Nor on the campus, nor at the store was he:

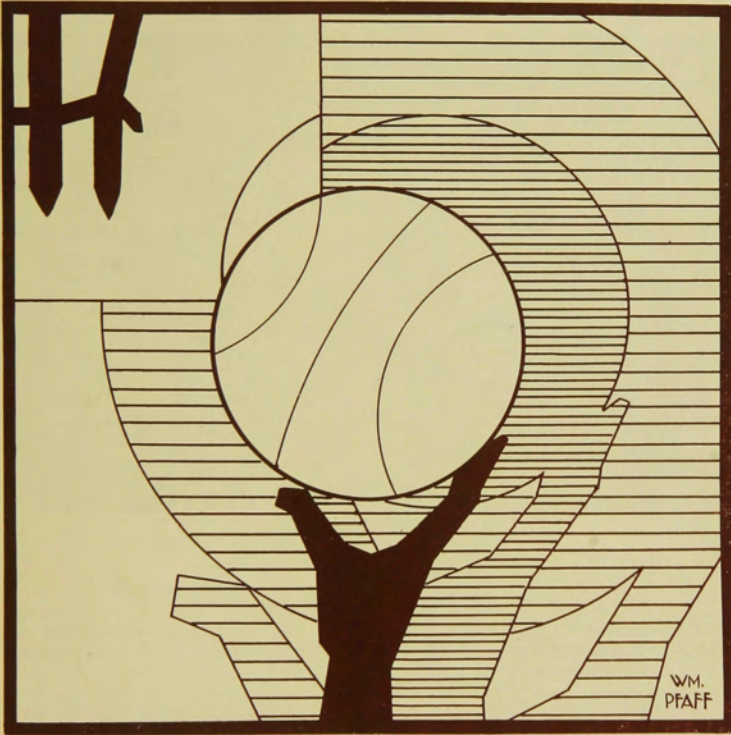
For he had graduated with honors with his class

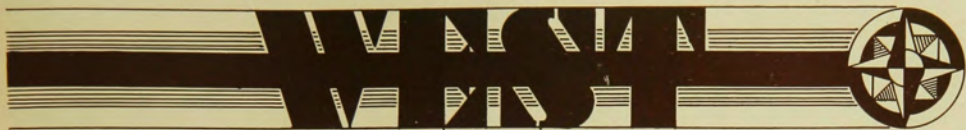
