Bridge Safety Is Questioned

The safety status of the Driving Park Ave, bridge is being questioned by the driving public, according to Councilman Stephen May, and he has asked City Manger Seymour Scher, to "shed light" on the city's future plans for repairing or replacing the span.

"Numerous people have expressed concern to me about whether it is safe to drive on the Driving Park bridge", said May in a letter to Scher. "I agree with them that it is puzzling to find that although its use by heavy trucks is prohibited, a far weightier load is permitted during rush hours when the bridge is jammed with dozens of automobiles. If you plan to continue the prohibition on truck travel, it would be helpful to know if special steps are being taken to crack down on those presently violating this rule".







Driving Park Span Gets Safe Rating

The city makes inspections of the Driving Park bridge every three months and the span is safe even though filled with vehicles during rush-hours periods.

This is the reply of City Engineer Patrick S, Sidney-Smith to Councilman Stephen May who had asked for this assurance last week.

"The conditions which were considered unsafe at the time the bridgewas closed to traffic were remedied prior to its reopening", says the engineer. "The 8-ton load limit is a limit per vehicle and is not a cumulative limit for all vehicles which may be on the bridge. This limit is by design a conservative one and takes into consideration the fact that the bridge may be filled with vehicles during rush-hour periods."

Sydney-Smith also informed May that the city does not consider the structure worthy of major rehabilitation and that a new bridge must be built on the basis of information obtained from the Metropolitan Transportation Study, but not necessarily on the present location, A decision on the exact location of a new bridge and its capacity should be made within the next six to nine months, he said.







POLITICAL ROUNDUP

Although Election Day is still more than six months away, candi dates are beginning to emerge and slates are taking form. Here are some of the developments as related to this area:

The Ninth and Tenth Wards have been split again for the Council race. The northern half is now in the new Northeast District; the southern half is in the new setup of the Northwest District.

Andrew Celli, Democratic leader of the Ninth and Tenth Wards, appears to have the City Council nomination for the Northwest District if Councilman Henry Gillette persists in his avowed intention of not running. The Republicans have several men under consideration but no front runner has emerged.

Jerry Clifford, former Tenth Ward supervisor, is almost certain to be the Republican nominee for City Council in the new Northeast District which will include the northern parts of the Ninth and Tenth Wards along with Wards 2, 4, 6, 17, 22, and 23. (This straddles both sides of the river as does the new Northwest District,) Clifford's opponent probably will be Urban Kress, who is about to be named to fill the Council seat vacated by Assemblyman Raymond Lill.

Peter Fuino has re-considered after a unanimous vote of confidence by his ward and county committee in the First Ward and has resumed the Democratic leadership. He had submitted his resignation some time ago. At the same meeting, on April 13, the committeemen endorsed Celli for council and Raymond Margrett, former First Ward supervisor, for another try at County Legislator.

Another Hearing For Apartments

Property owners in the Emerson-Mt. Read area who thought they had won out in their fight against a 56 unit apartment project have discovered that they have another Zoning Board hearing at which they must appear. They are still opposed, however, and plan to continue their opposition.

The request of John Bianchi for re-zoning of two large plots of land will be given another hearing tomorrow (Thursday) morning and the aroused neighbors plan to turn out in large numbers "to protect the neighborhood" as a spokesman for the property owners puts it. All affected residents in Abbott St. and Mt. Read Blvd. are urged to be at the hearing which is at 9:30 a.m., Room 229, Public Safety Building in the Civic Center

The neighbors led by Rudolph Youngman, have hired a lawyer and have won their point twice before the Zoning Board and also in a Supreme Court decision. The court decision allowed the application for a re-hearing by the Zoning Board, however, and this has been scheduled for to-

All the surrounding lots have been upgraded some time ago to R-1 status, but the land pur-chased by Bianchi was left in R-2. He bought the Mt. Read land, in the rear of the fire-house from the city at public auction, and a house and a vacant lot on Emerson next to the firehouse, were acquired from private owners. Bianchi claims "hardship" if not given permission to build his apartments. The neighbors want homes built on the lots and will settle for duplexes, but not apartments.

"Twenty-Eight" **TOPICS**

28th District County Legislator

The past month has been a busy one for myself and all members of your County Legislature. At the regular meeting on March 7, I seconded the resolution of Robert Neilon eliminating charge-backs as of December 31st of this year. The result will be a decided savings on next year's city budget, with lower tax rates for city residents, expanded programs and services. Provided the city council applies this savings to the tax rate.

With the problem of chargebacks settled at last, I plan to devote much of my energy in the coming months to the increasingly critical matter of water pollution, in an effort to arrive at some sort of a solution whereby Lake Ontario's beaches may be safely reopened for our residents. In a related matter, the County Legislature has plans for a committee to study the growing problems of air pollution in the Rochester area.

A number of you have called me regarding the parking situation at the Rochester Monroe County Airport, and I'm pleased to report that steps are now being taken to expand the parking lot. This additional parking will take into account not only the airport's present needs but projected future traffic as well - in an era when air travel is becoming increasingly vital to the prosperity of this and every other community as well. The new parking facilities should be completed later this year, with little or no dis-ruption of the present parking lot during construction.

On a matter of special interest to the people of my area, we hope soon to expand the recreational facilities in the central section of the 28th District, in order to replace those eliminated by the new construction at #7 School. I'm also pleased to report that the proposal to rezone Dewey Avenue between Driving Park and Kislingbury St. from R-2 to R-3 has been sent back to the Planning Board for further study. I want to thank the members of the Maplewood Association and all who appeared in opposition to this measure at the recent informal meeting of the Planning and Zoning Boards.

I'll be discussing other topics of local interest in next month's column. In the meantime, remember to call me if I can help you in any way.

ALBANY REPORT

As many of you now know, the lottery bill was introduced and passed in the wee hours of the morning of April 2 -- the last day of the 1967 Legislative session. Although the lottery had been discussed for months, the changes were introduced to the bill in the last 24 hours, and many of the legislators had not even read the entire bill by the time a vote was taken - - truely a sad state of affairs. I find it hard to believe that, although the lottery proposal amendment was defeated upstate, I was the only upstate Senator of either party to cast a negative vote.

The final lottery proposal that became law goes much farther than anything New Hampshire has tried:

1. There will be twelve lotteries a year, not three or four. 2. Lottery tickets can be sold

for as little as one dollar.

3. Lottery tickets can be purchased by anyone 18 or over. In fact, the law specifically allows, under Section 1311, that a person 18 years of age or older can purchase a ticket for the purpose of making a gift in the name of and for the benefit of a person less than that age. This concept has no defense. I suppose we will now witness scenes of lottery tickets being used as presents for graduations, birthdays, and other happy

events in the lives of our young people.

4. Although some of the profits from the lottery will go to all school districts, on the basis of operating costs, those counties and cities which sell the most tickets will be given a bonus, which means that areas that gamble most will receive the most benefits. This is nonsense. For example, we receive tax dollars for the sale of whiskey and these tax dollars are used for the benefit of the whole state. No one has ever suggested that communities that sell the most whiskey ought receive some special benefit because of the "civic mindedness".

5. Lottery tickets will be sold at banks, savings and loan associations, telegraph corporations, hotels and motels, and if the commissioner determines that public "convenience" requires additional licensees, he may license agencies and instrumentalities of the state, counties, cities, towns and villages as agents to sell lottery tickets.

First hand information on a variety of government problems was brought to the political forum of Dewey Presbyterian Church Sunday night and all who attended agreed it was a very informative session,

Congressman Barber Conable flew in from Washington in a snowstorm and Mayor Frank Lamb delayed his departure for the State Constitutional Convention in order to be present, but the turnout of about 75 people was disappointing.

Powers berated the speed with which important measures had to be rushed through the State Legislature due to the early closing date made necessary by opening of the Con Con.

Questions from the floor took up as much time as the speakers prepared talks and as stated by Chairman Gordon Skinner "made it a very worthwhile evening."

### NEEDS OF THE URBAN COMMUNITY

You may have read one or more of the articles in the series on Urban-Suburban problems by Robert Spellman, which appeared in the Democrat and Chronicle the first week of May. This is must reading for anyone concerned about his community.

Many arguments, of course, exist as to what the suburban community might do to help the city, but most reasonable men agree that the city must be given additional financial aid. The particular form of the aid and the political body that will administer this program is certainly debatable, but the need for such aid in some form I believe to be irrefutable.

Here are the facts. In Rochester as in all cities throughout the nation, a high percentage of the middle and upper class are moving to the suburbs. The lower economic groups, for a variety of reasons,

move to the city. The lower economic group, of course, receives and are in need of the various governmental services, which means the cost of these services increase. At the same time, they contribute fewer tax dollars, which means sources of revenue are cut. For example, to win the war on crime, Rochester must allocate more money for more and better paid police and a variety of specialized training courses.

Dollars are not easy to come by and we must make sure that any program adopted is efficient and needed and that the taxpayer receives one hundred cents of service for every dollar spent, I have always tried to evaluate each and every program by this criteria. Whether you agree with County Manager Howe that the city should be aided by the county assuming some of the programs now paid for by the city, or whether you agree with Dr. Scher, City Manager, that the city should be given additional financial aid to discharge its obligations, one thing is true, the city will not be a pleasant place to work, visit or live without the necessary financial expenditure.





The author goes on to evaluate our technological society which has made such strides in the world of space, science, medicine and material things. Yet in the area of human relations there has been little progress in his opinion.

Our tension-ridden society has all the affluent symbols of wealth. Automobiles, private planes, winter and summer homes, etc. Yet people spend billions of dollars every year for pills to alleviate their woes so that they may sleep at night.

Is this a revolt against religious and social tradition? Can we go on defying all the virtues that this great country of ours was founded on? Should we stand by and let this "New Generation" destroy "conscience", "Principle" and the "Word of God"?

Dr. Merlanti believes that God has endowed mankind with intellect instinctive, and psychic faculties which, properly understood and used can bring man true directives for living well with himself, harmoniously with his maker, and in finer relationship with his fellow man.

It was G. K. Chesterton who said, "The Christian faith has not been tried and found wanting. It has been found difficult and left untried."

It is a conforting book to read and thought provoking too. - E.A.M.



# Former Aquinas Coaches To Fete Father Carter

Eight Aquinas head football coaches, spanning a period of 25 years are expected to be among the guests attending a testimonial dinner June 11 for Aquinas athletic director Father Cyril F. Carter, C.S.B.

Sponsored by friends and alumni of Aquinas, the dinner will be held at Vince's Fifty Acres in Henrietta. The occasion marks 25 years of service by Father Carter to Aquinas and the Rochester community.

A two year stint by Ray Jablonski netted a 7-6-1 performance. Stan Zajdel in 1954 and Hank Vadas the following year both had 3-5 records. Former professional football player Joe Repko took over in 1956 and in nine years accumulated a 37-31-1 record. Present coach Bob Rosmarino is 12 and 4 over two years.

When Aquinas expanded its football program in 1945, Coach Harry Wright elevated Aquinas elevens to lofty heights as the games shifted from Edgerton Park to Red Wing Stadium and teams began their invasion coming from Texas, Illi-







# Flags On Display

A special exhibit on the first floor of Rochester Museum of Arts and Sciences features "The Flag: Symbol of American Development".

Flags and objects highlight the theme and will remain on display through Flag Day, June 14. Re-search and material are the joint effort of Mrs. Jon Porter, registrar and Miss Diane McDonough, educational assistant.

Congress adopted the Stars and Stripes on June 14, 1777 and the first 13 stars were arranged in a circle based on the idea that no colony should take precedence, This flag is on exhibit,

Also the first flag of 1775 which incorporated the Union Jack with 13 alternate red and white stripes.

In 1795 when Kentucky and Vermont entered the Union, the flag had 15 stars and 15 stripes. Congress set the number of stripes at 13 in 1818 and provided for the addition of one new star for each state admitted to the Union.

Other flags in the exhibit include the Confederate flag of 1863 with 13 stars on the blue St. Andrew's Cross and those with 34, 45 and 48 stars and the flags of today with 50 stars.

Objects symbolize the story of unity, westward expansion and military maneuvers.

position. No one suggests that your legislator's voting record should not be clearly before the public. In fact, without knowledge of your legislator's voting record, you have no standard by which to judge him. I contend that unless a man's voting record and behavior at committee meetings are open to the public, you do not have "half" the story.

The primary purpose of a committee is to allow a relatively small group of men to research and debate in depth a small number of bills, because no single legislator can do this same intensive study on all bills before the house. When a bill is "killed" or voted down in committee, it has no chance of passage in the house. The public has the right to know the voting record of each member of the committee and arguments put forth by them.

I will readily agree that to defend your committee voting record is a major additional burden for your legislators, but it certainly is in the interest of responsible government, Moreover, no man should

DEAR SIRS:

As a life member of The National Rifle Association and the New York State Rifle and Pistol Association, I wish to add my support to the firearms legislation as introduced in February 1967 by Senator Powers (2596) and Assemblyman Stockmeister (4679). This bill completely retains the liberty of a responsible sportsman while eliminating firearms ownership from alcoholics, individuals with criminal records, rioters, vagrants, and other elements in our society who would use firearms for other than sporting use.

To obtain a hunting license in New York State today, one must present a certificate of competency for completion of the New York State hunter safety training course. To obtain this certificate, the good character of the applicant and his knowledge of safe handling of firearms is tested and proven. Under this bill a firearm would be sold to any owner of this certificate.

The bill introduced by Senator Powers and Assemblyman Stockmeister is aimed at the misuse of firearms while guaranteeing the legitimate sportsman his unalienable rights to ownership and use of firearms.

This particular legislation was suggested by and received the general approval of the National Rifle Association, National Wild-life Federation, Isaac Walton League and the National Police Officers Association, which proves that the sportsmen are as much concerned with keeping firearms out of the hands of undesirables as they are about unnecessary restrictions to the responsible sportsman.



according to Al Justus, director of Safety Services for the local Red Cross chapter. "It was the first year since the early 1930's that water fatalities have exceeded 7,000," he said. "Since the Red Cross and other organizations became active in water safety instruction a half century ago, the drownings have declined from 10,000 a year when few people were participating to last year's 7,200 with some 100,000,000 people involved. That record is good, but it is not good enough."

Justus pointed out that about 60 percent of the people who drown do so because they are in the water involuntarily - they have fallen in by accident. "Had they been able to swim, most of them could have saved themselves", Justus declared.

# **Council Candidate** Speaks To ConCon

Andrew G. Celli, the Democratic candidate for Northwest district councilman, made pleas for fiscal home rule for Rochester and for creation of a State Department of Recreation in recent appearances before two State Constitutional committees which were holding hearings in Rochester during the last two weeks.

"Speaking as a City Council candidate and also as president of the Citizens Club of Rochester, a group of Italian-Americans", said Celli, "I urge that Rochester be given the right to make its own fiscal decisions and to control its destiny.

"Rochester is faced with a crisis. This city, like many metropolitan centers across the state is at its taxing limit. At the same time, the County of Monroe uses only 16% of its taxing power. And yet, that county government, a group which has demonstrated over and over again that they do not care about the future of the city, has control over one of Rochester's major sources of revenue. I refer here to the sales tax.

"In spite of the fact that some 65% (perhaps more) of the sales tax revenue is collected in the city, the county returns only 44% of that money to the city government. The county did in fact call for a special census in 1964 and used that census, which showed a decline in city population, to cut the amount of money which would be returned to



PURPLE MAGIC!

I returned not long ago from a brief but most satisfying trip to the Kissimmee River lakes of Florida's Osceola County. This four-day jaunt was made for just one reason: to test a new lure color. But wait'll you hear the best part — the color was purple!

Now I haven't anything against the color purple — particularly

not after this test and some earlier experiences - but if you'd have asked me two years ago to go fishing with a purple spoon, I'd have said . . . well, I don't know what I'd have said. Nothing very complimentary, I'm sure.

But it was in 1965, not too far from Ocala, Florida, that I

heard about a lot of bass being taken with a purple plastic worm. Didn't take me long to check out the rumor and brand it a fact. Those purple worms were out-performing other colors, and

several different shades of spoons, to boot.

It wasn't long afterward that I heard a similar story about the drawing power of purple. Some fishermen farther north reported that lake trout were lapping up lead-headed jigs done in a purple-blue color. These stories were verified for me by the people who make the Johnson's lures — and boy, were they ever

A PURPLE SPOON

So, as things turned out, the forged Silver Minnow I'm so fond of finally acquired an-other finish. Yep — purple! There's nothing drab about

it, however, because the color was added by means of a dye in clear lacquer. This was then baked on the tapered spoon after it got its regular bright silver finish. The result is a lively, see-through color that's just the opposite of our first reaction when we hear the word "purple."

As for the "fish-ability" of the new lure — well, it was good enough to make my Orlando brother-in-law and his know-it-all buddies holler "Uncle."

Four of us started down the Kissimmee, fishing in pairs. My partner and I used the purple spoon exclusively, in all sizes from 1/24 oz. (with fly rods) to  $1\frac{1}{8}$  oz. (with bait casting rigs). The brother-in-law and a friend worked with all sorts of lures, including the Silver Minnow with standard silver finish.

At the end of four and a half days, my partner and I had taken and released well over one hundred keeper-sized bass and bream — beating the other team's score by very nearly two to one!

One thing I should add about fishing the purple Minnow is that

it works best with a trailer: pork rind, rubber skirt, or plastic worm. Select the color that works best in your area. Also, you'll want to keep in mind a couple of tips I've mentioned before. First, get down in the weeds. The biggest bass we took, half a dozen at 6 to 8 lbs., were in the heaviest weedbeds we found.

Second, work a change-of-pace retrieve by giving the lure time to sink to the bottom after casting, then bring it in with alternate slow and fast cranking speeds





# B. Historie Newspapers Collection Started By Heart Association

The nation's youth was enlisted today in a drive to persuade parents to break the cigarette habit and parents were advised that the best way to keep their youngsters from smoking is to give up the habit themselves. The double-barrelled assault is contained in a new leaflet, "What to Tell Your Parents About Smoking" issued by the American Heart Association Inc., to help convince both youngsters and their parents that cigarette smoking is a health menace.

Mr. William P. Blackmon, President of the Genesee Valley Heart Association said that the leaflet was one of a series of efforts being undertaken to emphasize the risk factors leading to coronary heart disease.

The leaflet cites scientific studies and statistics which point to the relation between cigarette smoking and heart disease, lung and throat cancer, emphysema and chronic bronchitis. It emphasizes that smokers who quit will substantially improve their chances of avoiding premature death or disability caused by these diseases, "For children, the strongest influence has been the example of their elders. Most young people who take up smoking are copying parents who have the habit. But as smoking has increased, so has the knowledge about its effects on the human body. There is no longer doubt that smoking can seriously impair our health and shorten our lives,"

In a message to youngsters, the Heart Association points to dis-

coveries in medical research which show that cigarette smoking is responsible for thousands of deaths and serious illnesses among people who are your parents age." This it says, makes clear that the "grown-up thing to do is NOT to smoke." Breaking the cigarette habit is a matter for the whole family to work on with all members helping one another to stick by their dicision to quit smoking, the leaflet concludes,

The eight-page publication was issued in connection with special year-round programs being conducted by Heart Associations nationwide to help educate the public on ways to guard against cardiovascular diseases. The smoking phase of this "risk reduction" program began in March and continues through December, 1967. The leaslet has been endorsed by the National Interagency Council on Smoking and Health as being in accord with the council's national program objectives.



dition), X-ray, surgery or radium usually have been used. These methods, however, sometimes leave extensive scars.

The new treatment is an oint-ment containing from .5 to Dr. Amberson fluro-urocil.

Over a four-year period, in more than 100 patients receiv-ing this medication, nearly 95 percent of basal-cell cancers and an even higher percentage of solar keratoses have disappeared with little or no scarring.

Furthermore, when applied to a large area other than the obvious trouble site, the ointment leaves normal skin virtually unaffected, while early hidden tumors swell up so they

can be seen and treated.

About 18 percent of all cancers involve the skin. These skin cancers are not contagious, and cannot be "caught" from another person.

Because skin cancer can be seen and diagnosed readily it is simpler to cure than other types of cancer. Cancer of the inner organs, on the other hand, may remain undetected until it has progressed to a considerable extent.

How can you recognize skin cancer? Any skin blemish, sore, or lump which fails to heal, may bleed or looks irritated, increases in size, or changes color would be suspect. If you have a skin lesion with any of these characteristics, consult a physician without delay.

### WHAT IS LEUKOPLAKIA?

When white patches develop on the tongue cheek and gums, separated by little fissures or paths, the condition is called leukoplakia. It is generally thought to be related to smok-ing. Your physician will prob-ably advise you to give up smoking. If there is minor dis-comfort or pain of the cheek or gums associated with leukoplakia, he may recommend an anesthetic oral solution called Chloraseptic that has been found to provide temporary relief of pain involving the gums, cheeks or tongue within seconds.

Leukoplakia should be followed by your physician, since constant irritation may result

Father Carter is being feted by alumni and friends of Aquinas on the completion of 25 years at the Dewey Avenue school.



# **Medicare Tips**

Medicare beneficiaries who signed up for medical insurance protection can now obtain an information kit to help them keep a record of their doctor bills so they will know when they reach their yearly \$50 deductible, Joseph Tomaino, Rochester Social Security district manager, announced today.

The kit includes a record keeping folder and two leaflets which explain the two methods of payment for medical insurance claims, and what medical expenses count for the \$50 deductible. The folder has pockets on the inside for holding doctor bills and space to write in the date and amount of each bill so that the beneficiary will know immediately when he reaches the \$50 each year. After that, the medical insurance plan pays 80% of the reasonable charges for covered espenses for the remainder of the year.

Tomaino said that all new medicare beneficiaries will receive the kit when they sign up for medical insurance. Those who already have medical insurance coverage should write, telephone, or visit the social security office to obtain this free kit. The office is located at 107 Clinton Avenue, North, telephone

Also, people who need help in completing a medical insurance claim are urged to get in touch with the social security office, "We know that these claims -especially the first claim -- can be confusing to people", said Tomaino, "and we will be glad to help in every way possible".

# **Landfill Fires Get Attention**

The City quite properly is genuinely concerned about the recurring fires in the Emerson St. dumps and has issued a number of decrees which, if enforced, could reduce the hazards. The unbearable smoke screens and the property-destroying fly ash for years have driven property owners to distraction and they appreciate every effort to alleviate the situation.

However, the primary difficulty does not revolve around human carelessness, as the City decrees seem to infer, but rather the enemy is something known as "spontaneous com-

ustion".

If the City can do nothing about fires that originate from "spontaneous combustion", that landfill operation will have to be abandoned. It is entirely too close to human habitation to be tolerated much longer.

Councilman Stephen May who happens to be a member of the minority group in the City Council and therefore susceptible to charges of being political is quoted as taking a "wait and see" position on the effectiveness of the City's cure for the problem. Our only criticism is that Mr. May is just a bit too mild. We say we have been waiting too long now.

# That Emerson Landfill

The City has taken steps to alleviate the fire hazards in the Emerson St. land-fill and Councilman Stephen May, expressing a skeptical attitude, has called for "the best minds" to seek a better solution to "intolerable conditions".

tions".

The city program calls for a fire extinguisher on every bull-dozer working in the dumps; extra efforts by employees particularly in keeping children away from the operation; stock-piling material to help fight fires; extra caution on movement of trucks: more hosing down of the land-fill; no smoking signs; cutting through of an additional road; etc.

"The new regulations are commendable", says May, "and I am willing to see if they will work, With all the progress of modern science, however, I would hope that more effective means could be found to remedy the situation".

I therefore request that the driver education program be continued as a part of the course curriculum in the Rochester schools at least until such time that a non-profit corporation or some other organization can assume this respon-sibility."

The church received the organ as a gift from the late Mrs. Harry Beach, in memory of her husband. Mr. Beach, who died in 1935, had been a vestryman of the parish, and both were long-time, active members of the church. Their children, John and Catherine, were present at the dedication service.
