



The advisability of saving Aquinas Stadium cannot be disputed. It is a much needed community asset from the recreational point of view and if it is demolished, it will have to be replaced with a much costlier structure in the very



## SPAIN and PORTUGAL

(The Post-Courier editor, Fred R. Metzinger, and his wife have just returned from their sixth trip to Europe. They tell some of their experiences in a series starting this week and to be continued in future issues).

On the morning of the day of our departure for three weeks in Europe, the headlines blazed with news of the thwarted hi-jacking of an Israeli plane involving the shooting of one hi-jacker and the capture of another. The El Al jet had made it to Heathrow Airport, our destination in London.

We were off on a self-charted trip which, after a couple of days in England was to take us to southern Portugal, starting at Faro; then to Seville, Algeciras and Malaga in Spain driving a sturdy little Morris 1300; back to Faro, then to Lisbon and home. Favored by perfect weather and some very fine hotel accomodations, we had one of our most successful ex-







In this case, I believe the people should have been advised what was to take place before it actually became a reality.

"If the council has final judgement on this proposal, I would appreciate your investigating this situation before a final decision is made. I know you have always been receptive to people and their neighborhood problems and I -am certain you will do your best to satisfy the majority of the people."

a mature movie or a quiet zone depending on where you were seated. Our stewardess served us dinner about an hour after we took off and a light lunch about three hours later. It was dark when we left (about 8:30 p.m.) and daylight some six hours later when we landed in London where it was 7:30 a.m. We tried to sleep, but got only catnaps.

There was more than the usual confusion at Heathrow, but our English friends were there to pick us up and as soon as we got through customs they whisked us off in their Bentley, driving on the left hand side of the road, scaring the wits out of us until we got accustomed to seeing traffic whiz by us on the wrong side of the street. It took us over an hour to skirt the southern border of London on the outer loop that wound up in Chiselhurst, the home of our friends.

Fortunately we were only staying three days. We ran into typical English fall weather, rain and quite cool. The change in time caught up with us at this point. We had lost five hours and a night's sleep on the way over and an afternoon siesta was more than welcome.

Greenwich Observatory Despite the weather we did plenty of sightseeing in the short time at our disposal. The Greenwich Observatory, the center of the universe as far as time is concerned, was just around the corner high on a hill. You could look down on the British Naval Academy on the banks of the Thames and off in the distance got a very comprehensive view of the London sky-line about ten miles away. We snapped pictures of the clocks that are the official time-pieces for the entire world.

We had dinner one night at the famous LeMarquis de Montcalm in Quebec Square, Westerham, Kent, which has been written up in Gourmet Magazine. It was French cooking, quite tasty and served with a flourish.

One of our visits was to the Chiselhurst Golf Club which from about 1855 on had been the exile home of Napoleon III, Empress Eugenie and the Imperial Prince. The building, now the clubhouse for the golfers, is much the worse for wear, but dripping in historical lore, Napoleon, the last emporer of France, had died there 100 years ago and preparations were being made for a big celebration a few days hence. The threadbare carpets and the general air of decay made it difficult for even our English friends to stay long enough to avail ourselves of the manager's invitation to a drink at the bar.

The news of two more hi-jackings and the subsequent rough treatment of the hostages by the guerillas on the Jordan desert made us apprehensive about boarding our Portugese (TAP) Carevelle for the flight to Portugal. We were lucky, however, not to be flying any great distance. Overseas travelers were being subjected to close inspection and long delays, but we got out of Heathrow with a minimum of inconvenience.

## EDITORIAL COMMENT

Friend of the chains whacks them.

Back in the 1930's the Tenth Ward Courier raised its small voice to protest chain store practices which it is interesting to note have now come home to roost. The deceptive tactics by which the chains have hoodwinked the American public are now recognized by the daily newspapers here in Rochester. And a major chain operation, without admitting that it, too, has been a party to this deception, has embarked on a new policy of honesty-and gets a pat on the back from the daily newspaper.

Of course, it's too late in history to bring back the independent grocer to the status he once enjoyed-a symbol of service, friend in need, creditor to the neighbor temporarily in financial difficulty-you name it. But who can blame us for taking a moment to reminisce and also to lament the short-sightedness of the American public for letting this happen.

We wrote an editorial 35 years ago, pointing out that a big mustard manufacturer was putting up a special size jar-a couple of ounces less-but available only at chain stores at a big savings". We were crusaders in a lost cause. Significantly, however, no one sued us.

One day last week, the local daily used its editorial page to praise a chain operation specifically by name, for going to unit pricing-in other words honesty. You don't call it "the giant size" in your advertising; you tell the contents, so that the housewife knows what she's buying. And this in a newspaper carrying the ads of several other chains who haven't yet seen the light!

Pardon us if we say "we told you so"

#### About illegal sign posting.

A reader who signs her letter Mrs. A. Williams, with no further identification or address, complains about signs posted along Dewey Ave. and Ridge Rd. West.





The Monroe County Department of Health will hold mass immunization clinics next month to provide free vaccine protection against German measles (Rubella) for children from 1 through 9 years

County Health Director Dr. Wendell R. Ames said about 25 immunization clinics will be held throughout the city and county, at schools, churches and other public buildings with easy access and parking facilities.

The clinics will be conducted on Saturday, Nov. 7, from 1 to 4 p.m. and the locations will be announced as soon as the schedule is completed.

The immunizations will be given by jet injector gun, which injects a fine jet spray of vaccine by hydraulic pressure. Immunizations by this process are faster and have the advantage of being painless since no needles are re-

Dr. Ames said the goal of the clinics is to immunize 50,000 children in the hope of averting an epidemic of German measles this winter. The Health Department during the past year has immunized about 30,000 children, and is now undertaking mass clinics because of the availability of the new vaccine in large supplies.

Because it has come to our attention that the residents of the neighborhood do not understand the church's relationship to Concerned Youth, the church would like to clarify this.







#### **Honors Divided Here** In Election Results

The tendency of voters to be a little more selective resulted in some surprises in last week's elections. Four of the Northwest wards, as usual, showed a Democratic trend. Wards 1, 15, 20 and 24 gave pluralities to Arthur Goldberg and the Ninth and Tenth went for Rockefeller.

Barber Conable (R) won all six wards in his successful campaign for re-election to Congress. And State Senator James Powers (D) also came out ahead in all wards, giving him a sizeable margin over Joseph Campbell (R), County Court Judge Edward Provenzano (R) also won in all wards as did State Comptroller Arthur Levitt (D) and Attorney General Louis Lefkowitz

Councilman Andrew Celli (D) who was elected a City Court Judge was the top vote getter among the four candidates in Wards 1, 15, 20 and 24; was second only to Harold Galloway (R) in Celli's home ward, the Tenth as well as in the Ninth. Galloway was a winner in all local wards and also was elected.

Assemblyman Frank Carroll (R) carried the three wards in which he ran, 15, 20 and 24 in winning re-election, Assemblyman William Steinfeldt (R) carried the Ninth and Tenth, but trailed in Wards 1, 15 and 24. He came out of Greece with enough plurality to insure his re-election.

The Ninth and Tenth favored U. S. Senator-elect James Buckley (C) but the other wards gave their pluralities to Richard Ottinger (D).

In the surprising school board results, David Branch (D) did well in all six wards, but it was Emilio Serrano (R) who was the top favorite in all but the 20th. Wyoma Best (D) was close to the leaders in all wards and James Sims (C) did well in all but the 15th. Branch and Best were elected despite the fact that they apparently will be for a more liberal school policy.

### Sims Unhappy About Election

Proud as he is of the more than 20,000 votes he got in last Tuesday's election, James R. Sims, Jr. is not happy with the outcome in the School Commissioner race, He told the Post-Courier that he finds it difficult to explain how people could vote for the two Democratic candidates who were elected.

"They must have voted the straight party line", says Sims. "And now I am afraid they will get just what they deserve".

Sims is quite certain that he would have been elected if he had been successful in getting the Republican nomination in the Primaries. (He lost the Republican endorsement by 17 votes). He feels that he could have held the 20,000 plus votes he got running as a Conservative and with the Republican vote could have emerged a winner.

Sims has been a leader in the development of Rochester Neighborhood School Association and served as its president. He is badly disillusioned by lack of support from the parents who favor the neighborhood school concept and who are opposed to busing. He is willing to run again next year, but only if he is nominated on a major party ticket.

#### SPAIN and PORTUGAL

By FRED R. METZINGER, Post-Courier Editor

(The first portion of this tale of our experiences in our sixth trip to Europe ended in London. Now we have flown to southern

At Faro we had reservations at a modern and very comfortable hotel, right on the shores of the Atlantic and set in the midst of a golf course with the greenest grass you ever saw. (It hadn't rained there in weeks and the countryside was badly scortched). Water was the answer and the golfers' fairways as well as greens were watered day and night. Food and service at the hotel was the finest. We rented our snappy little Morris here and spent a few days exploring the nearby towns and seaside resorts.

This is in the area of Portugal known as the Algarve where there is no wintertime. The skies were cloudless every day and it was in the 80's. At night, the temperature dropped only about

ten degrees. There is a curving shoreline at this point and Faro Island is the part jutting out the farthest toward Africa, It is also interesting to note that Faro is within about 50 miles of the western-most point of the European continent where it extends out into the Atlantic toward North America.

There are still 125 miles of relatively untouched beach, but Englishmen with the aid of American money are rapidly exploiting the area, building high rise apart-ments, white stucco town houses and Spanish haciendas--the same as they are doing all over Portugal and Spain as well as elsewhere in Europe. The modern touch strikes you as quite bizarre when you see natives riding donkeys and driving oxen in the fields in the same general vicinity. The rank and file still live in the close







confines of very narrow alley-ways--behind white-washed but ancient stucco walls that have been home for many, many generations of Portugese.

But Portugal is not called the Cinderella of Europe without good reason. The bondage of a dictatorship and the practical peonage it imposed on the working class is gradually becoming a matter of history. They still have a long way to go, but the Portugese are definitely on the go, especially the younger generation. (We could see noticeable improvements since our 1966 visit to Portugal).

Even in the small towns you see evidence of the new era--from the mini skirts on the girls to the mini-motor cars piloted by daring young men, and young ladies, too, darting hither and you like scared jack rabbits, on the narrow streets oblivious to the comfort and safety of the dodging pedestrians.

And the younger ones don't walk around balancing bundles on their heads as do their mothers. You don't see many of the young folks riding donkeys along the highways, either, like their parents still do.



### On TOP, with Tony Douglas.

This past summer the TOP program reached 70 young people through the cooperation of the Rochester Police Bureau and Rochester Jobs Inc., with funding help from Kodak. 



# This is what a traffic jam looks like to our computer.

It takes the place of the Kodaker behind the wheel—the person who creeps out of a company parking lot and onto a stretch of double-yellow-striped, bumper-to-bumper molasses every 5 p.m.

A large part of the traffic in Northwest Rochester has long stemmed from 28,000 Kodak Park people who head out of 175 manufacturing buildings and make tracks for cars in 35 parking lots every day. So our Kodak Park traffic committee decided to help do something about the problem.

Not for the computer. It proved capable of simulating the entire three hours of rush traffic from 3 to 6 p.m. in less than 3 minutes.

After studying the computer data, we staggered the arrival times and especially the quitting times of thousands of our people. Our engineers shared their knowledge with city and state traffic experts, who were doing their part by adjusting signal light intervals and widening intersections.

We're glad our computer technology could work with our community's engineers to help ease the strain of one of America's best known and least-loved afternoon phenomena—the rush-hour traffic jam.

Now after five delightful days at the Dona Felipa Hotel in Faro, Portugal, we set out in our sturdy little Morris 1300 on our 1000 mile round trip that was to take us over into Spain, to Seville and then to the Costa del Sol.

We often have traveled in Europe without advance reservations, since we like to be able to pace ourselves according to how we feel, what we see along the way or what have you. Fortunately this time we took the word of travelers we met at Faro and had our concierge phone ahead. (The hotel concierge or man at the front desk - is the indispensable fixer, source of information on any and all subjects and the traveler's best friend).

It was good that we took this precaution. For it turned out to be fiesta time in Seville, our next stop, the bull fights were on and even the small pensions were filled to capacity. However, the Dona Felipa concierge just happened to have been a classmate of the manager of one of the smaller hotels in Seville and I think he got us the only room available in the entire town.

It was less than 200 miles to Seville, but that's about as far as we like to go in one day--in Europe. There was one main road, Route 431, along the southern tier of Portugal, by way of Huelva, and we couldn't get lost. It was generally well paved with a few rough spots, but our Morris gave us a very comfortable ride.

## "Twenty-Eight" **TOPICS**

By John J. Romano

28th District County Legislator

This is a brief report on major actions of your County Administration and Legislature during the third quarter of 1970. As your representative I have taken part in numerous committee meetings which have contributed to what I consider commendable progress in County planning and accomplishment.

a larger share of the Sales Tax, it is only natural that taxpayers expect an accounting of what we are doing with the extra money. (Incidentally this Sales Tax distribution was based on 1964 census figures and if 1970 census figures were to be used the County would be entitled to an even greater share).

As a representative of a city district it is my special obligation to see to it that a change in the tax structure is balanced by more assumption of service by the County. And that I am doing.

Let's look at some of the recent accomplishments of the County Legislature:

PURE WATERS-Projects such as the construction begun in the Northwest Quadrant and Western Extension, plus other phases, will indirectly alleviate some of the sewer problems in our area.

SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL-It is now recommended that the County assume responsibility in this field. In order to close the Emerson dump as quickly as possible, the City is to move on its own for the present time. However, accepting the Greeley-Hanson report, the County would amortize any expense in the operation of the landfill, the purchase of the land, or the construction of incinerators for the destruction and disposal of solid wastes.

NEW CHILDREN'S DETENTION CENTER-It has been authorized at a maximum cost of two million dollars, reimbursed 75% by the State. We would save the \$38,000 yearly rental for the present facility which has a capacity of 12 boys and 8 girls (and more than twice that number are frequently held in detention). The new one story structure is to be built on county-owned land in the Iola area and will house 60 children.

CONSOLIDATIONS-The City's share of operating the Rochester Museum and Science Center has been transferred to the County involving \$274,186 for the last six

months of this year.
SOCIAL SERVICES-A major reorganization of this department went into effect on Nov. 12, scrapping many traditional welfare concepts and eliminating reams of paper work. It should make more efficient use of social services and personnel and should eliminate the need for creating some 50 department positions at a cost of \$600,000. Also over 1000 welfare clients and applicants have been placed in jobs in the Welfare Rolls to Payrolls program.

NARCOTIC GUIDANCE COUN-CIL-This has already been at work, approving establishment of a residential treatment center for adolescent drug abusers; and initiating studies on a hot-line at Strong Memorial Hospital plus a series of crisis centers on a 24 hour basis. Application for funds will be made to the State.

PRISONER REHABILITATION -A Work Release Program, approved by the State Department of Correction, will provide opportunity

Since the County is now taking for prisoners to be released for gainful employment or education, returning to the institution at night. The wages thus earned would be applied to support the dependents, payment of debts and reimbursing the County for food and lodging.

CABLE TELEVISION-The Legislature has approved a plan that the State Legislature enact legislation enabling Monroe County to create a non-profit, publicly regulated body to construct and operate a cable TV system. (This is expected to give the County a new source of revenue other than property tax for support of educa-

MONROE COMMUNITY COL-LEGE-The County is contributing \$2.7 million to the \$9.6 million budget for 1970-71.

As I said at the outset these are only some of the major concerns of the County Legislature. Of course there are hundreds of other services which the County is providing, too numerous to mention here, but which will be found in the minutes of our meetings as published periodically in the news-



## Social Security

Banks, department stores, and smaller merchants are losing a great deal of money each year because they accept social security cards as identification in cashing checks, Joseph Tomaino, Social Security District Manager,

warned today.

For years, Tomaino noted, the card has carried a notation "Not For Identification" -- and the Social Security Administration, in posters and press releases has explicitly pointed out that a social security number card is issued for the convenience of workers and their employers and helps to identify a worker's social security account for social security purposes only. "The mere possession of the card is obviously not a positive method of identifying an individual, since the card could easily fall into the hands of the wrong person," To maino said. "We do not consider it such when claims are filed for social security benefits, and we certainly do not expect others to do so," he added.

Tomaino's warning followed reports of stolen checks cashed on the basis of stolen or forged social security cards.

Tomaino also pointed out that build-in safeguards in the social security claims process protect the social security trust funds from imposters who might use forged or counterfeit cards in attempts to collect social security benefits.

He also noted that under the Federal law, a person could receive up to five years imprisonment and up to \$5,000 fine for falsifying a social security card. In addition, violations would be subject of prosecution on the charges of cashing forged checks or other fraudulent transaction, using the false cards.



#### Blood Donors "Regulars" Overcome Their Fears After First Giving sonnel.

"My blood isn't the right type." "I'm too thin,"

"Frankly, I'm scared of giving blood."

All are common excuses for not giving blood. However, any blood is the right type, and if you weigh 110-pounds, you're not too thin, according to Dr. Jacob Nusbacher of the Rochester Regional Red Cross Blood Program. As for being scared, nearly every donor feels this way the first time, but it soon passes. Donating has become a regular habit with thousands of people and many regulars have become 15-gallon donors.

There are two main factors to be considered before the Red Cross will decide whether you can give blood - the health and safety of you, the donor, and the health and safety of the unknown recipient of your blood.

In making this decision, the Red Cross medical officer has the prospective donor, who must be over 18 and hasn't yet reached his 66th birthday, answer a number of medical questions.

Donors may give blood eight weeks - no oftener - and no more than five times a year.

After being registered the donor has his temperature taken, his blood pressure noted, and he is weighed. Then he moves from table to table to give his medical history, receive a hemoglobin test, and finally, to give his blood.

The actual process of giving blood is quite easy with the donation taking approximately seven minutes and the remainder of the processing usually requiring 40 minutes. All is performed under the watchful eye of medical per-

What does donating a unit of blood mean?

The blood may be used in treating one person or it may be separated into red cells, platelets, cryoprecipitate and fresh frozen plasma. Part of the blood may be fractionated into gamma globulin, serum albumin, fibrinogen, and anti-hemophiliac factors. Since many products can be made available from one unit of blood, many patients can be treated. And, if someone in the donor's family becomes ill or injured and requires blood or a blood product, he will receive all he needs.

Not everybody who wants to give blood can do so, Dr. Nusbacher explained.

A donor must not have an acute respiratory disease or history of hepatitis. A person who has had malaria is permanently deferred. Taking anti-malaria drugs can cause a deferral until two years after medication is stopped. Persons who have traveled in a malaria zone are deferred for six months after returning.

Women are ineligible as donors during pregnancy and for six months after delivery, abortion, or miscarriage.

Serious heart problems exclude a donor for his own safety, as does recent major surgery.

A person receiving treatment for tuberculosis, as well as those with lymph gland diseases and cancer are refused. Those who have had infectious mononucleosis are acceptable after six months. Persons with chronic kidney disease can't be accepted. Prospective donors in the active stages of asthma or an allergy are deferred temporarily.

Immunizations or vaccinations are evaluated according to the type. Medications must be judged individually to determine eligibil-ity to give blood.

A physician is always on duty in Red Cross Blood Centers or in Mobile units to make a final decision in any case that is questionable.

Despite the minor discomfort and the little time it takes, there is great satisfaction in helping several patients by your single blood donation, Dr. Nusbacher con-





Historic Newspapers Collection SPAIN and PORTUGAL

There is a natural border between Portugal and Spain at this point- a river. No bridge: just ferry boats and not very pretentious at that. One accomodated three cars and the other eight. We had to wait in line for over an hour and when we arrived on the Spanish side, lost another half hour while they did the paper work, mostly on the car. It was the longest delay we have ever experienced at any European border. But the boat ride was fun. We were packed in so tight you couldn't even get out of the car. But was interesting just to observe the antics of our fellow travelers, Germans, Frenchmen, Algerians, Dutchmen--you name it, all dressed very casually and comfortably for traveling.

Our route took us through Villa Real, center of the Portugese tuna industry. It seems that the tuna come to the warm waters of the Algarve to spawn and fishing is good from April to July. This provides work for the canneries and gives the region its main source of income. Not a single shread of the fish is discarded, we were told. The choicest fillets are canned in their natural flavor with oil or tomato sauce. The less desireable portions are dried and sold for food to the poor classes. The by-pro-ducts go into fertilizer which has a high phosphate content.

After crossing the border, it was only a short distance to Seville and we soon found ourselves in this busy city. We had a few anxious moments finding our hotel, the Dona Marie. Caught in heavy traffic and getting directions from policemen that were not too explicit due to the language difficulty---well, we made it.

Our hotel was just off a little square in the downtown area, directly across the street from the 800 year old Seville Cathedral, said to be the largest church edifice in the world. It took up about six city blocks. It has fabulous riches in both decorations and works of art. The remains of Saint Ferdinand, the liberator of Seville, are enshrined there, the guide told us. Every day 50 masses are said, utilizing most of the 80 chapels.

It was in the heat of the day when we arrived and we were greatly relieved to find that we could park our car, right at the hotel door. on the street. A rather nondescript old fellow came up to us as we got out of the car and presented us with a ticket. We paid him the equivalent of about 15 cents and he tucked the ticket under our windshield blade. The hotel doorman assured us it was perfectly legal, that he had the concession from the city, and that this gave us parking rights until 8 the next morning.

It was close to 90 in the shade and if you were silly enough to be found on the street from noon to 4 in the afternoon, you looked for the side of the street where the buildings shade you from the sun. As soon as we completed checking-in formalities, we settled down for a siesta in our hotel room. At about 4:30 we sauntered down to a sidewalk cafe in front of the Cathedral and settled down to observe the Spanish shoppers as they hurried along to their favorite stores == now open after being clos= ed since noon. Most of the stores, including the larger ones, stay open until 8 p.m.

We sipped our beverages and watched the crowds go by-the tourists' most enjoyable pastime. Then we strolled a few blocks down the street and came upon a public square about the size of a

football field. It was a huge cement floored playground where the old folks sat around on park benches and the children were having a gay time of it chasing each other around, skipping rope and acting like normal boys and girls. You had to pay a few pesadas for a chair or a seat on a bench if you wanted to linger.

The next day we left Seville and found the best roads ever on our way to Algiceras, passing but not visiting Jerez de la Frontera, a name to conjure with and home of sherry wine. And we also skirted numerous seacoast towns. It was only about 200 kilometers and we made it easily in about four hours.

At Algeciras we had the experience of staying at a very fine hotel, the Reina Christina, set in the middle of a 12 acre estate, beautifully flowered and shrubbed. Favored by perfect weather here, as elsewhere on the entire trip, we felt pretty lucky.

We took side trips to numerous towns and places of interest including the Rock of Gibraltar which towered skyward across the bay and looked just like the picture most everyone knows so well, thanks to the insurance company ad. Stranger than fiction, however, we drove to within a quarter mile of the Rock only to be stopped by a roadblock. We were not surprised since we had been told if you want to go to Gibraltar, the only way is via ship--to Africa, Tangiers that is, and thence to Gibraltar by ship. The quarrel between England and Spain over possession of this important gateway to the Mediterranean is unabated and although Gibraltar is populated mostly by Spaniards and is part of the mainland of Spain, the border is closed tight. We took a picture and drove away.

Our attractive and comfortable hotel was quite a contrast to the nearby town. Algeciras' streets appeared to have the dust of the centuries on them. They were very dirty and the whole town, except for some swanky new apartments on the outskirts, smelled bad. In particular, a canal that ran right thru the center of town was veritably an open sewer. It was one of the few towns in our travels that we were glad to leave behind.

And now we headed up the famed Costa del Col, the sunny coast of Spain, toward Malaga.

Some of the weight problems are est percentage. Overweight can be a family affair—that is, an inherited faulty metabolism or a too-rich cook for a mother. But the main problem stems from teen's poor nutrition habits. nutrition-habits

Think of the greasy french fries, the pizzas, the thick shakes; the ssive dependence on sweet car-

bonated sodas and you can see the problem growing before your eyes. Diet control by the mother in the home is 9/10 of the battle accord-ing to the adolescent medical specialists. So, eschew the rich desserts, cut down on the breads and puddings, stock fruit juices instead of soda, and resist the temptation to bake. Turn, instead, to making available a good variety of fresh wholesome fruits and vegetables. Prepare attractive salads with plenty of tomatoes, chunky wedges Chiquita brand lettuce and celery, Cook without fat, broil instead

Pay special attention to snacks, since teens are never close-mouthed. For a mid-afternoon nibmouthed. For a mid-afternoon nib-ble, don't offer a plateful of cup-cakes. /2 cup corn starch

1 teaspoon baking powder

34 teaspoon nutmeg

1 cup mashed fully banana (about 3)

4 cup water

1/4 cup corn oil

1/4 cup sugar

Sift together flour, corn starch, sugar, baking powder and nutmeg into bowl. Stir in bananas and water. Heat about 1 tablespoon corn oil in skillet over medium heat. Drop batter by tablespoons full into skillet, flattening slightly. Fry until golden brown on each side, about 3 minutes total. Add additional oil as necessary. Drain on absorbent paper. Makes about 14 fritters.

In announcing the new \$60 deductible, Commissioner Ball explained that the law requires an annual review of hospital costs under Medicare and an adjustment of the portion of the bill for which a Medicare beneficiary is responsible, if these costs have risen substantially. The law provides a formula for determining the amount of any adjustment in the deductible amount.

Based on 67 million days of hospitalization covered by Medicare bills in 1969, the current average per diem rate for inpatient hospital services amounted to \$55.70 compared to a rate of \$37.94 for the base year of 1966. Applying the formula, i.e., multiplying the ratio of the 1969 rate to the 1966 rate by \$40, the result is \$55.72, which must, under the law he rounded to \$60 the the law, be rounded to \$60, the new deductible amount.

The hospital deductible amount,

Commissioner Ball explained, is intended to make the Medicare beneficiary responsible for expenses equivalent to the average cost of one day of hospital care. It is like the deductible amounts specified in many auto insurance policies where the car owner pays the first \$50 or \$100 on a repair bill, and the insurance policy covers the rest.

Ball said that when the hospital deductible amount changes, the law requires comparable changes in the dollar amounts that a Medicare beneficiary pays toward a hospital stay of more than 60 days, or a posthospital extended care stay of more than 20 days.

When a Medicare beneficiary has a hospital stay of more than 60 days, he will pay \$15 a day

Beginning in January, an older for the 61st through the 90th day, up from the present \$13 per day. If he has a posthospital stay of over 20 days in an extended care facility, he will pay \$7.50 per day toward the cost of the 21st day through the 100th day, up from the present \$6.50 per day.

If he needs to draw on his "difetime reserve", the reserve of hospital days a beneficiary can draw upon if he ever needs more than 90 days of hospital care in the same benefit period, he will pay \$30 for each day used, instead of the present \$26 per day.

#### Don't File Too Late

Don't lose out on your reimbursement for medical expenses under Medicare's Part B because you file too late, advises Joseph Tomaino, Social Security District Manager.

Under the law there are spec-ific time limits for making payments on your claims. December 31, 1970 is the latest date a claim may be filed for any medical services you received from October 1, 1968 through September 30, 1969. Tomaino stressed the date the medical service was received determines the latest date you may file your claim.

Tomaino also suggest those who have any questions in connection with Medicare consult their Medi-Handbook or contact the local social security office. The office is located at 107 Clinton Ave. N. The telephone number is 325-6640. The office hours are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily and until 8 p.m. on Thursdays.

#### Mrs. Kazmayer Dies On European Trip

# December Historic Newspapers Collection Kodak Park Installing **New Disposal Unit**

Solid wastes will pay most of their own disposal costs -- while also cleaning up the air -- when Eastman Kodak Company's new combustible waste disposal unit goes into operation at Kodak Park here by the end of this year.

A unique heat-reclaiming cycle, coupled with advanced silver recovery and sludge combustion features, will help the new unit earn

back much of its building costs, according to Kodak.

John M. Walsh, manager of the Engineering, Construction, Maintenance and Utilities Organization at Kodak Park said the unit will be unique in industry since it is far more advanced and sophisticated than anything in use today.

"Today's average incinerator equipment," he said, "is usually nothing more than an enclosure for a bonfire sitting on a grate. The closest approach to the Kodak unit is a Norfolk Navy Yards prototype, but it was built for other purposes, and so it is not comparable except for its heat recapturing feature."

"As soon as the new combustible disposer becomes fully operational," he said, "a full-scale second phase investigation will focus on the existing incinerator which also feeds the same tall

Phase two experiments will be directed at the more thorough burning of semi-solid liquid combustible chemicals. Closer attention to the fluctuating volume and the content of the chemical loadings is expected to develop more appropriate burning techniques and -- eventually -- even cleaner plumes from the stack.

The unit will also be unusual in its ability to capture heat from industrial waste treatment sludge reclaimed from the company's King's Landing water purification plant on the nearby Genesee River. It will burn this sludge right along with the solid wastes. Sludge is expected to make up about onefifth of the incinerator load.

Malaga we found to be a densely populated metropolis, bustling with activity and many attractions to excite the tourist. It is a seacoast town with the wharfs a short walking distance from its center. Our hotel, the Palace, was only a stone's throw from the water's edge and we could watch the ships coming and going from the comfortable vantage point of our hotel room balcony.

One of the big events of our stay in Malaga was the arrival of a huge tourist ship, flying the familiar hammer and sickle flag of Russia. The vessel was painted a sombre black, but there was nothing sombre about the passen-

We were standing on the dock snapping a picture of the ship whan a group of young people apparently in their 20's and 30's came up behind us. They were Russians who had been into town shopping-like all good tourists -- and were on their way back to the ship with their loot. They didn't look like Russians as we are apt to picture them. They were quite evidently in a most happy mood and definitely not alcoholic-inspired. One had a camera and he

lined up about a dozen of his pals --both men and women-- to snap their pictures with their ship in the background, I grabbed a shot of the fellow taking the picture. and incidentally got the entire group in the same film.

We found out later that this ship calls at Malaga quite a bit; that it sails from its home port in the Crimea, via the Black Sea and the Dardanelles into the Mediterreanean where it visits numerous ports. There is no apparent restriction on the movements of the Soviet tourists and they don't seem to worry about defections.



The big contrast strikes you, however, as you leave the business district and head back into the hills where the people live. The narrow streets are lined on either side with white-washed walls behind which the people live. Thousands of front doors, but few win-

One of the most popular spots in Malaga is a park-like street which ran alongside our hotel. It is nearly a mile long with very wide marble-like sidewalks and a canopy of trees that covered the sidewalks and the wide street in the middle to provide a delightful place to stroll. There were several small playgrounds for the children; a band shell where concerts were played almost nightly; a mammoth booth featuring fames of chance, ring and ball tossing for dolls and stuffed animals just like Sea Breeze, with loudspeakers blasting out the shrill entreaties of the shills. Late in the afternoon, this area is the rendezvous for scores of other promoters with their carriages and gaily decorated horses lying in wait for tourists, and offering a pleasant sight-seeing expedition, seeing the town at night for about \$2.00 an hour.

# Those Lake Ave. Signal Lights

Residents of the Lake and Ravine Ave. area expressed their resentment earlier this year when the traffic control engineers took away the signal light from their busy corner. Now, after the fatal hit and run death of a young woman there on Christmas Eve, they are really upset, and rightly so.

Why should there be three signal lights within a few hundred feet of each other--at Glendale, Lexington and Driving Park--and none in the very long three block span between Glendale and Phelps?

There is much more pedestrian traffic at Ravine than anywhere else in this whole stretch of Lake Ave., and it had a signal light for years. One wonders what is the thinking behind this elimination?

Admittedly this is a layman's point of view, but as we see it there could be considerable improvement in the Lake Ave. expressway setup. All north-south traffic should move in a synchronized manner. At regular intervals then it would be comparatively safe to cross on foot, with only cars coming in from the side streets to contend with.

# City Maps "Corrective Action" For Emerson Landfill Area

Councilman John R. Parrinello and County Legislator Joseph Esposito have advised City Manager Kermit E. Hill that several immediate steps will be taken to alleviate environmental conditions in the area of the Emerson St. landfill.

The lawmakers met with the Northwest Environmental Task Force, appointed by Hill, to determine what immediate corrective action could be taken.

The Task Force felt that the most serious problem was the illegal dumping of refuse on the landfill's perimeter by suburban drivers. Signs will be posted on recently installed snow fence urging persons who wish to dump refuse to use the landfill by driving to an entrance instead of dumping outside the grounds. In addition, DPW crews have begun regular patrols

-Unplugging the drainage pipe to alleviate the overflowing of Lexington Avenue




