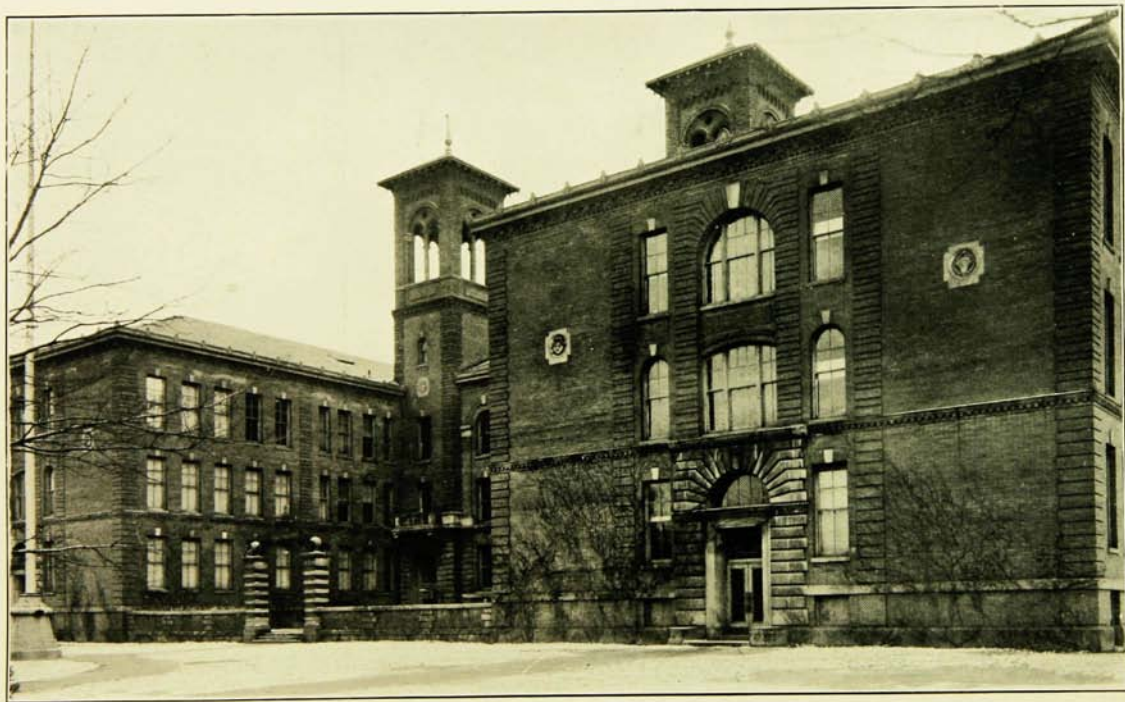

Although nearly every assembly in East High School is opened by the singing of the Alma Mater, few of the pupils know anything about the origin of our high school song. The Alma Mater was written at a time when East High School was just appearing on the horizon, Rochester High School being the only high school in the city. The pupils had just adopted a constitution, the CLARION had just begun, and, with the increase in school spirit, it was only natural that the pupils should feel the need of a school song.

The words of the Alma Mater were written by Mrs. Bertha Scrantom Poole, who was at that time an English teacher in the school, and the music was composed by J. Guernsey Curtiss, a member of the Class of 1902.

The song, which was composed in 1901, will always live in the hearts of those who have passed through East High School.

Review of Music

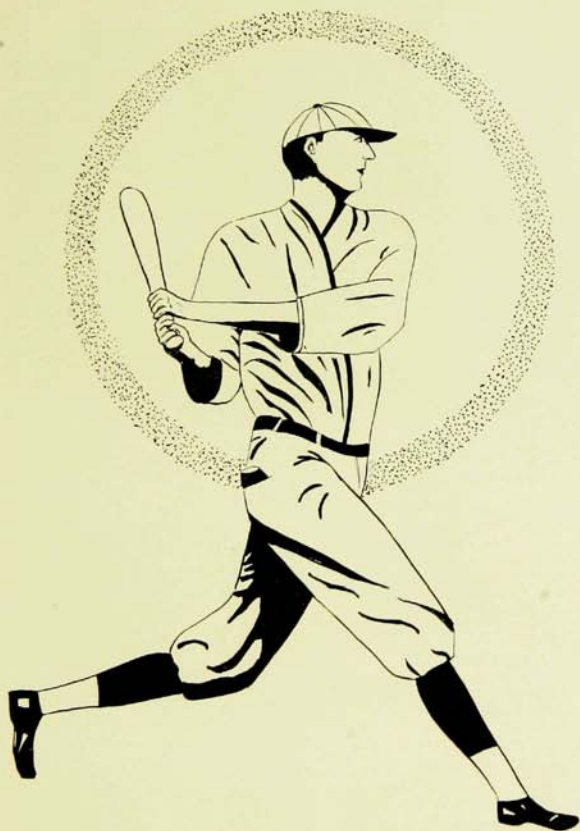
