MISS SCHWENDLER ♦ AN APPRECIATION

Late in the afternoon of a certain day in June, nineteen thirty-six, a slight, darkly clad figure emerged from Room 106, locked the door behind her, and unobtrusively but briskly, stepped from the building—and out of the life of East High School. Only two or three people were aware at the time that Miss Sara Schwendler had ended her connection with the institution of which she had been so vital a part since its beginning. There was no demonstration to mark her departure, no farewell party, not even a goodbye said to her countless friends, in and out of the school. That was just as she would have it, for she hated the sham and insincerity, which so often play a part in such occasions, and she dreaded the glaring light of publicity. Despite her unspoken preference, however, those of us who knew Miss Schwendler well are constrained to leave some permanent expression, inadequate though it may be, of our admiration and affection for her.

While the course of Miss Schwendler's teaching career extends back beyond the first opening of East High School, most of us have been acquainted with her only during the last two decades. But upon everyone, young or old, fortunate enough to have come under the spell of her personality, an indelible impression has been made. Many a person with troubles, whether real or imagined, has shifted his burden to her and departed with a heart strangely lightened. Never too busy to listen to the trials and perplexities of others, never too engrossed in her own troubles to lend a helping hand, she brought to their difficulties the same understanding and keen discernment which found for her the answers to her own problems.

Yet withal, Miss Schwendler seemed never to grow old. Her mind was so active and alert that the years, as they passed, only added the riches of experience without detracting one whit from the vital force of her personality. Her keen sense of humor, the clarity of her vision, and the wisdom of her counsel are known to many of us. But to her courage and determination, to her qualities as a leader, and to her unswerving loyalty to her colleagues, those who taught with her pay especial tribute.

When school convened last September and the sudden realization came over us that Miss Schwendler was no longer in our number, many disliked the thought of facing a year without her. Yet all of us were glad for her. She had done a splendid piece of work and we wish for her many years, "Ad Multos Annos."

ALICE NEWMAN GIBBONS

For the past thirty-one years Alice Newman Gibbons has been Director of the Department of Social Sciences at East High School and at one time lecturer in Education at the University of Rochester. She was educated at Vassar College where she was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. Soon after her graduation in 1898 she became a teacher in the Rochester Free Academy and through her long career as an administrator, she never ceased active teaching in the classroom.

Alice Gibbons is a member of the National Education Association, American Association of University Women, American Historical Association, Foreign Policy Association, American Academy of Political and Social Science, National Council for Social Studies, and of the Executive Board of the Social Studies Magazine.

She is the author of a "Directed Study Guide in the Origins of Contemporary Civilization," of a "Teacher's Manual" and of an accompanying "Test Book," all widely used in secondary schools throughout the United States as well as in several universities. She is a frequent contributor to professional periodicals and has been constantly in demand as a speaker at conventions and professional meetings and as a reviewer of professional books and texts for publishing houses.

For several years, Alice Gibbons was a member of the State Syllabus Committee of the Board of Regents of New York State. She contributed to three Year Books of the National Council for Social Studies, a publication of the Social Studies Section of the National Education Association. She was Chairman of the Committee for Curriculum Revision of the Social Studies in the public schools of Rochester, New York. She was a pioneer in the development and expansion of the Social Science Laboratory idea, a system which has been widely admired. This achievement, her published articles and texts, her career as a lecturer, her generous personal services in an advisory and supervisory capacity and her example as a teacher have helped to revolutionize the teaching of the Social Studies in the community of which she has long been so constructive a part.

A thorough scholar, a liberal thinker, a progressive administrator and a brilliant teacher, aggressive for the values she felt to be sound, she has profoundly influenced the lives and thought of those who have come in contact with her. Modest by nature, she has habitually avoided the publicity to which her distinction entitles her, but her sound judgment, kindly dignity and warm friendship are cherished deep in the hearts of those who know her. Her numerous friends hope for a long and happy retirement for this gracious lady.

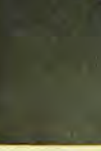

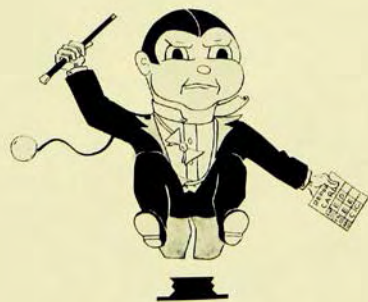
