City Drops Plan To Make Jay and Maple One-Way

The proposal to make Maple and Jays Sts. one way has been definitely dropped in deference to wishes of the neighborhood residents. Word to this effect was contained in a letter from Councilman William Malley to Frank A. Scarfone, chairman of the Charles House Neighborhood Council.

"We appreciate the effort your organization put into studying the proposal", wrote Malley, "The posts which were installed on Jay and Maple Sts. will be put to other uses. Parking regulations, stop and street name signs have already been installed on some of those posts; and we intend to make use of the others in a similar manner.

"Our Acting Director of Engineering, Alexander Morris, is studying other possible means of resolving traffic problems in your area and will be in touch with you as soon as those proposals are ready for discussion".

The Neighborhood Council had held a meeting previously between representatives of ACTION, DRIVE, FRIEND and UNITE with Malley, Morris and Councilmen

Andrew Celli and Stephen May. Area business men also were in attendance. The proposal to make Maple and Jay one-way was discussed at that time and the business men and neighborhood group representatives indicated that the proposal was not desirable. Subsequent meetings of the local people established a unanimous opposition and letters were sent to City Manager Seymour Scher as well as to Morris and the city councilmen.

Mr. Scarfone stated that "the common goal of the neighborhood groups, business men, clergy and all concerned is to preserve the stability that still remains and to support programs that will stimulate a positive attitude in our area".

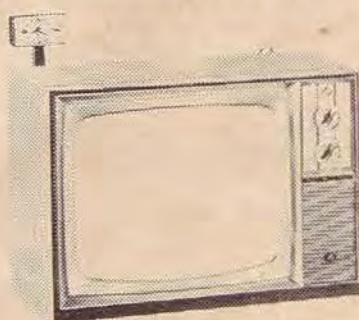



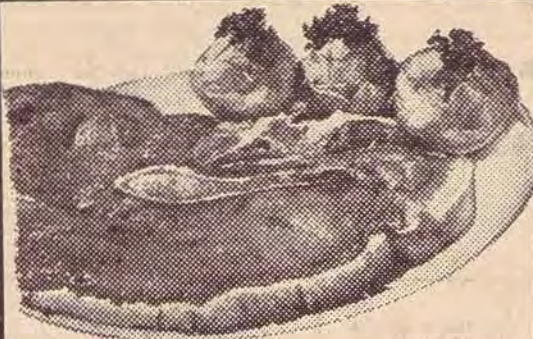

DEAR MRS. DP: West's Greenhouses on Portland Ave. has the spider plant you are looking for. It will cost about a dollar. Alice.

"Resolved, that I will start 1969 with a physical checkup, which may enable me to reduce my risk of heart attack".

This New Year's resolution was proposed by the Genesee Valley Heart Association for adoption by all adults - especially men.

The association pointed out that doctors - now more so than ever before - are equipped to identify coronary prone individuals, for whom a regimen of risk reduction is vital. Others, during the course of an examination by their physician, may acquire valuable information regarding what can be done to improve their chances of avoiding or delaying heart attack. "New diagnostic tools, as well as new knowledge, now enable the physician to offer suggestions which may add years to the individual's life", reports the Genesee Valley Heart Association. "Obviously, people can get the full benefit of these new advances only through periodic medical examinations."

The association said your physician may recommend such steps as avoidance of cigarettes, maintenance of normal weight, regular physical activity, an intake of less saturated fats and foods high in cholesterol, and importantly, control of high blood pressure if present.

"Of the nation's 25 million persons living with some form of cardiovascular disease, more than 19 million suffer either from high blood pressure or its result - -

hypertensive heart disease", reports the Genesee Valley Heart Association. "This means that nationally, high blood pressure is associated with about 77 percent of all known cardiovascular illness".

"It is a tragic fact that many millions of people are unknowingly walking around with high blood pressure, which not only triggers hypertensive heart disease, but also accelerates conditions which set the stage for heart attack and stroke. In most instances, the physician can bring high blood pressure under control".

Routine physical checkups also can disclose inborn heart abnormalities, or heart damage resulting from rheumatic fever.

The hours for registration will be 9:30 to 11 a.m., at which time the pupils will be notified as to what time they are to report for instruction the following Saturday mornings. Classes will be of 30 minutes duration. Registration will be based on "first come, first served" basis.

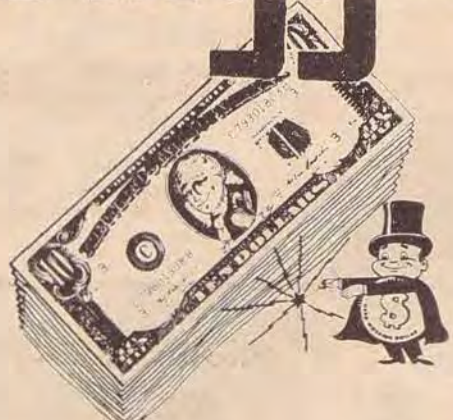

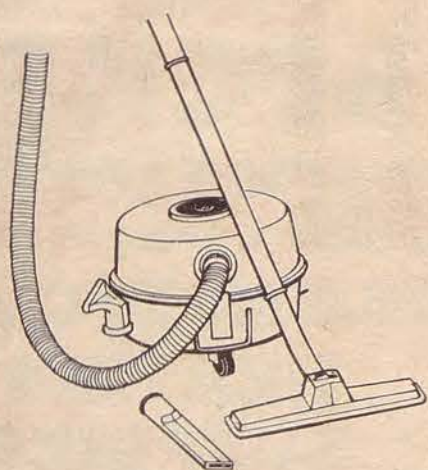

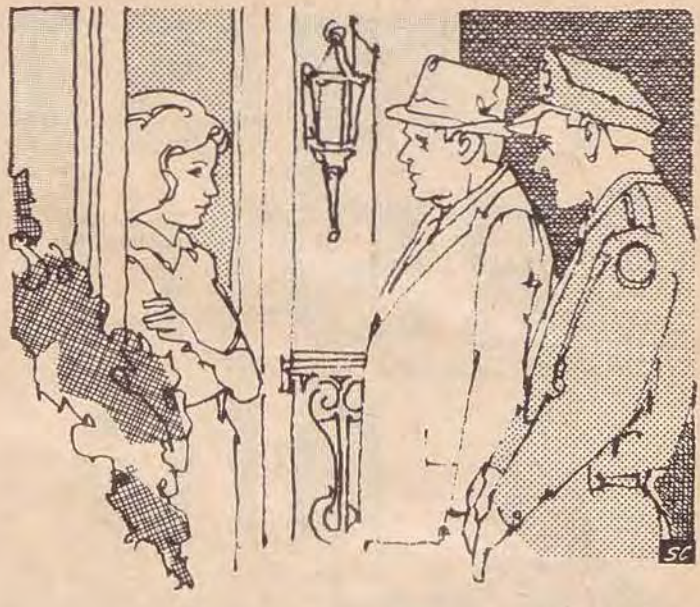

Policemen and realtors in Alameda County, California have something in common. They make "burglary calls" together!

In the interest of protecting homes and businesses from after-dark prowlers, the Southern Alameda County chapter of the National Association of Real Estate Boards is getting the full cooperation of its local police departments in a "Light the Night" program.

As a part of the program, policemen and realtors are making house-to-house calls together to inspect homes and business establishments for faulty locks and to be sure lighting in and around dwellings and buildings is adequate. Free advice about burglary prevention is part of their service.

Through schools, real estate offices and the police force, the realtors are also distributing 100,000 brochures entitled "Light the Night," which stress the dangers of nighttime crime, and urge homeowners to be sure their property is well lighted.

Similar programs are under way in other communities, including Long Island, N.Y.; Flint, Michigan, and Denver, Colorado.

In an endorsement of the program, J. Parker Heck, Educational Director of the Street and Highway Safety Lighting Bureau commended the realtors' group, saying it "is helping to call attention to residential streets that desperately need adequate street lighting."

Mr. Heck commented, "Barely ten per cent of the nation's residential streets have adequate street lighting. Many have none at all. Since light is a proven deterrent to the nighttime criminal, I heartily encourage these conscientious realtors and policemen to continue and expand their efforts. By making homeowners and businessmen aware of the crime-stopping value of well-lighted neighborhoods, they are making a valuable contribution toward the safety of their communities."

On Your Healthy Feet

Good health is a precious commodity to be handled with care literally from head to toe. If we tend to neglect the latter, the lowly ingrown toe nail provides a frequently painful, sometimes alarming reminder. Ingrown toe nails are in fact one of the most common causes of severe foot pain.

Improper methods of trimming toe nails, careless habits of foot hygiene and the wearing of constricting stockings and stylish shoes which are often too small or too pointed, all contribute to this common disorder.

If toe nails were permitted to grow out straight, and if they were trimmed straight across, there would rarely be a toe nail problem. But, most of us cut and shape our toe nails very much as we do our finger nails. The difference is, of course, that we wear shoes, and the pressure of a snug shoe exaggerates the ordinary curve of the nail. This creates a downward pressure of the nail into the adjacent skin areas.

When the toe nails have been improperly trimmed, to an oval or pointed shape, shoe pressures create a greater than normal arch and the nails dig in more deeply into the skin at the edges, resulting in pain, and if the feet have not been kept clean, infection

may result as well.

Should blood circulation in the foot be normal, the infection is likely to be limited and readily cured. However, in a person whose circulation is impaired because of diabetes or other ailment, the resulting infection may develop to such serious proportions that amputation may be necessary. Neglect of such conditions could even cause death.

The Colorado Medical Society recently issued a series of health hints on proper foot care, which are worth quoting:

1. Do not do a fancy "pedicure" on your toe nails. Trim them off blunt and straight. Be particularly careful in trimming the big toe nails.
 2. Wear properly fitted shoes. If you must follow fashion's dictates on pointed toes, buy a larger size so that the toes and nails are not compressed.
 3. Avoid tight stretch hose.
 4. Cleanliness is important to all foot care.
 5. Don't neglect a painful ingrown toe nail... If extra cleanliness and careful trimming do not improve the situation, see your doctor for help.
- In short, use your head—don't neglect your feet!

Medicare Law Explained

There is one provision of the Medicare law that is not generally known, Joseph Tomaino, Social Security Administration district manager, pointed out. He said that it could mean savings in medical bills for many individuals who come under Medicare.

Tomaino stated that under Part B of the Medicare program, the first \$50 in medical bills must be paid for by the beneficiary. He may then be reimbursed for 80% of all reasonable covered medical charges over \$50 during the calendar year.

To help the beneficiary who have to meet this \$50 deductible twice in a short period, a special "carry-over" rule was included in the law. This rule is that covered medical expenses incurred in October, November or December of any year can count as credit toward the \$50 deductible not only for that year but also for the following year.

Tomaino gave the following two examples of how this rule works. He said that if covered medical expenses for a year are \$50, or less, any such expense that is incurred in October, November or December can be used for the following year.

In the second example, he said that if covered medical expenses do not go over \$50 until the last 3 months of the year, any expense

in those 3 months which counted toward the \$50 deductible for that year, can be used again for the \$50 deductible for the next year.

Tomaino said that the staff at the Rochester district office would be glad to explain further this rule or to help any person in making out application form for Medicare payment. The local office located at 107 Clinton Ave. N., is open regularly from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Thursday evenings is open to 9 p.m. Telephone number is 325-6640.

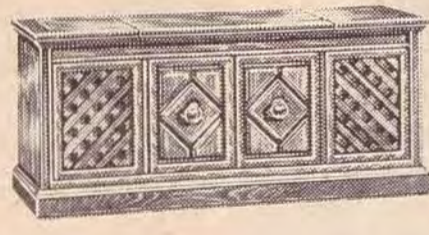

TO THE EDITOR:

"Members of the four neighborhood associations, ACTION, DRIVE, FRIEND and UNITE, held a combined meeting at Charles House on Wednesday, Jan. 22.

The intention of the Charles House Area Neighborhood Council at this time is to initiate a new program. The four associations will hold six combined meetings every other month such as January, March, May, July, September, and November. These combined meetings will help keep the people in the Charles House area informed of the objectives, the projects, the accomplishments and the future plans of the four associations. This should further their aims to encourage neighbors to participate in programs for the benefit of the neighborhood. The combined meetings will help expedite communications between the four associations and between the associations and city government. Programs can be attempted with the unified support of the four groups and an exchange of ideas can be discussed and encouraged. This will, also eliminate the necessity of speakers to return to speak to the individual groups making duplicate presentations necessary. Many problems have been common and mutually shared: handling of these problems involved four different approaches, making many trips to City Hall and the Building Bureau necessary, and many times the solutions were the same.

The four associations will still maintain their independence and hold six separate meetings to handle the problems pertinent to those areas. These will be held in the in-between months such as February, April, June, August, October and December.

The first of such combined meetings took place on Jan. 22. Frank Scarfone, president of FRIEND, was chairman of the meeting, and explained this new program which will go into effect immediately. Louis Romano, president of UNITE, gave a resume of the accomplishments of the four associations. Guest speaker for the evening was Monsignor George Cocuzzi, pastor of Holy Family Parish. He stated that he vehemently supported neighborhood associations and their programs to rehabilitate the neighborhood. He also stated that groups working together can be most effective and should be further encouraged. Monsignor Cocuzzi suggested that maybe the boundaries of the Charles House Neighborhood Association could be extended to include areas beyond Child St, which is the present boundary. It was because of the alertness of the Charles House Area Neighborhood Council and their subsequent meetings that prevented Jay St, and Maple St, from becoming one-way streets. This would have affected the residents as far as Mt. Read.

The accomplishments of the four associations in the past can attest to the concerned interest in the neighborhood and its problems. With combined interest and effort, greater participation and involvement, new programs and new benefits can be introduced and attempted by the four associations. Residents will be urged to become involved, to work together to rehabilitate and overcome the signs of an aging neighborhood. The challenge is there, and the neighborhood associations will lead the way in guiding us in the future plans for the area."

VIEW OF EARTH FROM MOON

Moon-mapping was the essential aim of the important photographic assignments the astronauts had during the Apollo 8 mission. This was the reason the official NASA release called the deep space probe the most important photographically of any manned flight to date.

A series of photographs exposed at twenty-second intervals were the most valuable of the over 1000 taken during the six-day flight. Astrogeologists will use them for accurate mapping and investigative purposes.

The Swedish-made camera NASA uses was automatically tripped by a programmed timer. The timer, drawing its power from the camera, opened the camera's shutter at the right times but the astronauts adjusted the opening manually instead of using a fixed setting as usual. During the sequence shooting, the astronauts used a twin camera for photographing possible landing sites.



The camera, the Hasselblad EL 70, is the electric version of the one astronauts have been using for still photography on all their flights since Walter

Schirra's Mercury Sigma 7 craft flew on October 3, 1962. Hasselblad space models are like those made for professional and amateur use. The controls are larger for the astronauts' gloved hands and they are anodized against glare. They perform the same in space as they do on earth which is why NASA narrowed its choice to only the Hasselblad. NASA reports their flawless performance has already resulted in over 4000 photographs.

Still photographs brought back from the early flights were only considered added pluses but turned out to be of increasing importance. They have been used for studies from determining geological structures to rerouting commercial shipping. Now the Apollo 8 photographs will help land a man on the moon.

With the almost 500 photos taken during the sequence, astrogeologists have a sharp clear look at the moon's surface for the first time. Each photograph has a 50% to 60% overlap and are to be stereographically projected. In this way, the height and depth of surface features can be determined.

What makes the Apollo 8 photographs more exciting than any others is looking at the earth as a planet in its universe setting for the first time! Apollo 8's historic mission has given us all a chance to feel the way Columbus did discovering a new world. And to think, we are only on our way to discovering the universe!

Community Savings Reports 1968 Gains

SKI-SLANTS



BY BILL BECK - Former U.S. Olympic Ski Team Coach

The hobgoblin of fear which haunted would-be skiers may be a creature of the past because of refinements in equipment and skiing know-how. Today's skiers are better prepared than ever for the exciting challenges of the slopes.

Let's review what constitutes safe skiing as the snow builds up invitingly on our mountains — and hope that in so doing we exorcise the hobgoblin that still keeps a few folks on the sidelines.

CONDITIONING.

First rule of safety is to build up your strength and stamina to cope with the rugged exercise of a day on the slopes. Tune up for the season with months of ski conditioning exercises. If you haven't had a chance to work out before you head for the hills, try to take it easy for the first few days. Try an easier slope than the ones you finished up on last year, rest often and quit early in the afternoon. The releasable ski binding — the cornerstone of safe skiing. It lets the skier "bail out" of his skis during a fall. Better binding systems, such as Marker heel-toe combinations, absorb shocks and vibrations which sometimes cause premature release and always cause leg fatigue.

MOUNTING AND ADJUSTING BINDINGS.

Bindings should be mounted by competent ski shop mechanics. The wise skier checks the release action of his bindings daily, adjusting for changing snow conditions.

CONTROL.

Beginners must learn basics before getting out on the slopes alone — regulating speed, stopping and turning.

PRUDENCE.

A recent National Ski Patrol study showed that intermediates have more accidents than any other class of skier.

They're past the novice stage and are confident they can ski anywhere on the mountain. Mountain trails and slopes are graded novice, intermediate and expert. Most major ski areas have a trail marking system. Different shape signs and their colors show the difficulty of each run. Be sure to learn and understand them. If you aren't sure of rating and the snow conditions of a trail, ask a ski patrolman. The slope that looks so gentle at first could turn into an expert's trail beyond the bend. When you've mastered the easy slopes, take a few more lessons until the instructor checks you out for more advanced terrain.

AVOIDING OVER-EXERTION.

Skiers are superstitious about saying, "this is my last run of the day." But the jinx is in taking it, not saying it. By late afternoon, after a hard day of skiing, fatigue has set in, reactions have slowed down and its grown colder with the sun behind the mountain. If you've got to get your lift ticket's worth with another run, stop often and check the stretch of trail in front.

VISION.

While trail conditions change with the day, so does visibility. Enough cannot be said for a good set of goggles, such as Uvex, with interchangeable lenses which are quickly adaptable to changing light and weather conditions. You should wear goggles with dark lenses while the sun is up to protect your eyes from bright ultra violet sun rays reflected on the snow. Late afternoon is time to switch to a yellow lens which makes better use of available light and lets you pick up the trail easier — the moguls, ruts and ice patches.

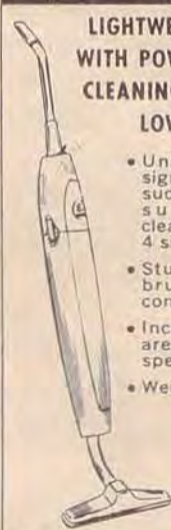



Gillette Appointment, School Trouble Put Spotlight On Northwest Area

Fast-moving developments both at City Hall and in the city school system have more than passing interest for the Northwest area. The appointment of Henry E. Gillette as commissioner of public safety and the disturbance at John Marshall High School resulting in several stabbings put the spotlight on this section of town.

Gillette, who is a long time resident of Seneca Parkway and a former Northwest district councilman, will take over duties as commissioner next week, but will be unofficially starting the job tomorrow in a conference of school and city officials over a policy with regard to violence in the high schools.

The trouble which erupted last week after a basketball game at John Marshall between Marshall and Jefferson High, resulting in knife wounds for four students and a faculty member, may lead to the suspension of athletic contests or at least a restriction to daytime competition. This and other school problems is the subject of tomorrow's conference.

The appointment of Gillette has been hailed by many sources, including leading Democrats as well as other non-political figures, as timely and well merited, but has been assailed by the Republicans on the grounds of Gillette's lack of experience for the job.

The Democrat & Chronicle in an editorial praising the appointment, referred to Gillette as "peppery and plain spoken". It went on to say:

"Gillette is no one's toady. He's a scrappy man who has never run away from a fight. . . . If he has mellowed a little in recent years and now flings out fewer angry statements, this may well be to the good in a post as sensitive and responsible as that of safety commissioner."

The new commissioner appeared to have retired from public life when he declined run for reelection as councilman in 1967. However, as he told a reporter, he has found life a little dull during the past year and he is

Your Assemblyman Reports

DEAR FRIENDS AND NEIGHBORS:

Republican legislators have been successful in reducing the appropriations in the annual deficiency budget which was passed by the Assembly and Senate.

After careful study by our members and our fiscal staff, we proposed and got adopted revisions to this deficiency budget totalling \$16 million.

The deficiency budget is actually the most difficult of the three annual budgets to pare because its major features reflects commitments by past Legislatures and relate to monies already spent and programs already in effect. I am pleased to report, however, that our efforts resulted in a \$14 million cut in the first instance appropriation for the South Mall Library and Museum.

We deleted \$1 million proposed for the purchase of 620 new state automobiles, pending completion of an immediate study, called for by Speaker Duryea, of state automobile use by state employees throughout New York State.

I have objected to the million dollar provision in the deficiency budget for state automobiles since its insertion. Since it seemed a logical cut to make at this time, I persisted in my objections, and with the cooperation of Speaker Perry Duryea, was able to achieve its removal from the budget through intervention by the Governor.

Furthermore, a \$200,000 reduction was made possible by a re-estimate of the funds needed to be set aside from now until April 1, 1969 in anticipation of legal claims against the state.

And, a reduction of \$620,000 was made possible through a re-evaluation of our needs in relation to planning for the construction of facilities at the State University. We were able to achieve this cut without delaying requested projects.

I observed that the new Republican majority in the Assembly began this session determined to enforce legislation which would produce significant savings for taxpayers while still insuring continued state progress in vital program areas.

Our ability to meet the needs of both program and economy was demonstrated this week by our approach to the deficiency budget.

CUT AID FOR STUDENT LAW BREAKERS

Last week I supported, and the Senate passed, a bill which will eliminate state aid for college students involved in illegal disruptions on our universities.

A student has the same rights as any other citizen, no more, no less. Our state laws permit freedom of speech, assembly and peaceful demonstrations. This right is held by all citizens, including students; however, the illegal rampages which have struck our colleges must not be tolerated. I refuse to financially aid students who burn and trespass on private property, and physically assault those people with whom they are in disagreement.

Each year we have a multitude of students turned away from colleges of their choice as a result of a shortage of facilities. It is indefensible that we will allow a small number of students to not only disrupt their own education, but disrupt the education of their colleagues who are more serious minded.

If our Senate bill becomes law, any student who is convicted by a court of a misdemeanor or a felony as a result of criminal trespass, unlawful assembly, aggravated harassment, or criminal nuisance on a college premise will not be able to receive state aid for a period of not less than two years.

HUMANE SLAUGHTER BILL

I have co-sponsored with Senator Adams and Assemblymen Carroll and Harris the Humane Slaughter Bill. This legislation is long overdue. It stipulates that no slaughterer, packer, or establishment operator shall throw, cast, shackle, hoist or otherwise bring livestock into position for slaughter by any method which causes injuries or pain.

Meat is a prime source of substance for most New Yorkers and the raising of animals for human consumption is an absolute necessity. However, there is no humane reason why an animal must suffer indescribable pain before its death.

Under present slaughtering methods the animal, while fully conscious, is shackled by its legs, hoisted in a position which causes excruciating pain and hangs until its throat is severed. This process is deplorable and barbaric and must be ended.

Under the provisions of the humane slaughter bill a packer would be obliged to use a mechanical, electrical or chemical method of making the animal unconscious before the slaughter process begins.

This is not only humane because it eliminates unnecessary pain to the animal, but packers have found that the handling of limp, unconscious animals reduces the incidents of accidents to workers, decreases insurance rates, lessens manpower turnover and reduces breaking of bones and bruising of meat.

I would appreciate any letters in support from you to strengthen our case in the Agriculture Committee.

R.G.&E. Tax Payments Run Into Millions

One of the largest taxpayers in the County of Monroe is the Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation. Last week, the RG&E presented the county with a check for \$3.2 million. The \$3.2 million represents the utility's annual real estate tax payment to the county for property it owns in the City of Rochester and in the county's 19 towns.

It is interesting that the RG&E at the same time made a quarterly payment to the City of Rochester of \$1.2 million on that portion of its property which lies within the city limits. The \$1.2 million represents one-fourth of the RG&E's yearly tax payment to the city of \$4.8 million.

The \$3.2 million received by the County from RG&E will pay com-

pletely or in part for many services to county residents, which otherwise would have to be supported from other sources of revenues.

For example, \$1,160,000 of the sum will be spent on behalf of the 60,000 clients that the county has either in the Medicaid program or on public assistance.

Here's a breakdown on how the balance of the \$3.2 million will be spent:

- 1 - Operation of Family, County and Supreme Courts, the District Attorney's office, Public Defender, Probation and the Hall of Justice, \$380,000.
- 2 - Youth Board, Veteran's Service, Election process, County Clerk, Planning and Human Relations, \$360,000.
- 3 - Health and Mental Health programs, \$325,000.
- 4 - Community College for 6,000 students, \$225,000.
- 5 - Police Operations and Public Safety Laboratory, \$225,000.
- 6 - Park operations, \$225,000.
- 7 - Highway work and airport, \$150,000.
- 8 - Penitentiary and Jail operations, \$150,000.

With the current furor over rising taxes and increased spending being felt in every department of your county government, the legislature has been taking a long, hard look at all appropriations, I promised in my last letter that we would trim the budget wherever possible, and I think my voting record since that time shows I've continued to hold the line on spending - especially on the unnecessary or extravagant items which should have no part of an austerity budget.

I have spent the past year, and longer, actively working for fair share government to help relieve some of the burden from city taxpayers. During 1969 the county has assumed \$3 million of city services as a result of my efforts and the efforts of others. This \$3 million is a burden taken away from the city budget, though as yet we have seen no reflection of this savings in the city tax rate.

In a related matter, the County Health Bureau has now taken over administration of the sanitation code. We think this should mean

prompt action in the field of air pollution, and improved conditions in the western part of my district.

Another current problem in our district is the heavy traffic, especially along Dewey Ave. I'm grateful for all the letters and calls I've received on the subject, and I have passed along your comments to the city council, together with my suggestions on the matter. Responsibility for traffic conditions on city streets rests with the city council, but you can be assured that I will press for action wherever possible.

Parked cars along Dewey Ave. near Augustine St. might have been partly responsible for a recent fatal accident at that corner, and I feel that No Parking signs should be installed along that stretch of Dewey Ave. to prevent such accidents in the future. The parking lot behind the library serves those using the library, but it is used by too few book borrowers. Signs on Dewey Ave. would prevent parking near the corner, and hopefully direct library users to the proper lot.

One final item for this week - if you should want any new trees planted in front of your house on your street, please call me with the information and location by early March. I'll be submitting my requests then, and the tree-planting crews will be out by mid-April. Help keep the 28th beautiful!

Proposed New School Setup Subject Of Meeting Tuesday at School 43

Fast-moving developments in the No. 43 School area indicate that a "doubleheader" next Tuesday night, March 11, will bring a record turnout to the School's auditorium. Parents of both No. 43 and Jefferson High students are expected to attend.

The March meeting of No. 43 PTA, originally scheduled for tonight has been shifted to next Tuesday. Mary Grooms, the speaker of the evening, will give her talk, according to present plans and the rest of the evening will be given over to a public discussion of the proposed new junior-senior high set-up in the city schools.

Mrs. Carmel Burruto, PTA president, will preside and a short business meeting at 7:15 will be held with the public meeting following at 7:30. Mrs. Burruto will introduce Mrs. Grooms, the well-known and controversial Times-Union columnist, who has indicated only that she will talk on "topics of interest".

The junior - senior high suggestion then will become the topic of discussion.

Some indication of what direction this discussion will take depends upon the results of a meeting tonight at Jefferson High between school and PTA officials. One suggestion, it is reported, would make it mandatory for No. 43 pupils to go to West High for the seventh and eighth grades; and with Jefferson High converted to a junior high, boys and girls from the No. 43 area would be obliged to get their high school education at Madison High, Madison High and John Marshall would be the only west side high schools under the plan.

A letter on the junior - senior high plan is printed elsewhere in this issue.

Esposito Gets 24th Support

The 24th Ward Republican committee has unanimously endorsed the candidacy of Joseph R. Esposito for another term as County Legislator. The committee took the action Wednesday, Feb. 26, in a meeting at the Avery Bowling Hall, according to Walter Dukelow, chairman of the ward committee.

Esposito represents the 27th County Legislative District comprising all of the 24th Ward and parts of the First, 15th, 20th, 19th, and 11th Wards.

Dewey Stop Signs Are Promised

Stop signs will be installed at the corner of Dewey Avenue and Augustine Street, scene of a three-car crash which took the lives of a mother and her daughter last week, Councilman Stephen May announced today.

(Remedial action at Dewey and Augustine was called for in an article in last week's Post-Courier by County Legislator John Romano, who promised to seek action from the City Council.)

May said city traffic engineering officials have agreed to install the signs as a result of his "urgent plea" for control devices at what he termed an "extremely hazardous" intersection. "No parking" signs, to provide 30-foot clearances from each corner and better visibility, will also be placed, May revealed.

May said he was "flabbergasted" to discover that there are no stop signs at the intersection of Dewey and Augustine. "These are two busy streets where the lack of control devices poses real dangers to all motorists, particularly those who aren't familiar with the area," the Councilman stated.

Victims of the Feb. 17 accident were Mrs. Doris J. Rodman and her daughter, Dolores Rodman, of 115 Westmoreland Dr. on the other side of the city. Their car, headed east on Augustine, was struck broadside by two southbound cars as it crossed Dewey. It is likely they weren't familiar with the dangerous nature of the intersection, May observed.

May also said that Traffic Engineering has agreed to install stop signs where Albemarle St. and Selye Terr. run into Dewey Ave. He said he was "surprised" that these intersections, although less dangerous, do not have control devices.

EDITORIAL Traffic Signs Badly Needed

There are several intersections along busy Dewey Ave. that are almost blind corners and stop signs such as those promised by the City's traffic engineers have been long overdue. As so often happens, it took a fatal accident to bring a demand for speedy action. (The signs will be erected, we are told, as soon as the supplier can furnish them).

The library, at Augustine and Dewey, impairs visibility as motorists approach Dewey from the west on Augustine St. And cars parked on Dewey too close to the corner also are a hazard. There should be no parking allowed for at least two (possibly as many as four) car lengths from the intersection.

Drivers, especially those not familiar with our area, often proceed into busy thoroughfares like Dewey without due caution and stop signs should be erected to give them sufficient warning to beware and watch for danger. The parking ban for a reasonable distance should also be enforced at dangerous corners.

Police Continuing Use of Scooters

The Rochester Police Bureau plans to continue using its present fleet of 8 scooters and may expand their number if future conditions warrant, Chief William M. Lombard has informed Councilman Stephen May.

May, who first suggested police utilization of scooters in 1966, recently wrote police officials pointing out the tremendous success enjoyed by Detroit's scooter patrol and inquiring about local plans for utilizing them. In Detroit, the police feel the scooters have given them important new mobility and have helped to improve community relations.

In a letter to May, Lombard noted that the Police Bureau acquired four scooters in 1966 and expanded the fleet to 8 in 1968. "We find merit in the use of scooters as an extension to our foot post assignments during the spring, summer and early fall months", Lombard observed. He added that inclement weather during the balance of the year makes them "not suitable in our locale".

While indicating the Bureau's belief that the fleet of 8 is "sufficient to cover areas of concern", Lombard added that "continued planning is in effect throughout the year to determine the widest application of our personnel and equipment in serving the total community." Concluded Lombard: "If our plans indicate the value of additional scooters, we most certainly will make such a recommendation."

DEAR FRIENDS AND NEIGHBORS:

I've been asked frequently lately, by many boatowners from our area, what the state's intentions are about the law relating to pleasure craft and pollution.

As you know, a law that would require all boatowners to install either tank or incinerator devices on their boats is scheduled to take effect on March 1st. However, there has been some confusion about precisely what kind of device is required, what the responsibilities of marina operators will be, the costs, and how to enforce the law. At the moment, the skippers are concerned, boat basin people are concerned, and legislators are most concerned.

A legislative study group is currently working on the solutions to the problem. I believe they will come up with answers that will be economically feasible for the boatman, that will solve the very basic conservation problem that we're trying to deal with, and that will be enforceable. However, it's going to take more time. And with that in mind, a bill has been filed to extend the effective date to next year.

I intend to support the measure, and I believe a year's grace period will allow us to take care of the remaining problems. I would expect a formal announcement of its passage within the next week or so.

Lately, I have also received an unusual profusion of mail from a number of my Senior Citizen friends who are unaware that they must sign up every year for their 50% real property tax exemption. The impression has been widespread that once one has applied and the problem is solved, it's renewed automatically annually.

Under the existing law, nothing could be further from the truth, I regret to say. However, help is on the way, I believe. There is now a bill before the Legislature which will, if passed, make the procedure

automatic. In addition, there is more legislation which will raise the income which an over 65 citizen is allowed to have, and still qualify for the exemption, from \$3,000 to \$4,000 or perhaps \$5,000.

I intend to support both of these measures, with the thought that it's the least I can do for many of our older residents who are faced with the challenges of living on a fixed income that may have been established in days less inflationary than today's. And I'll be happy to hear your opinions on this or any other issues of importance to those of us who live in Monroe County.

These children now attend John Marshall which is much nearer their homes.

The PTA president was briefed on the proposed changes last Wednesday, along with other PTA and school officials. She wishes to pass on the information she has received and get the reaction of the parents at the No. 41 meeting next Tuesday evening.

"Keep our children in neighborhood schools" is the anxious plea of No. 43 School parents and they plan to present their case to the Board of Education at the board's meeting tomorrow (Thursday) night in West High School. They also have initiated a letter writing campaign addressed to Herman R. Goldberg, superintendent of schools.

Following up on a heated discussion which featured the school's PTA meeting of last week Tuesday, a group representing all areas of the No. 43 School district met at the Avery Bowling Center Sunday and formulated plans for a concerted effort to make their voices heard. They have listed three alternatives which they will present to the school commissioners tomorrow night at West High. They are:

1. Return 7th grades to the grammar schools, adding whatever rooms are necessary.
2. Leave Jefferson High School as it is.
3. Immediate construction of a new junior high on the north side of town.

The sentiment expressed by several speakers was "Don't experiment with our children" and threats were heard from some about sending their children to private schools. The big objection to the suggestion for a new junior senior high setup was that one of the options in the plan is to send seventh and eighth graders from No. 43 in the Lyell-Mt. Read area to West High School and high school students to Madison High, both involving a long bus ride and transfer in the center of town.

Several No. 43 parents have asked for an opportunity to be heard tomorrow night under the leadership of Raymond Guentner, Jr., chairman of school - community relations of No. 43 PTA. Guentner has also requested that individual letters be sent to Superintendent Goldberg whose office is at 13 S. Fitzhugh St.

The meeting of No. 41 parents to consider the junior-senior high suggestion was held last night, missing the deadline for this week's Post-Courier. Further developments will be reported next week.



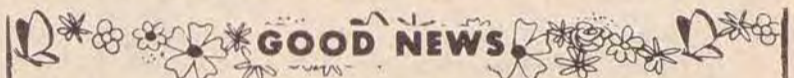

Ecumenical Ministry Board Formed To Serve Northwest Community

The Northwest Ecumenical Ministry Board (N.E.M.), representing some 16 churches in this part of the city, is meeting regularly to coordinate work "for the benefit of the community". The board consists of representatives from each organization, each having a vote. It meets again next Wednesday, April 2, at Dewey Ave. Presbyterian Church at 5:30 p.m.

The stated program of N.E.M., as outlined in a brochure recently printed, is to "join together the churches in order to offer themselves more effectively as servants to the people of the neighborhoods".

The N.E.M. is cooperating with the Joint Urban Office, Board of Urban Ministries of the Rochester Area of Council of Churches and the Urban Ministry Council of the Rochester Roman Catholic Diocese to develop an over-all strategy for church involvement in the total Rochester Urban Crisis".

It is planned to initiate programs through combined lay staffs and funding resources at both the neighborhood and sector levels.

The Northwest sector is divided into three parts, as follows:

OTIS AREA: Lyell Avenue Baptist, Holy Apostles, Trinity Lutheran, Holy Family, Grace Presbyterian, Charles Settlement House, Trinity U.C.C.

EDGERTON AREA: St. Patrick's Church, Lake Avenue Baptist, St. Anthony's, Christ Presbyterian, Holy Apostles, Holy Rosary.

MAPLEWOOD AREA: Grace Methodist, Ascension Episcopal, Dewey Avenue Presbyterian, Sacred Heart, Holy Rosary, Wesley Methodist.

Rev. Robert Booher is temporary chairman of the board which has offices in his Christ Presbyterian Church building at 5 Locust St. Father Gene Weis heads the Otis unit; James Martel, the Edgerton unit and Harry Roberts the Maplewood unit.

SENATOR POWERS TO INVESTIGATE STATE POWER

Last week I was appointed by Senator Zaretski and Assemblyman Steingut to a four man committee which will investigate the public power needs of the State of New York.

The cost of electric power to all residents of New York is a major part of the family budget. Not only are we directly affected by power rates when we pay our monthly utility bill, but we are also indirectly affected when we purchase any product or service in New York State because the company manufacturing the product or offering the service in New York State must take into

consideration the cost of utilities as part of its overhead expense.

Our committee, which includes Assemblyman Stockmeister, Assemblyman Kremer and Senator Bookson, will hold hearings to determine if power rates for the consumer can be reduced by expanding the influence of the New York State Power Authority throughout the state at large. Moreover, we will try to determine if the private power companies who buy from plants established by the New York State Power Authority are conveying these lower costs to the consumer or retaining these savings as benefits for their own stockholders.

I enter this project with an open mind and no preconceived notions of what conditions will be discovered. I pledge only to be diligent and fair in my investigation and to inform you of the results. If you have any suggestions on methods of investigation and/or data or information in this area, please forward it to my office: State Capitol, Albany, New York 12224.



Tomaino Explains Disability Benefits

"Many persons eligible for disability benefits apply too late to receive checks as early as they should," states Joseph M. Tomaino, district manager of the Rochester Social Security Office.

According to Tomaino, anyone whose work activity was covered by social security for 5 of the past 10 years, and is expected to be out of work for at least 12 months (because of sickness or injury) should apply for disability payments, immediately. In addition anyone who becomes disabled between ages 24 and 31 needs work covered by social security for only half the time between age 21 and the time he becomes unable to work. Those disabled before age 24 will need only 1-1/2 years of work credit out of the 3-year

period ending when the disability began.

Mr. Tomaino explained that although benefits can't be paid for the first 6 months of disability, medical records and other data needed from the applicant can be collected, evaluated, and a decision reached before the 6-month waiting period is up-enabling payments to begin on time.

Anyone in the Rochester area who wishes to apply for disability benefits, should visit the social security office at 107 Clinton Ave. N. The office is open from 9 to 5 week days and until 9 p.m. on Thursdays. A person unable to come to the office, may telephone 325-6640 and arrange for a visit by an office representative.

Learn-To-Swim Classes At "Y"

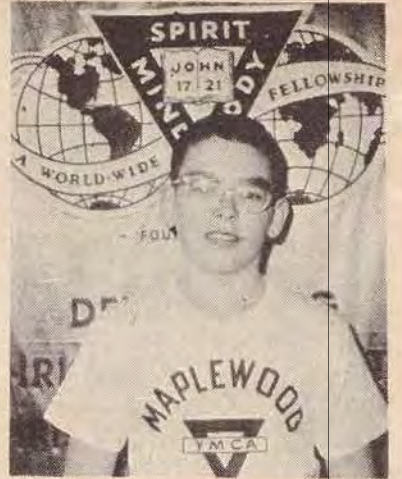

**Is Food
Expensive?**

Should a head of cabbage, can of peas, or package of frozen corn cost no more than last year, five ten or twenty years ago? Are food prices really sky high?

"What portion of a day's or week's wages does it take today, in comparison to some other date, to buy a particular food item or a week's food supply for a family?" Motesenbocker asks.

Food now takes less than 19 per cent of our income, less than at any previous time, in spite of increased costs to the farmer and food handler. This feat has been accomplished by better farming methods and greater efficiency on the part of the farmer, processor, distributor and grocer.

Growers of cabbage, sweet corn, potatoes, snap beans and other vegetables, Motesenbocker emphasizes have invested heavily in labor saving machinery. They are using improved varieties and all the latest ideas in disease, insect and weed control.

The result has been a fantastic increase in output per unit of land, labor and dollar invested. Were it not for this continually improving efficiency, Motesenbocker declares, food costs would really be sky high by any comparisons.
