Celli Asks City To Cancel Atkins Lease

The City Council has been requested to consider immediate cancellation of the lease agreement with Atkins Waste Materials, the controversial junk yard operation at Smith and Oak Sts.

Andrew G. Celli, Democratic candidate for Northwest district councilman, states that the company has failed to demolish an old building used as a locker room and toilet and has also failed to erect a new facility.

Explain Procedure For Medicare Aid

Many older area residents fail to carry with them their Medicare card when they go for treatment at hospitals or doctors' offices, advises Joseph Tomaino, Social Security District Manager. This identification card, he added, has red, white, and blue stripes across its top and shows the person's name, claim number, and the date that protection begins under hospital or medical insurance, or both. "Failure to produce this card causes much unnecessary work and delays a patient's reimbursement for paid doctor bills."

Moreover, because numerous questions are being raised as to how doctor's bills are paid under the Medicare Program, Tomaino noted that the law provides two methods of payment. It is up to the doctor and his patient as to which method is used.

(1) The doctor may bill the patient and after the patient has paid the bill, the patient will send the receipted bill to the carrier which in the Rochester area is Blue-Shield; or
(2) The patient may assign his right to reimbursement to the doctor and the doctor will send the bill to the carrier and be reimbursed directly.

Under either method, after the \$50 deductible has been met, there will be paid 80 percent of what is determined to be the reasonable charge for the services furnished. This payment will be made to the patient if he has sent in

New York State Should Hold Preferential Presidential Primary

The influence of John Q. Public in determining the Presidential nominees is constantly increasing. Most political experts agree that if Senator John F. Kennedy had not been successful in the Democratic primaries of 1960, he would not have been the party's choice for the Presidency. In 1964 Senator Goldwater's victory over Governor Rockefeller in the California primary sewed up the Republican nomination on his behalf.

With so much importance placed on the results of these primaries, the people of New York State should have an opportunity to par-

ticipate in them. To accomplish this end, I will submit the necessary legislation to allow New York State to hold a Presidential primary. At the moment, it appears that the 1968 primaries of New Hampshire, Wisconsin, Nebraska, and Oregon may well determine the Republican candidate for the Presidency; and yet, the combined population of all these states does not equal that of New York.

It is too late to obtain the necessary legislation to permit a Presidential primary in New York for 1968, but next session I will submit this legislation so that in 1972 the people of the Empire State will play the rightful part in the nominating of men to the highest office in the world—the Presidency of the United States.

Al Sigi Center Seeking Funds

Estimated cost of constructing and equipping the Al Sigi Center for Rehabilitation Agencies is set at \$3,800,000. Federal and state grants totaling approximately \$1,600,000 have been approved, and more may be obtained. The center is under construction at South and Elmwood Aves.

Resources available to the agencies, including the value of their present properties, amount to \$200,000. The remainder needed to complete the project, a minimum of \$2,000,000, is being sought by public subscription.

Construction was undertaken in advance of the fund-raising campaign in order to obtain the substantial grants from the Federal and State governments. The contracts for construction had to be let by May 30, 1967. For this reason, the Board of Trustees of

M.C.C.R.A. went ahead with the building program, confident that the people of the community would recognize the importance of the project and contribute the amount needed to see it through to completion. The fund drive is now in progress.

Conable Proposes Government Study

Representative Barber B. Conable Jr. has introduced legislation in Congress to create a special commission to study the organization of the federal government and recommend changes that would eliminate the serious duplication and overlapping of federal programs. The Congressman said his proposal would create a new Hoover-type commission like those which suggested sweeping changes in government organization in the 1940s and '50s.
 Congressman Conable's bill would create a 14 member commission including members of Congress, the executive department, state governments and the general public. The Commission would be assisted by a strong management staff.

SWIMMING TIPS

The danger of drowning from extended breath holding under water is stressed by Al Justus, director of Safety Services of the Rochester-Monroe County Chapter, American Red Cross.

Justus said his warning was addressed to children and teenagers who compete with each other to see who can stay under water the longest. "Youngsters who play this game are simply asking for trouble -- and possible tragedy," Justus said.

"Hyperventilating -- taking several deep breaths before going

under water -- is a dangerous practice. This is what happens physiologically," he continued. "Before going under water an individual takes several deep breaths in order to build up as much oxygen in the lungs as possible. This deep breathing, called hyperventilation, does increase the oxygen but it lowers the carbon dioxide in the system."

After a period under water, because the carbon dioxide does not build up fast enough to trigger the breathing urge, the swimmer tends to stay under too long and may black out. Then, unless help is at hand to get him to the surface quickly, drowning will result. He urged that parents make these facts known to their children and instruct them not to play the "holding-the-breath" game.

The same principles apply to swimming under water for long distances, Justus said.

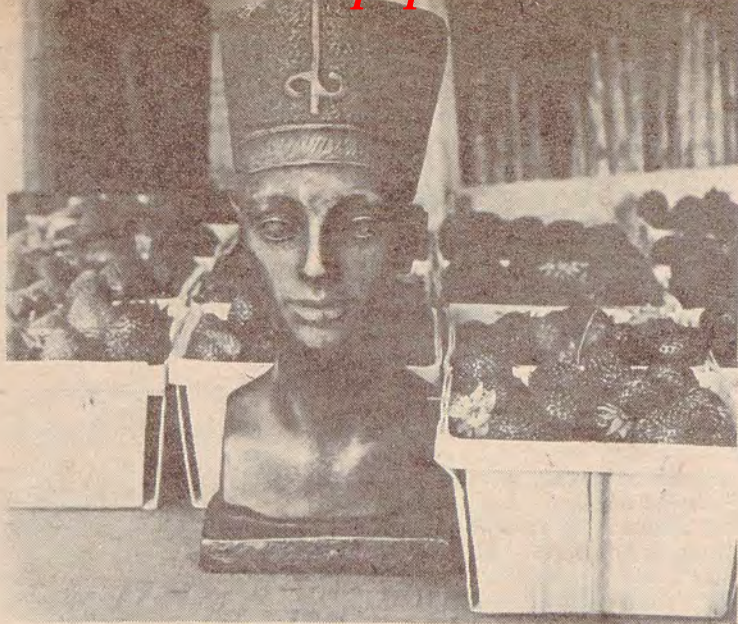

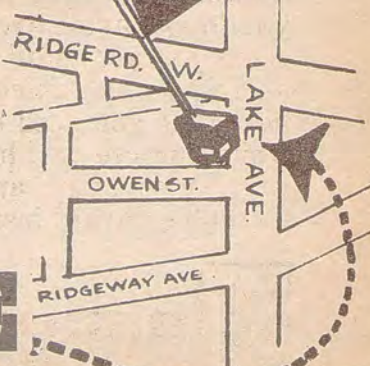

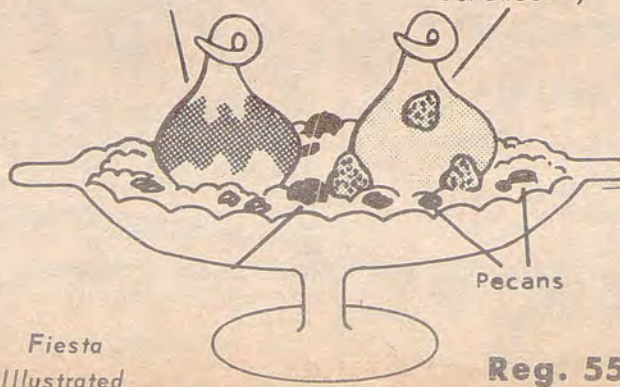

Senator Powers later confirmed this meeting on July 21, the day he toured the junkyard and personally witnessed the open burning. The Senator plans to be at the hearing.

The groups also resolved to have the city of Rochester void the lease since many of the terms in the lease have apparently not been realized by Atkins.

"Twenty-Eight" TOPICS

28th District County Legislator

During the past four weeks I have been very much involved in the dispute over the Barrington Study and its recommendations for a cross-the-board pay increases to all county employees. Though I certainly did not oppose the principal of pay raises, I found after a great deal of research that I could not in conscience support all the conclusions of the Study.

As the facts were presented in caucus, I found that the upper income group - those earning more than \$12,000 among county employees - would be receiving an unusually high pay raise as compared with the great majority of employees further down the pay scale. This was my main objection to the Barrington Study as originally presented, and it was fortified by a number of smaller errors. (The Study actually overlooked completely close to 15 county jobs.)

I supported the Study as amended by the County Legislature, and I believe that the new pay raise bill takes into account the oversights and inequalities of the original proposal. We are now providing raises for the great bulk of county employees - scaled down for those in the higher brackets - and at the same time we are saving the county some \$100,000 a year on the

salaries as originally proposed by the Barrington Study.

Another cause for concern during the past month has been the growing problem of air pollution, especially in the western end of my district. I am working with the proper authorities to alleviate the situation and have also advised officials of our displeasure with the city's neglect of the Emerson Street dump.

I want to thank all those who have contacted me regarding the airport. This is a continuing problem, and I greatly appreciate the opinions of the people in my district.

HIGH, TIGHT AND LOOSE

Just tie into a good sized fish and get set . . . not necessarily for the eating, but for a liberal supply of unsolicited advice on how to whip that thrashing lunker out on the end of the line.

For some odd reason, strangers who wouldn't ordinarily give away the leavings in the bait bucket, suddenly burst forth with shouts of encouragement or warnings, all intended to be helpful. The net result is confusion. It's about like a husband teaching his wife to drive a car.

Advice on landing fish, note the fishing authorities at Mercury outboards, seems to be more readily available than the fish themselves. And, though most of it is sound, it may or may not apply to a particular situation.

For example, the common admonition to keep your rod tip high has another school of thought that says to keep it low and to the side at right angles. Both are right. But when and where?

In one instance, it makes sense to utilize the resistance of water against the line by keeping the tip low when the fish skitters across the surface. It really makes no difference when slugging it out with a deep-running fish, and it certainly won't work when you're fighting in close quarters, with partners or brush at either side.

Aerial antics by a fish draw plenty of advice: drop the tip, raise the rod, loosen the line or tighten up. Advice is valid only when it applies to the task at hand. If the line is short and you're using a heavy plug that can be rattled loose, pick up the line during the jump. But if you have a bit of line underwater you won't be able to do anything anyway, so ease off and hope for the best.

During a fight, fish are apt to do the unexpected, like suddenly releasing a lure that wasn't hooked in the first place, or falling back on the line, sometimes snapping free or wrapping themselves up like a mummy.

Instinct and experience probably land more fish than advice, say the Mercury lads. If you really feel in need of the latter, just give and take the best you can.

The Common Cold

The "miraculous advances of modern medicine" is a phrase almost taken for granted. It is, of course, true that medicine has made tremendous strides in recent years. Yet precisely because of this great progress which has been made, it is important, from time to time, to examine those areas where little or no progress at all has been made. When we do this, we have the opportunity to contrast our medical achievements with our inadequacies.

Perhaps our most obvious and persistent failure is related to our ignorance of how to prevent or cure the most common one of mankind's maladies. So frequent in incidence is this entity that it is quite justifiably referred to as "the common cold."

From your own personal experience, you will probably agree that the usual frequency of the common cold is three to four such attacks per year. The average cold, without complications, lasts about a week.

Most people endure a cold without any interruption of their routine activities. It does not prevent them from performing their duties and obligations, but they are below par in this performance. In addition, the constant sneezing and coughing scatter droplets of mucous saturated with virus particles that often infect the innocent bystander.

Most healthy adults shake off

a cold without complications. However, infants, especially, and older people with debilitating disease are often susceptible to the complications of the cold such as bronchial pneumonia, severe infections, cardiac difficulties and chronic lung disease.

The cause of a "cold" is one of a virus group not yet identified and against which no effective agent has yet been found. It is hoped that a specific vaccine may some day be developed, but to do so requires an exact identification of the virus. The difficulty is that probably many different viruses cause the common cold. For a vaccine to be successfully produced, the causative virus must be exactly specified.

As to the actual treatment of the common cold, there is none—absolutely none. The large sums of money spent for medical care of the cold and medications to "cure" it are like water down the drain. There are many drugs which may give symptomatic relief, such as the anti-congestants, etc. They have a tendency to produce other symptoms, however, which are just as disturbing.

Barring complications, common sense is possibly the most effective resource to use against a cold. The most helpful preventive measure is probably the avoidance of individuals you see sneezing or coughing. Once you have a cold, stay warm, get adequate rest, maintain a good urinary output and drink plenty of fluids. Should your cold hang on for more than a week or so without obvious improvement, or should you have an elevated temperature or other complications, consult your personal physician.



How Long Should A Nursing Nipple Last?

A research scientist this week gave young mothers some recommendations that could save them time, money, and worry. William O. Elson, director of research at the Kendall Company's Curity laboratories, disclosed some information concerning nipples which has emerged from hospital and laboratory tests.

"While it is possible for a single set of six nursing bottles and nipples to last for the duration of the entire period in which baby needs bottle-feeding, it is highly unusual," said Elson.

"Nipples can easily wear out from sterilization which is too hot or too long. Boiling for more than three minutes makes them too soft — and baby gets his food much too quickly. Hunger is appeased long before sucking and feeding instincts are satisfied, and baby is unhappy and cries. When the rubber becomes sticky, dark, or enlarged, it should be replaced."

Elson then gave these tips to mothers:

A. Before sterilizing, clean nipple and bottle carefully. Plastic bottles which show the cap-threads on the inside are harder to clean than those nursers which are smooth on the inside.

B. To cut butter-fat left from milk, it is wise to put a pinch of salt inside the nipple, rub the sides together, and rinse well. Turning the nipple inside out makes cleaning easier.

C. Use a detergent when cleaning nipple, forcing water through the feeding and vent holes. A round tooth-pick will aid in cleaning the vent-holes.

D. Clean the inside of the ribs, if a modern ribbed nipple is used. This is easily done, and the formula can then flow, as it is designed to, up through the ribs, and baby can not bite it shut. The outside shape of this type of nipple conforms to the baby's mouth — shutting out air.

"Mothers should also be aware," said the scientist, "that there is a relationship between the tightness with which the cap of the nipple is screwed on and baby's feeding time. A loose cap permits too-rapid feeding; a tight cap will inhibit the flow and frustrate the baby's efforts to get his food."

"When testing the heat of the milk or formula, watch to see that it comes out of the nipple in rapid drops but not in a steady flow. Most of all," Elson concluded, "feed him with warmth and tenderness, so that he enjoys it, and so that you enjoy it yourself."

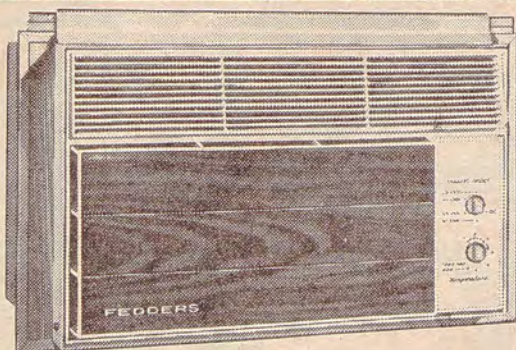

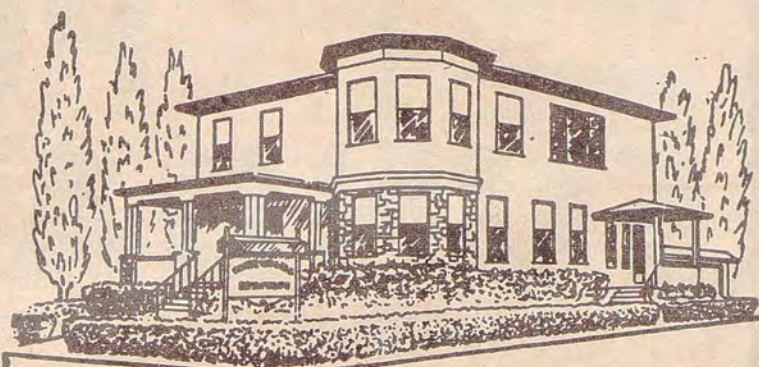

Homemade Vanilla Ice Cream

- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons corn starch
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 cups milk
- 1/3 cup light corn syrup
- 2 eggs, slightly beaten
- 1 cup light cream
- 2 teaspoons vanilla

Combine sugar, corn starch and salt in double boiler top. Blend in milk, corn syrup and eggs. Cook over boiling water, stirring constantly, until slightly thickened, about 10 minutes. Chill. Stir in light cream and vanilla. Freeze in 2-quart ice cream freezer following manufacturer's directions. Makes about 2 quarts.

Chocolate Ice Cream: Follow recipe above, adding 1/2 cup cocoa with dry ingredients, substituting heavy cream for light cream, and decreasing vanilla to 1 teaspoon.

Banana Ice Cream: Follow recipe above, substituting 1/2 cup heavy cream and 1/2 cup mashed banana for the light cream and decreasing vanilla to 1 teaspoon.

Strawberry Ice Cream: Follow recipe above, substituting 1/2 cup heavy cream for 1 cup light cream, adding 2 cups chopped strawberries (sweetened fresh or frozen, thawed) with cream, and decreasing vanilla to 1 teaspoon.

Councilman May Outlines Case For Metropolitan Setup For County

Metro services are the key to restoration of control to the grass roots, Councilman Stephen May told the Gates Lions Club in a talk last week. Excerpts from his remarks included:

"Although Americans have more know-how in the field of local government than any other people, in many ways local governments are the most ineffectively and inefficiently run segment of our federal system. We have done the poorest job in the planning and coordination of local functions and services, primarily because they have not been treated as the legal responsibility of area-wide governments even though their area-wide implications are obvious.

"It is high time that politicians and public employees recognized that over-burdened taxpayers can no longer afford the luxury of a multiplicity of small governmental jurisdictions which duplicate and compete with each other, lack the personnel and resources for effective planning, and chew up tax dollars without providing adequate services.

"We must end the unseemly political and narrow minded bickering which has impeded progress toward cooperation between the city and county on matters of metropolitan concern. We need an immediate end to the provision of services to the metropolitan area of Monroe County on a piecemeal, duplicative basis. Functions which affect the entire area should be handled on an area-wide basis, in the interest of efficiency and effectiveness of operation.

"The kind of services which eventually should be provided on a metropolitan basis in Monroe County include water supply, police and fire protection, ambulances, planning, refuse disposal, sewerage systems and sewage treatment, libraries, vital statistics, recreation, weights and measures and

probation. The Museum and War Memorial also ought to be financed on a countywide basis, rather than having the city taxpayer foot the entire bill.

"Since many aspects of these services must remain local responsibilities, it is possible to achieve effective area-wide planning and coordination without a general upheaval of the functions or loss of the home rule strengths of our system of local government.

"As long as our local governments fail to strengthen and modernize themselves in order to provide the services demanded by their constituents, the flow of power away from the grass roots to Albany and Washington will continue at an accelerating rate. We can begin to reverse that trend and restore control over local affairs to the grass roots by city-county cooperation on matters of metropolitan concern."

Recreational Use For 9 Backus?

The large building at 9 Backus St. which is to be vacated on Sept. 1 by R.I.T. will be used for recreational purposes if Andrew G. Celli has his way.

Celli, who is running for Northwest District Councilman, told Eighth Ward Democrats at their meeting on Aug. 1 that he intends to "vigorously pursue" this and other recreational plans for this area. It is his understanding, he says, that the Cumming report provides that the Backus property be part of the city's recreational facilities including skating rink, skating shelters, parking facilities, baseball diamonds and other uses.

"Aqua Festival" Here Saturday

Rochester's annual water show will take place in Genesee Valley Park the evening of Aug. 12. At 6:45 p.m., a squadron of police boats with sirens wailing and lights flashing will usher in the fifth annual Genesee Aqua Festival.

Sponsored by the city's Bureau of Recreation, in conjunction with the Rochester Jaycees, the event starts with a water parade consisting of gaily decorated canoes and power boats, water skiing demonstrations and hydro-boat exhibitions. The climax will be a fireworks display presented from the decks of floating barges. This year the Festival is expected to attract even more than the 80,000 people who viewed last year's spectacle, described by Mayor Frank T. Lamb as "the most exciting show in the city's calendar of events."

The idea of a water carnival extends far back in Rochester's history. In 1906, some 50,000 people gathered on the banks of the river, lined with Japanese lanterns, to watch a floating parade of lantern-lit canoes. In following years the carnivals attracted so much attention that trolley cars were hard pressed to accommodate the thousands who wished to view the colorful pageant. For years, the people of Rochester were entertained and thrilled by the float

parades. Although suspended during the war years, the water carnival flourished again in 1922 and before its demise in 1924, throngs estimated at 150,000 lined the banks of the park.

The theme of the 1967 Aqua Festival will be, "The Wonderful World of Recreation".

**Powers Attacks Proposal
For Lottery Sales
In Theatres**

I have just received a letter from Harry Brandt, president of the Independent Theatre Owners Association, Inc., asking my support for proposed legislation to allow lottery tickets to be sold at the movies. This is outrageous!
Mr. Brandt informed me that he received a communication from Tax Commissioner Joseph H. Murphy in which Commissioner Murphy expressed the view that motion picture theatres would be ideal outlets for lottery sales. At this time I am sending a letter not only to Mr. Brandt, but to Commissioner Joseph H. Murphy, Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller, Senator Earl Brydges and Speaker Anthony Travia opposing any such ventures.

lottery sales in 1968 to new levels in the interest of education and state revenue needs". I don't know what Mr. Brandt means by showmanship, but obviously something more than simple availability of tickets is envisioned.

Mr. Brandt said in part, "Lottery ticket sales are consistent with our entertainment function. Motion picture theatres, with few exceptions, are open seven days a week and for longer hours than the banks. We can also put our screens to good use in promoting the necessary information to spur lottery ticket sales. The motion picture theatres have already proven their ability in raising funds for public purposes. During World War II, motion picture theatres sold hundreds of millions of dollars worth of United States War Bonds."

I readily admit that the theatre did an excellent job in selling bonds which was a laudable and beneficial endeavor, but I see no similarity to the purchase of a war bond and the buying of a lottery ticket. The purchase of a war bond provided the necessary money to protect our country from the axis powers while giving financial security to the buyer. Such a claim cannot be made for the lottery.

Moreover, I was also disturbed when Mr. Brandt wrote, "We (Independent Theatre Owners Association, Inc.) would then put the showmanship of the motion picture theatre owners to work to spark

Electricity Rates To Be Reduced

It was made possible by new efficiencies developed by the company.

The reduction will bring to \$1,750,000 the annual amount of RG&E electric rate cuts in less than three years, based on 1967 expected revenues.

The rate cut will benefit those using more than 300 kilowatt hours a month, nearly half of the residential customers, Drake said. Those using less than 300 kilowatt hours were the main beneficiaries of another voluntary \$740,000 rate reduction made Dec. 28, 1964.

"These voluntary rate reductions are in continuation of RG&E's tradition of quality service at the lowest possible price," he said. "The reduced rates will accelerate the use of electricity, and quantity sales constitute the keystone of cost reduction.

"The energy we sell -- gas and steam as well as electricity -- are just about the only essentials in our lives that have become less and less expensive, in terms of constant dollars, while other prices have been going up and up. This means that, in spite of spiraling costs of operation, the productivity of our system has outrun inflation.

"We aim to keep it that way, and to pass on to our customers the new fruits of technological efficiencies as we develop them".

The households getting the greatest benefit -- reductions of 7 to 8.7 percent -- use 450 to 1,000 kilowatt hours per month. Those using 500 are the biggest gainers on a percentage basis.

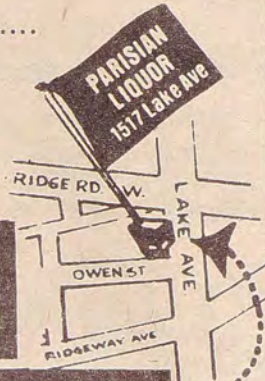

Presbyterians Get Temporary Home In Catholic School During Rebuilding

The first step in the building of a new edifice for Christ Presbyterian Church, demolition of the old building at Fulton and Locust, is scheduled to start on Sept. 1. Men of the congregation have been called on to assist in moving the church offices to an empty store at Dewey and Locust and the church belongings into storage at the same place.

Sunday, Aug. 27, is moving day.

The church services for the next year will be transferred to the school building of St. Anthony's Church in Costar St. Sunday worship will be in the school auditorium and church school classes will be held in the classrooms.

A big inventory of serviceable items which will not be useable in the new church are to be offered to the public at a sale which will be held Saturday of this week, from 12 noon to 9 p.m. under supervision of Ralph Williams (who may be reached at 254-0567). Oak tables, blackboards, coat racks, sideboards, chairs, pews and pew cushions, sinks, gas incinerator and many other things are to be sold. Each will be marked with a suggested price.

The temporary office at Dewey and Locust will provide space for the pastors, secretary, area ministry and one large meeting room. The storage space will be in the basement and garage.

Supervising the moving are Mrs. Mildred Sabin and Mrs. Joan Botsford and recruiting the workers to help is Mrs. Glen Irish (who may be reached at 254-7287). Rev. Robert Booher is senior pastor of the church.

The new church is scheduled for completion within a year. It will be a one story structure with a sanctuary seating 120, with provision for expansion to 150 on special occasions. The new building will occupy only part of the plot of land at Fulton and Locust, leaving room for automobile parking. It is planned to utilize the cut stone from the present building for exterior decoration of the new church.

Celli Advocates Cut In Taxes

Democrats of the First Ward heard from three of their candidates last Thursday at a meeting of their organization. They were Andrew G. Celli, running for councilman, Raymond Margrett for county legislator and Ralph Annucci for constable.

Celli stressed his plea for a 50 per cent easing of taxes for home owner senior citizens with incomes of \$3500 or less. "We want to keep these good people who have shouldered tax burdens for many years in our neighborhood", said Celli. "I have asked City Manager Scher to make a complete investigation of the facts upon which an ordinance may be based and report to the City Council at its next meeting. I am sure that an ordinance previously introduced by Councilman Henry Gillette on this subject contains the appropriate provisions as called for under State Law. With the rising cost of living to the older residents of our district, it has become apparent that the plight of our senior citizens must in some way be alleviated."

Margrett, in his talk, also endorsed the tax easing proposal and said that he felt the City Council should act on it immediately. He is a former supervisor seeking the 28th District seat in the county legislature.

Constable Annucci who is running for re-election, gave a short talk on the functions of the Port Authority of which he is a member.

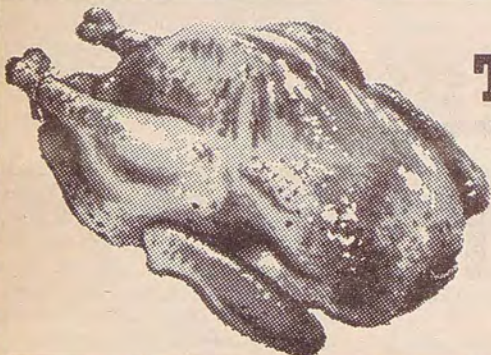

Labor Day Is D-Day For Lawns

Late August or early September is the ideal time to plant new lawns or renovate old ones in the Rochester area, according to Monroe County Cooperative Extension.

Kirkwood E. Personius, local Extension Agent specializing in turf, points out that fall seedings are better than spring seedings because they have a maximum good growing weather before crabgrass and other summer lawn problems appear. "Even late fall seedings made at any time before the soil freezes are a better risk than spring seedings", Personius says.

Therefore, he urges, if you plan to renovate or plant a new lawn, now is the time to get started so you'll be ready to seed by Labor Day. By starting work now, a good seedbed can be prepared, allowed to settle for easier grading and some weeds destroyed.

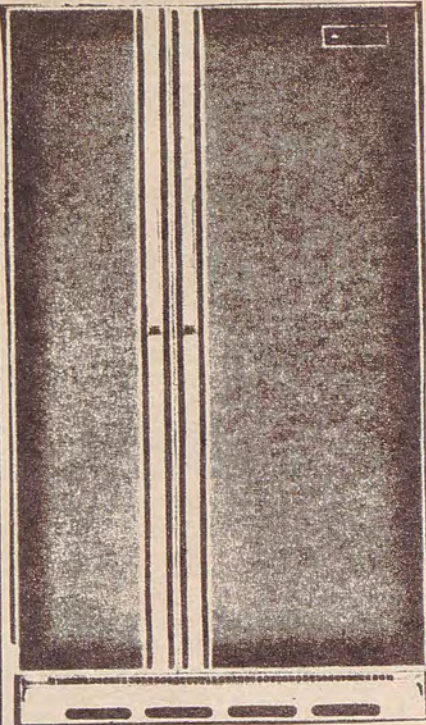

**Powers to Resubmit
Medicaid Cuts**

Developments over the last two weeks make it mandatory for New York State to modify its Medicaid Program. The liberal coverage must be reduced, I noted during the last session of the Legislature that Medicaid costs were getting out of hand and submitted a bill to substantially increase the deductibility factor (the deductibility factor is the amount of money the individual or his personal health insurance company must pay before receiving state aid.)

Over the past two weeks the House Ways and Means Committee approved an omnibus welfare bill which makes substantial cutbacks in Federal obligations under the Medicaid program -- under existing law the total Federal Medicaid outlay would rise by 1972 to \$3.1 billion. Should this new bill become law, Federal contribution would be cut to a cost of \$1.6 billion. New York is already bearing the cost -- with Federal aid -- far in excess of original predictions.

Without Federal aid, the cost to New Yorkers would be astronomical.

Governor Rockefeller on Friday, Aug. 5, 1967 indicated that he would recommend an increase in state taxes next year, and one of the reasons for additional revenue is the increased cost for Medicaid, even with the present high level of Federal aid.

No public official enjoys voting for tax increases. However, when they are necessary they must be put into effect, but I will not support a tax increase unless the Governor and my legislative colleagues agree to restrict the Medicaid program. With our immediate and pressing needs in the field of education, crime control and aid to our truly impoverished, massive state aid for people capable of purchasing their own health insurance is a luxury the taxpayers cannot afford.

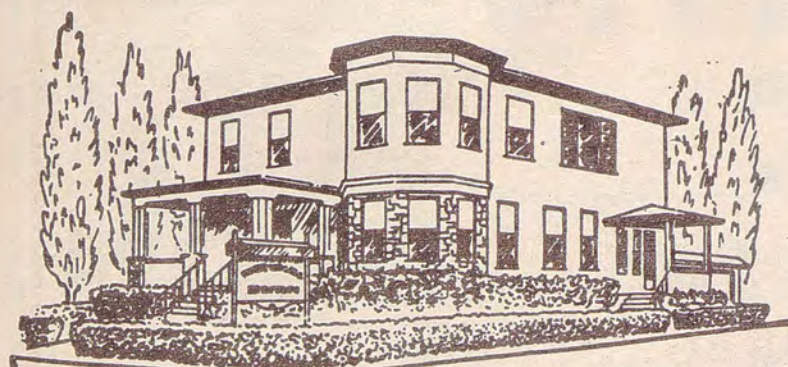

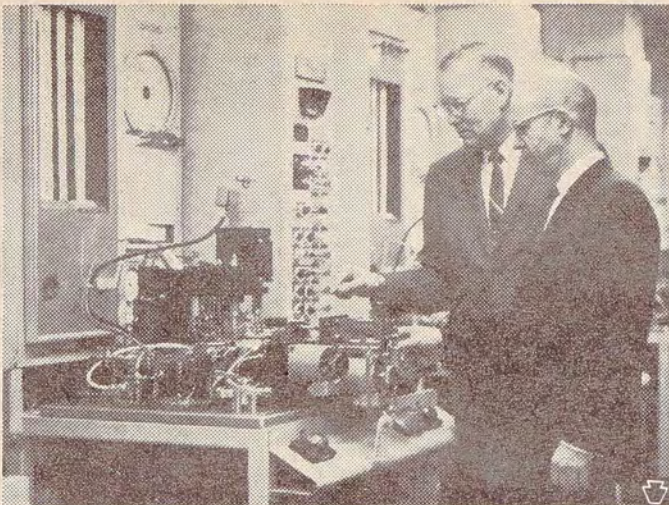

Carburetor Test For Exhaust Emission

ROCHESTER, NEW YORK — Another significant step in the automotive industry's program for exhaust emission control has been taken by General Motors' Rochester Products Division.

An \$8-million test facility for checking carburetors for exhaust emission to required specifications is now in operation in Rochester.

Philip B. Zeigler, General Manager of Rochester Products, stated that the facility, employing the largest process computer in use by the industry, will enable technicians to test carburetors on the production line to accuracies obtainable formerly only under the most precise experimental laboratory conditions.

"Although we have long been in the forefront of carburetor development and testing, this new system is a progressive step in providing cars that meet today's more exacting exhaust emission standards."

The test equipment is housed in a specially constructed 420 x 50 foot chamber. Twelve-inch-thick walls of reinforced concrete are used to withstand the normal daily changes in atmospheric pressure, temperature and humidity.

These factors are now controlled precisely to eliminate

the variables which have made exact measurement of air-fuel ratios in carburetors difficult.

Ninety-seven test stands are located in the room. The stands were designed by Rochester Products engineers in cooperation with the General Motors Engineering Staff, GM Research Laboratories, GM Manufacturing Development in Warren, Michigan, and Chevrolet in Bay City, Michigan.

The test stands check carburetors to evaluate the air-fuel ratio at engine operating modes from idle to wide-open throttle.

A unique fuel blending system controls temperature, specific gravity and viscosity of the test fuel.

The computer facility will adjust the carburetor, read process variables, make limit checks on good-or-reject basis, provide an alarm system in event of any test operation failure, provide quality reports, store data, and calculate the level of production.

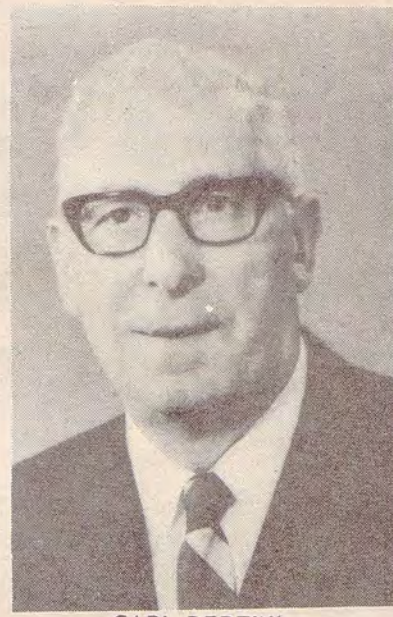

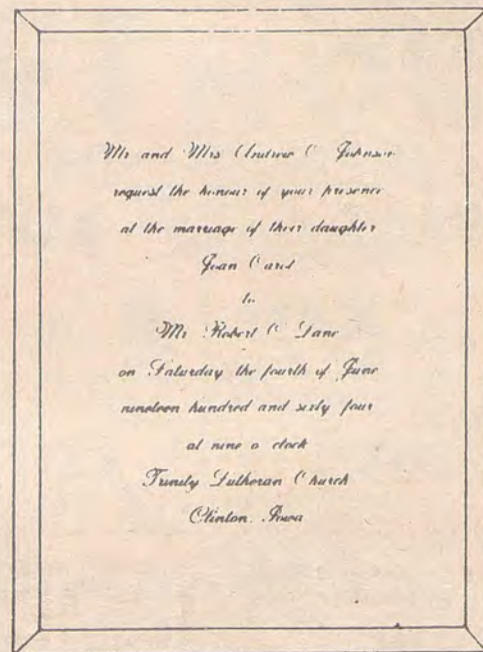

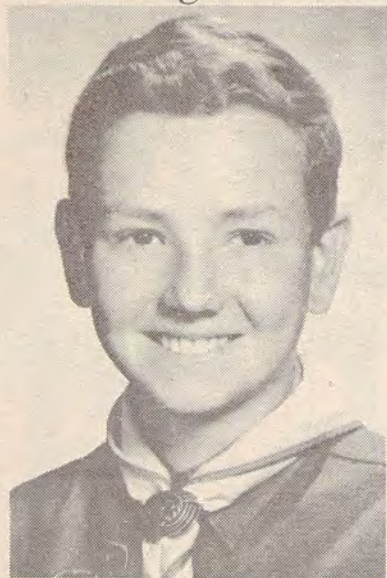

Urges Caution on Junkyard Ordinances

Councilman Stephen May said today that city residents and neighborhood associations "should be on their guard, lest the city administration's junk yard proposition turn out to be a Trojan horse". He hinted that City Hall was misleading the public by overselling the virtues of the proposed ordinances in order to win speedy approval of deficient legislation.

May indicated there was need for extensive revision of the proposals, such as in inclusion of specific rat control programs for each junkyard and a requirement that all junk yards either be entirely enclosed except for loading and unloading areas or be moved to heavy industrial sections. He said final conclusions on the ordinances must await consultation with neighborhood associations and interested residents.

While the proposed ordinances hold out some hope for strengthening controls against abuses and protecting neighborhood interests, many of the provisions about which City Hall talks most are simply repeats of what is presently on

the statute books, May observed. "The big questions", he pointed out, "are whether the proposed new rules provide sufficient protection for city residents and whether they will be full and firmly enforced".

May pointed out the "belated" offer of the city administration to meet with neighborhood associations about junk yards came only after vigorous Republican protests in the City Council. "It is certainly a strange way to conduct the public's business when city officials consult with junk yard operators in drafting ordinances and only offer to meet with affected neighborhood groups after the ordinances have been drafted, introduced and been the subject of a public hearing".

He termed the handling of the ordinances and the neighborhood associations "heavy handed" and said "such tactics are typical of the arrogant attitude of the present city administration".

The public should be on notice, May said, that several of the provisions of the new ordinances are already part of local laws. These include the requirement for 8-foot fences and that junk yards must be located over 500 feet from residential areas and 200 feet from business areas. May pointed out that the new ordinance provides that junk yards can be located not less than 100 feet from an M-L district, while present law requires 200 feet. "That's hardly progress" he observed.

May also questioned the logic of permitting 20 foot storage piles while only requiring 8-foot fences.

"These ordinances will be worth less," May concluded, "unless they are better enforced than are the present laws. I have yet to hear by what means City Hall intends to insure that improved enforcement will accompany these new ordinances".

**Next S.S. Checks
Due On Saturday**

Over 23 million Social Security beneficiaries who normally find their monthly checks in their post box on the third of every month will no longer have to wait until the next day when the third falls on a holiday or Sunday.

Commissioner of Social Security Robert M. Ball, has announced that starting with the upcoming Labor Day weekend, Social Security checks will be dated in advance and delivered to the post office early when the third falls on a Sunday as it does in September of this year, or on a holiday.

"Most beneficiaries," he said, "will receive their Social Security benefit payments for the month of August by Saturday, Sept. 2, rather than Tuesday, Sept. 5, as they would have under the old procedure".

Social Security checks are issued on the third of the month under an arrangement to stagger the issuance of monthly checks from various Federal agencies, so that post offices, the Treasury, and banks will not be overburdened at any one time of the month.

Explaining the reason for the change, Ball said, "Since these monthly checks are the only source of income for many beneficiaries, even a few days' delay can be serious, and this new procedure will eliminate any possible delay".

The new procedure will be used for the second time in December when the third falls on a Sunday.

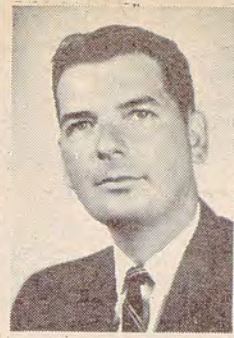

Why Rising Taxes?

Last week I noted that increased Medicaid costs among other government activity have caused Governor Rockefeller to say he may ask for more taxes next year. In light of the high 1965 increases in sales tax, cigarette tax and automobile license tax, this is certainly not a

popular proposal, and to add to the dismal picture, present taxes are not producing their proposed revenue. In fact, State Comptroller Levitt noted that tax collection for the first four months of this fiscal year rose less than 1% over last year -- the Governor had assumed an 8% increase from existing tax sources.

Studies by various Federal Bureaus indicate that the migration of white and negro poor from rural areas -- largely from the south -- saddled New York with a critical welfare burden. Let me add here that the disadvantaged, aside from needing direct welfare aid, increase costs in other areas, for example, in education because the environment restricts potential and lowers the motivation for learning. Various labor saving devices in agriculture and allied fields will probably result in a continued migration. Mayor Lindsey of New York has said that the severe economic and social pressures in rural areas will result in a continuation of a large flow of migrants to the urban areas.

The New York Times extracted some revealing figures about our new migrants found in a report by the United States Public Health Services National Center for Health Statistics:

1. 34.1% of nonwhites in the 1962 farm population living in families of two to seven or more persons, had a total family income of less than \$1000 a year. The corresponding figure for whites was 8.7%.
2. 48.2% of the nonwhites had family incomes of under \$3000 a year. 15.7% of the whites fell in this category.
3. 11% of the nonwhites had annual family incomes of \$7000 and over. 36% of the whites fell in this category.
4. 3.6% of the nonwhite families had income over \$10,000 a year. 15.3% of the whites fell in this category.

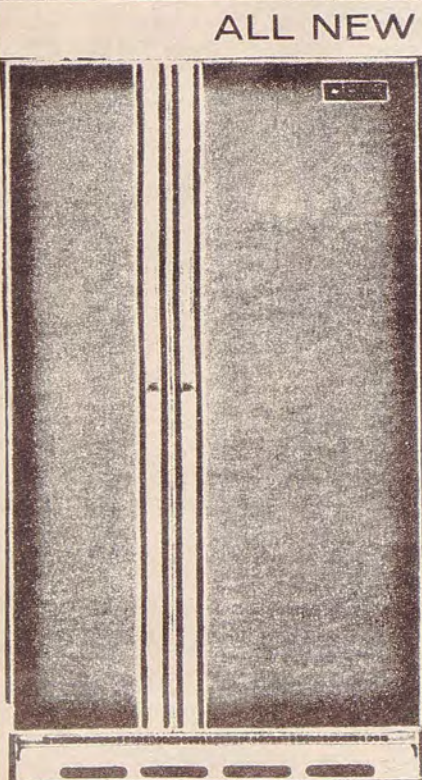

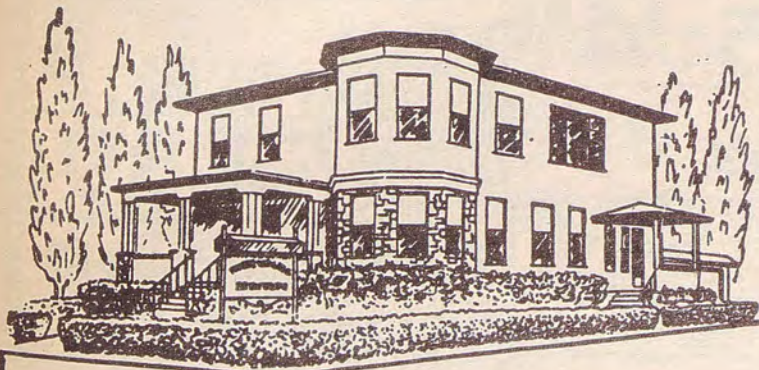

**TB Still Taking
Its Annual Toll**

TB in the United States a dead
letter? If so, it's the livest dead
letter you ever saw. The annual
number of new cases reported
still approaches 50,000, with 8,000
deaths.

Adults are now the chief victims
of tuberculosis, but a considerable
number of children still do get
the disease each year. When TB
strikes an infant or a young child
it often develops very rapidly and
becomes a serious threat to life.
Vigilance, in other words, is the
watchword for parents and ped-
iatricians.

Doctors recommend a tuberculin
test for every infant by the age
of one. If TB infection is found
drug treatment is usually effective
in preventing active disease or
in curing it if it has already
developed. If the test proves neg-
ative, it should be repeated every
six months until the age of three.
From then on, the tuberculin test
should form part of an annual
medical checkup.

A positive TB test should be
followed promptly by a chest
x-ray to find out whether there
is active disease. Because most
infections in children are acquired
from adults, the parents and other
adult associates of every infected
child should be tuberculin tested
and, if necessary, x-rayed and
treated.

All persons who regularly come
in close contact with children, such
as teachers and other school per-
sonnel, baby sitters, and child
nurses, should be tuberculin tested
annually to find out whether they
have TB infection. These measures
are recommended by the U. S.
Public Health Service and the Mon-
roe County Tuberculosis and Respi-
ratory Disease Chapter of the
Health Association of Rochester
and Monroe County, your local
Christmas Seal organization. If
the infection of children with the
TB germ can be prevented, a long
step will have been accomplished
toward abolishing the disease.

Constitutional Convention

During my latest visit to the
Constitutional Convention in Al-
bany, I have noticed an increased
pace in action. I strongly believe
that this convention will be com-
pleted this year and you the voter
will have an opportunity to make
your judgement this November. If
you are to vote on the proposed
Constitution this November, the
Convention must finish its work by
Sept. 26, 1967

Thus far it appears that a number
of major changes have either al-
ready been approved by or will be
shortly approved by the Conven-
tion:

1. A provision making it easier
for taxpayers and citizens to sue
the state.
2. Repeal of Article XI, Section
3 of the present Constitution known
as the "Blaine Amendment" which
prohibits financial aid to schools
operated by religious groups.
3. A recommendation that the
State Courts System be revised and
its cost assumed by the state.
4. Increased powers for local
government to levy taxes and raise
debts.
5. In some form, transfer the
obligation from local government to
state government to "foot" the
bill on welfare programs.

As you may know, the full con-
vention has already voted 132 to
49 for repeal of the Blaine Amend-
ment. However, the big debate at
present seems to revolve around
the question should the Constitu-

tion be presented as a whole where
the voter will either vote yes or no
on the package, or should such
issues as the Blaine Amendment
be voted on separately.

The time is growing short for

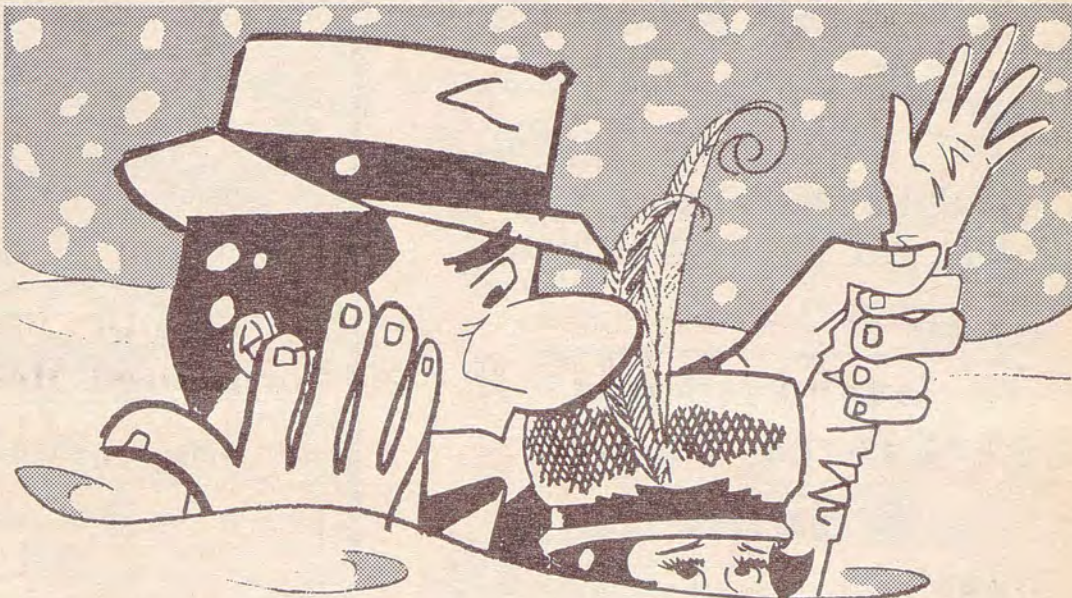

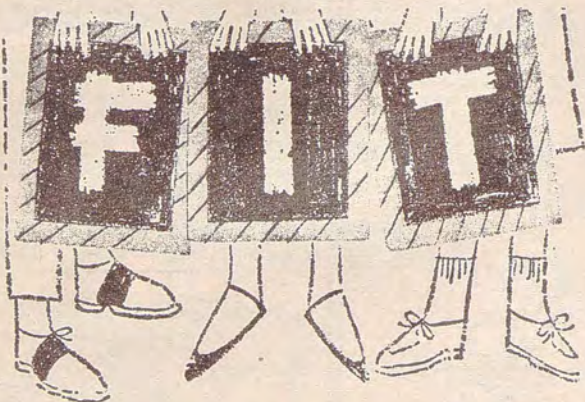

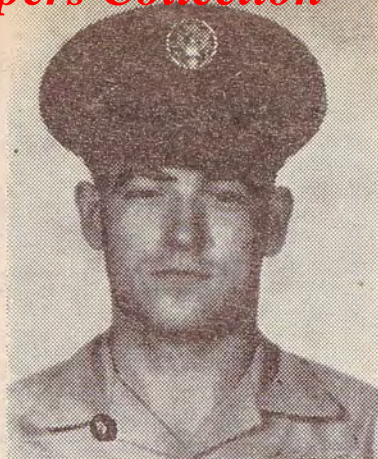

\$47,243 a month in 1957 to \$442,843 a month in 1967. The average amount of monthly benefits today is \$98 for a disabled worker; \$52 for a disabled child; and \$215 for a disabled worker, his wife, and one or more children."

Unlike retirement benefits and medicare, disability can be paid at any age under 65 as long as the worker has worked long enough under Social Security to be insured. Generally, he is insured if he has credit for 5 years of work in the 10-year period preceding his disability.

At the present time, 56 million workers and their wives and child-

ren -- or 87 percent of the Nation's population under 65 -- are protected against loss of income should the wage earner become disabled.

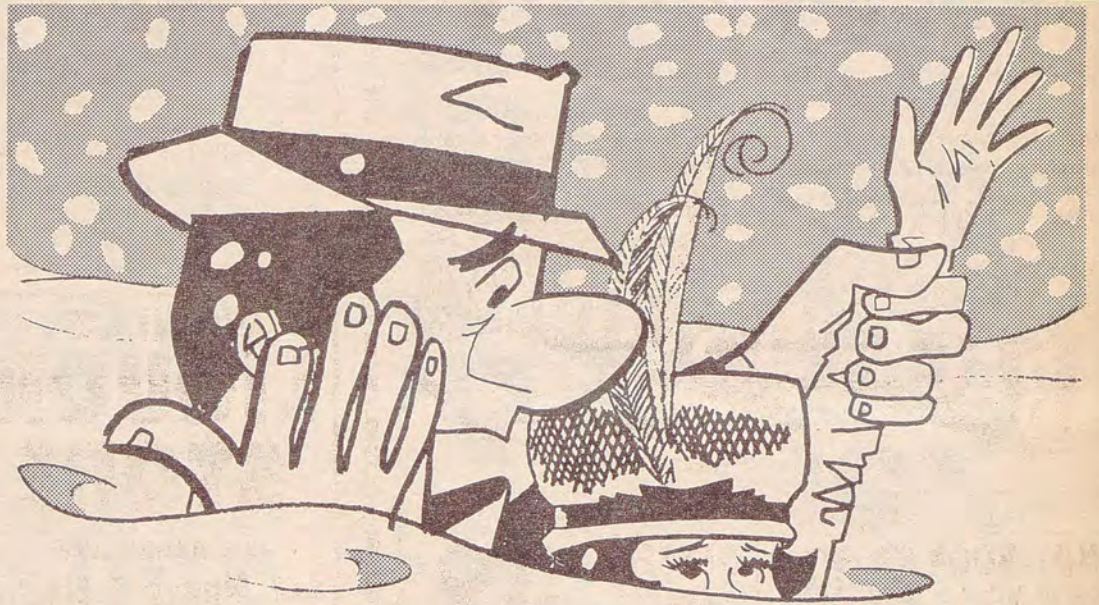

Your weekly publications are on the mailing lists and feel appropriately complimented. However, in the space at our disposal—quite limited as compared to the dailies for instance—we don't have room for a tenth of the releases (some of them are two and three pages long).

We can't print one man's or one party's releases without giving comparable space to the opposition. It's just about impossible to boil the stuff down and we have no illusions about our infallibility in deciding who is right and who is wrong.

So we hope the candidates will not be too upset if we insist that their releases be referred to our advertising department.

Then when the building looked presentable once again, he called in the structural engineers to find out if it was as good as it looked. The engineers decreed that the building was sound -- that it could hold 125 pounds per square foot load -- so Corsetti was on his way to building Empire Mall.

The Rochester area's third covered mall shopping plaza is done in turn-of-the-century motif with chandeliers and muraled walls lining the 200 by 16 foot mall onto which ten stores open their doors.

Measle Vaccination Urged By Doctor

Dr. Wendell R. Ames, director of the Monroe County Department of Health, urges more parents to take advantage of free measles vaccine for the protection of their children.

"We have had an exceptionally good measles record in Monroe County in the past two years," Dr. Ames said. "But this should not lead us into feeling complacent."

"To preserve our good record, every newborn infant should be immunized against measles when he is about one year old. And all children over this age who have not had measles, should be immunized now."

The county health director explained that the Monroe County Health Department, through a co-operative program with the New York State Health Department, makes available free measles vaccine to private physicians. In addition, the County Health Department provides free measles vaccine immunizations at its well baby, pre-school, school and inner-city health clinics.

Since the program began two years ago, the County Health Department has distributed more than 27,000 doses of vaccine and immunized more than 10,000 children at its clinics. In addition, more than 1,000 other youngsters here were immunized four years ago when the County Health Department, together with four other metropolitan health bureaus in the country, carried out field trials that proved the effectiveness and safety of measles vaccine.

Dr. Ames said the county measles immunization program is patterned on recommendations of the U.S. Public Health Service. It is designed as a continuing effort aimed at immunizing each new group of young children born into the community.

The program, Dr. Ames said, has been an important factor in the sharp reduction in measles over the last two years. Only two cases were reported in Monroe County in 1965, and none were reported in 1966. In the five years prior to the program, there was an annual average of 900 cases, with as many as 1,700 cases occurring in a peak year.

However, Dr. Ames noted that so far this year there have been 23 cases of measles reported in Monroe County. He continued: "Measles seems to be a cyclic disease, with peak years occurring every three or four years. On the basis of past experience, it is likely that the disease will be more prevalent during the coming year. Thus, it is important for young children to be immunized. If they are not protected, an outbreak could spread rapidly."

Dr. Ames pointed out that measles sometimes may lead to serious complications, including bronchopneumonia, middle ear infection, and encephalitis or "sleeping sickness." He said encephalitis follows measles in approximately one of every 1,000 cases, often causing permanent brain damage and subsequent mental retardation. An average of one death occurs in every 10,000 measles cases, he added.

"It is particularly important for children in high risk groups to be immunized against measles," Dr. Ames said. "These groups include children with chronic illnesses, such as heart disease, cystic fibrosis, and chronic pulmonary disease."

For residents wishing to know more about the disease or vaccine, free brochures are available through the Monroe County Health Department's Office of Health Education.

Seek Assistance To Find Housing

A request for help in seeking homes in this area for non-white families has been issued by the Urban League of Rochester. The league has requested publication of the following bulletin:

"The Urban League of Rochester is undertaking a project of 'Operation Equality' where all persons can purchase or rent housing based only on their ability to pay. A major goal is to locate homes for non-whites in areas outside the ghetto.

"Organizations and groups throughout the city interested and concerned in housing have been asked to cooperate. The project simply asks help to locate any home or apartment, outside the ghetto area that is surely available for purchase or rental by a non-white. It is most important that the unit be genuinely open to a non-white, for it is frustrating to think a place available only to find out otherwise. Quite often the seeker is one who has been convinced with great difficulty by the Urban League that housing is available outside the ghetto. If such a person were rebuffed, the experience could lead to an absolute sense of defeat.

"Will you help to locate a home or apartment that is definitely available to a non-white. The critical needs are for two to four bedroom houses and apartments. Houses that sell for under \$17,000 within the city are a priority need.

"If you know of a house or apartment meeting the needs, will you please call the secretary at Dewey Avenue Presbyterian Church, Mrs. Penelope Ruppert 458-1533. Information on price, number of rooms, address and whom to contact will be most helpful. The value of the service you so render can be immeasurable."

The trucks are apparently headed for the West Side landfill and "the resultant noise and vibrations have disturbed the peace and quiet of those along this route and made their lives quite uncomfortable", wrote May.

May pointed out that until recent years there was a City policy that kept the heavy trucks off Glide St. He requested an explanation for the change in policy and also asked for a study of possible alternate routes.

POLICE PROTECTION



As I tour the campaign trail, I am more and more convinced that police protection is uppermost in the minds of our citizenry today.

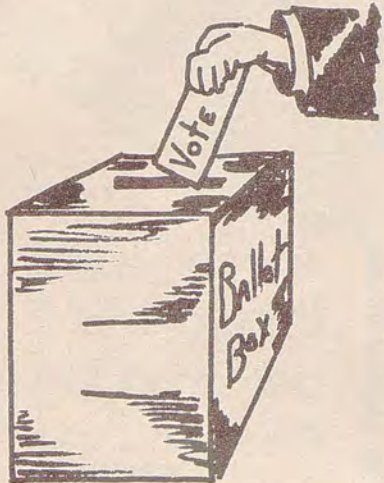

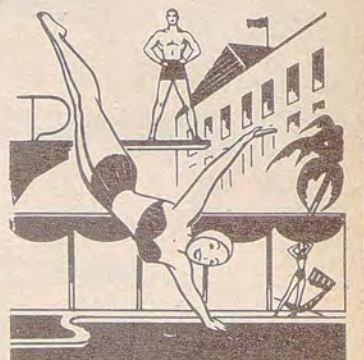

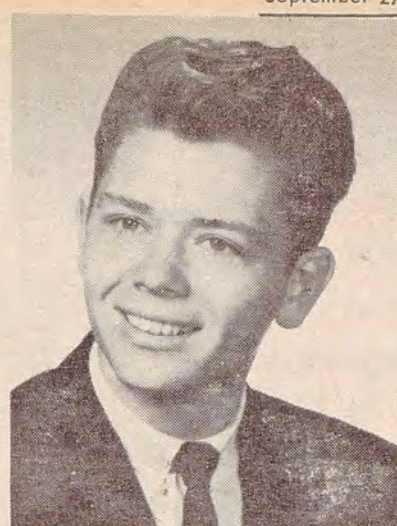

"Twenty-Eight" TOPICS

 28th District County Legislator



During the coming weeks I plan to discuss a number of county-wide topics - subjects of special interest to residents of the 28th District because they involve the use of tax money, and ways in which the tax burden can be shared more equitably by all the people of the county.

One firm step in this direction was the recent agreement on county financing of central services of the Rochester Public Library. This action, which had my wholehearted support, is expected to save city taxpayers close to \$800,000. Since recent survey show that 40 percent of the users of Rundel Memorial Library are town residents, it is only fair that the annual cost of this valuable service be shared throughout the county.

Another important legislative action of recent weeks was the approval of an immediate expansion in airport parking facilities. Whatever the future of the airport, no one can argue that it doesn't need more parking spaces right now! Still another service to the people of the entire county is the long-overdue establishment of branch license offices in suburban communities. This not only is a service to the county residents, but also helps alleviate the long waiting lines which had become so customary at the main license bureau.

Turning to matters of our 28th District for a moment, I want to repeat that I am doing everything possible to resolve the problem of air pollution at the western end of my district. I first mentioned the smoke nuisance in the Lakeview Park area in my column of July 26th, and since that time I have met with Ernest Brundage of the city's Smoke Abatement Division in an effort to have some action taken to improve the situation. I hope that action will be coming very shortly, and that any code violators will be persuaded to cease their current practices.

Sergeant Culhane Dies

Funeral services were held last week for Sgt. Gerard A. Culhane, 42, who died Sept. 12 of a heart attack in a camp near Saigon. He was the son of Michael Culhane of Lapham St. who was superintendent of the paper division at Kodak Park. Newly naturalized citizens no longer need proof of literacy, all that is required is proof of citizenship.

Registration dates are Saturday October 7, 10:00 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. and Monday October 9, 3:30 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. In addition to our regular evening hours (7:30 to 10:00), our Lyell Avenue headquarters will be open during registration hours. If in doubt as to the location of your place of registration please come in. We have comprehensive maps and charts available and can immediately indicate the location of your proper polling place. If you have a rela-

tive in military service you should take steps to obtain a military ballot. Stop in if you expect to be away on Election Day and need information on absentee voting. 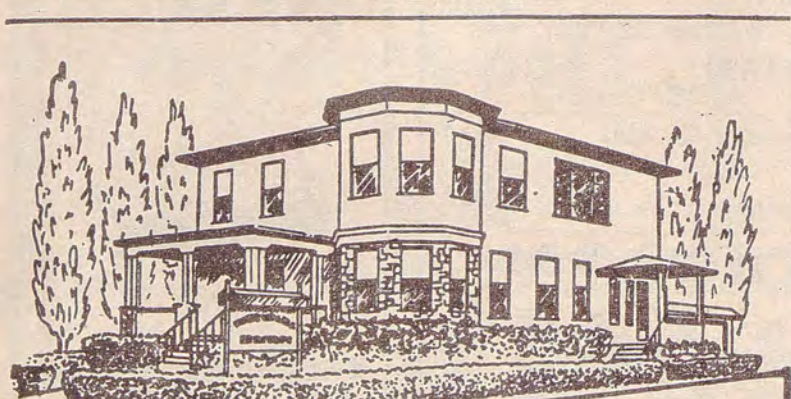


