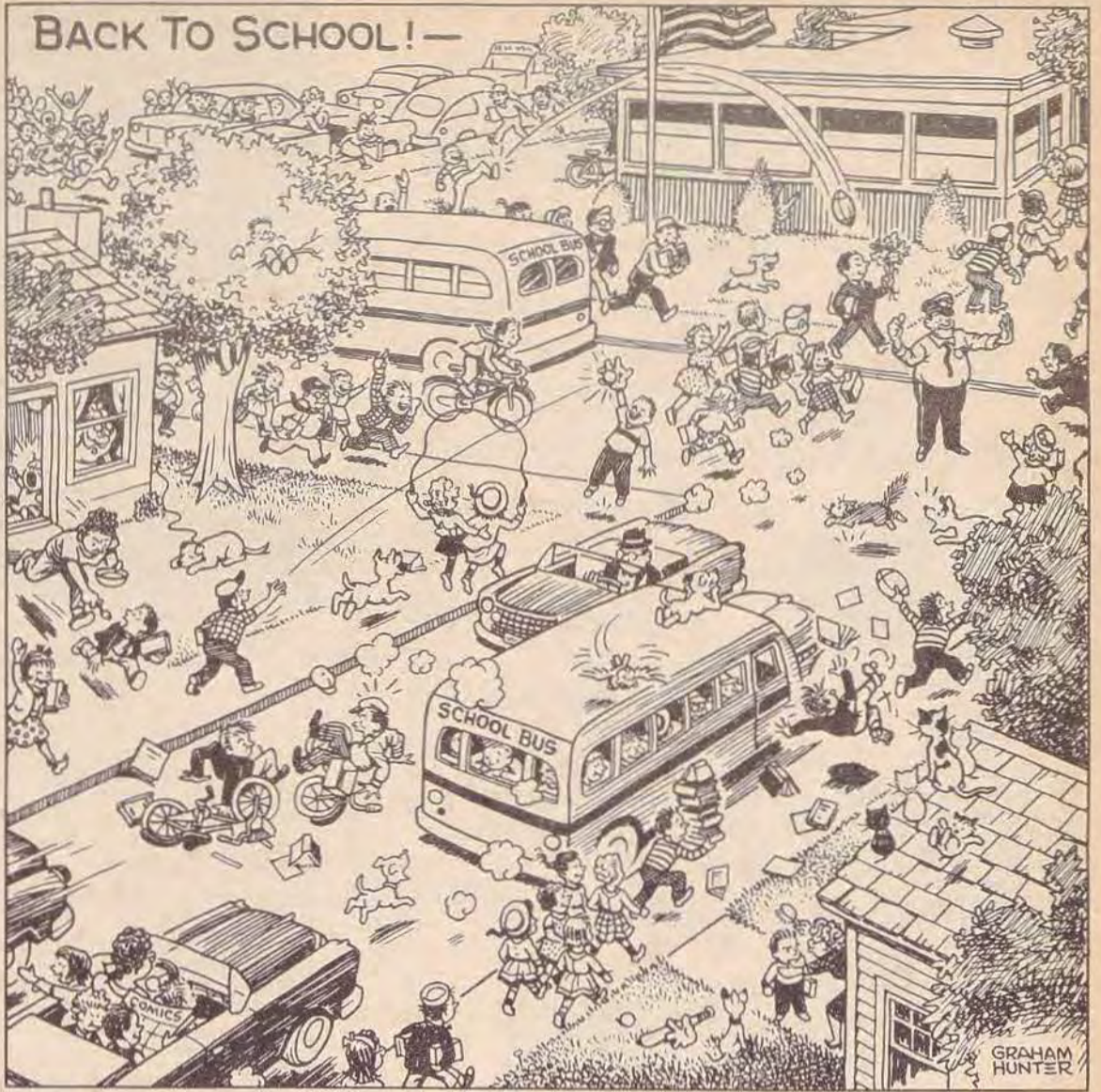

SPAIN AND PORTUGAL

Continued from P. 1

16 patios, 88 fountains, 86 staircases, more than 1,200 doors and 2,600 windows!

On another side are officials' houses, ministries, a palace for the queen and other buildings, all made of granite similar to the monastery.

WE ENTERED THE temple through a huge door with a bronze grating and emerged into a breathtaking scene. Enormous center pillars rose about 300 feet above our heads to the arched ceilings on which the patient and talented artists of yesteryear had painted scenes similar to the works of Michel Angelo in St. Peter's. In niches all around the church were oil paintings of fine quality executed by Spanish masters. And the main altar all done in gold didn't seem quite real. No description could do it justice, but fortunately there was light from about 40 or 50 windows for us to get a good picture of it, without flashbulbs or artificial lighting.

We spent most of the afternoon meandering around, had a snack in the sidewalk cafe on the grounds and then headed back to Madrid.

ANOTHER SIDE TRIP we took was to El Pardo, the residence of the Generalissimo. We were parked outside the palace gates, pointed our camera at the two mounted guards and snapped a picture of them. They were at attention expecting momentarily the emergence of a big black limousine, but one of them spied us and took his hand off his spear long enough to wave us on our way.

Whether Franco was in the limousine we didn't determine, but on two subsequent occasions we ran into him - - or rather saw him from a distance as he was whisked by in an imposing phalanx of motorcycle policemen. Once he was on his way to the bullfight and the second time he was returning from

the airport where he had picked up the president of Nicaragua (since deceased) on his official visit to Spain. On both occasions all traffic along the route came to a dead stop with all signal lights red and armed soldiers every few hundred feet. He sure is well guarded in his public appearances.

THE FIRST TIME we saw Franco we were strolling along the Paseo do Sotelo, a wide boulevard with a wooded parkway down the middle and where a big flower show was in progress. The displays were by Madrid florists and interspersed with sidewalk cafes, extended for a dozen city blocks.

It was part of the Festival of St. Isidoro and the city was festooned with banners and bunting, a circus was in town and apparently there were many gay events in progress. The Generalissimo's procession crossed the boulevard at the corner where we happened to be standing.

THAT NIGHT we had dinner in a very attractive restaurant near our apartment. We went at 9:30 and found ourselves the only customers with dozens of well-dressed waiters at our beck and call. In such a deserted atmosphere we feared the worst. We had been misdirected by our apartment manager. But as soon as we sampled the gourmet dishes placed in front of us our fears were dispelled. We were just too early! When we left at 11:30 the place was packed. Those Spaniards are sure late eaters.

AS WE EMERGED from the restaurant, we noted, much to our surprise, that the football stadium across the street was still lit up and the noise of the crowd indicated that the international game between Spain and some other country was still in progress. No one was tending the gate, so we went in and saw the last five minutes of as rough and tough a soccer game as you could imagine. No quarter given, nor asked, and the crowd was wilder than at the bullfight. Then suddenly the game was over, the opposing players put their arms around each other and the crowd (some 125,000 people) calmed right down and made for the exits. We should have seen the whole game, I suppose, but you can't do everything in a limited stay in a big metropolis.

Paying High College Bills

TAX DEDUCTIONS FOR COLLEGE DIES IN STATE SENATE

The biggest single financial burden faced by parents today is the high cost of a college education. For this reason I supported and the Assembly passed a bill which allowed parents to deduct from their state income tax up to \$750 for each dependent for expenses incurred in full time attendance at an approved institution of higher education. Unfortunately, this bill died in the State Senate.

The state should give at least some aid to parents when one considers the thousands of dollars spent in behalf of their child's education. This is particularly true because the state benefits by a well educated citizenry, not only by having qualified personnel to fill the needed professional vacancies, but in actual tax dollars obtained as a result of the higher income received by college graduates. This bill should be reintroduced and passed at the next session of the Legislature.

STUDENT LOANS FOR RESIDENTS OF NEW YORK STATE

Many New York State students with the ability to profit by higher education, but lack the funds, are able to borrow these funds through the NEW YORK HIGHER EDUCATION ASSISTANCE CORPORATION. This organization, though created by the state, is operated like any other business.

WHO MAY BORROW?

Students at accredited colleges and other approved post secondary schools may apply.

HOW THE LOANS ARE FINANCED

Loans are made by lending institutions of New York State which have a signed contract with New York Higher Education Assistance Corporation (NYHEAC).

The students pay no interest while in school. After graduation or termination of studies, the student pays only 3% interest. Arrangements for monthly repayments of the loan must be made within 60 days after graduation or termination of studies. These payments may be spread over a period as long as six years.

HOW STUDENTS MAY APPLY

The Students may obtain a loan application form by writing to NYHEAC, 111 Washington Ave., Albany, N. Y. 12224.

HOW MUCH MAY BE BORROWED PER YEAR

A "Full Time" student pursuing a "Degree Course" may obtain the following amounts: Freshmen year \$750; second year \$1000; third year \$1250; fourth year \$1500; and subsequent and graduate years, \$1500. Loans shall not total over \$7500 for any student.

Children learn big skills in small ways.

Often the home-made or throw-away item serves a child better than an expensive toy.

Is he ready to tell time? He can learn to do it with a paper plate.

Reading a clock is a complicated business. The face may have either Roman or Arabic numerals, confusing enough. Then the child has to grasp the 60-minute hour, and the fact that each numeral has to count for five minutes.

It's easiest to write the clock numbers plainly on a paper plate. Attach a long and short hand of cardboard, fastened with a prong. Bright colors help. Then adult and child can practice setting a clock for 12, 2, 5 or whatever. As the children learn, the clock can be "set" to show lunch-time or bedtime. It can be taped to a child's door for messages or practice in time-reading.

A child can learn the days of the week and the cycle of months by having a household calendar explained to him, or by making his own with a playbook.

Is he studying words? There are puzzles at the local variety store to teach him nouns and verbs.

Even a dime box of crayons can help him learn to read. He associates the color and the name of it. Soon he learns to draw and identify the objects of his world.

"Every sight and sound in the world will interest a child if he has help sorting it all out," reminds Alice Hanson of Whitman Publishing Company of Racine, Wis., leading producers of children's activity items.

Beginners' playbooks and help-yourself workbooks, at most variety stores, provide pages full of ideas. A child can learn to add and subtract with buttons, marbles or pictures of them. He starts science, spelling and other subjects simply.

In a shared half hour he gains in curiosity and confidence.

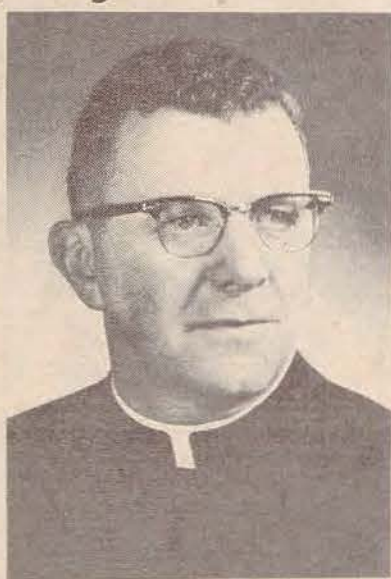

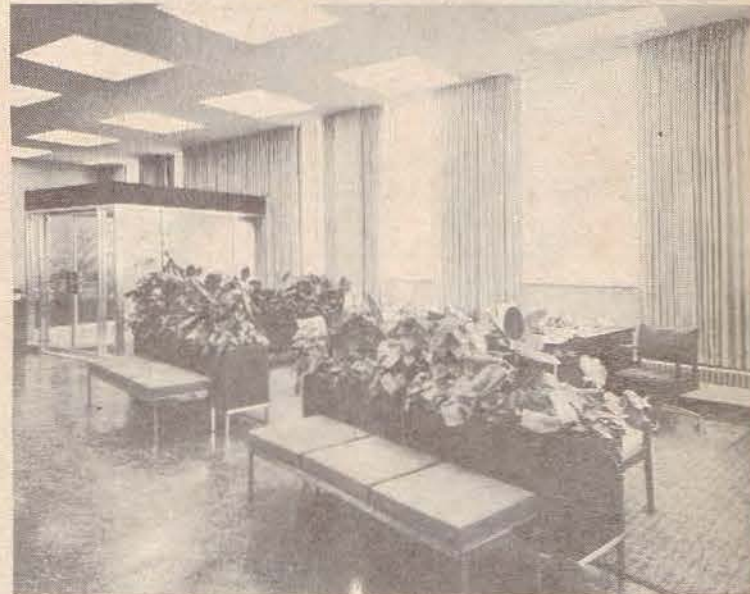

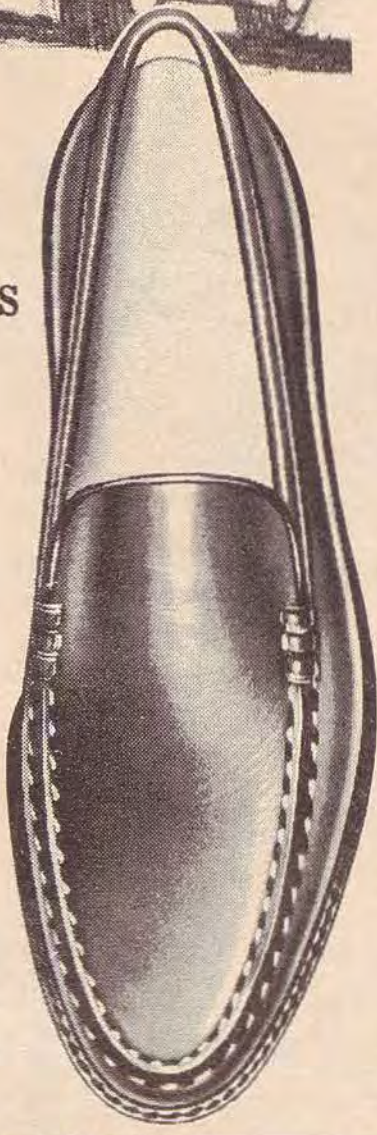

Holy Lands Tour Thrills Redeemer Lutheran Pastor

A month of touring and sight-seeing in the Holy Land was recalled this week by the Rev. Elmer Schaertel. He expressed himself as "amazed and overwhelmed" by the relics of antiquity and all but astounded at the "tremendous contrast" in living standards he observed in some of the countries he visited, especially Egypt.

Pastor Schaertel and his wife were given the trip by their congregation (the Lutheran Church of the Redeemer) and they enjoyed "every minute of it". They had perfect weather, stayed at the best hotels, had excellent food and the finest travel arrangements, mostly by jet planes, even on the short hops.

They started in Rome, for a short stopover, then flew to Cairo where they were impressed with the modern apartments and other conveniences of present-day living. But when they traveled along the country roads outside the city, they saw people working as did their forefathers thousands of years ago. The Schaertels noted, however, that the people looked healthy; that the women as a rule were quite beautiful, carried themselves well and "looked lovely despite being poorly dressed."

From Cairo they flew to Beirut and then spent two weeks in the Holy Land, Jordan and Lebanon. In Greece they took a week's cruise in the Aegean Isles where they saw evidence of early civilization. "We came away with a keen realization of what Paul was up against

and a greater faith in the power of the written word which has survived through the centuries even though civilizations have perished", says Rev. Schaertel. The historical basis of legend he found everywhere.

"For instance," he pointed out "the whole of Homer's Iliad, always treated as legend until the middle of the last century, is now accepted as factual due to archeological exploration".

Incidentally, they were told by their guide that some of the valuable treasures unearthed were seized by the Germans in World War II, had subsequently fallen into the hands of the Russians and were now believed to be in East Germany.

Pastor Schaertel took several hundred pictures and expects to share his experiences with members of his church and others in "grateful appreciation for the trip of a lifetime."

Mrs. William T. Harper, chairman of Rochester State Hospital Service, explained the volunteer's role. "There are two aspects in treatment of the mentally ill: The medical and the humanistic. Only the volunteer can administer the humanistic aspect because only the volunteer has a pure humanitarian interest". The mentally ill must be convinced that there is someone who cares. Socialized companionship is gained through group activity. The volunteer work is a group-working-with-group program in such activities as: planning and leading parties and games; group singing; book card and library aides; assisting in arts and crafts; and planning play for disturbed children. A special need exists for persons who can play piano, especially by ear. Daytime and evening volunteers are needed—men and women.

Mrs. Harper says, "Volunteers are doing things today we never dreamed possible. We need so many more of them. They do things that ONLY a volunteer can do because the patient realizes they are not paid to be kind and that the volunteer is motivated only by a sincere interest in humanity."

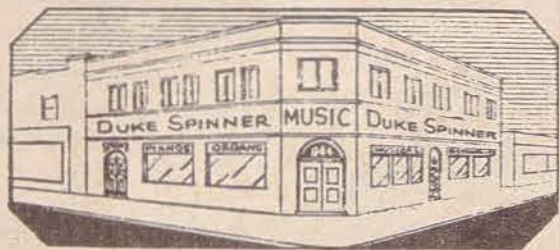

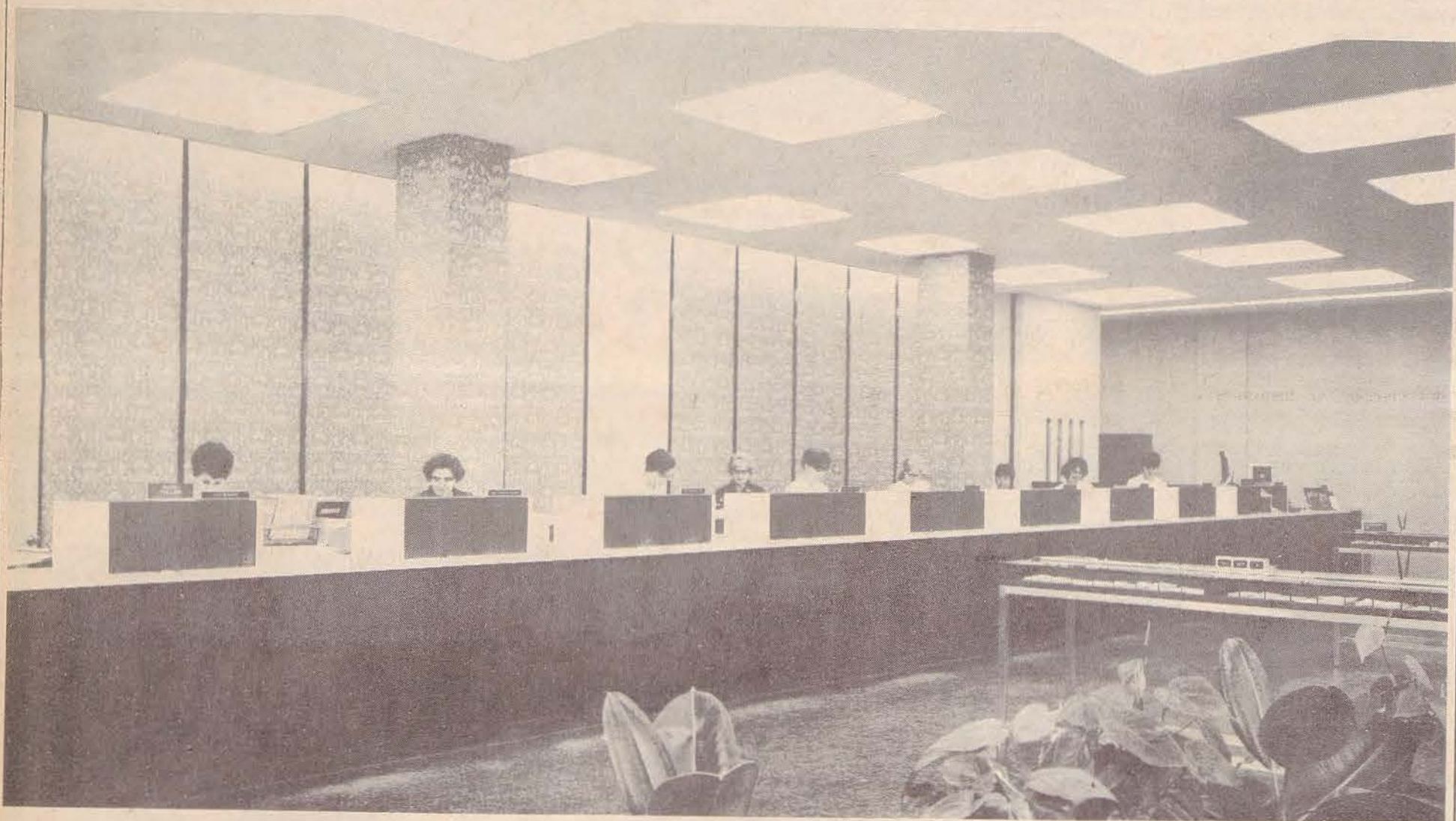

Once a year the Italian American Sports Club Women's Auxillary donates to a needy organization. This year they will help form a new chapter in the city called, "The Mended Hearts, Inc."

It is an affiliation of persons throughout the world who have undergone heart surgery.

In 1950, at a Boston Hospital the new heart surgery brought together four of its beneficiaries. In new found happiness, they were adjusting themselves to a bright new outlook. Out of their conversation together and with relatives and friends came the question: "How can we encourage and help others who are going to have heart operations?"

These four and others with sympathetic interest were sure that they could help. To do so most effectively they formed an organization in January 1951, with membership of two men and two women. They named it simply by capitalizing the words they used so readily in referring to themselves "The Mended Hearts."

The good that such an organization could accomplish was soon recognized in other cities. In October 1955 it was incorporated.

The objectives of The Mended Hearts are to visit and encourage with the approval of the physician, persons anticipating or recovering from heart surgery.

To distribute information of specific educational value to Mended Hearts and potential heart surgery patients.

To provide advice and services to families of patients undergoing heart surgery where possible.

To establish a program of assistance to surgeons, physicians, and hospitals in their work with heart patients.

To cooperate with other organizations which engage in educational and research activities pertaining to heart illnesses.

To assist established rehabilitation programs for The Mended Hearts and their families.

Many doctors indicated their enthusiasm for the services which Mended Hearts can give to pre- and post-surgery heart patients. They agree that the empathy which exists between patient and former patient brings a rapport which can be gained in no other way. Here is the way one of the leaders sums up the purpose: "What we so happily feel... what we gladly do is summed up in this saying we have: It's great to be alive and to help others!"

"We invite all who are interested in our work to join with us," said Mrs. Russell Pecoraro, who is chairman and can be reached at BE 5-0224.

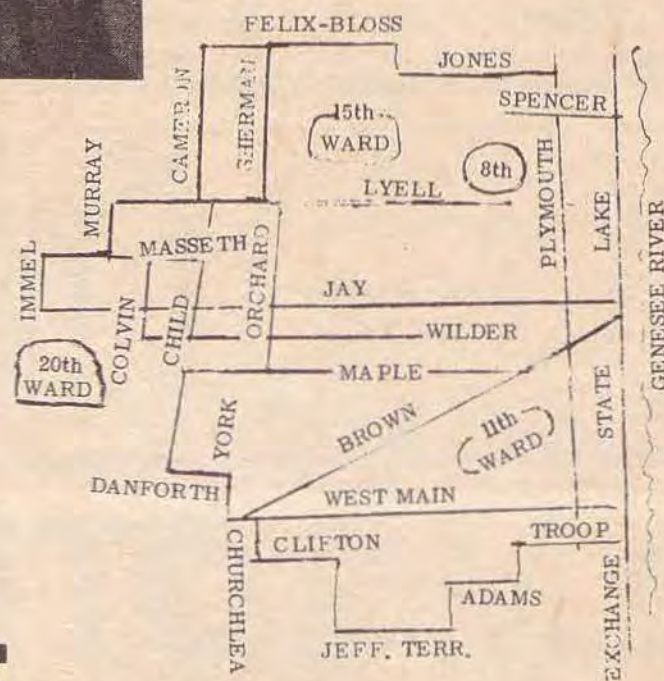





Old Tenth History Subject Of Neighborhood Meeting

The fall meeting of the Maplewood Neighborhood Association in the Kodak Park auditorium on Oct. 7 will be highlighted by a re-counting of the history of the Old Tenth Ward, as well as by an Old Timers' Contest for which prizes will be awarded.

Dr. Blake McKelvey, city historian, is now doing research on the Northwest area with particular emphasis on the Old Tenth, and will be the featured speaker. He will illustrate his talk with all available slides and with material from the historical files of the city as well as from a series of articles written in 1930 for the Tenth Ward Courier by Joan Lynn Schild.

(Older residents of the Tenth who may have pictures or material they feel would be of interest are invited to loan it for the occasion to Dr. McKelvey. It may be submitted to him directly at his office in the Rundell Library, South Ave., or may be left at the Tenth Ward Courier office, 495 Emerson St.)

Details of the Old Timers' Contest will be found in another column of this page.

Dr. McKelvey will cover the city's "spread" from the days of its founding with particular relation to this area and parts annexed in the early days. He plans to go back to the era of the first settlers, to the building of the first roads and bridges, and to geographic considerations in its growth and development.

This will be essentially for adult listeners, but an invitation is being extended to fourth and seventh graders who are studying local history to come, accompanied by their parents.





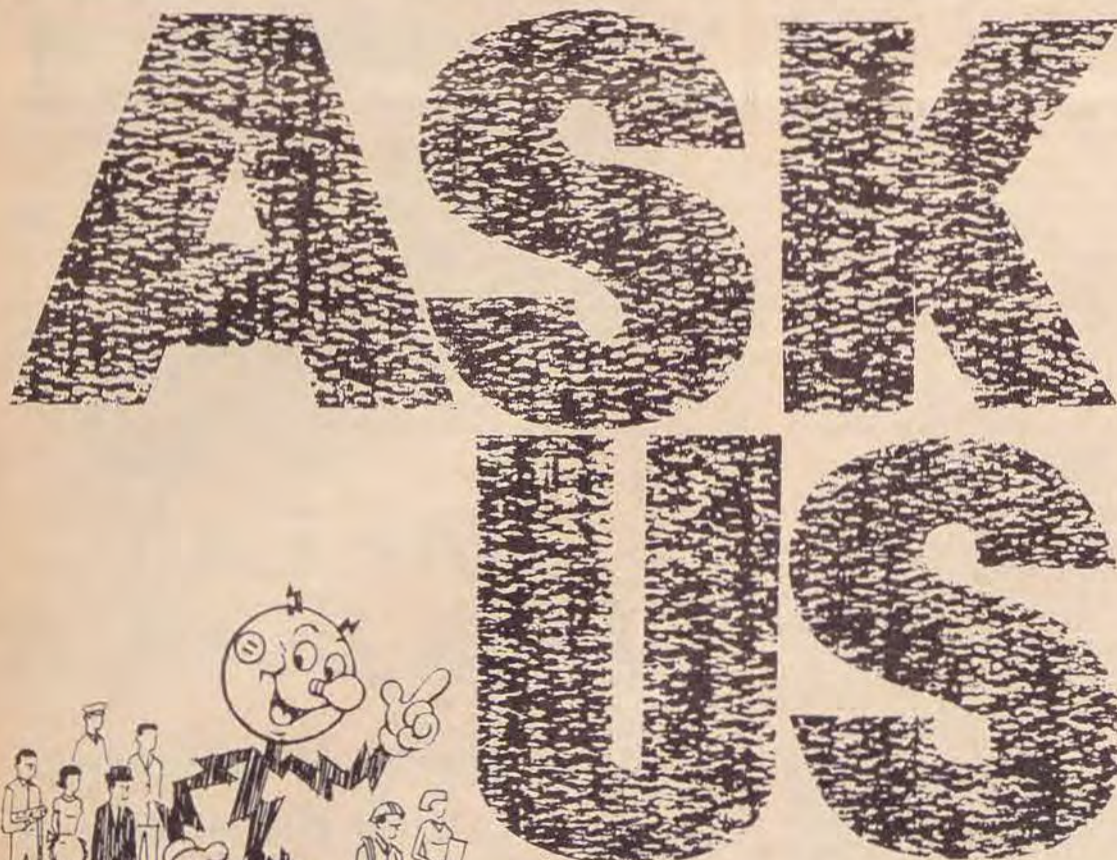

Safety Tips For Fishermen

It has been said, "Caution is a most valuable asset in fishing, especially if you're the fish." But caution is also important to the fisherman, according to Wilbur M. Mauk, Safety Services Director of the local Red Cross chapter.

The careless fisherman can wind up "lifeless as a string of dead fish," said Mauk, recalling English journalist G. K. Chesterton's vivid phrase. To avoid this situation he recommends these safety tips to anglers:

BE PREPARED before you cast that first line -- know how to swim, know basic First Aid techniques, and take along First Aid and snake

bite kits. Discuss with your physician the advisability of tetanus shots.

LISTEN TO THE weather forecast so you can dress warmly -- or coolly enough, and take along sunglasses, sunburn ointment, or insect repellent if necessary.

This personal equipment should be supplemented by an assortment of fishing gear, including needle-nose pliers, wire cutters, and a pocketknife.

KEEP ALL fishing tackle, lures, and/or hooks in a covered container when not in use.

Let someone know where you plan to fish and approximately when you will return. Better yet, take a friend along.

ALWAYS BE ON the alert for swimmers, scuba, and skin divers or water skiers who may be near the fishing area.

Anglers should not go barefoot. Broken glass, nails, or other debris can injure your feet, or you might step on a fish and cut your foot on its fins. Don Waders or some type of thick soled boots, not soft soled shoes which are vulnerable to sharp objects, too.

When you wade, know the bottom. Watch for drop-offs, slimy rocks, and water weeds. Muddy water can obscure these hazards.

WATCH OUT for wet rocks in fast-running water.

Don't let your fishing line get wrapped around your hand. So that when you get a bite, the line will be pulled tight and leave a bad burn.

Extracting the hook from a fish's mouth can be dangerous, for several varieties of fish have teeth which can lacerate a hand, or cut a finger to the bone. Remove the hook with pliers or a knife.

Should a hook snag an individual, cut the hook from the line, cut the "eye" end of the hook with wire

clippers, and pull the shaft of the hook through the skin.

In the event there are no wire clippers available or it is impossible to pull the shaft through the skin, cut the line, put a light bandage around the injured area, and get to a doctor.

Fishermen should not lean against or put their hands on fallen logs, trees, or in weeds. These are favorite places for snakes. Fishing from a boat requires special safety procedures, said Mauk, offering these tips:

Know and follow federal and state boating laws such as the Rules of the Road, required equipment, running lights, and boatloads.

Practice "courtesy afloat". Steer your vessel wide and slow down. The wake of your boat could flip an anchored vessel or swamp it.

Keep a lookout on the water ahead and traffic in the area you are trolling. Don't anchor in boat channels or tie up to navigation aids, for these are traffic lanes

and guides and must be kept clear at all times.

If at all possible remain seated while casting. And cast overhead, not sidarm.

Net your fish with a firm quick sweep so you won't disturb the boat's balance.

Korean Veteran's Benefit Reminder

Hospitalization is now available for peacetime veterans. Four thousand nursing home beds have been authorized in addition to 125,000 hospital beds in Veterans's Administration hospitals.

Veterans preference for federal employment.

Job counseling and employment placement.

Service connection for certain chronic diseases on a presumptive basis. This type of service connection was previously granted only to wartime veterans.

Entitlement to a burial flag, Extension of the Soldiers' and Sailors' Relief Act to cover "Cold War" veterans.

Post-Korean war veterans of the U. S. Armed Forces are urged by Services to Military Families of the local Red Cross Chapter to take advantage of benefits now available to them under a law signed by President Johnson last March 3.

The Red Cross can help veterans apply for these benefits and invites them to make an appointment to visit Chapter headquarters at 276 Clinton Ave., S., or call 454-2400 for an appointment.

The new law, the Veteran's Readjustment Act of 1966 (PL 89-358), would enable veterans with at least three years of service after January 31, 1955, to attend college for four scholastic years -- 36 months -- full time. Single veterans will get a \$100-a-month allowance from the government and veterans with dependents, allotments somewhat larger.

Veterans with less than three years of military service may receive allowances for as many months of education as the time they served.

Courses may be taken at approved colleges and universities or high schools, and correspondence schools.

Other benefits under Public Law 89-356, which became effective June 1, 1966, are these:

Guaranty of loans for homes for ex-servicemen. It is anticipated that 64,000 such loans will be guaranteed in the first year, and 500,000 in the first five years.

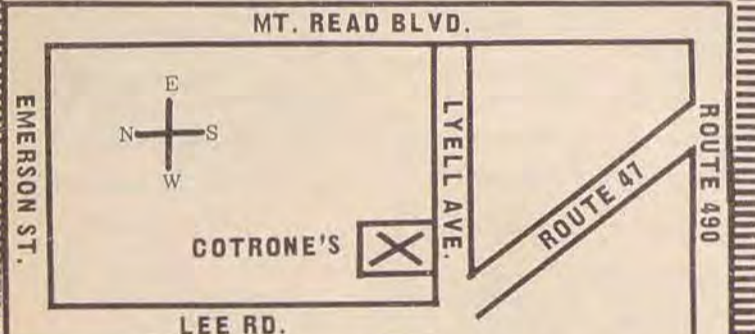

Who redesigns the pedestrian?

What happens to the pedestrian once cars have been redesigned to increase the occupants' chances of crash-survival? The need to protect pedestrians as well as motorists can be seen in the approximately 9,000 pedestrian fatalities, annually.

That many persons, drivers and pedestrians alike, would prefer to avoid accidents, rather than simply to survive them, is the opinion of the

Street and Highway Safety Lighting Bureau. Since the traffic death rate at night is two and a half times that in daytime, a good way to start would be by improving lighting at dangerous locations, the Bureau says.

Deaths from after-dark traffic accidents have gone down, where lighting has been installed, an average of 64 percent at 100 locations, according to Bureau figures.

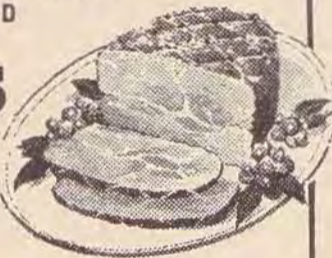

About To Be 65? Here Are Some Social Security Suggestions

When do I enroll in medicare if I'm going to be 65 in the near future or later years? This is a question the Rochester Social Security Office receives quite often, said Joseph Tomaino, district manager.

Persons who are not yet 65 will have seven months in which to enroll for medicare. These seven months are the three months before the month they are 65, the month in which they are 65, and the three months after the month in which they are 65.

The medical insurance part of the health insurance program becomes effective on different dates depending on when the application is filed in the seven month period. It is a definite advantage to file in the three month period before the month of reaching age 65. The medical insurance is then effective with the first day of the month of your 65th birthday. If you apply in the month you are 65 or in the following three months, your medical insurance protection will not begin immediately, although you will have hospital insurance as soon as you apply.

A person who is not yet 65, but who is working or has worked under social security and has not filed an application, should get in touch with the social security office in the three months before he is 65. In

this way he becomes entitled to the health insurance benefits, even though, because of his work, he may not receive a monthly benefit. He should not worry about his additional earnings; these will be automatically included in refiguring his benefit rate.

The Social Security Administration has always urged those persons who have not filed for benefits to get in touch with them three months before they are 65. Now with medicare it is more important to do so, said Tomaino.

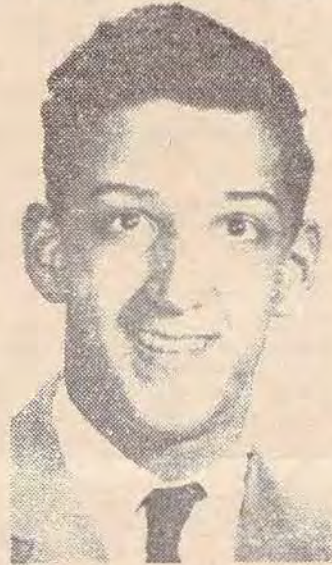

U. S. Navy Advisory For High Schoolers

The following release from the U. S. Navy Recruiting Station in the Federal Building is for information of high school seniors. It reads:
"For many students their senior year of high school is fast approaching. College plans have already been established by some of these students, but many others remain undecided about their pursuits upon graduation. College plans should begin early, and no male high school senior should overlook consideration of one of the Navy's finest college training officer candidate programs - the Regular Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps (NROTC) - in deciding upon his college plans.
"The Regular NROTC is a program designed to train career officers for the Navy and Marine Corps. The program includes payment by the Navy of tuition, educational fees, textbooks, uniforms, and provides \$50 monthly subsistence allowance to its members for four years. Selected candidates are enlisted in the U. S. Naval Reserve and are appointed Midshipmen upon enrollment in college. The college majors which a candidate may take are many, and only a few nontechnical majors are prohibited.
During the summers between college years, Midshipmen participate in cruises which provide practical experience in Naval operations and from which they receive many varied and rewarding experiences. Upon graduation, Midshipmen may be commissioned as Ensigns in the U. S. Navy, or as Second Lieutenants in the U. S.

Marine Corps.

Painting Pointers

Summertime is paint up time. And if you plan to paint your house this summer --- or hire it done --- you'll probably be interested in these tips from the U. S. Department of Agriculture, says Mrs. Mary Ellen Burris, Cooperative Extension home economist.

Use the same brand and type of paint originally used --- unless, of course, it's given poor service.

Repaint only when the old paint has worn thin and no longer protects the wood. Ordinarily paint no oftener than every four years.

When applying two coats, wait two weeks between the first and second. To avoid heat blisters, paint the north side of the building during the first part of the morning, the east side in late morning, the south side early in the afternoon, and the west side in late afternoon.

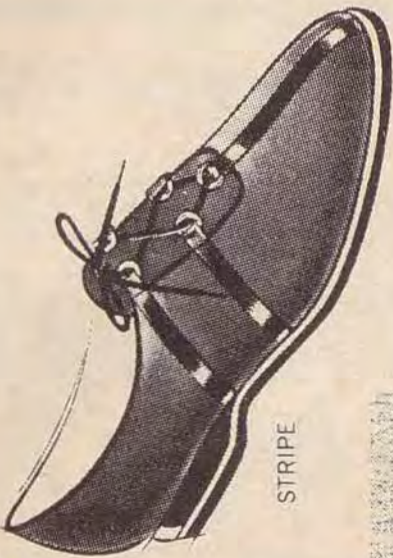

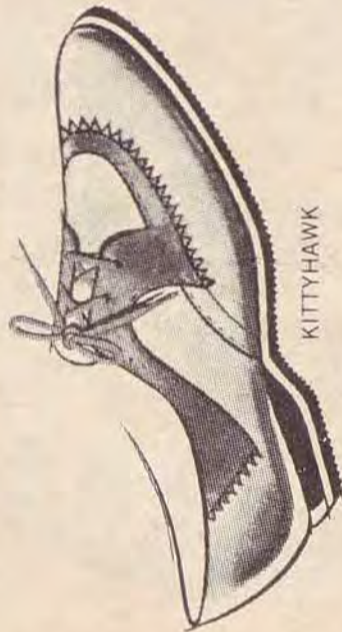

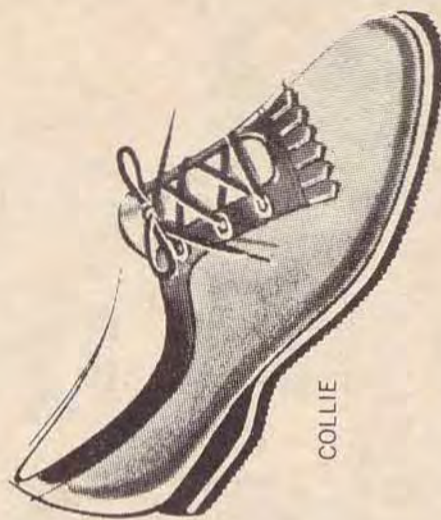

I supported a bill in the Assembly which amended the penal law to PROHIBIT malicious injury to buildings, places of religious worship and institutions and cemeteries. Specifically the bill (1) added DESECRATION of religious places

to the types of activities prohibited by the law; (2) made the destruction, defilement, defacement or desecration of a monument, headstone marker in a cemetery a FELONY; and (3) increased the maximum prison term for such acts covered in the Law from three to seven years.

This bill died in the State Senate, but I'm sure it has an excellent chance of getting the necessary support at the next session of the legislature.

HIGHWAY SAFETY

The legislature passed and the Governor signed the following bills in reference to Highway Safety:

1. MOTORCYCLES are prohibited from being driven more than two abreast.

2. 1968 or later model passenger cars and light trucks (up to 10,000 G.W.) registered in this state must be equipped with a padded instrument panel.

3. All 1968 or later model passenger cars must have a dual breaking system. At present a complete loss of breaking force will result from the failure of the brake master cylinder, brake actuating cylinder, brake line or hose.

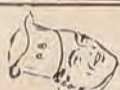

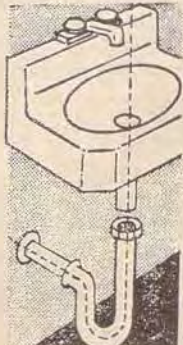
