Withdrawal Clinic Scheduled Jan. 21

Through the courtesy of the Monroe County Unit, American Cancer Society, a Smoking Withdrawal Clinic will be offered in the Adult Education Program of Greece Central School District No. 1 during the 1970 spring semester.

The clinic will be held on five consecutive Wednesdays beginning Jan. 21. In addition, a reinforce-ment program is scheduled for Mar. 11, and an evaluation for Mar. 25. Sessions will include presentations by experts plus showing of related films; group discussions; suggestions on how to stop smoking; distribution and analysis of materials.

Volunteer personnel will serve as the faculty for this Clinic. Among participants will be a physician to talk about the medical aspect of smoking and health; a dietician to present procedures for keeping weight down; a psychiatrist to discuss emotional effects of smoking withdrawal; and other medical and lay people experienced with various aspects of this topic.

American Cancer Society withdrawal programs emphasize medical supervision and involvement. About 100,000 physicians throughout the United States have given up cigarette smoking, and ACS feels that they can do more to influence smoking behaviour than any other concerned group.

According to American Cancer Society, most people, . even most smokers, . are familiar with the risks of the habit, and the Society believes there has been a striking change in attitudes toward cigarettes. Registration for the Clinic will be held in January, with a \$3.00 fee to cover cost of materials.





Can Be Harmful

Monroe County Health Director Dr. Wendell R. Ames warns parents to keep children's aspirin tablets out of the reach of children.

Citing a report just released by the National Clearinghouse for Poison Control Centers, Dr. Ames said children's aspirin now outranks all other products as the cause of accidental poisoning among small youngsters.

He said children's aspirin was

involved in 10,785 cases of poisoning in children under five years of age in the U.S. last year, which is three times more cases than caused by any other item, including in-secticides, household bleaches, and other medicines.

"The figures indicate that many parents mistakingly believe that children's aspirin is harmless", Dr. Ames said, "But when consumed in quantity by a small child who may think he's eating candy, children's aspirin can produce severe poisoning. I would advise parents too keep children's aspirin under lock and key".



Local Schools Drop In Ethnic Survey

Annual ethnic census of the City School District just announced reveals that Northwest area schools generally have experienced a small drop in percentage of Negro, Spanish surname, American Indian and Oriental children now in the public schools. This is in contrast to the citywide trend of a slight increase in 1969 over 1968.

Schools No. 7, 17, 21, 30, 41 and 43 experienced a small loss percentage-wise in this category, with a slight gain at Nos. 34 and 40. The two latter schools, however, still have the smallest percentage in the city, except for No. 43 and all the others except No. 17 are among the lowest percentage-wise. No. 17 has about 28,7 percent of its students in this category, a drop from 32 percent.

Northwest Clergy Vote Approval Of Goldberg Desegregation Plan

The Goldberg plan for grade reorganization and desegregation of the Rochester public schools has the support of the Northwest area clergy, a group representing many of the local churches. They met last Thursday noon at Lake Ave. Baptist Church to discuss Dr. Goldberg's report to the Board of Education. At least one of the ministers present dissented and issued a statement to the Tenth Ward Courier in opposition to the

Goldberg plan.

The clergy have gone on record supporting the plan as "the potential structure for providing quality education for all the students of the Rochester school system." They see the plan as "a necessary first step in meeting the requirements of a quality education at this time in the history of our city" and extend the hope that it be given "a fair and open hearing by the public".

Plans for enlisting greater support of the plan were discussed. Rev. Elmer G. Schaertel, pastor

of Redeemer Lutheran Church, on behalf of himself and his assistant pastor, Rev. John C. Schaertel, issued this statement:

"As pastor of Redeemer Lutheran Church, speaking for myself and for my assistant, we do not favor the Goldberg plan because we believe that the large amount of money for busing children would be much more effective in improving the educational system; and because we feel the emphasis being placed by Superintendent Goldberg on integration is far superseding his interest in education. In the long run we believe that both whites and blacks will suffer from this kind of policy".

from other cities".
"It is true", the Mayor said,
"that Rochester is now experiencing urban dilemmas common to all large cities. However, it has long been my conviction that if any American city can overcome its version of the urban crisis, it is Rochester".

Added May, "this unique and dynamic community cannot be and should not be satisfied to be as badly off as other cities. We have had, and continue to have, a sound basis for realistic pride and op-timism. We can do better. We will do better".

Assemblyman Reports

Assemblyman, 133rd District

One broad legislative area the Assembly will consider this session is consumer protection.

There are seven specific subjects which we undoubtedly will consider:

1. A consumer credit code. We will be asked to adopt this proposed new Uniform Consumer Credit Code or similar legislation.

Credit Ratings. This is an 2. area that has needed attention for a long time. We will have to decide whether or not to give consumers the right to challenge a bad credit rating and have it corrected if it is based on hearsay, inaccurate information or other unreliable data.

Sellers would be required to inform the consumer of the name and address of the credit agency if a credit sale is denied because of a credit agency report, Such legislation also might restrict persons who could offer credit information to creditors, law enforcement agencies, licensing agencies and credit bureaus, A man's credit is much like his reputation generally, and should be guarded just as carefully.
3. Credit Cards. You've prob-

ably heard about or actually experienced some of the abuses that certain sources for these cards are practicing. As a result, the Legislature will be asked to prohibit the mailing of unsolicited

Use of such cards, according to Attorney General Lefkowitz, is said to be placing a strain on budgets of families that can ill afford increased credit purchases.

4. Unit Price System. We will consider adoption of the New York City unit price system, which requires that the price per ounce and/or price per pound be printed on all packaged foods, Many housewives in the city claim this system really helps them save money.

5. Insurance Coverage. We will be asked to strengthen the law pertaining to non-cancellation of a policy by the insurance company that also includes non-renewal of the policy. An exception to this would be where conditions permit cancellation, Also, we will consider the requirement that a company doing business in one part of the state do business in all parts, so as to prevent it from withdrawing from high - risk urban areas.

6. Auto Insurance, This is another matter concerning insurance, where we will study the need to reform the automobile insurance system, substituting no-fault compensation for the current tortliability system.

7. Finally, we will deal with that omnipresent problem of consumers finding the properly trained repairman. We will be asked to consider licensing two broad cate-gories, TV and Auto Repairmen, so the consumer is better assured that a repairman working in New York State has been approved to do so by the State.



Gary Baird Wins Combat Citation

Lance Corporal Gary C. Baird, a Marshall High graduate who is serving in the Marines, has been cited for "accomplishment of a hazardous mission" and has been presented the Air Medal. He is the son of Mrs. Mary Baird, 1420 Lake Ave., a worker for the city school cafeteria.

"Late on the afternoon of 7 February 1969," reads his citation, "Lance Corporal Bairdlaunched as an aerial gunner aboard a CH-46 transport helicopter assigned to helilift a recovery team to a crash site in Quang Nam Province to retrieve several seriously injured Marines whose helicopter had come under intense hostile fire and crashed while engaged in a medical evacuation mission.

"Arriving at the designated area he ably delivered such effective suppresive machine gun fire that his aircraft was able to land, disembark the recovery team and its equipment and embark three seriously wounded Marines. Departing for the nearest medical facility to discharge the casualties, his CH-46 then quickly returned to the crash site.

"Undaunted by the extremely heavy volume of enemy small arms, automatic weapons, and machine gun fire directed at his aircraft, Lance Corporal Baird boldly manned his weapon and delivered gun fire, enabling his helicopter to land in the fire-swept zone. Despite the hostile rounds impacting near his aircraft, he resolutely delivered covering fire while the Marine casualties, salvaged aircraft equipment and the recovery team were embarked on his CH-46. Alertly locating enemy firing positions and delivering return fire, he enabled his helicopter to lift out of the dangerous area and depart for the Marble Mountain Air Facility.

"Lance Corporal Baird's courage, superior professionalism and unwavering devotion to duty at great personal risk were instrumental in the accomplishment of the hazardous mission and were in keeping with the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and of the United States Naval Service."

Baird, who was married last June expects to be transferred soon from South Carolina for secret work in Baltimore.





Social Security Information

Social Security beneficiaries do not need to apply for the 15% benefit increase just signed into law by President Nixon. "Every one of the 25 million men, women and children now on the benefit rolls will receive the increase automatically," Robert M. Ball, Commissioner of Social Security said today.

"The first regular check in the new amount", Commissioner Ball said, "will arrive April 3, the usual day for delivery of benefit checks covering payments for the month of March". A separate check in the amount of the benefit increase for the months of January and February will reach benefi-ciaries later in April, probably during the week of April 20.

Refiguring the benefit amounts of the 25 million men, women and children now on the benefit roles is a tremendous task, Commissioner Ball pointed out, and it must be done without disputing the regular benefit payment cycle.

About one out of every eight Americans is now receiving a Social Security check each month, Commissioner Ball said, As of the end of December, these monthly payments totaled \$2.2 billion and the monthly total will go up by \$345 million to more than \$2.5 billion as the 15% benefit increase becomes effective.

The average retirement benefit of \$100 a month will rise to \$116 per month; a couple 65 or older receiving the average couple's 65 or older receiving the average couple's benefit of \$170, will have their benefit increased to \$196; the average benefit for a family made up of a disabled worker, wife and one or more children will go up from \$237 to \$273; and average payments for a widow and two or more children will rise from \$254 to \$292,"

Home Owner Approval Sought For Lyell Urban Renewal Project

Authorization to proceed on an Urban Renewal project involving con-siderable land fronting on Lyell Ave. near the city line has come from Washington, It is known as Western Gateway and would be the site of an industrial development,

Application was made for plann-ing funds over 2-1/2 years ago and local officials were taken somewhat by surprise when the order came through a short time

Donald Auries of the city's Urban Renewal office, who has been assigned to the project, states that the first step the city will take is to sound out the feelings of the affected residents and property owners. He has sought the assistance of County Legislator Joseph Esposito to set up meetings with property owners to acquaint them with all the facts.

"After thoroughly consulting with the people, the decision to proceed or not to proceed will be made, "says Auries, He has assigned David Baldwin, Urban program assistant, to meet with the affected people in small block gatherings.

It will be approximately 1-1/2 to two years before re-location activity would begin, it is pointed out. And federal funds to take care of all expenses would be available.

All of Lyell Ave., from the B&O Railroad crossing west to the Barge Canal, would be affected, on both sides of the street. Present industrial property, such as Delco and Ragu, would be unaffected, but other business properties on Lyell and homes on such streets as Adirondack, Harcourt, Grenville and others would be included in the Urban Renewal Plan.

A portion of Lyell Ave. from the Central Trust office to the railroad crossing and Dodge and Ashcroft Streets would be kept residential, says Baldwin,

The cost of land acquisition would be paid for mostly out of federal funds, HUD would pay 2/3 and the city and state would divide the other 1/3.

Surveyors are working in the neighborhood now, but have identi-fication papers with them. Any questions by property owners may be directed to Mr. Baldwin at 232-1100, extension 86, he states.

Rochester has been successful in an application to the federal government's Open Space Land Program and has been lucky enough to earmark \$2.2 million dollars out of the total \$15 million appropriated by the government for parks in cities.

Funds Available

For No. 17 Park

A portion of this fund would be utilized for complete acquisition of land adjacent to the new No. 17 School, between Orchard and Saxton Streets. This would be devoted to park and recreational use.

The city sent in its application on Jan. 16 and hopes to have final approval from the federal government within another 60 days. The area adjacent to No. 5 School in Plymouth Ave. North would also be part of the project. Completion date would have to be within a year

Several meetings have been set at the Charles House in an effort to give the people of the No. 17 area a voice in what goes into the land when and if acquired.

Local Urban Renewal officials who are in charge of the program also will have the responsibility of re-locating any property owners who would affected and they promise to carry out this aspect of the program as soon as final approval is given.





March 31, 1970 is an important date for individuals born between Oct. 2, 1901 and Oct. 1, 1902, according to Joseph Tomaino, dis-trict manager of the Social Security Administration, "It is particularly important to those persons in this age group who have not already signed up for the Supplementary Medical Insurance under Medicare because if they do not do so by March 31, 1970, they will not have another opportunity," de-

clared Tomaino.
"An individual can sign up for this medical insurance only during specified enrollment periods", Tomaino explained."There are two such enrollment periods," he continued, "the initial enrollment period which is based on the time when an individual is first eligible to enroll - - usually the time he becomes 65; and the general enrollment period during which a person who failed to apply in his initial enrollment period may first enroll, or during which an individual whose enrollment has terminated may, with certain restrictions, re-

General enrollment periods extend from Jan, 1 through March 31 of each year, according to Tomaino. He cautioned, however, that for a person to enroll for Supplementary Medical Insurance during a general enrollment period it must begin no later then three years after the close of his initial enrollment per-

Tomaino explained that the Supplementary Medical Insurance portion of Medicare, sometimes referred to as doctor bill insurance, is a voluntary program. It offers valuable protection toward payment of doctor bills and in addition helps pay for outpatient hospital services, out-patient physical therapy, home health treatment and other medical items. Generally, the plan returns \$4.00 out of every \$5,00 of the individual's allowed medical expenses. The patient is responsible for the first \$50 of medical expenses in each year.







Compulsory Busing Necessary?

The hour is almost at hand for the decision on the socalled Goldberg Plan for re-organization of our public schools. Clergymen, educators and civic leaders, for the most part have long since taken their stand-they're for it.

But the School Commissioners have yet to declare themselves--and right now they are undoubtedly searching their consciences. (At least three of the five have all but pledged themselves previously against involuntary busing, and therefore against one of the basics of the Goldberg plan).

If these commissioners have their hand on the pulse of the parents, they must know by now that there is a tremendous and growing opposition to the busing aspect of the plan. A great many of our local politicians, either openly or covertly, are also in opposition. President Nixon is publicly opposed as are many other national leaders.

Six years ago, when busing was first introduced, it involved only No. 30 School in this area. No. 30 parents rose up in their wrath; the Post-Courier went on record deprecating the breaking up of the neighborhood school concept. But that was it. Parents in other school districts paid little heed. They thought it would never happen to them.

The Board of Education now proposes-in the name of integration-to bus about 16,000 boys and girls; and to ask many more to walk much longer distances to get to school than they do now. A great many parents resent it--especially those who have small children in school.

The Post-Courier has given, and will continue to give equal coverage to all concerned, but feels strongly that the bulk of the people are dead set against busing and that the School Board should act accordingly.



Glenwood Garden Draws Protests

"The project will cause congestion in the immediate area", say the leaders of the protest, "and will lower property values. It will also create sewer problems and traffic problems as well, Furthermore the neighbors have never been notified about the original planning".



Safest Way To View Eclipse Outlined By Health Assn.

Nearly every time a solar eclipse occurs in a populated area, several cases of minor or severe eye damage are reported. On Mar. the sun will be totally eclipsed along an 85 mile wide path, crossing Southern Mexico, Northern Florida, North and South Carolina, Georgia, Nantucket, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland, All of North America (except for Alaska Mexico and Northwestern South America will see a partial eclipse. The eclipse will occur near noon, hence the Intensity of the high-overhead sun's radiation will not be obscured by low atmospheric haze.

A total eclipse of the Sun is one of the most beautiful sights a person is likely to see, but without using simple precautions can be dangerous to one's eyesight, says a news release from the Health Association of Rochester.

The total eclipsed sun is much less bright than the full moon and can be safely observed (and should be) without the need for any protection filters. The danger of eye damage is only prevalent during the partial eclipse periods before and after totality. The sun brightly shines in the sky every clear day, but no one would think of staring directly at it except when an eclipse is in process. The brightness of the solar disc is not reduced at all until the moment ot totality.

Beware of dark filters that have not been tested for their transmission in the ultra-violet and infra-red portions of the spectrum, people are advised. A filter can

be extremely dark in the visible region but still let through amounts of energy dangerous to the eye in the ultra-violet and infra-red.

The Eye Conservation Committee of the Health Association recommends that a solar eclipse can be safely observed if these suggestions are followed:


1. Observe the partial eclipse phases by projecting the image of the sun onto a white piece of paper with the aid of one-half of a bin-

ocular or a small telescope, or 2. Use a safe filter - the only easily obtainable safe filter is a piece of fully exposed and developed black and white film (Not color film or photographic neutral density filters.)

3. If a filter is used, DO NOT stare at the sun for long periods. The partial eclipse phases last 2 to 3 hours near the path of total-ity, thus a quick observation every few minutes is sufficient for following the progress of the eclipse.

4. When the solar disc is completely covered by the moon (this total eclipse phase lasts only 3 minutes and is observable only in the narrow 85 mile wide path of totality) all protective filtration can be removed for observation of the solar corona and prominences.


CAUTION: Be prepared to use the projection or filter method again at the end of totality (the moment when the moon starts to uncover the solar disc.)





Senior Citizens Bus Rates Reduced

Under legislation sponsored by Mayor Stephen May the city administaration will soon begin a threemonth experimental program of reduced bus fares for senior citizens. He said it is now up to elderly bus riders to increase their use of buses in order to minimize revenue losses and permit the plan to become permanent.

The program, which will begin on March 15, will allow persons 65 years of age or older to travel on RTS buses for fifteen cents between the hours of 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. and 2 a.m. on weekdays and all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays. Zone and transfer rates will not be affected by the pilot program.

May said the city government

will continue to work closely with the Transit System and the Senior Citizens Action Council on a publicity campaign to encourage elderly citizens to make full use of the reduced fare service in an effort to minimuze the severe revenue losses predicted by experts. He said the City, Transit System

and the Senior Citizens Action Council will evaluate the program at the end of three months to determine the feasibility of extending it.

May estimated that about 90,000 Monroe County senior citizens can benefit from the plan, adding that "we owe special assistance to our aging citizens, so many of whom are caught in the tragic squeeze between fixed incomes and the rising cost of living."





Steinfeldt Protects News Media

ALBANY--Assemblyman Stein-feldt (R-Monroe County) is cosponsor of an Assembly bill which would protect newsmen's sources of information.

Steinfeldt's bill would become effective immediately if it is passed by the Legislature and signed by the Governor.

Newsmen could no longer be held in contempt for refusing to disclose their news sources before any court inquiry, legislative hearing or any other body having contempt powers.

Covered under the Steinfeldt bill would be newspapers, wire services, press associations and radio and television stations.

Assemblyman Steinfeldt saidhis bill has been tightly worded "so that only bonafide, professional journalists can legally withhold the source of their information."

"Every rational newsman wants to cooperate with the forces of law, order and justice. For years, newsmen have been asked to testify in court, As trained observers, they have frequently made ex-cellent witnesses," Steinfeldt said.

"No newsman objects to a court appearance when it is justified and when he realizes that a search for justice is underway," he said.

Assemblyman Steinfeldt pointed out that 14 other states already grant protection to newsmen from being forced to divulge their sourc-

es. "It is a tribute to New York State newsmen that they have protected their sources throughout the years," he said.

"A great part of the newsman's job is finding and later respecting confidential sources. To that end, I am committed to a leadership position in seeing the bill enacted into law," said the Assemblyman,

Warning that forces of negativism at work in American cities can prevent solutions to the urban crisis, Mayor Stephen May appealed for "return to our tradition of civility of dialogue," He said that "America today is a nation divided -- and as a result, we are entering an ominous period for our system of government,"

Addressing a communion break-fast at Sacred Heart Cathedral, May urged Rochesterians "to emphasize the many things we have in common and not the relatively few things which momentarily drive us apart." He said there is an urgent need to "revive the best in the American tradition which permits, even demands, that we talk to each other, not scream at each other."

Excerpts from the Mayor's remarks follow:

"Bitter controversies aroused by population shifts, unprecedented

increases in crime, deteriorating conditions in our cities, tensions between the races, and hostility between the establishment and the dissidents have created a genuine national crisis for our people. We

are tormented by division and beset by spokesmen who preach doctrines of acrimony.

"In city after city, powerful forces of negativism, fear and divisiveness are at work, Promises to turn back the clock and appeals to the baser instincts of the populace have become increasingly popular among articulate citizens. TO THE EDITOR:

Many parents who have worked hard to keep neighborhood schools have said in no uncertain terms that they believe in a good education for all children, that the right of the people to educate their children in their own home neighborhood must be preserved.

Many other parents who support the reorganization of schools say that they do so because they believe in a good education for all children.

Certainly all dedicated people on all sides of this splitting controversy give much thought and time and somethimes real sacrifice to support their beliefs. This is a problem which is not going to be solved today or tomorrow. Much is said and done, and much will need to be said and done for a long time to come.

Meanwhile the school where your

children are educated, stands in need of changes which can only be accomplished by your strong support, It simply doesn't make sense to say that all these dedicated people are interested only in where and how their children get to school. They must be interested also in what happens to their children after they get there.

In our schools today, too many children are still bunched in one classroom, too many children are still being forced to learn too quickly or too slowly, too many are achieving below grade level in key subjects. We are not making the best use of our teachers' separate talents. Over 760 children have the services of a nurse only two half days a week. Are they required to be sick or have accidents only by appointment? We have an old building, much of the equipment is ancient, Active children in primary grades are without gym classes and without playground equipment of any kind.

Too many children are in danger crossing busy streets because of our difficulty in getting and keeping crossing guards. These problems need our attention and they need it

On Tuesday, March 24, at 7:45 p.m., No. 41 School will hold a meeting to discuss the needs of our school. It is our hope that a "No. 41 School Community Committee" representing as many parts of our neighborhood as possible, can be set up to work with our teachers on ways and means to get something done about the needs of our children. We must, at least, make a start. Whether you are a member of No. 41 P.T.A. or not, please try to keep this time open to attend this meeting and be with us to put your two cents worth in.

Lacy "Basket Egg Tree" Is Fancy Fun At Low Cost



youngsters can be kept busy on Easter vacation fashioning a "Basket Egg Tree" that will make a lasting and lovely centerpiece or table decoration.

Because it's made from scraps and throw-aways, the cost of the project is very lit-tle. All it takes is eggshells, embroidery scraps, thread, transparent tape, glue, a branch, an empty fruit can, plaster and a basket or pot to set it in.

Start by saving eggshells. It's a good idea to break the eggs with a knife, near the smaller end. Use your finger to wash the inside of the eggshells wash the inside of the eggshells with warm water, and let them dry thoroughly. Reinforce any shells with jagged or cracking edges on the inside with tape. Before you decorate them, attach a hanger thread to the inside of each egg. Use transparent tape, preferably the nonshiny type (Scotch Magic Transparent) so that decorations can be easily glued on top of it. About nine inches of metallic thread make a pretty metallic thread make a pretty

With a little help from Mom, embroidery counter of any dewith glue, tape and imagina-tion, will help your children turn the eggshells into beauti-ful little basket creations.

While the youngsters are

busy decorating the shells, Mom can prepare the "tree." A branch from any tree or bush will do, but dry ones are best. Spray or brush on a flat white or pastel enamel. Mix about two pounds of patching plaster in a clean No. 2½ can, and brace the tree in it until it hardens. Then the can can be set in any handy pot or basket, and garnished with paper hay, foil or clear wrap.

A final touch to the Basket

Egg Tree is a nest made from a copper scrubbing pad, into which you place a tiny paper bird. To preserve your creation for next year, save an egg car-ton in which to pack the shells

The entire cost of the project is from \$2 to \$3, depending on what supplies you have on hand. Patching plaster is about 45 cents, non-shiny tape about hanger.

If your sewing box does not yield enough scraps of metallic braids, velvet ribbons, yarns and pieces of lace, you can buy remnants for pennies at the second specific remnants.

49 cents; white glue, about 29 cents, and a can of spray enamel, about 98 cents. If you choose to buy embroidery remnants, you can probably get all you need for less than a dollar.
