





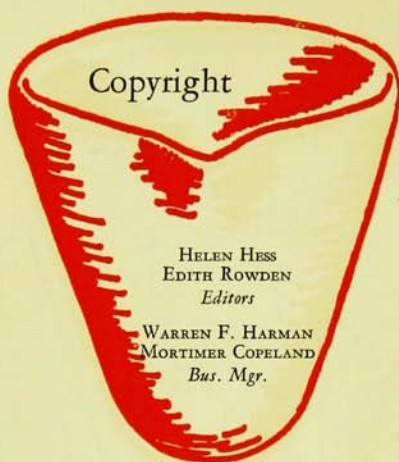

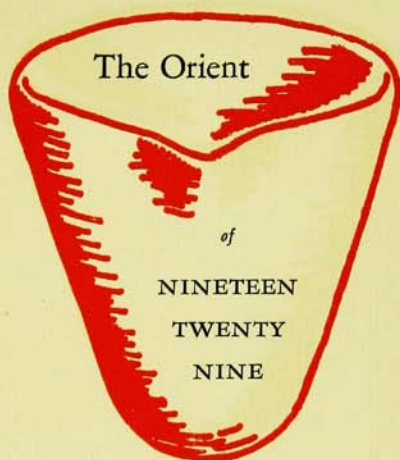

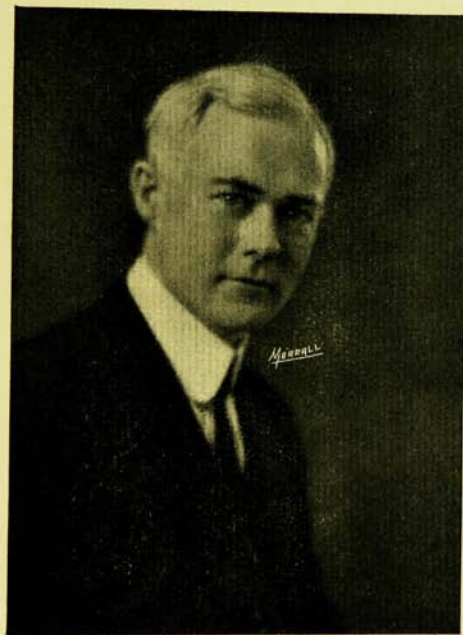

Our dance, The Eskimo Hop, was a decided improvement over our previous efforts (partly because it was decided beforehand to hold dance practice sessions). The summer vacation acted as the lull before the final storm.

In September we came back to listen with a certain complacent pride and esoteric pleasure to our Principal Wilcox call us the "ranking Senior Class" before all the pupils in assembly.

With "The Rear Car" as a vehicle for our actors, we offered mysterious murders on moving trains, blinking lights, and screams innumerable, all for fifty cents. Pooling our efforts with those of the Class of June '29, we held the first combined Senior party in the history of the school. And such a highly successful experiment did it prove to be that it promises to establish a precedent.

After discussions, wranglings, and meetings at which everything from clown suits to Roman togas were suggested for Senior day costumes, we went Bolshevistic and bought flaming red sweaters and blue nether garments. 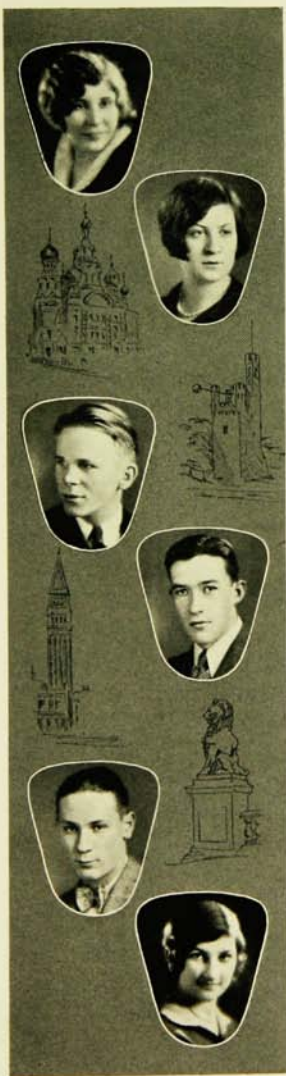

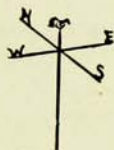

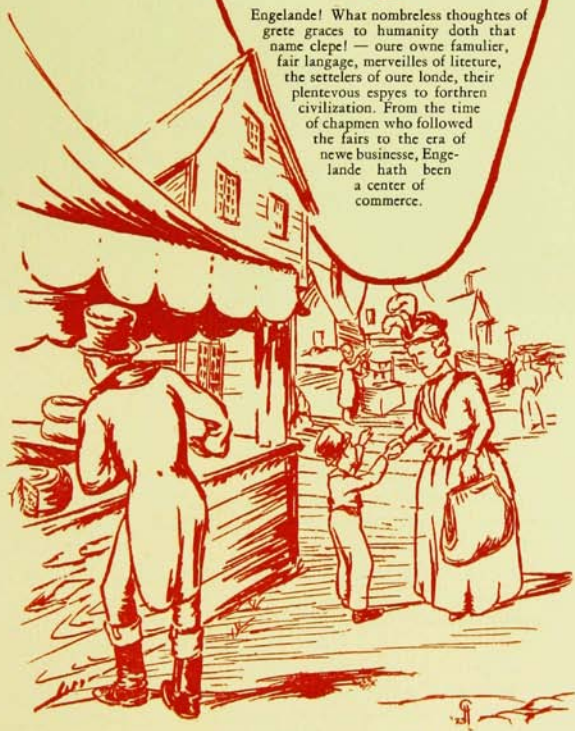

## *House of Delegates*

Enterprising pupils, who have for several years given voice to their opinions concerning the student government body through the CLARION, have brought about the initiation of a new government, based upon home room representation.

Large increases in the school's population have made the original class-unit form very inadequate.

Twenty-five years ago the Executive Council, consisting of representatives from four small classes, functioned admirably well. At present the eight large classes, scattered in various home rooms, cannot be used as satisfactory mediums of representation. Thus the home room unit has evolved.

The present government, the House of Delegates, now in the second term of its life, is composed of one delegate and one alternate from each home room. 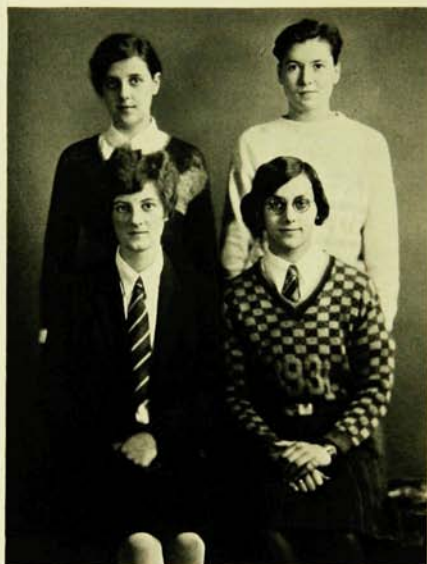

## Music

Rarely does a school enter into the making and enjoyment of music with such zest and enthusiasm or on such a large scale as did East High during the past year. Guided by three men of unusual ability and talent, pupils have worked industriously and achieved really praise-worthy results.

We have had the orchestra with its symphonies, the opera with its arias, and the vocal quartet with its tuneful croonings. We have been stirred by the band with its marches, the *à Capella* choir with its choruses, and the woodwind quintet with its unique tone color. The Glee Club with its melodious songs, the string quartet with its rich chamber music, and the soloists with their brilliant pieces and concertos—all these have delighted us by broadening and lending color to our school life.

An annex orchestra was formed to accommodate some of the sixty pupils who applied for admission to the orchestra—a number larger than the entire personnel not so many years ago. The remarkable growth and development of the band and orchestra under the skillful leadership of Karl Van Hoesen is evinced in still another way. For the first time in recent years both organizations have given separate formal evening concerts in the school auditorium with unusual success.

By its meritorious performances our Glee Club carried the name of the school with honor to various parts of the city. In addition to presenting its annual concert, it represented East High at the Community Festival, the Eastman School, and other institutions. In filling the place of Howard Hinga, who is now supervisor of music in the public schools of the city, Marlowe G. Smith even surpassed the high standard for work which he set at the annex last year. The picture of him in the assembly leading us as we sing "Sweet be thy memory . . .," will long remain with us.

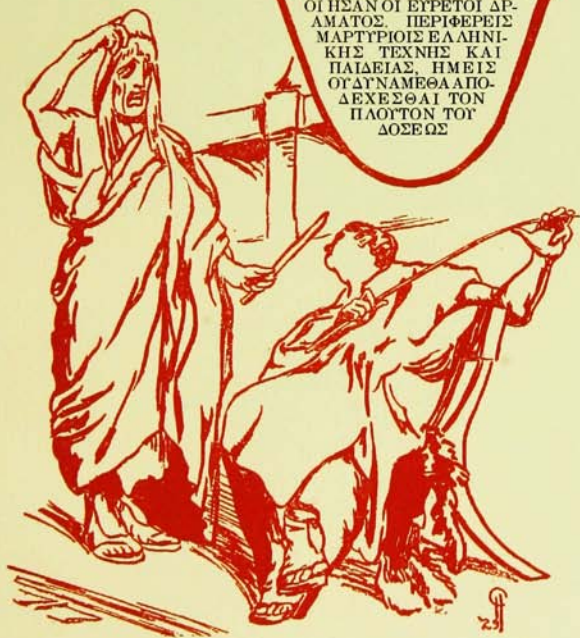

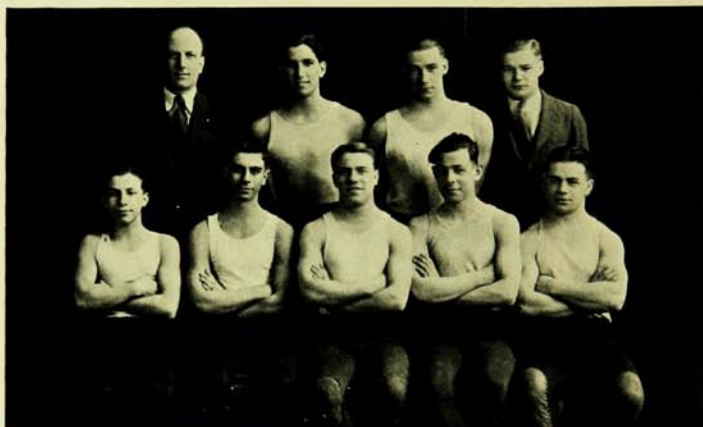

Coach Doc Fowle turned out another one of his strong teams this year. The Oriental hoopsters lost but one game in 21 starts—and that was in the first round of State Scholastic Tournament at Syracuse. 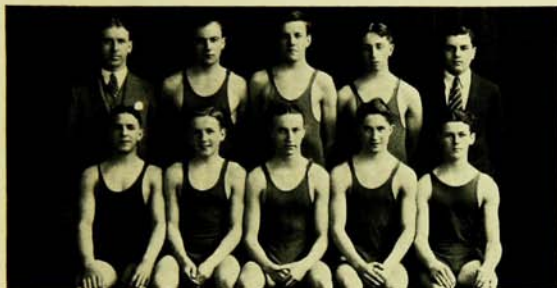

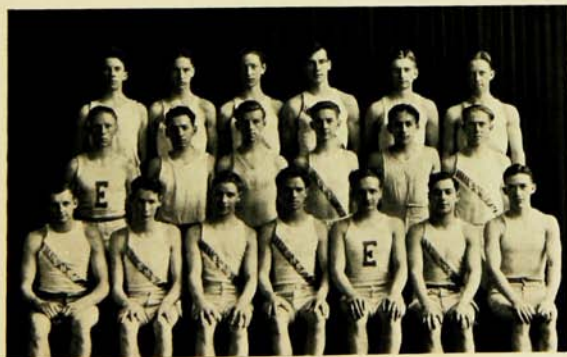

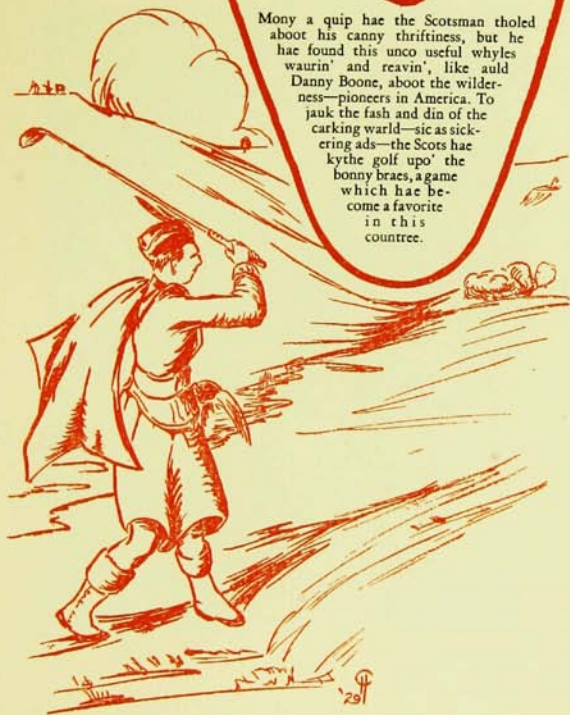
